Chapter 1 Overview of AdvancedCopy Manager CCM

This chapter presents an overview of AdvancedCopy Manager CCM.

1.1 What is AdvancedCopy Manager?

AdvancedCopy Manager is a product that uses the following functions to deliver storage management for open systems:

- High-speed backup
- High-speed replication

AdvancedCopy Manager uses the advanced copy function of ETERNUS disk storage systems to deliver these functions.

Refer to the "ETERNUS SF AdvancedCopy Manager Operator's Guide" for more information.

1.2 What is AdvancedCopy Manager CCM?

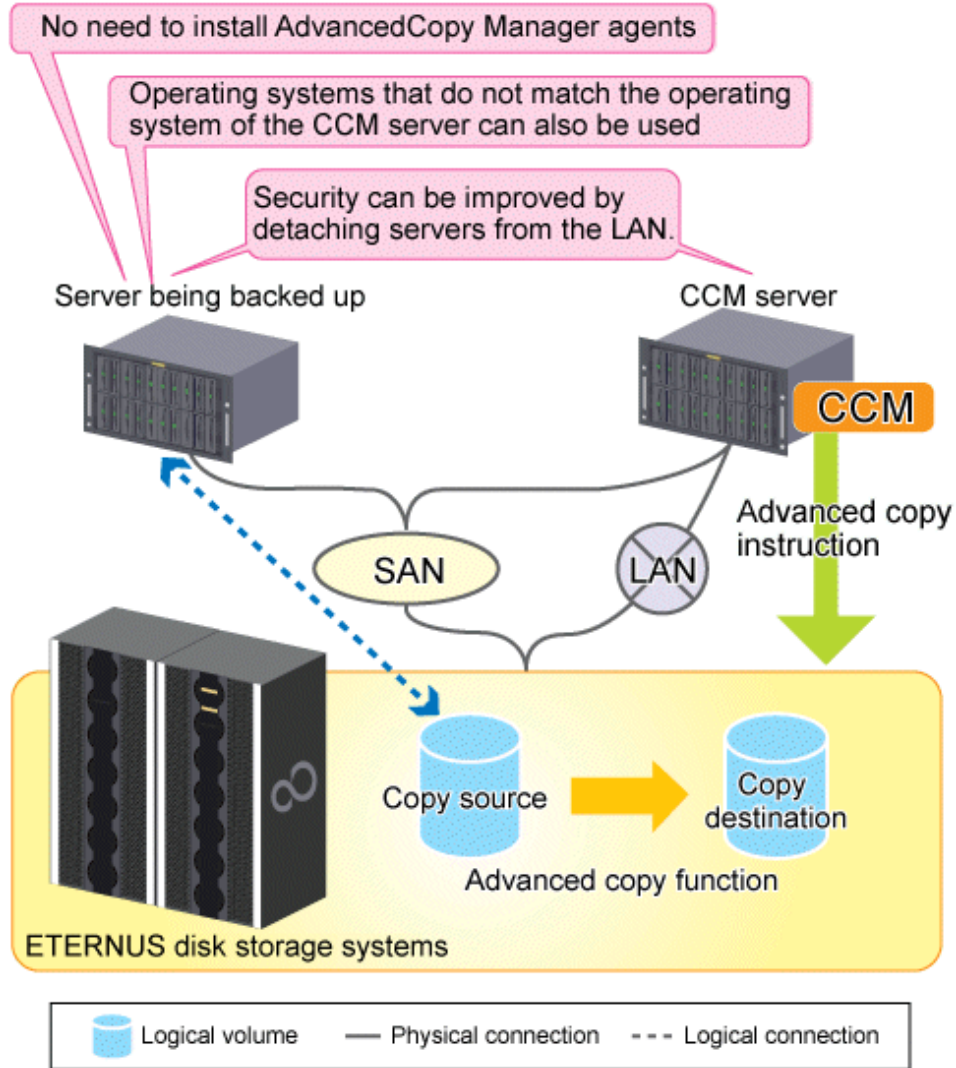
AdvancedCopy Manager CCM is a backup tool that uses the advanced copy function of ETERNUS disk storage systems without installing an AdvancedCopy Manager Agent on the server that is backed up (hereafter called the "backup source server").

Using AdvancedCopy Manager CCM has the following advantages:

- There is no need to install an AdvancedCopy Manager Agent on the server that is backed up.
 - Backups can be performed independently of the operating system of the server that is backed up.
 - Operational work becomes more efficient, because there is no need to spend time installing AdvancedCopy Manager Agents on each of the servers to be backed up.

- Security can be improved by isolating the LAN connected to the server to be backed up and the LAN connected to the server where AdvancedCopy Manager CCM is installed (hereafter called the "CCM server").

1.3 System Configuration

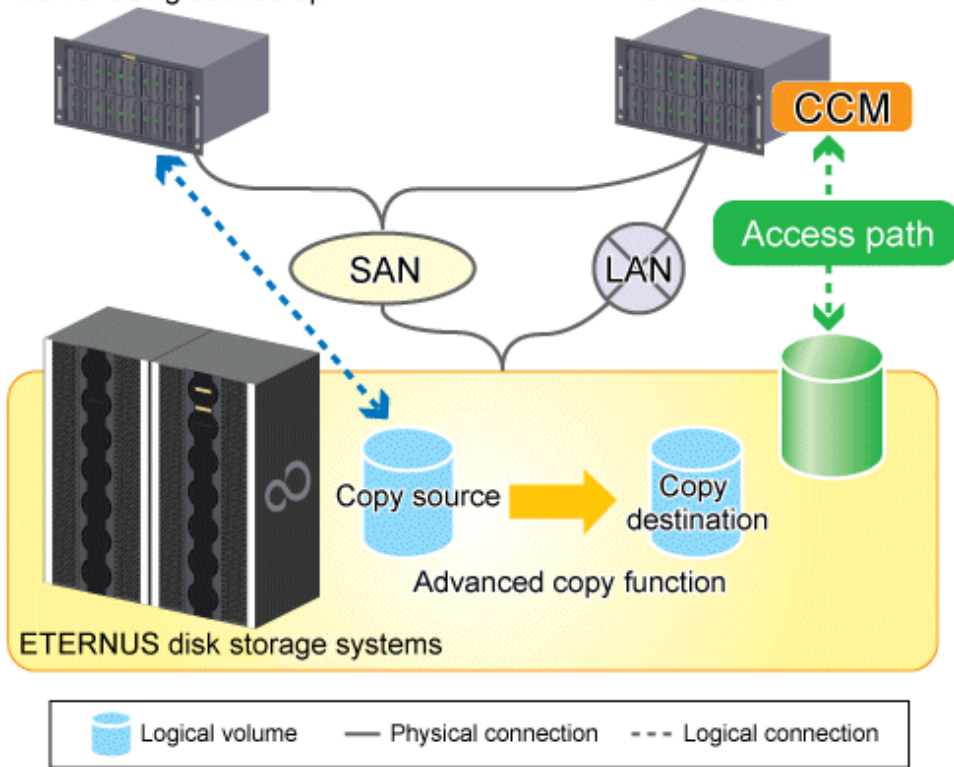
This section explains the system configuration for AdvancedCopy Manager CCM.

With AdvancedCopy Manager CCM, there must be a logical path between the CCM server and the ETERNUS disk storage systems so that the CCM server can issue advanced copy instructions to the ETERNUS disk storage systems. This logical path is referred to as "access path". To create an access path, the ETERNUS disk storage systems must have a logical volume for control purposes.

For using intra-box copy (OPC, QuickOPC, SnapOPC+ or EC)

Connect one of the logical volumes on the ETERNUS disk storage systems to be backed up to the CCM server as an access path.

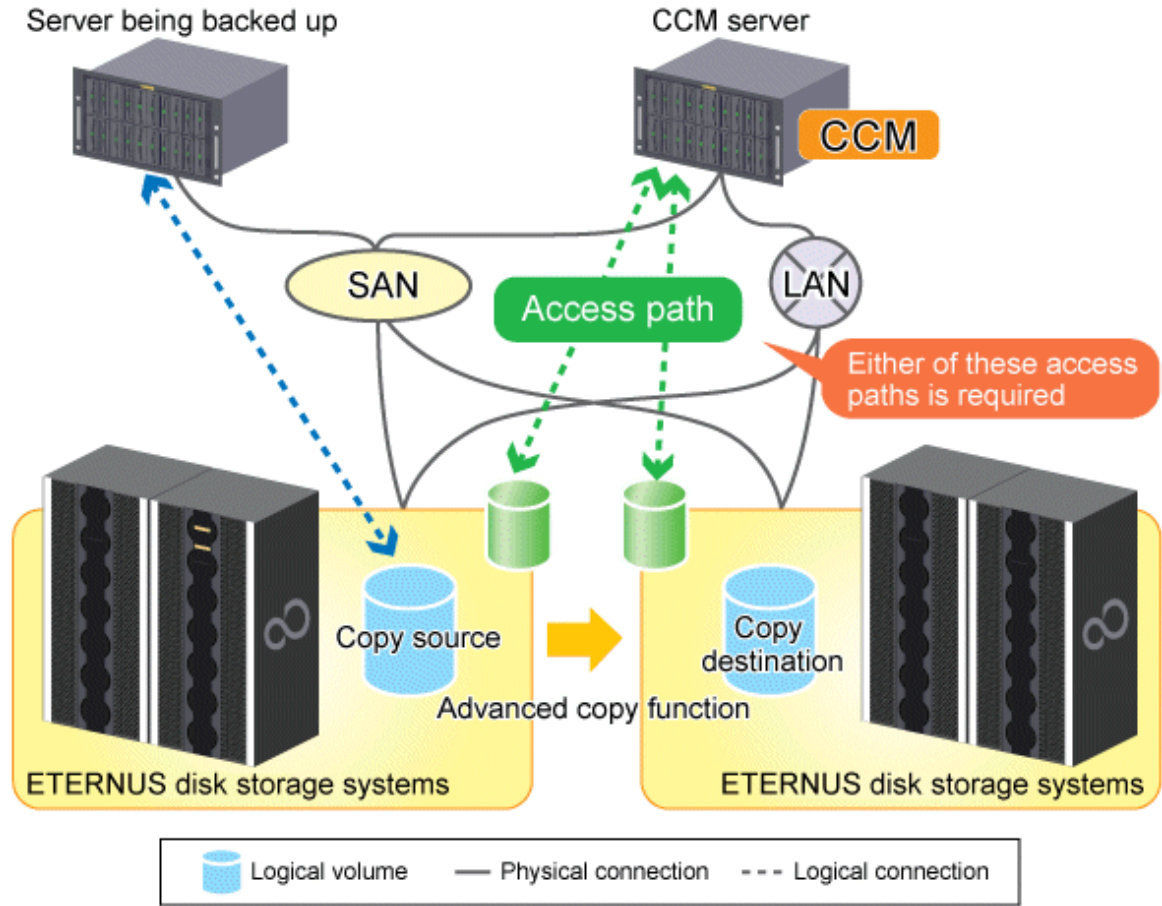
Figure 1.2 Sample configuration where intra-box copy is executed

For using inter-box copy (REC)

To execute REC using AdvancedCopy Manager CCM, there must be an access path on either the copy source or the copy destination.

