Chapter 1 Overview of Express

This chapter is an overview of Express.

1.1 Function Overview

Express makes storage management less difficult thanks to the following functions:

- Easy configuration and expansion

ETERNUS Disk storage system can be easily configured with the configuration wizard.

Even without prior experience of ETERNUS Disk storage system configuration and setup, volume creation in ETERNUS Disk storage system can be done with a wizard. ETERNUS Disk storage system and volumes can also be added later with only a few clicks in the wizard

- Easy operation

What to do, how to do it: operation target and method can be selected directly on the screen in the Web Console. Therefore, operation procedures are no longer difficult to understand.

The Web Console allows Express operation directly from a Web browser.

- Easy troubleshooting

When a problem occurs, the user can determine the cause and scope of the problem before calling to report it. Easy to understand messages makes it possible to understand the cause of a problem without prior expert storage knowledge. Advice on how to handle the problem can be displayed by clicking on the message.

Furthermore, Express provides access to the Advanced Copy function of ETERNUS Disk storage system. The Advanced Copy function allows high speed copy of a business volume at anytime.



Refer to "Overview" in the ETERNUS SF Express Operation Guide for information on the functions provided by Express.

After installation of ETERNUS SF Manager, if ETERNUS SF Manager is set up as the Express's manager, it is possible to use Express. Refer to "Operating environment of ETERNUS SF Manager" in the *ETERNUS SF Installation and Setup Guide* for information on the version level of the supported operating systems.

In this manual, the server where ETERNUS SF Manager is installed is referred as the "Management Server", and a server managed by the Management Server is referred as "Managed Server".

1.4 Operating Environment Models


Express can manage one or more storage devices

Express can operate in various system configurations such as the ones described in this section. Since using Express in the IPv6 environment is not supported, use it in the IPv4 environment.

Basic System Configuration

In this configuration, Express Manager and Web Console are operated on the same server.

Figure 1.1 Example of Basic System Configuration



Express Manager and Web Console can be operated on different servers. In this environment, Web Console accesses Express Manager over the network (HTTPS connection).

System Configuration Using the Advanced Copy Function

In Express, the Management Server sends a command to ETERNUS Disk storage system to perform an Advanced Copy function. There are two available methods for sending the copy command:

- Sending a command to ETERNUS Disk storage system to perform an Advanced Copy function from the server over the SAN (hereafter referred to as "Copy command via SAN")
- Sending a command to ETERNUS Disk storage system to perform an Advanced Copy function from the server over the LAN (hereafter referred to as "Copy command via LAN")



When using the Copy command via SAN method, a logical volume that can be accessed from the Management Server is needed in ETERNUS Disk storage system. In this manual, this logical volume is called "access volume". One logical volume of ETERNUS Disk storage system must be assigned to Management Server as the access volume.

Figure 1.2 Example of System Configuration Using Copy Command via SAN



When using the Copy command via LAN method, no access volume is needed.




Figure 1.3 Example of System Configuration Using Copy Command via LAN

NAS Management of ETERNUS Disk Storage System

ETERNUS SF allows you to use diverse functions to manage the NAS file systems of the ETERNUS Disk storage system connected to the Management Server by Management LAN.

Express provides management functions for NAS environment.

Perform NAS environment management from the Management Server or Web Console.

Refer to the *ETERNUS SF Express Operation Guide* for the overview of management functions for NAS environment and its operational procedure.

Chapter 2 System Design Before Express Installation

This chapter explains the system design required before Express installation.

Before reading this chapter, check the cautions and limitations mentioned in the software guide.

2.1 Choosing Management Server

Express's manager has to process requests from the Web Console as well as various events and data acquisition coming from the managed hardware. To avoid interferences from other software or insufficient physical resources and ensure smooth operations, it is recommended to install Express on its own dedicated server.

If a dedicated server cannot be secured, the Management Server should be chosen according to the following requirements:

Impact on Business Applications

On a server running business applications (hereafter described as "business server"), Express's manager operations will likely have an impact on other applications performance. If the candidate server is a mission critical server running financial, distribution or public utilities applications, the decision to install Express's manager must be evaluated with extra caution.

Impact on Other Guest OS (for Virtual Server Environment)

In a virtual server environment, the physical server resources (CPU, memory, and network) are shared by multiple guest OS. Therefore, the operations of a guest OS have an impact on the other guest OS performance. Before installing Express's manager on a guest OS, usage of physical resources and role of other guest OS must be evaluated carefully.