P Point

Depends on OS, it is different to register the procedure of ETERNUS disk storage systems which are not connected with SAN environment and use REC (hereafter called the "remote ETERNUS disk storage systems"). 1.4.1 Hardware requirements

This section describes the hardware requirements when using AdvancedCopy Manager CCM.

Note 1: The Hyper-V(TM) function of Windows Server 2008 is not supported.

Note 2: AdvancedCopy Manager CCM operation is not supported in an environment where SELinux (Security-Enhanced Linux) is enabled. Disable SELinux at servers that operate AdvancedCopy Manager CCM.

Note 3: Operates in 32-bit compatible mode or 64-bit mode.

Note 4: It is not able to use ETERNUS DX80 S2/DX90 S2, ETERNUS DX410 S2/DX440 S2.

 **Point**

It is recommended that the copy destination logical volume should not be connected to any server, for the following reasons:

- To prevent copies between different operating systems
- Operating system behavior cannot be guaranteed if there is another logical volume with the same management information in the same ETERNUS disk storage systems

1.4.2.2 Exclusion software

The AdvancedCopy Manager CCM cannot coexist with the following software.

- ETERNUS SF Express

The AdvancedCopy Manager CCM is internally bundled with the ETERNUS SF Express. When the ETERNUS SF Express has been installed, use the AdvancedCopy Manager CCM bundled with the ETERNUS SF Express.

1.4.2.3 Mandatory software

There is no mandatory software.

1.4.3 Supported functions

AdvancedCopy Manager CCM supports the following advanced copy functions.

Note that copies are executed for each separate logical volume of the ETERNUS disk storage systems.

In the above table, "A" means "Available" and "N/A" means "Not Available".

Note

- When using AdvancedCopy Manager and AdvancedCopy Manager CCM together, make sure that the different logical volumes do not interact with each other.
- Cluster systems are not supported in AdvancedCopy Manager CCM.

1.5 Incompatibility Information

This section explains the incompatibility information.

1.5.1 Incompatibility in Version 14.1

2.1 Installation

This section explains the procedure for installing AdvancedCopy Manager CCM.

Install AdvancedCopy Manager CCM on the server (the CCM Server) that will issue backup/restore (advanced copy) instructions.

2.1.1 Installation on the Windows environment

Use the following procedure to install AdvancedCopy Manager CCM.



Point

The AdvancedCopy Manager CCM is internally bundled with the ETERNUS SF Express. When the ETERNUS SF Express has been installed, use the AdvancedCopy Manager CCM bundled with the ETERNUS SF Express.

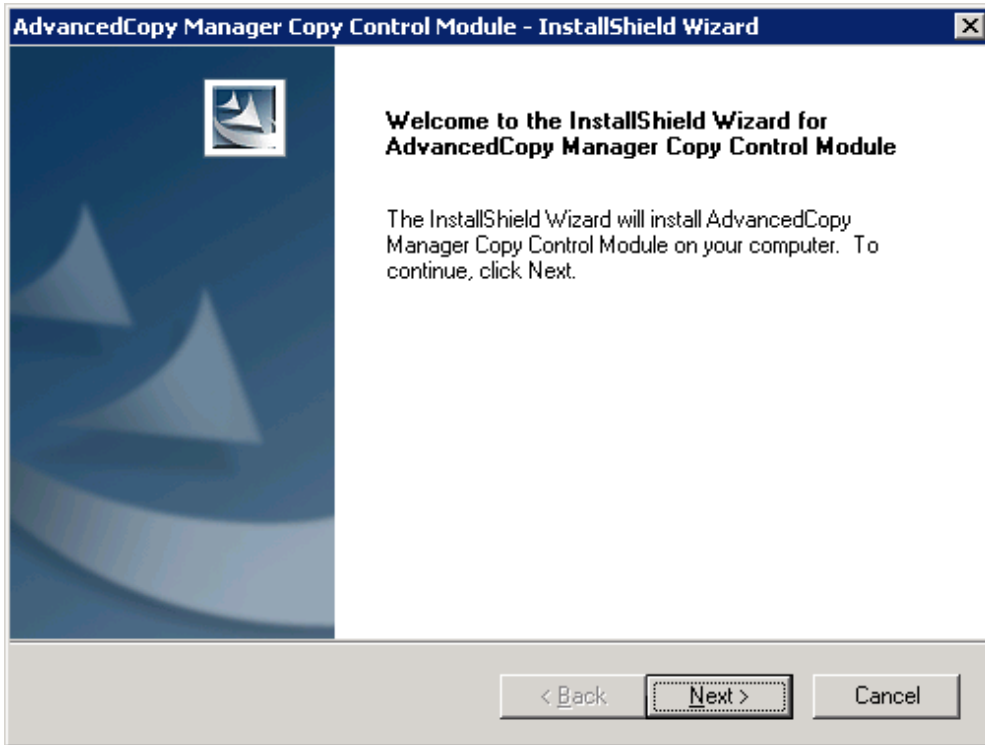
1. Log in to the system where AdvancedCopy Manager CCM is to be installed.
Log in as a user that has Administrator privileges on the terminal where AdvancedCopy Manager CCM is to be installed.
2. Insert the AdvancedCopy Manager CCM CD into the CD drive.
3. Execute the installation program (setup.exe) from the appropriate directory for the operating system being used.

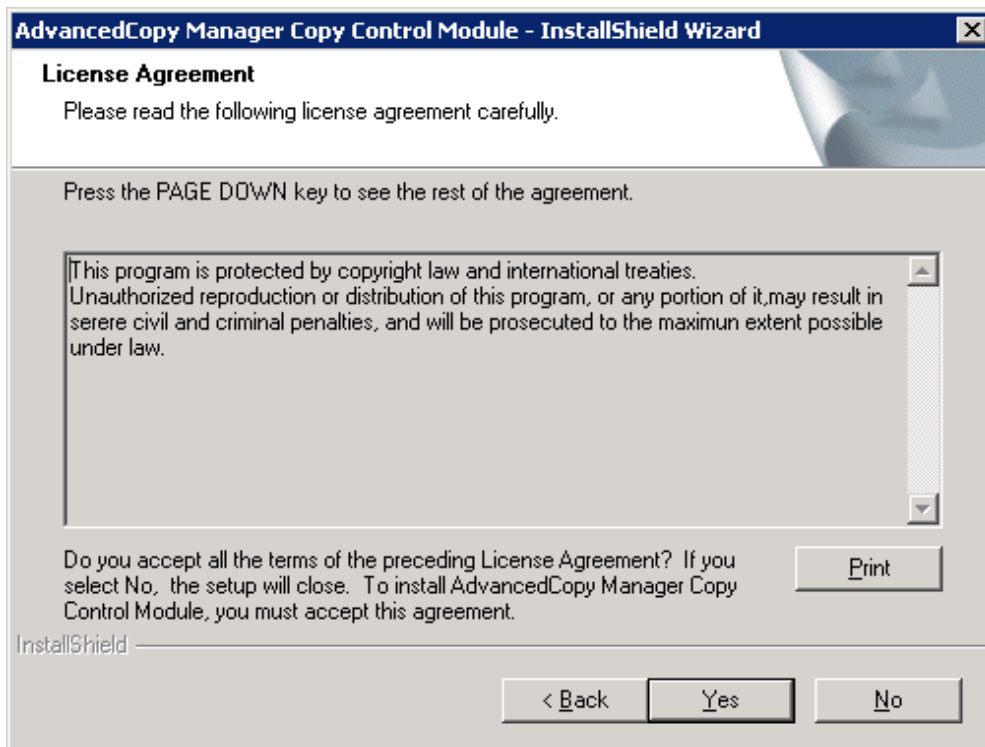

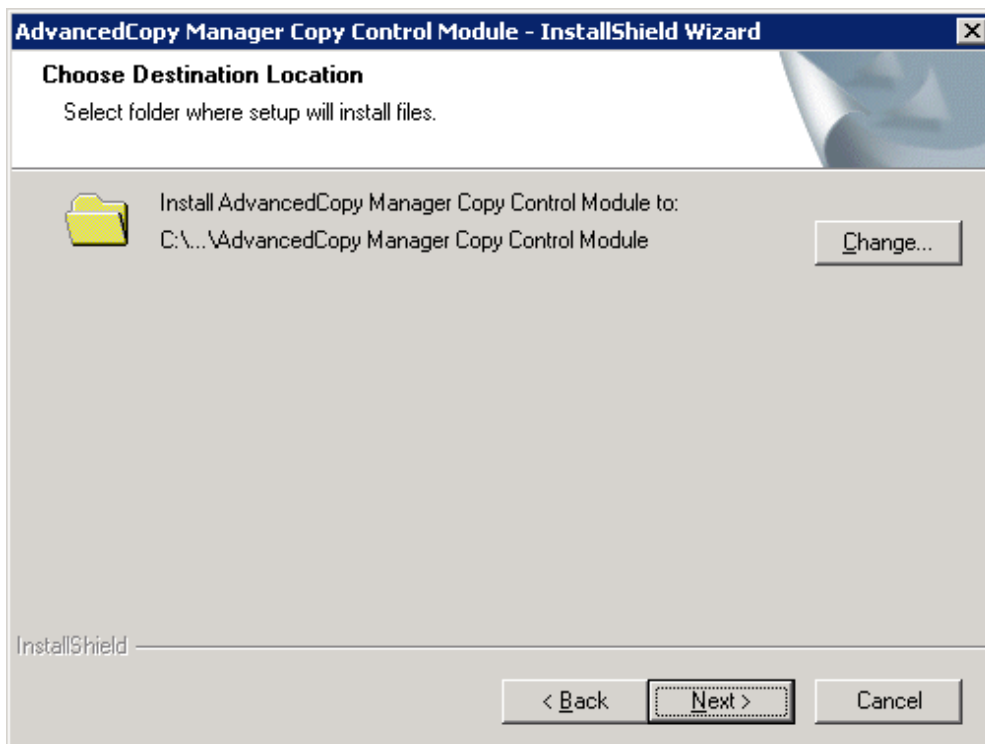

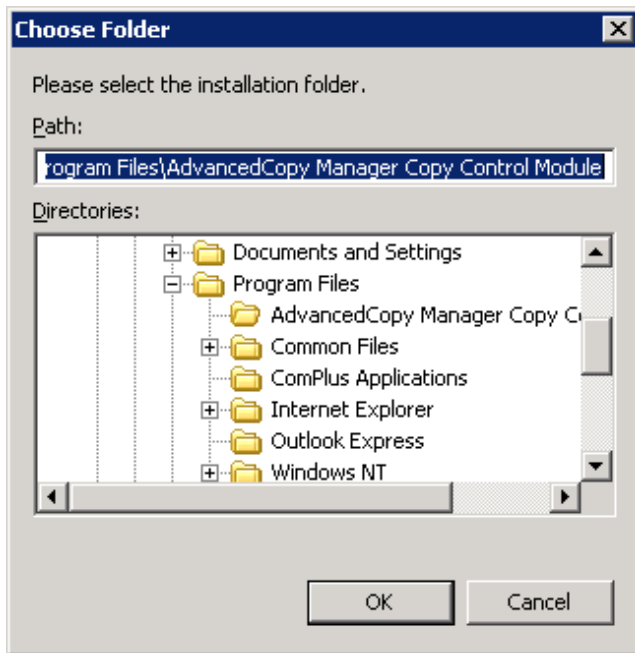
6. Specify the installation directory for AdvancedCopy Manager CCM in the [Choose Destination Location] window.