Incompatible Software

Express's manager cannot run on the same server concurrently to certain other software (hereafter described as "incompatible software"). A server with no incompatible software must be selected.



Refer to "Operating environment of ETERNUS SF Manager" in the *ETERNUS SF Installation and Setup Guide* for information on the incompatible software.

Chapter 3 Express Installation and Setup

This chapter explains the installation and setup procedures of Express.

In case of update from a previous version to the latest version, refer to the ETERNUS SF Migration Guide.

3.1 Overview of Installation Procedure

The ETERNUS SF Manager must be installed to use Express.

The overview of the installation procedure of ETERNUS SF Manager is shown below.

1. Check if the target server satisfies the hardware and software requirements for the ETERNUS SF Manager installation.

Refer to "Operating environment of ETERNUS SF Manager" in the *ETERNUS SF Installation and Setup Guide* for information on each condition.

2. Install the ETERNUS SF Manager.

Refer to "Installation of ETERNUS SF Manager" in the ETERNUS SF Installation and Setup Guide for information on the installation procedure.

3.2 Setup Overview

The overview of the procedure for setting up the ETERNUS SF Manager as the Express Manager is shown below.

Refer to "Setup of ETERNUS SF Manager" in the ETERNUS SF Installation and Setup Guide for information on the setup procedure.

1. Create and register a user account that will be using Express.

The possible operations by the user are dependent on the level of permission the user account is given. The following table describes the differences:

Yes	Operations are possible from the Web Console and the command line.	Operations are possible only from the Web Console.

- On systems using Single Sign-on, a created user account should be registered in the corresponding account authentication system so that the user can login to the Management Server.
 - For example, on the Windows environment, if the Management Server belongs to an Active Directory domain, the user must be added to the Active Directory domain.
- Commands can be executed only by users with OS administrator privileges or users belonging to the OS administrators group.
- 2. Set up the firewall.

The firewall must be set up so that the remote PC where the Web Console will be used can connect to the Management Server.

3. Launch the Web Console, and then check that the user registered by step 1 can login to the Management Server from the Web Console.

Refer to "Supported Web Browsers" in the ETERNUS SF Web Console Guide for the version level of the supported web browsers.



From the "Chapter 4 Configuration of Express Operating Environment" chapter on, the described tasks are supposed to be performed from the Web Console. Before proceeding, it is therefore important to check that Express can actually be operated from the Web Console.

Chapter 4 Configuration of Express Operating Environment

This chapter explains how to configure the Express operating environment.

4.1 Configuring the Network Environment

If a firewall is installed between the Management Server and the Managed Server, or between the Management Server and the Managed device, the network environment must be setup so that the SNMP Traps emitted by the Managed device or the Managed Server can be sent to the Management Server.

4.2 Setting the Storage System

The following procedure is required to set up the storage devices managed with Express:

- 1. Set the following properties for the storage devices to manage and then register them in Express.
 - IP address of the Management Server
 - Enable the SNMP function of MNT port
 - Created SSH server key (for ETERNUS DX80 S2/DX90 S2/DX100 S3/DX200 S3 only)
 - Created Software Role Account (for ETERNUS DX80 S2/DX90 S2/DX100 S3/DX200 S3 only)
 - SNMP community name (for ETERNUS DX80 S2/DX90 S2/DX100 S3/DX200 S3 only)

Refer to "Registering disk storage systems" in the ETERNUS SF Express Operation Guide for information on the procedure.

2. Register the Managed Servers used for ETERNUS Disk storage system in Express.

Refer to "Registering servers" in the ETERNUS SF Express Operation Guide for information on the procedure.

 ${\bf 3.} \ \ {\bf Create\ RAID\ groups\ in\ ETERNUS\ Disk\ storage\ system\ managed\ by\ Express.}$

4. Create volumes in ETERNUS Disk storage system.

Refer to "Create Volume" in the ETERNUS SF Web Console Guide for information on the procedure.

5. Assign volumes in ETERNUS Disk storage system to Managed Servers.

Refer to "Volume allocation wizard" of "Environment configuration using wizard" in the *ETERNUS SF Express Operation Guide* for information on the procedure.



Steps from 2 to 5 of the above procedure are supported by a wizard in Express to make them easier. Refer to "Storage configuration wizard" in "Environment configuration using wizard" in the *ETERNUS SF Express Operation Guide* for information on the wizard.