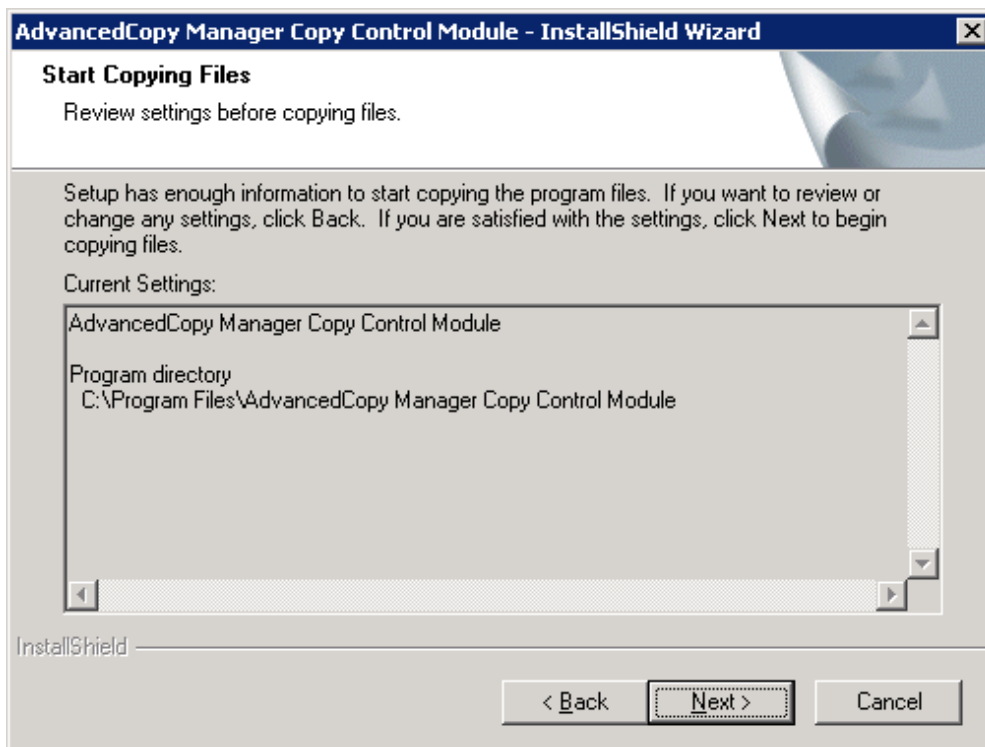

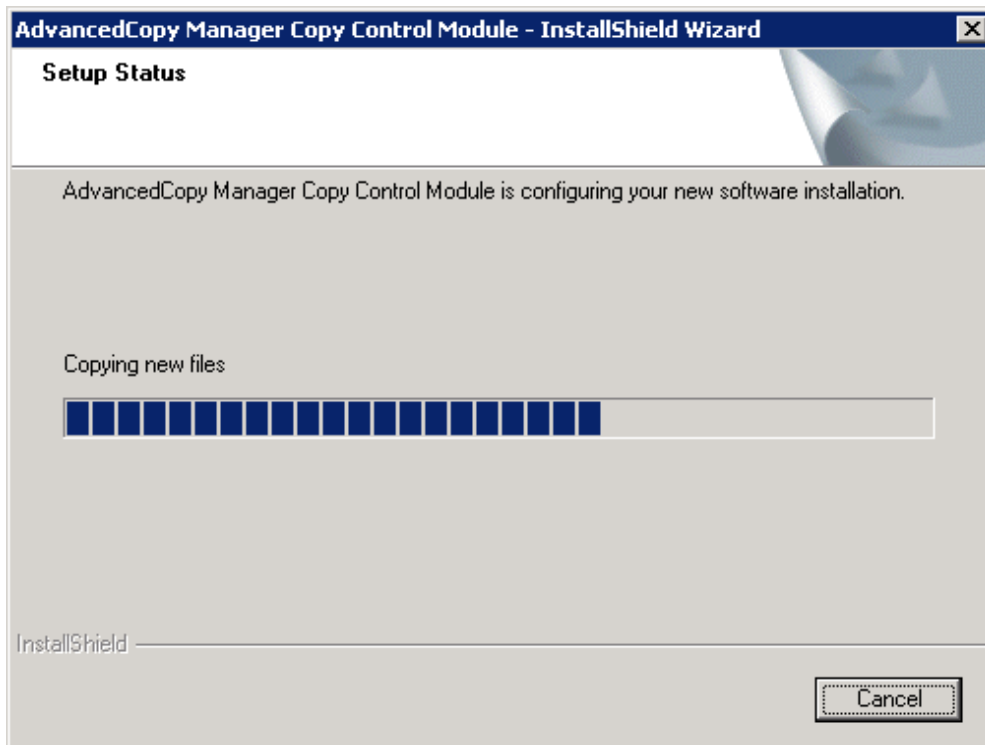

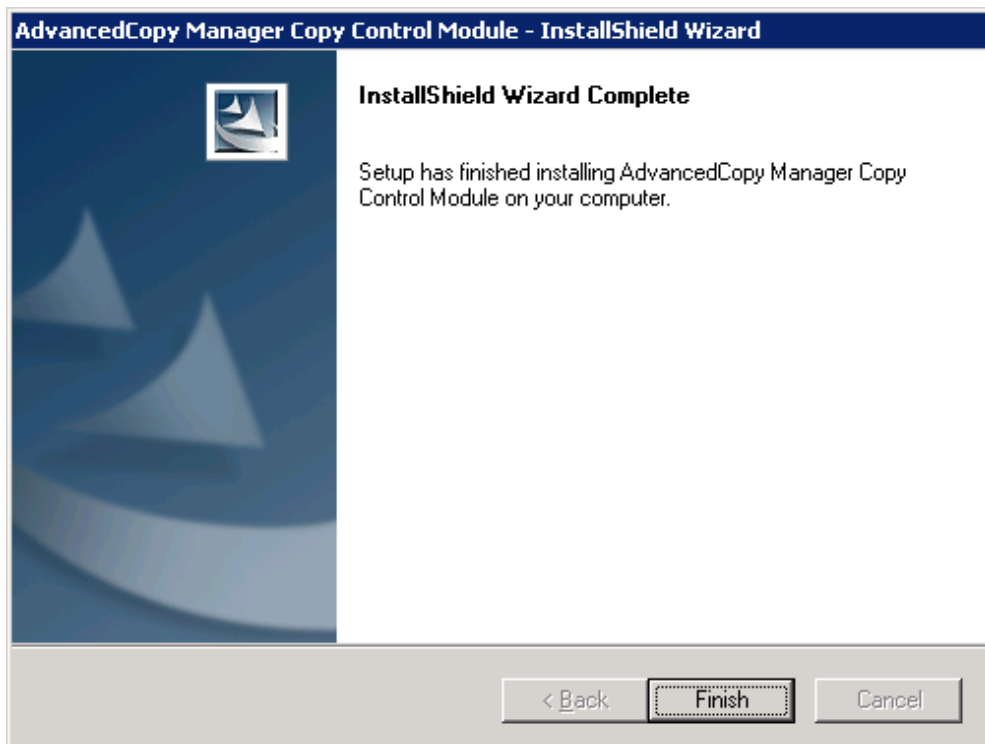

Double-click on the [Add or Remove Programs] icon in the Control Panel. On the "Add or Remove Programs" window, check whether [ETERNUS SF License Manager] is displayed or not.

- For Windows Server 2008 or Windows Server 2008 R2

Double-click on the [Programs and Features] icon in the Control Panel. On the "Programs and Features" window, check whether [ETERNUS SF License Manager] is displayed or not.

If the [ETERNUS SF License Manager] is not displayed, install the ETERNUS SF License Manager by referring the "Installation of License Manager" in the "ETERNUS SF AdvancedCopy Manager Installation and Setup Guide".

2.1.2 Installation on the Solaris environment

Use the following procedure to install AdvancedCopy Manager CCM.

1. Log in as a root user.

2. Insert the AdvancedCopy Manager CCM CD into the CD drive and mount the CD-ROM.

```

Note: The device name of the CD-ROM device differs depending on the device.

3. Start the installation.

2.2 Environment Settings

This section explains the environment settings for using AdvancedCopy Manager CCM.

Make these settings on all CCM servers.

2.2.1 Configuring User Accounts

This section explains the user accounts that are required when using AdvancedCopy Manager CCM.

2.2.1.1 Windows Server 2003

When using AdvancedCopy Manager CCM in Windows Server 2003, operate as a user with Administrator permissions or a user in the Administrators group.

2.2.1.2 Windows Server 2008 or Windows Server 2008 R2

In Windows Server 2008 and Windows Server 2008 R2, a User Account Control function (hereafter called "UAC") has been added to enhance security.

Cases where UAC is enabled and disabled are explained below.

- When UAC is enabled

When any user other than the built-in Administrator account (including accounts in the Administrator group) executes a process or program that requires administrator permissions, the "Permissions granted/authorized dialog" is displayed. Permissions granted or authorized must be confirmed.

- When UAC is disabled

Processes or programs that require administrator permissions must be executed by either the built-in Administrator account or a user account in the Administrators group.

The operating conditions are shown below.

Table 2.1 Relationship between account and UAC

	UAC: Enabled	UAC: Disabled
Built-in Administrator account	A	A
User account in the Administrator group	B	A

	UAC: Enabled	UAC: Disabled
Standard user account	B	C

A: Runs without displaying the permissions granted dialog.

B: Displays the permissions granted dialog, and runs if permissions are approved.

C: Does not run, because Administrator permissions cannot be obtained.

If you do not wish to perform the dialog process using the administrator permissions dialog, and the conditions marked as "B" in the table above apply (for example, in batch processing), the program must be executed using administrator permissions with one of the following methods:

- In the Command Prompt, use the runas command to execute the program as a user with administrator permissions or the permissions required to operate AdvancedCopy Manager. A password must be entered after this.

[Batch file (test.bat) execution example]

```
runas /noprofile /user:mymachine\acmuser "cmd.exe /k test.bat"
```

- In the Task Scheduler, specify "Execute with top level privileges" to operate the program.
- From the [Start] menu, select [All Programs]-[Accessories] and right-click on [Command Prompt]. Specify "Run as Administrator" to run the Command Prompt. Execute the program from the Command Prompt.

2.2.1.3 Solaris/Linux user accounts

Execution of AdvancedCopy Manager CCM is only possible for root users. Operate as a root user.

2.2.2 PATH environment variables settings

If using AdvancedCopy Manager CCM commands, add the AdvancedCopy Manager CCM bin directory to the PATH environment variables.

[For Windows]

1. Right-click [Start]-[My Computer] and select [Properties].
2. Select the [Advanced] tab of system properties, and click the [Environment Variables] button.
3. Add the values below to the PATH variables.

```
<AdvancedCopy Manager CCM program directory>\bin
```

Note: Use a semi-colon to separate multiple directories.

[For Solaris/Linux]

If using Bourne shell, add the value to the PATH variables as shown below.

```
# PATH=$PATH:/opt/FJSVccm/bin
# export PATH
```

Note: Use a colon to separate multiple directories.

2.2.3 Configuring the Network Environment

Configure the network environment to perform communications between the CCM Server and the ETERNUS disk storage systems.

Refer to the ETERNUS Web GUI manual and check the network environment settings.

If the network environment configuration is insufficient, set them with ETERNUS Web GUI.

Note

If setting up a firewall between the CCM server and the ETERNUS disk storage systems, in addition to the ETERNUS Web GUI network environment configuration, use the following settings in the firewall.

Table 2.2 Settings for a firewall between the CCM server and the ETERNUS disk storage systems

Communication Start Direction	From CCM server to ETERNUS disk storage systems

2.2.4 Access Path Settings

With AdvancedCopy Manager CCM, there must be a logical path between the CCM server and the ETERNUS disk storage systems so that the former can issue advanced copy instructions to the latter. This logical path is referred to as an "access path". To create an access path, the ETERNUS disk storage systems must have a logical volume for control purposes.

Allocate one logical volume within the ETERNUS disk storage systems to the CCM server for access path use.

The settings procedure for the access path is explained below.

- For specifying the access path manually when ETERNUS disk storage systems registered.
 - [For Windows]
 1. Allocate to the server the ETERNUS logical volume to be set up as the access path.
The allocated logical volume is recognized as a disk.
 2. Initialize the disk in MBR (DOS) or GPT disk format.
 3. Create a partition, and allocate a drive letter.
 - [For Solaris]
 1. Allocate to the server the ETERNUS logical volume to be set up as the access path.
The allocated logical volume is recognized as a disk.
 2. Initialize the disk as a disk with EFI label or VTOC label.
 - [For Linux]
 1. Allocate to the server the ETERNUS logical volume to be set up as the access path.
The allocated logical volume is recognized as a disk.
 2. Initialize the disk in MBR (DOS) or GPT disk format.
- For specifying the access path automatically when ETERNUS disk storage systems registered. [Excluding Linux 5 for Intel Itanium]
Allocate to the server the ETERNUS logical volume to be set up as the access path.
The allocated logical volume is recognized as a disk.

2.2.5 Registering Advanced Copy License

When executing the Advanced Copy function of ETERNUS DX60/DX80/DX80 S2/DX90/DX90 S2, it is necessary to register the Advanced Copy license to the License Manager.

Register the Advanced Copy license by referring to "About ETERNUS SF License Manager" in the "ETERNUS SF AdvancedCopy Manager Installation and Setup Guide".

2.2.6 Registering ETERNUS disk storage systems

Register ETERNUS disk storage systems with AdvancedCopy Manager CCM as the devices to be used for copies.

Use "[A.2.1 acarray add \(ETERNUS disk storage systems registration command\)](#)" to register the ETERNUS disk storage systems.

The following ETERNUS disk storage systems information is required for registration.

- ETERNUS disk storage systems name (hereafter called "ETERNUS name")
Future operations can be executed with the ETERNUS name.
In the case of REC, both copy source and copy destination ETERNUS names are required.
- ETERNUS disk storage systems IP address
- The following user name and password
 - When using ETERNUS DX80 S2/DX90 S2, ETERNUS DX410 S2/DX440 S2:
The user name with Software role for target storage device and password
 - When using other ETERNUS disk storage systems:
The user name with Administrator authorization for target storage device and password
- Access path set according to "[2.2.4 Access Path Settings](#)".
This setup can be omitted except for Linux 5 for Intel Itanium.



Point

For omitting access path setup

To set the access path automatically, execute [A.2.1 acarray add \(ETERNUS disk storage systems registration command\)](#) without -path option.

Follow these steps to find the ETERNUS disk storage system.

- [For Windows]
The order of "PhysicalDrive [disk number]" displayed in Disk Management.
The disk number is the same value as the "disk?" in the AdvancedCopy Manager block device name and the "Disk #" displayed in the [Disk Management] - [Computer Management] - [Management Tool] from the [Start] menu.
- [For Solaris]
 1. OS standard device (/dev/rdisk/*)
 2. ETERNUS multi path device (/dev/FJSVmplb/rdisk/*)
 3. VxVM(/dev/vx/rdmp/*)
- [For Linux]
 1. OS standard device (/dev/sd*)
 2. by-id format for udev (/dev/disk/by-id/*)
 3. by-path format for udev (/dev/disk/by-path/*)

Even if the access path is invalid because of changing device information, you can change the access path easily by "[A.2.5 acarray pathscan \(Access path automatic setting command\)](#) [Excluding Linux 5 for Intel Itanium]".

Finding valid access path may take a few minutes.

For Windows, Solaris, Linux 5 (for x86, for Intel64), when using when using REC for the ETERNUS disk storage systems which is not connected with SAN environment, these ETERNUS disk storage systems must be registered by the method of non-authentication with them. The following ETERNUS disk storage systems information is required for registration.

- ETERNUS disk storage systems name (hereafter called "ETERNUS name")
- ETERNUS disk storage systems BOX-ID

Point

Note for REC

Both ETERNUS disk storage systems of the copy source and the copy destination must be registered.

Perform the following procedure on the CCM server.

1. Register the one of ETERNUS disk storage systems.

From two ETERNUS disk storage systems, register the ETERNUS disk storage systems that have the access path set by "[2.2.4 Access Path Settings](#)". When both ETERNUS disk storage systems have the access path, register either one.

Specify the existing drive letter or device name in the access path.

2. Register another one of ETERNUS disk storage systems.

From two ETERNUS disk storage systems, register another one that is different from the ETERNUS disk storage system registered by step 1.

- When its ETERNUS disk storage system has the access path:

Specify the existing drive letter or device name in the access path as well as step 1.

- When its ETERNUS disk storage system does not have the access path:

- For Windows, Solaris, Linux 5 (for x86, for Intel64)

Register it by executing the "[A.2.1 acarray add \(ETERNUS disk storage systems registration command\)](#)" command with -boxid option. It cannot be registered by specifying nonexistent drive letter as an access path.

- For Linux 5 for Intel Itanium

Specify any device name as an access path. Nonexistent drive name is also allowed.

3. Create copy groups by referring the "[2.2.7 Creating copy groups](#)".

Specify the ETERNUS name of step 1 in the "-a" option.

Specify the ETERNUS name of step 2 in the "-remote" option.

Execution examples are shown below.

Register the ETERNUS disk storage systems.

To check whether the ETERNUS disk storage systems has been registered, use "[A.2.3 acarray list \(ETERNUS disk storage systems information display command\)](#)".

2.2.7 Creating copy groups

Create copy groups. A copy group is a group of copy pairs, consisting of a copy source logical volume and a copy destination logical volume.

When creating copy groups, specify which type of advanced copy and which ETERNUS disk storage systems to use.

Refer to "[A.6.1 acgroup create \(Copy group creation command\)](#)" for more information.

> acgroup create -g GRP1 -type OPC -a E4000

2.2.8 Adding copy pairs

Add copy pairs to the copy groups that have been created.

Copy pairs are strings that define copy source and destination logical volumes.

- Checking the logical volume number of the copy source

If using the AdvancedCopy Manager CCM function to check the correspondence between the OS device name and the Logical Volume Number, execute the following, depending on the server.

[For Windows, Solaris, Linux 5 (for x86, for Intel64)]

1. Install the AdvancedCopy Manager CCM.
2. Execute "[A.9.1 acutil devs \(Logical volume information display command\) \[Excluding Linux 5 for Intel Itanium\]](#)" to check the correspondence between the OS device name and the Logical Volume Number.