4.3 Checking the SNMP Trap Reception

The purpose of the SNMP Trap test is to check that events generated by the storage devices are properly displayed in Express's manager. Refer to "Event notification test" in the *ETERNUS SF Express Operation Guide* for information on the procedure.



If the system is operated in a state where events cannot be displayed, problems will not be detected or detected too late and create a possibility that the system will not work properly. It is therefore important to check that the events generated by the storage devices are properly displayed.

4.4 Configuring the Advanced Copy

If you use the Advanced Copy function of ETERNUS Disk storage system, the environment has to be configured accordingly.

For ETERNUS Disk Storage System Using the Copy Command via SAN

- 1. Access volume settings
- 2. Connection method settings
- 3. Advanced Copy settings

For ETERNUS Disk Storage System Using the Copy Command via LAN

- 1. Connection method settings
- 2. Advanced Copy settings



For the ETERNUS Disk storage system using the Copy command via LAN, access volume settings are not needed.

When using the Copy command via SAN method for the ETERNUS Disk storage system, an access volume setting is needed. However, when using the Copy command via LAN method, an access volume setting is not needed.

Chapter 5 Start Express Operation

5.1 Monitoring and Managing Storage Systems

This explains how to verify the operation and load status for storage systems.

5.1.1 Performance Monitoring

Performance monitoring of ETERNUS Disk storage system is possible with Express.

Performance monitoring can be performed by selecting a storage device previously registered in "4.2 Setting the Storage System" in the Web Console.

5.1.2 Storage Capacity Virtualization Operation by Using Thin Provisioning

For ETERNUS DX80 S2/DX90 S2/DX100 S3/DX200 S3, storage capacity virtualization operation can be done by using the Thin Provisioning function.

There are two methods to start the Thin Provisioning operation for ETERNUS Disk storage system:

- By registering ETERNUS Disk storage systems where Thin Provisioning is enabled
- By updating the system information on the Web Console after the Thin Provisioning is enabled on an already registered ETERNUS Disk storage system

5.2 Backing Up the Data of Business Volumes

This explains how to backup the data of business volumes using the Advanced Copy function of ETERNUS Disk storage systems.

5.2.1 Executing the Advanced Copy

The data of business volumes on the ETERNUS Disk storage systems can be backed up with the Advanced Copy function.

5.2.2 Checking the Copy Status and Cancelling the Operation

When Advanced Copy is running, it is possible to check the copy progress status or cancel the copy operation from the Web Console or via a command.

Part 2 Storage Cruiser

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Chapter 6 Overview of Storage Cruiser

This chapter is an overview of Storage Cruiser.

6.1 Function Overview

Storage Cruiser, so as to support the stable operation of the storage system environment, provides the following functions:

- Configuration management

This displays the physical connection status between devices onto the ETERNUS SF Web Console.

This is convenient for obtaining a grasp on the access points for each device's parts (for example, the Fibre Channel switch ports).

The Web Console allows Storage Cruiser operation directly from a Web browser.

- Correlation management

This automatically acquires from within the storage device's disks configuration information for physical paths, related server file systems, and multipath, and correlates this information, displaying it to the Web Console.

The configuration elements are correlated and displayed on one screen, so it is convenient for obtaining a grasp of the entire configuration.

- Fault management

This function reads faults having occurred with the device and displays the relevant information in an easy-to-understand format to the Web Console.

It supports early identification of the faulty part and its range of impact, as well as early recovery from the fault.

- Performance management

This function displays the performance information (for management) for the Fibre Channel switch and ETERNUS Disk storage system to the Web Console in the form of a graph.

Through continuous collection of information, it is easy to obtain a grasp of such things as the operation status and load status from the past.

If a threshold value for performance information is set up on Storage Cruiser, an alarm will be issued when a performance value error has been detected.

This function is useful for identifying the location and cause of bottlenecks and removing the source of the problem so that the storage system can be operated under an optimal environment.

Storage Cruiser visualizes the ETERNUS Disk storage system's power consumption and implements a reduction to power consumption for storage operation. Also, during operation of thin provisioning, Storage Cruiser supports virtual storage operation through monitoring capacity.


Storage Cruiser can manage multiple storage devices, tape libraries, Fibre Channel switches and servers.

Also, in addition to physical environments, Storage Cruiser is also compatible with server virtualized environments.

Also, it is possible to manage the Managed Server regardless of whether or not the Storage Cruiser's agent has been installed.