[For Linux 5 for Intel Itanium, HP-UX, AIX]

1. Check the operating OS.
For the operating OS, refer to "[A.9.2 acgetvolinfo \(Logical volume information display command\)](#)".
2. Execute "[A.9.2 acgetvolinfo \(Logical volume information display command\)](#)" to check the correspondence between the OS device name and the Logical Volume Number.

- Checking the logical volume number of the copy destination

Operation that is not connected to the server is recommended for the logical volume of the copy destination.

Specify the "-free" option in the "[A.3.1 acinq lv \(Logical volume information display command\)](#)" with the CCM server to check a logical volume number that is not connected to the server.



Note

When adding logical volume of remote ETERNUS disk storage systems registered to copy pair, confirm the logical volume number of the object in ETERNUS Web GUI beforehand.

2. Add the copy pair to a copy group using "[A.6.5 acpair add \(Copy pair addition command\)](#)".

The execution example of making the copy group "GRP1" state in the "[Figure 2.2 Adding copy pairs](#)" is as follows.

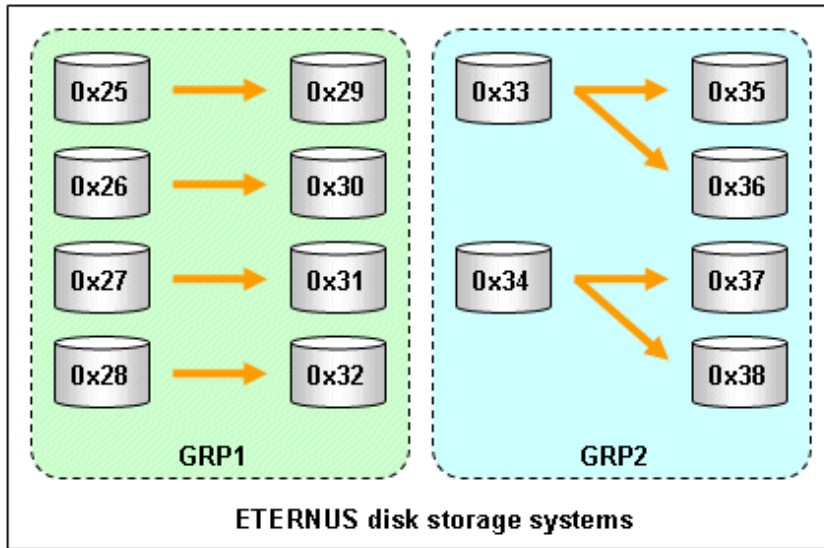

2.2.9 Setting Copy Volume Protection [Excluding Linux 5 for Intel Itanium]

Volume protection can be set for transaction volumes in order to prevent volumes being discarded accidentally via operator error.

The copy volume protection function performs tasks at ETERNUS disk storage systems to protect logical volumes from all advanced copy functions.

This function is supported in Windows, Solaris, Linux 5 (for x86, for Intel64).

Use the following commands to set and release volume protection settings:

- [A.4.1 acinhibit set \(Volume protection settings command\) \[Excluding Linux 5 for Intel Itanium\]](#)
- [A.4.2 acinhibit unset \(Volume protection settings release command\) \[Excluding Linux 5 for Intel Itanium\]](#)

In addition, the following command can be used to check the copy volume protection status:

- [A.3.1 acinq lv \(Logical volume information display command\)](#)

Note

An ETERNUS disk storage system must support the copy volume protection function in order to use it.

The following logical volumes can not be set this function.

- The logical volume in the remote ETERNUS disk storage system
- The destination logical volume with REC session

The purpose of this function is to prevent copy operation errors. It does not prevent file write or other disk access.

2.2.9.1 Copy Volume Protection Unit

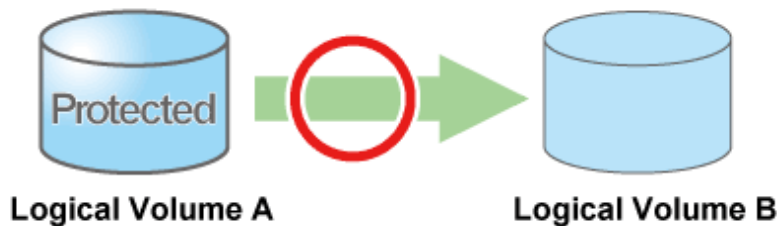
Copy volumes can be protected in logical volume units. They cannot be protected in partition or slice units.

The only type of logical volume that can be protected is the Open (including thin provisioning volume) type.

2.2.9.2 Advanced Copy of Protected Volumes

This section describes advanced copy operations for protected logical volumes.

- The volume-protected logical volume A can be set as the copy source (backup source).



- The volume-protected logical volume B cannot be set as the copy destination (backup destination).



If the copy destination logical volume is protected, an error is output when advanced copy is executed.

2.2.9.3 Volume Protection Function for Logical Volumes not performed

Volume protection can be set for logical volumes to prevent wrong operation even if AdvancedCopy Manager CCM does not perform copy operations for them.

Logical volumes for which volume protection has been set can be added to a copy group as a copy destination.

Note that an error does not occur if a copy pair is added to a copy group.

Chapter 3 Operation

This chapter explains the procedures required to operate AdvancedCopy Manager CCM.

Point

- AdvancedCopy Manager CCM performs backups and restorations regardless of the state of the server to be backed up. Make sure that the server to be backed up has stopped before executing backups and restorations.
- If using commands, perform "2.2.2 PATH environment variables settings".

3.1 Executing Advanced Copies

This section explains the procedures for executing advanced copies using AdvancedCopy Manager CCM.

Refer to "Advanced Copies" in the "ETERNUS SF AdvancedCopy Manager Operator's Guide" for more information about each type of copy.

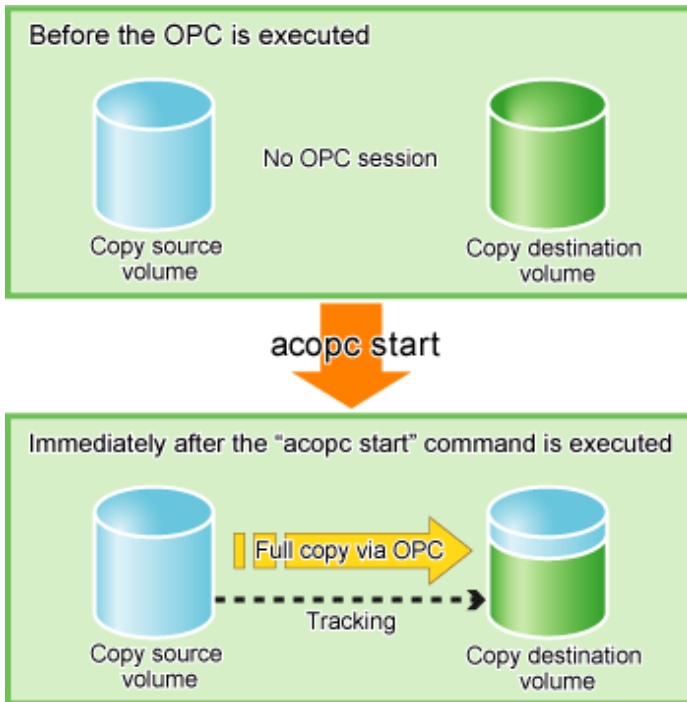

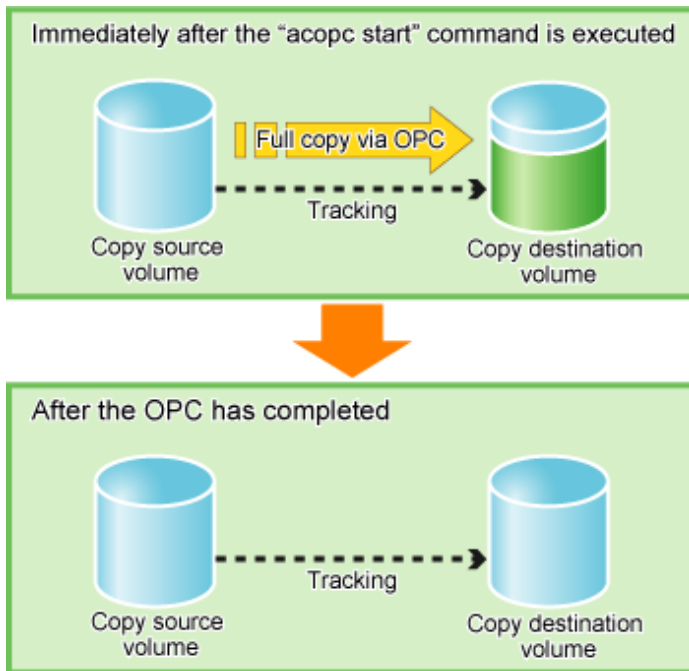

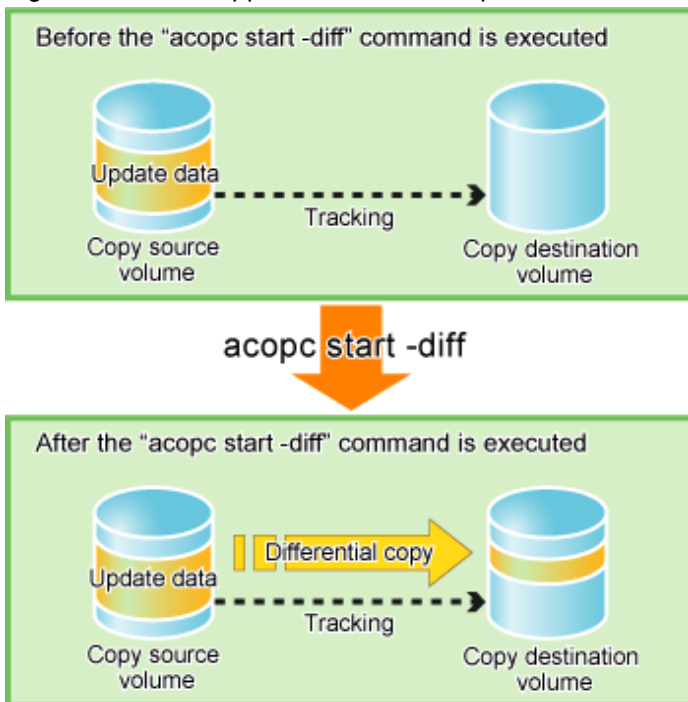

3.1.2.5 REC operating modes

This section explains the REC operating modes.

There are three types of operating modes for copies that use the REC function, as listed below. One of the following operating modes can be specified to match the operation.

- Transfer mode
- Recovery mode
- Split mode

Transfer mode

This mode relates to the method that the REC uses to transfer data.

Table 3.1 Types of transfer modes

Transfer method	Transfer mode	Explanation
Synchronous transfer method	Synchronous	<p>In this mode, responses to write requests from the server do not return as "complete" until data has been written to the copy source volume and copied to the destination volume.</p> <p>Synchronizing data copies with writes to the copy source guarantees the integrity of the data on both the copy source volume and the copy destination volume when the copy completes.</p> <p>This mode is suitable to RECs within sites with short delay times, because it has a large impact on the performance of write accesses from the server.</p>
Asynchronous transfer methods	Stack	<p>This mode has only a small impact on the time taken to respond to the server because it only records the position of the block that has been updated before returning "complete" to the server. The data for this block is transferred using an independent transfer engine.</p> <p>Copies can be executed even when there is only limited bandwidth, but in this case the amount of data that has not been transferred may build up.</p>
	Consistency	<p>This mode guarantees the sequence of transfers between copy sessions for the copy destination ETERNUS disk storage systems, and is suitable for operations, such as on databases, that perform mirroring using copies that consist of multiple areas.</p> <p>This mode uses part of cache memory for transfer buffers. Data is transferred to the copy destination by first "storing" a block of data to be copied in a transmission transfer buffer and then using a reception transfer buffer to "expand" the data that has been transferred.</p>
	Through	<p>This mode is for transferring data that has not been transferred when copies in stack mode or consistency mode are stopped or suspended.</p>

Recovery mode

Recovery mode is an operating mode for performing recovery following REC communication errors. The following operating modes can be selected.

Table 3.2 Types of recovery mode

Recovery mode	Explanation
Automatic Recovery	In this mode, REC sessions recover automatically when the line that was disconnected due to a communications error is connected again.
Manual Recovery	In this mode, REC sessions must be recovered manually even if the line that was disconnected due to a communications error is connected again.

Split mode

Split mode is an operating mode used when the line path is disconnected due to a line error or disaster, in situations where an REC in synchronous mode is in an equivalency maintenance state. The following operating modes can be selected.

Table 3.3 Types of split mode

Split mode	Explanation
Automatic Split	In this mode, if a communication error occurs for some reason while the REC is executing, the REC session will be automatically disconnected and update processing to the copy source will continue.
Manual Split	<p>In this mode, if a communication error occurs for some reason while the REC is executing, the operator will be asked to choose whether to disconnect the REC session.</p> <p>This results in reduced availability, but it also minimizes data losses when disasters occur, because there is no discrepancy between the data on the copy source and the data on the copy destination.</p>

3.1.2.6 Backup via REC using initial copy skip [Excluding Linux 5 for Intel Itanium]

The initial copy skip function is used when an initial copy cannot be executed by reason of network bandwidth shortage.

Change the REC synchronous processing to the suspend status by executing the "[A.8.1 acec start \(Synchronous high-speed copy start command\)](#)" with -skip option. In this case, the data of copy source volume is not copied to copy destination volume.