It is possible to operate Storage Cruiser with a system environment as depicted below.

NAS Management of ETERNUS Disk Storage System

ETERNUS SF allows you to use diverse functions to manage the NAS file systems of the ETERNUS Disk storage system connected to the Management Server by Management LAN.

Storage Cruiser provides management functions for NAS environment.

Perform NAS environment management from the Management Server or Web Console.

Refer to the ETERNUS SF Storage Cruiser Operation Guide for the overview of management functions for NAS environment and its operational procedure.

Installation to Clustered System

- Installation of the Storage Cruiser's manager

To increase the availability of the Storage Cruiser's manager, make the system redundant by installing the Storage Cruiser's manager to the clustered system.

Also, note that this product does not support configurations of managing a single operating system with multiple Storage Cruiser's managers (multiple Management Servers environment).

- Installation of the Storage Cruiser's agent

This product monitors the status of each node of which the clustered system is comprised. If installing the Storage Cruiser's agent to a clustered system, install to all nodes of which the clustered system is comprised.

If performing device registration for each node of which the clustered system is comprised, for the node's IP address, designate the physical IP address allocated to each node, not the clustered system's logical IP address.

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Refer to the ETERNUS SF Cluster Environment Setup Guide for the Installation procedures to a clustered system.

Chapter 7 System Design Before Storage Cruiser Installation

This chapter explains the system design required before the Storage Cruiser installation.

Before reading this chapter, check the cautions and limitations mentioned in the software guide.

7.1 Choosing Management Server

Storage Cruiser's manager has to process requests from the Web Console as well as various events and data acquisition coming from the managed hardware. To avoid interferences from other software or insufficient physical resources and ensure smooth operations, it is recommended to install Storage Cruiser's manager on its own dedicated server.

If a dedicated server cannot be secured, the Management Server should be chosen according to the following requirements:

Impact on Business Applications

On a server running business applications (hereafter described as "business server"), Storage Cruiser's manager operations will likely have an impact on other applications performance. If the candidate server is a mission critical server running financial, distribution or public utilities applications, the decision to install Storage Cruiser's manager must be evaluated with extra caution.

Impact on Other Guest OS (for Virtual Server Environment)

In a virtual server environment, the physical server resources (CPU, memory, and network) are shared by multiple guest OS. Therefore, the operations of a guest OS have an impact on the other guest OS performance. Before installing Storage Cruiser's manager on a guest OS, usage of physical resources and role of other guest OS must be evaluated carefully.

Incompatible Software

Storage Cruiser's manager cannot run on the same server concurrently to certain other software (hereafter described as "incompatible software"). A server with no incompatible software must be selected.



Refer to "Operating environment of ETERNUS SF Manager" in the *ETERNUS SF Installation and Setup Guide* for information on the incompatible software.

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7.2 Selecting the Agent Installation

Storage Cruiser provides the following two types for server monitoring models.

- Monitoring without the Storage Cruiser's agent installed
- Monitoring with the Storage Cruiser's agent installed

Please refer to the following selection criteria and choose the monitoring condition accordingly.

Monitoring Model	Selection Criteria	
Monitoring without agent installed (agent-less monitoring)	- If the OS installed to the Managed Server is not supported by the Storage Cruiser's agent.	
	- The HBA built into the Managed Server is not supported by the Storage Cruiser's agent.

	For example, if installation of applications is not permitted on the Managed Server outside a restricted set of applications, or if an incompatible software application is already installed on the server.	
	- If you want to reduce the maintenance tasks on the Managed Server.

	- If using Storage Cruiser under the VMware vSphere 4 or later environment.

4. A Storage Cruiser license must be registered for each of the ETERNUS Disk storage systems managed in Storage Cruiser.



There are two ways of registering a license, from the Web Console or from the command line.

However, use the command line interface to register a license in this time.

License registration from the Web Console is possible only for ETERNUS Disk storage systems already managed in Storage Cruiser. Registration for the ETERNUS Disk storage systems not yet managed in Storage Cruiser is possible from the command line.

Registration from the Web Console becomes possible after "9.2 Registering Device".

Refer to "License Management" in the ETERNUS SF Installation and Setup Guide for information on the license and registering procedure.

8.3 Installation of Storage Cruiser's Agent

The overview of the installation procedure of Storage Cruiser's agent is shown below.



It is not necessary to install the Storage Cruiser's agent under the VMware vSphere 4 or later environment.