3.1.2.8 Using Concurrent suspension function on EC/REC [Excluding Linux 5 for Intel Itanium]

The concurrent suspension function simultaneously suspends multiple EC/REC sessions for ETERNUS disk storage systems. By using this function, a copy with consistency can be easily taken.

To use the concurrent suspension function, execute the "[A.8.3 acec suspend \(Synchronous high-speed copy temporary suspension command\)](#)" with -concur option. For the operating methods, refer to "[3.1.2.1 Backup via EC](#)" or "[3.1.2.3 Backup via REC](#)".

Note

- The concurrent suspension function of REC can be used, when the transfer mode is not Stack mode and an ETERNUS disk storage system that set the access path is copy-source box.
- If the REC transfer mode is Consistency mode and the REC disk buffer is used, check that no transferred data exists in the REC disk buffer before executing the concurrent suspend.
You can check the data size by executing "[A.5.2 acrecbuf stat \(REC transfer buffer status display command\) \[Excluding Linux 5 for Intel Itanium\]](#)" with -disk option in "DiskRate".

Changing timeout value for concurrent suspension function

When there is many data or the network is not good condition, a timeout error will occur. When a timeout occurs, the following message is output.

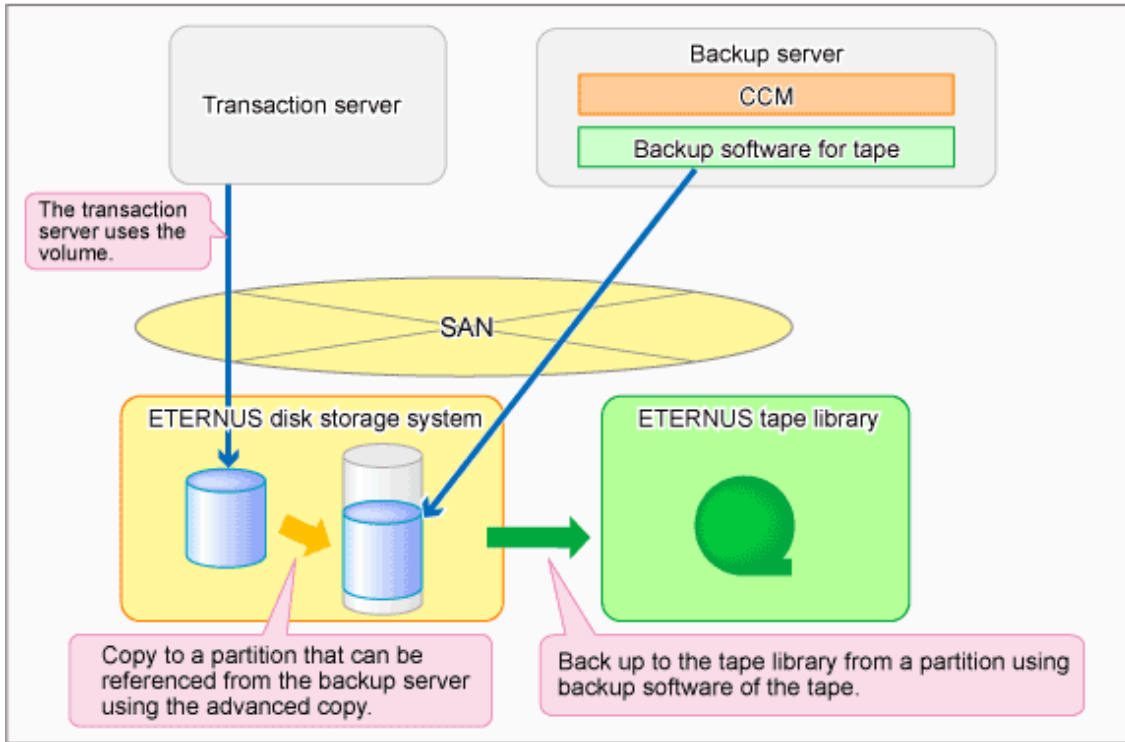

3.2 Backing Up to Tape

Back up the volume data to the tape device connected to the CCM server.

AdvancedCopy Manager CCM copies backup data to a volume partition referenced from the tape server. Then, copied data to the partition will be backed up to the tape library by using tape backup software.

Figure 3.4 Overview of backup to tape library



3.2.1 LU to Partition

If you want to copy the contents of a disk volume, specify the extent start position in the copy source volume, the extent size, and the extent start position in the copy destination volume. AdvancedCopy Manager CCM can backup the contents of a volume to a partition by using these specifications. Under AdvancedCopy Manager CCM, this is called the LU to Partition function.

Figure 3.5 Copying a volume to a partition



Note

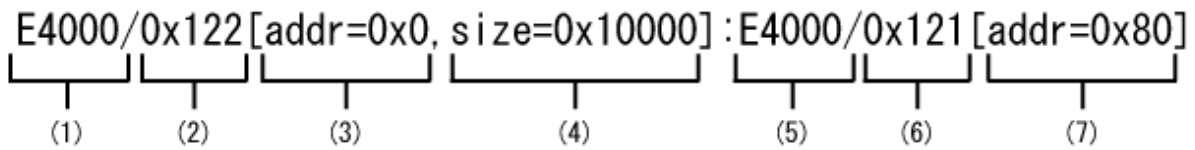
This function is used for saving data to secondary media, such as backing up to tape. Do not use this function for copying from one disk to another disk.

Adding copy pairs

To use the LU to Partition function, specify the extent start position and add a copy pair.

Copy pairs are strings that define the copy source and copy destination logical volumes.

Figure 3.6 Copy pair format



- (1) Copy source ETERNUS name
- (2) Copy source logical volume number
- (3) Extent start position at the copy source volume (block units)
- (4) Extent size at the copy source volume (number of blocks)
- (5) Copy destination ETERNUS name
- (6) Copy destination logical volume number
- (7) Extent start position at the copy destination volume (block units)

A character string starting with "0x" expresses a hexadecimal value.

Follow the procedure below to add a copy pair.

1. Calculating the extent size at the copy source

Calculate the extent size at the copy source that is to be added to the copy pair.

1. Execute "[A.3.1 acinq lv \(Logical volume information display command\)](#)" on the backup server to check the copy source logical volume number (LV No) and the logical volume size (LV Size).

Create partitions at the copy destination volume.

The partition size must be larger than the copy source logical volume size. As a guideline, create a partition with a size that is 128MB larger than the copy source logical volume.

Note

Megabyte unit

In this document, the megabyte unit is defined as being 1024x1024 bytes.

However, when creating partitions, note that Linux calculates the megabyte unit as being 1000x1000 bytes.

Point

Creating partitions

- For Windows
Create partitions with a drive letter.
- For Solaris
Create partitions without a VTOC label.

3. Checking the information on the copy destination logical volume

Execute the "[A.9.2 acgetvolinfo \(Logical volume information display command\)](#)" on the backup server to check the copy destination logical volume (LV No), the extent start position (Address), and the extent size (Size) to be added.

Point

Check that the extent size of a partition at the copy destination is larger than the extent size of the copy source volume.

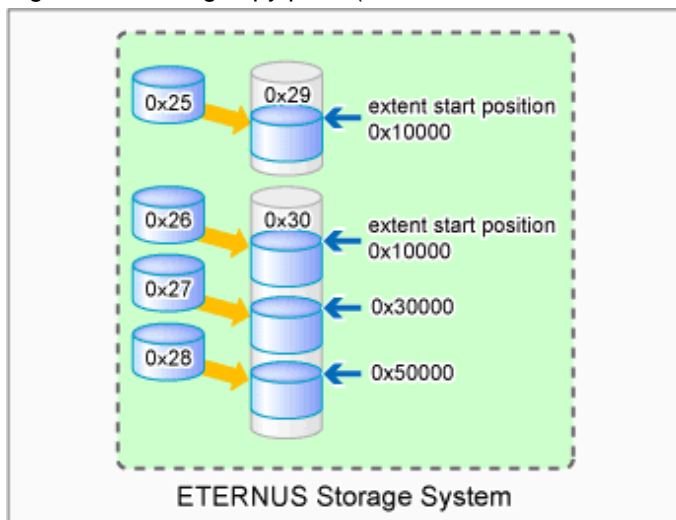

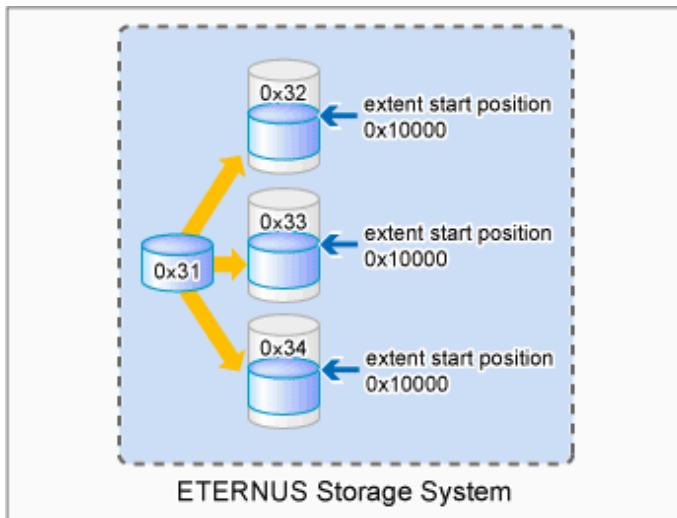

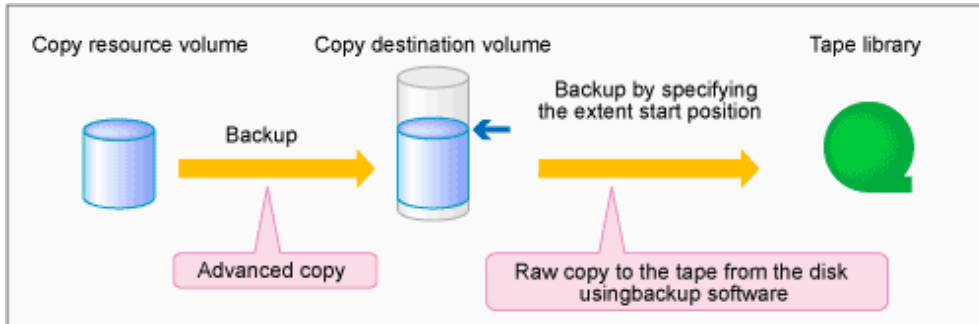

To back up a volume to the tape library using AdvancedCopy Manager CCM, use the LU to Partition function. Copy the contents of the copy source volume to a partition that can be referenced from the tape server. Then use the backup software to back up to the tape library.

Figure 3.9 Overview of tape backup

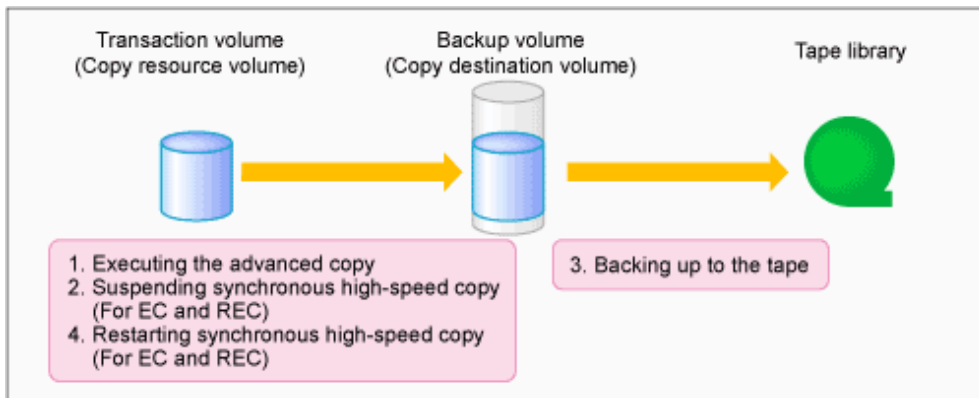


To manage the backup data on the tape library, the backup software with a function capable of performing RAW copy is required. Prepare ETERNUS SF TSM (the software that operates the ETERNUS tape library) or similar. Refer to the manuals of the backup software and tape device that you are using for details on how to back up to tape.

3.2.2.2 Backup procedure

The flow to back up the transaction volume is shown below.

Follow the procedure below to back up transaction volume data to tape.

1. Executing advanced copy

Back up the contents of the transaction volume to the backup volume partition by executing the advanced copy. Refer to the copy types in "3.1 Executing Advanced Copies" for the execution procedure.

2. Temporarily suspending synchronous high-speed copy (EC and REC only)

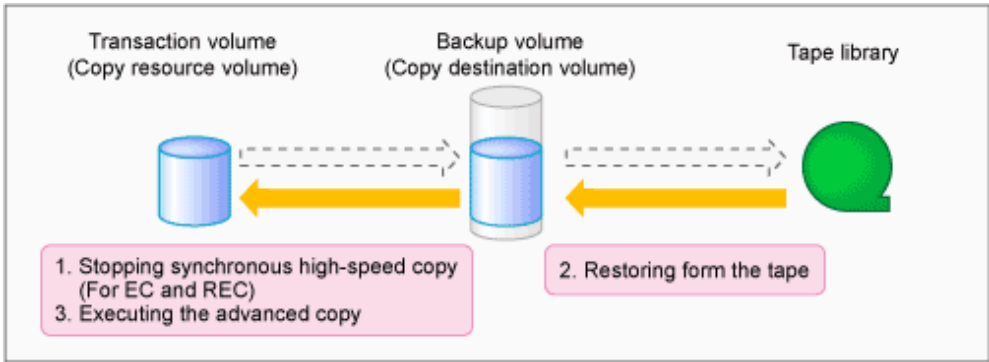

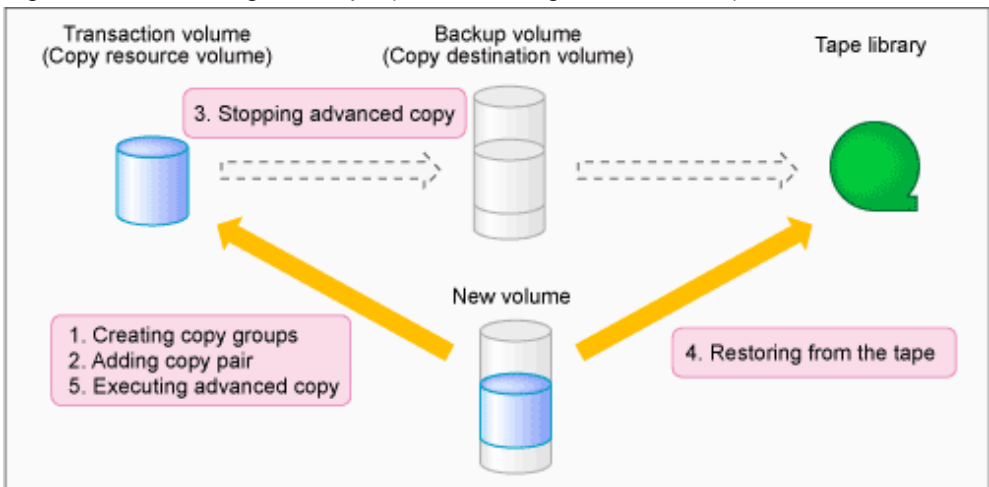

3.2.3.2 Restoring using a new volume

To perform advanced copy for a transaction volume and a new volume partition, create a new copy group. Specify OPC as the copy type.

- BOX ID

Changing ETERNUS names or access paths

Change ETERNUS names or access paths by referring to "[A.2.2 acarray change \(ETERNUS names and access paths for ETERNUS disk storage systems change command\)](#)".

Using the access path automatic setting function to change access paths

Refer to "[A.2.5 acarray pathscan \(Access path automatic setting command\) \[Excluding Linux 5 for Intel Itanium\]](#)" and change the access path.

Changing information other than ETERNUS names or access paths

Use the following procedure to change information other than ETERNUS names or access paths.

1. Delete the registration information

Delete the registration information for the ETERNUS disk storage systems.

Refer to "[3.4.3 Deleting registration information for ETERNUS disk storage systems](#)" for more information.

2. Reregister the ETERNUS disk storage systems

Register the ETERNUS disk storage systems (whose registration information was deleted) again using the new information.

Chapter 4 Uninstallation

This chapter explains how to uninstall AdvancedCopy Manager CCM.

4.1 Uninstall from the Windows Environment

Use the following procedure to uninstall AdvancedCopy Manager CCM.

1. Log in the system where AdvancedCopy Manager CCM is to be uninstalled.

Log in as a user that has Administrator privileges on the terminal where AdvancedCopy Manager CCM is to be uninstalled.

2. Stop all advanced copies

Use one of the following commands (depending on the type of advanced copy) to stop all of the advanced copies that are executing.

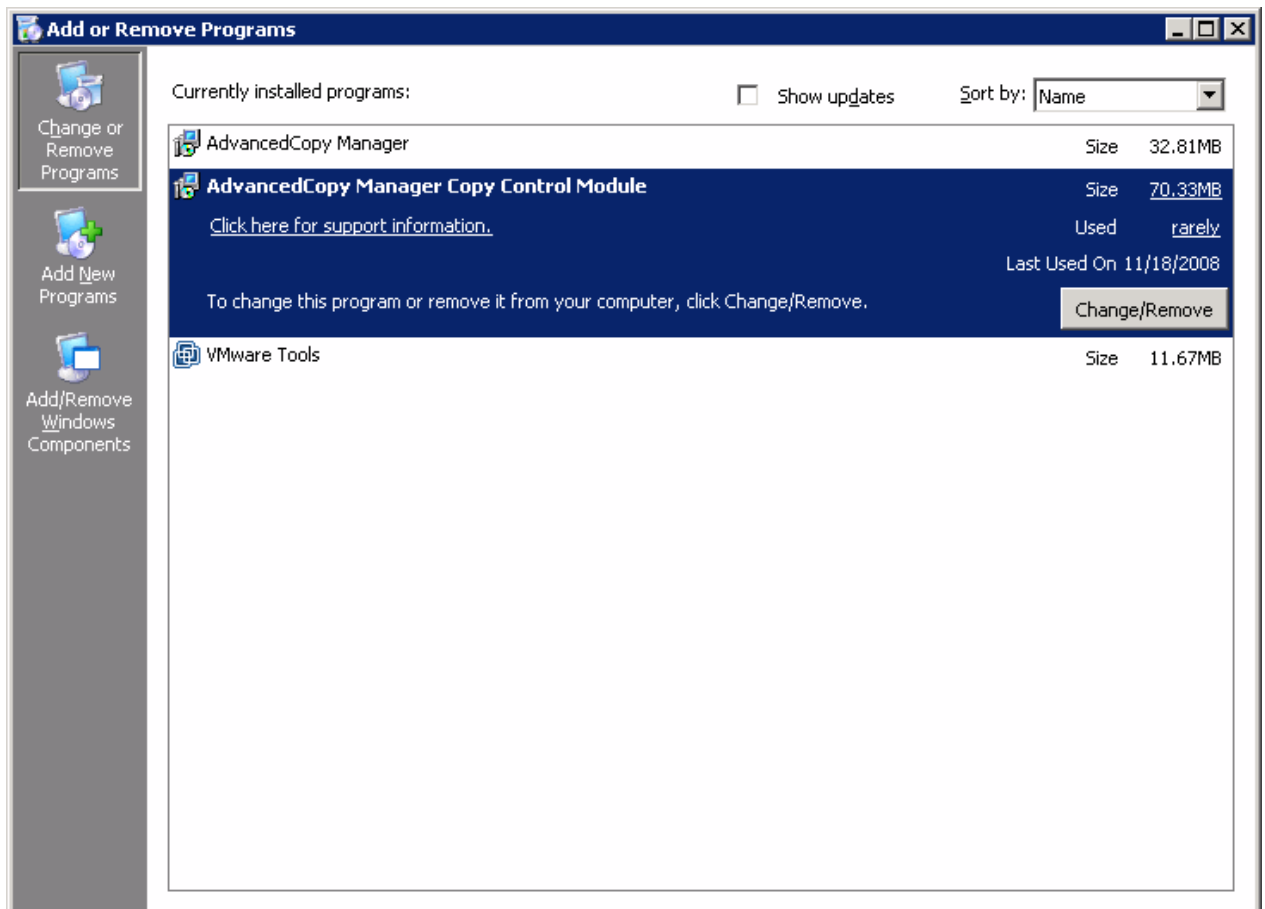

Chapter 5 Upgrades

This chapter describes how to upgrade from ETERNUS SF AdvancedCopy Manager Copy Control Module 13.4 or later editions.

Follow the procedures below to perform the upgrade. The command examples is for Windows operating system.

1. Backup environment settings files.

Backup the environment settings file as described in the manual for the version currently being used.

- Backing up the environment settings file

2. Backing up the license management database of License Manager

Backup the license management database of ETERNUS SF License Manager by using "esflm backup" command. For details of "esflm backup" command, refer to the "ETERNUS SF Installation and Setup Guide" for the currently using version.

- Example of executing "esflm backup" command

> esflm backup Backup.dat
Backup of license database was performed successfully
```