- 1. Check if the target server satisfies the hardware and software requirements for the Storage Cruiser's agent installation.
 - Refer to "Operating environment of Storage Cruiser's agent" in the *ETERNUS SF Installation and Setup Guide* for information on each condition.
- 2. Install the Storage Cruiser's agent.

8.4 Setup of Storage Cruiser's Agent

For the setup of the Storage Cruiser's agent, it is necessary to set up such things as the port numbers to be used and the SNIA HBA API library.

The items and procedures necessary for setup vary according to OS. Refer to the part detailing one's OS in "Setup of Storage Cruiser's agent" in the *ETERNUS SF Installation and Setup Guide*.

Chapter 9 Configuration of Storage Cruiser Operating Environment

This chapter explains how to configure the Storage Cruiser operating environment.

9.1 Setting Up to Manage Devices

Perform the necessary setup for the devices to be monitored/managed by Storage Cruiser.

Servers

So that Storage Cruiser can manage the HBA built into the Managed Server to which the Storage Cruiser's agent has been installed, install the SNIA HBA API library that HBA vendor distributes.

Fibre Channel Switches

So that Storage Cruiser can manage the Fibre Channel switch device, first, perform setup to the Fibre Channel switch.

ETERNUS Disk Storage Systems

So that Storage Cruiser can manage the ETERNUS Disk storage system, first, perform setup to ETERNUS Disk storage system.

Refer to "Disk Array" in "Environment Configuration" in the *ETERNUS SF Storage Cruiser Operation Guide* for items and procedures pertaining to setup.

Network Attached Storages

So that Storage Cruiser can manage the NetApp FAS Series, first, perform setup to NetApp FAS Series.

Tape Libraries

9.2 Registering Device

For the managing of devices with Storage Cruiser, register the managed devices to Storage Cruiser.

If the ETERNUS Disk storage system just registered in Storage Cruiser does not have a Storage Cruiser license, register the Storage Cruiser license for it.

10.1 Performance Monitoring

Performance monitoring of the Fibre Channel switch and ETERNUS Disk storage system is possible with Storage Cruiser. Performance monitoring can be performed by selecting a storage device previously registered in "9.2 Registering Device".

Refer to "Performance Management" in the ETERNUS SF Storage Cruiser Operation Guide for information on the procedure.

10.2 Energy-saving Operation for Storage Device by Using Ecomode

Storage Cruiser can achieve the energy-saving operation by using the Eco-mode function of ETERNUS Disk storage system.

For Eco-mode, there is "storage device Eco-mode" and "RAID Group Eco-mode". One can set each Eco-mode ON or OFF separately, so it is possible to achieve a meticulously energy-saving operation.

Refer to "How to control the Eco-mode" in the ETERNUS SF Storage Cruiser Operation Guide for information on the procedure.

10.3 Storage Capacity Virtualization Operation by Using Thin Provisioning

Storage Cruiser can achieve the storage capacity virtualization operation by using the Thin Provisioning function of ETERNUS Disk storage system.

There are two methods to start the Thin Provisioning operation for the ETERNUS Disk storage systems:

- By registering ETERNUS Disk storage systems where Thin Provisioning is enabled
- By updating the system information on the Web Console after the Thin Provisioning is enabled on an already registered ETERNUS Disk storage system

Refer to "Thin Provisioning management" in the ETERNUS SF Storage Cruiser Operation Guide for information on the procedures.

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Chapter 11 Overview of AdvancedCopy Manager

This chapter is an overview of AdvancedCopy Manager.

11.1 Function Overview

AdvancedCopy Manager is the storage management software for using the Advanced Copy functions of the ETERNUS Disk Storage System.

The Advanced Copy function allows copying the data from a business volume to another volume at a given time in a very short duration.

AdvancedCopy Manager provides the following functions with the purpose of performing high-speed and high-reliability backup/replication operations.

- Advanced Copy functions
 - Snapshot high-speed copy
 - Synchronous high-speed copy
- Backup management functions
- Replication management functions
- Backup functions using the AdvancedCopy Manager Copy Control Module (hereafter referred to as "AdvancedCopy Manager CCM")



Point

AdvancedCopy Manager provides a function called "Web Console" in order to manage AdvancedCopy Manager operating environment from a Web browser.

Refer to the ETERNUS SF Web Console Guide for information on the operating environment and screens of the Web Console.