3. Uninstall the software.

Uninstall the software as described in the manual for the version currently being used.

4. Install the new version of the software.

For details, refer to "[2.1.1 Installation on the Windows environment](#)", "[2.1.2 Installation on the Solaris environment](#)" or "[2.1.3 Installation on the Linux environment](#)".

5. Restoring the license management database of License Manager

Restore the license management database that has been backed up. For the restoration procedures, refer to "esflm restore (License management database restore command)" in the "ETERNUS SF AdvancedCopy Manager Installation and Setup Guide".

- Example of executing "esflm restore" command

6. Restore the environment settings files.

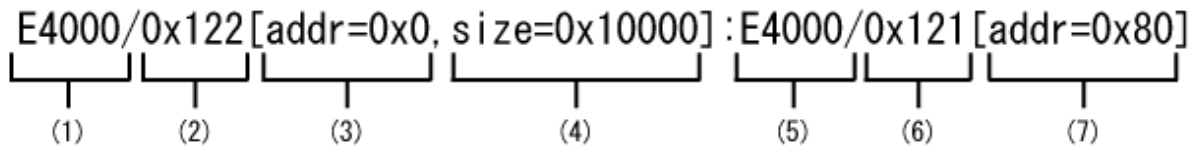

Description

There is no session for the specified copy pair.

Interrupts the processing.

invalid logical volume name.

Description

Either the access path specified at ETERNUS disk storage systems registration time or the device name specified using a command is invalid.

Check that the specified device name is correct.

Or, The access path may have been disabled.

STXC1005 ERROR Another copy has already started.

Description

For the specified logical volume, a copy operation of another type is already running.

System administrator response

Review the specification for the logical volume name.

STXC1006 ERROR Target volume is already defined in another copy operation.

Description

The specified copy destination logical volume has already been defined as the copy destination for another copy session.

System administrator response

Review the specification for the copy destination logical volume name.

STXC1007 ERROR Logical volume is already reserved.

Description

The logical volume has already been reserved by another user.

System administrator response

Wait for a few seconds and try again.

STXC1009 ERROR Logical volume is busy.

Description

The logical volume is being used by another user.

System administrator response

Wait for a few seconds and try again.

STXC1010 ERROR Specified option is invalid.

Description

The specified option is invalid.

System administrator response

Correct the processing option setting and try again.

STXC1011 ERROR Invalid parameter. Parameter=(PARAM).

Description

The parameter is incorrect.

Parameters

PARAM: Parameter

System administrator response

The parameter value is incorrect. Correct the parameter and try again.

STXC1013 ERROR Target volume size mismatch.

Description

Copying cannot execute because the size of the copy destination logical volume is inappropriate.

System administrator response

For the copy destination, specify a logical volume that is equal in size to the copy source logical volume.

STXC1014 ERROR Target volume overlap source volume.

Description

Copy destination logical volume and copy source logical volume area are overlapped.

System administrator response

Change the copy destination or copy source logical volume setting.

STXC1016 ERROR The group file of the form not permitted was specified.

Description

Operation cannot be performed because the specified format of the group file is not permitted.

System administrator response

One of the cases indicated below can be assumed. Re-specify the group file, and try again.

- A group file which describes copy pairs may have been specified in a logical volume operation.
- A group file which describes logical volumes may have been specified in a copy pair operation.

The current status cannot execute the specified operation.

- Start of SnapOPC+ was executed for the Snap Data Volume being initialized.
- Suspend was executed for the session in Suspend status.
- Copy stop, copy resume, or copy direction reversal was executed for the session that is not in Suspend status.
- Session start/resume was executed for a copy destination logical volume for which the copy destination volume protection function is set.

STXC1106 ERROR Insufficient memory.

Description

Memory shortage occurred.

System administrator response

Execute the following and try again.

- Shut down unnecessary programs.

STXC1107 ERROR Alias is not defined.

Description

The ETERNUS disk storage system alias that is specified as the copy source or copy destination has not been defined.

System administrator response

Check that the ETERNUS disk storage system alias has been registered. If the alias is not registered, register the routing information and try again.

STXC1108 ERROR The specification of physical information is incorrect.

Description

The specified physical information is incorrect.

System administrator response

One of the cases indicated below can be assumed. Correct the physical information description.

- A start location or copy size that exceeds 2TB was specified for a copy operation to an ETERNUS disk storage system which does not support copy operations over 2TB.
- Other than "0" is specified for the start location, but "0" is specified for the copy size.
- A size that is larger than actual capacity is specified for the copy size.

STXC1109 ERROR ETERNUS cannot be recognized.

Description

The ETERNUS disk storage system specified by alias name cannot be recognized.

System administrator response

One of the cases indicated below can be assumed. Correct the physical information description.

- Disk information was reconfigured after the routing information was set.

An unsupported function was called.

STXC1203 ERROR The operation is not permitted.

Description

User does not possess required root privilege to perform copy operation.

System administrator response

Perform copy operations with root privilege.

STXC1204 ERROR SCSI error detected. Error=(*ERROR*).

Description

An error was detected through the SCSI command.

Parameters

ERROR: Error information

System administrator response

Check the connection status of the device and try again. If this error persists, contact Fujitsu technical staff (CE).

STXC1208 ERROR Specified logical volume is not ETERNUS.

Description

The specified logical volume is not an ETERNUS disk storage system.

System administrator response

Specify an ETERNUS disk storage system logical volume and try again.

STXC1209 ERROR Insufficient resource in ETERNUS.

Description

Not executable due to ETERNUS disk storage system resource shortage.

System administrator response

Take any of the following measures:

- Check/set the Advanced Copy option license.
 - Check/set the device resources for such errors as "Table size not set" and "Table size not enough".

STXC1212 ERROR Disk drive off by the ECO mode.

Description

The disk drive is stopped due to the Eco-mode.

System administrator response

Try again when the disk drive is activated.

STXC1213 ERROR Invalid file system.

Description

The file system is invalid.

System administrator response

The file system is unsupported. Check the file configuration and try again.

STXC1214 ERROR Preconditions for copy operation are not satisfied.

Description

The preconditions for the copy operation are not satisfied.

System administrator response

Check for the following causes, and check the copy status.

- Tried to start SnapOPC+ session for a copy pair for which a SnapOPC+ session already exists.
- Tried to restore SnapOPC+ session that does not exist for the copy pair.
- Tried to suspend EC session for a copy pair for which no EC exists.
- Tried to suspend EC session without waiting.
- A group configuration that cannot be simultaneously operated is specified.

- Retried to suspend a copy session without resolving the error.

STXC1220 ERROR Change mode operation failed because of communication error. Cause=(DETAIL).

Description

Communication or ETERNUS disk storage system error occurs and changing session mode failed.

The GDS environment is incorrect.

System administrator response

Correct the GDS environment settings.

STXC1250 ERROR Specified LUN_V Number is invalid.**Description**

The specified LUN_V number is incorrect.

System administrator response

One of the cases indicated below can be assumed. Check the parameter settings and the status of the ETERNUS disk storage system, and try again.

- A LUN_V number that does not exist or cannot be accessed is specified.
 - Tried to start copy between an encrypted volume and non-encrypted volume.
 - Specify the volume which contains bad sector.

STXC1252 ERROR Operation is not supported.**Description**

Operation cannot be performed as operation is not supported.

System administrator response

One of the cases indicated below can be assumed. Correct the parameter settings, and try again.

- Tried to execute a copy operation of a size that exceeds 2TB. (For Linux)

STXC1300 ERROR Time out detected.**Description**

Timeout was detected while Suspend was being executed.

System administrator response

Try executing the command again.

Or, correct any mistakes with the timeout monitoring frequency and interval specified in the parameters.

STXC1301 WARNING The operation was accepted.**Description**

The copy operation was accepted, but the process is not completed.

System administrator response

Check the copy status to confirm whether the copy operation is completed.

If this message appears when the copy operation is suspended, correct any mistakes with the timeout monitoring frequency and interval specified in the parameters.

STXC1400 ERROR File open error. File name=(FILE). Cause=(CAUSE).**Description**

Failed to open the file.

Parameters

FILE: File name

CAUSE: Cause code

System administrator response

Check file status by referring to the cause code and the file name sent by the message.

STXC1401 ERROR The file name of ACCC can not be acquired. Cause=(CAUSE).

Description

Files required for operation of ACCC cannot be obtained.

The ACCC operating environment may be corrupted. Check that the following files exist in the sub directory (etc) of the install directory.

Description

STXC1405 ERROR The combination of ACCC parameters is incorrect.

Description

The parameter combination defined in the ACCC predefinition file is incorrect.

Correct the ACCC predefinition file and try again.

STXC1406 ERROR Waiting time cannot be set.

Description

The monitoring time for suspendable status cannot be set.

System administrator response

The following may have occurred. Check and correct parameters or the predefinition file.

- Accumulated monitoring interval and monitoring count values exceed their respective permissible values.
 - The monitoring count is specified but the monitoring interval is not set (or set to 0).

STXC1407 ERROR ACCC parameter is not defined. Parameter=(PARAM).

Description

Parameters necessary for ACCC operation are not set in the ACCC predefinition file.

Parameters

PARAM: Parameter name

System administrator response

Set the parameters displayed in the message in the ACCC predefinition file.

STXC1409 ERROR ACCC (PARAM) parameter is already defined.

Description

Defined parameter has been defined twice in the ACCC predefinition file.

Parameters

PARAM: Parameter name

System administrator response

Correct the ACCC predefinition file and try again.

STXC1410 ERROR Alias number reached the maximum.

Description

The ETERNUS disk storage system alias reached the maximum number that can be managed by ACCC and routing information cannot be set.

System administrator response

Check alias definition status and if there are unnecessary alias names, delete them.

STXC1411 ERROR Alias is already defined.

Description

The ETERNUS disk storage system alias has already been registered.

System administrator response

Specify another alias and try again.

STXC1412 ERROR Alias identifier does not exist.

Description

An ETERNUS disk storage system alias with the specified ID does not exist.

System administrator response

Check the alias definition status and ID, and try again.

STXC1500 ERROR Error occurred recognition of ETERNUS management file. Cause=(CAUSE).

Description

The ETERNUS disk storage system management file cannot be obtained.

Parameters

CAUSE: Cause code

System administrator response

The following may be causes. Take an action based on the *CAUSE* (cause code).

- When the *CAUSE* is -1 or -2:
MICC is not installed or registry is rewritten.
 - When the *CAUSE* is -3:
The file used for setting ETERNUS disk storage system registration information is corrupted or deleted.

Appendix C Troubleshooting

C.1 How to Collect Data

Log into the CCM server, and execute `acmcapture` (troubleshooting data collection command) to collect data for investigating the problem - for details, refer to "[A.10.1 acmcapture \(troubleshooting data collection command\)](#)".

Send the collected data to a Fujitsu SE.

C.2 Resolving Hardware Error

If, as a result of a hardware error, the advanced copy cannot continue, the ETERNUS disk storage systems will automatically suspend it. If a problem occurs, check the copy status and error code, and take action.

- Procedure for checking copy status

Use either [A.7.2 acopc query \(OPC/QuickOPC copy status display command\)](#) or [A.8.2 acec query \(Synchronous high-speed copy status display command\)](#).

If the copy is suspended, then its status will be changed to one of the following:

- OPC Error Suspend
 - EC Error Suspend
 - EC Hardware Suspend
 - EC Hardware Suspend (Use REC DISK) [Excluding Linux 5 for Intel Itanium]
 - Snap Error Suspend [Excluding Linux 5 for Intel Itanium]
- Procedure for checking error code

Use ETERNUS Web GUI to check error codes:

1. In the ETERNUS Web GUI [Status display] menu, click [Advanced copy status display].
2. In "Session status", click the "Number of active sessions" link for the relevant copy type.
3. Refer to the value of the "Error Code" column for the relevant copy process.

Appendix D Notes on Operations

This appendix explains the notes for AdvancedCopy Manager CCM operation.

Calculate the physical capacity for the Snap Data Volume [Excluding Linux 5 for Intel Itanium]

It is necessary to create the Snap Data Volume for the SnapOPC+ operation.

The formula for estimating the physical capacity of Snap Data Volume is as follows:

$$\text{Physical capacity} = (\text{number of updated blocks for the copy source volume}) \times (\text{safety factor})$$

Strictly speaking, both the number of blocks that have been updated on the Snap Data Volume and the management area used by the hardware (about 0.1% of the logical capacity) should also be taken into account before the SnapOPC/SnapOPC+ is taken, however this can be covered by increasing the safety factor.

The number of blocks that have been updated on the copy source volume can be estimated by using updated estimation function. The estimation can be performed by the following procedure:

1. Start the estimation of the update amount by configuring a pseudo session on the copy source volume.

2. Start transactions. Blocks that are updated by transactions will be recorded on the hardware.
3. After the estimation period has elapsed, check the number of blocks that have been updated.