NAS Management of ETERNUS Disk Storage System

ETERNUS SF allows you to use diverse functions to manage the NAS file systems of the ETERNUS Disk storage system connected to the Management Server by Management LAN.

AdvancedCopy Manager provides backup functions for NAS environment.

Perform NAS environment configuration, management and backup from the Management Server or Web Console.

Refer to "NAS Management" in the *ETERNUS SF Express Operation Guide* or *ETERNUS SF Storage Cruiser Operation Guide* for the overview of NAS environment configuration/management and its operational procedure.

Refer to "Backup of NAS environment" in the *ETERNUS SF AdvancedCopy Manager Operation Guide for Copy Control Module* for the overview of NAS environment backup and its operational procedure.

Installation to Clustered System

To increase the availability of AdvancedCopy Manager, manager or agent of AdvancedCopy Manager can be installed on a clustered system for redundancy.

- AdvancedCopy Manager's manager installation

A system cannot be managed by more than one AdvancedCopy Manager's managers.

- AdvancedCopy Manager's agent installation

Register the logical node names (unique names in a cluster configuration) of the clustered system as Managed Servers. When the cluster real node names are registered as Managed Servers, the clustered system cannot be correctly managed.

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Refer to the ETERNUS SF Cluster Environment Setup Guide for information on the installation on a clustered system.

Chapter 12 System Design Before AdvancedCopy Manager Installation

This chapter explains the system design required before the AdvancedCopy Manager installation.

Before reading this chapter, check the cautions and limitations mentioned in the software guide.

12.1 Choice of Operating Model

With AdvancedCopy Manager, the following 2 operating modes are available:

Agent-Based Operating Model

This operating model requires the installation of ETERNUS SF Manager and the AdvancedCopy Manager's agent.

Use of this operating model requires that the installed ETERNUS SF Manager be set up as the AdvancedCopy Manager's manager.

Application data copy is possible on a server where a business application is installed (hereafter "business server"). As a function to trigger scripts before and after the copy operation is provided, scripts can be customized to conform to the administration policies and allow flexible and optimized operations.

Agent-Less Operating Model

This operating model requires the installation of AdvancedCopy Manager CCM.

There is no need to install either ETERNUS SF Manager or AdvancedCopy Manager's agent, therefore the time to get ready to start is shorter compared to Agent-based operating model. Moreover, as all the operations can be done directly on the server where the CCM has been installed, there are no requirements about the OS environment of the business server.

Unlike the copy operation with an agent, the copy is done per disk rather than per partition or slice. For this reason, the copy destination resource must be larger. Also, as copy is done without relation to the application running on the business server, the operator must ensure the integrity of the copied data. (for example, by performing the copy when the data is inactive).

Decide which operating model to use by considering the following criteria.

Operating Model	Choice Criteria
Agent-based	- If you want to use functions available when the AdvancedCopy Manager's agent is installed.
	For example, if you want to use advanced copy operations such as multiple generation backup/restore functions, interaction with a DBMS on a business server, volume shadow copy service (VSS Volume Shadow Copy Service function), etc.
Agent-less	- If there are many business servers and you want to reduce the cost of installation and start operation as soon as possible.
	- If the OS on the business server is not supported by the AdvancedCopy Manager's manager or the AdvancedCopy Manager's agent.
	- If the AdvancedCopy Manager's agent cannot be installed on the business server.
	For example, if installation of applications is not permitted on the business server outside a restricted set of applications, or if an incompatible software application is already installed on the server.
	- If you want to reduce the maintenance tasks on the business server.
	For example, if you want to avoid having to apply patches on the software.



It is possible to have operating models with Agent-based and Agent-less at the same time, but when operated in parallel, the copy data of both operating models must not have common areas.

If the copy data of both operating models have common areas, there is a possibility of data loss when copy operations use the mutual areas.



Refer to the following sections of the *ETERNUS SF Installation and Setup Guide* for details about incompatible software with AdvancedCopy Manager.

12.2 System Design for Agent-Based Operating Model

This section explains the required tasks to perform before the installation and configuration of Agent-based operating model.

12.2.1 Selecting Function to Use

With Agent-based operating model, the following two functions are available:

- Backup and restore function

This function allows maintaining multiple generations of the copied data.

Unlike the data copied with the replication function, the data copied with backup cannot be used outside this function.

By setting a backup policy, the backup can be performed according to that policy.

This function creates multiple generations of the copied data. When performing a restoration, any one of the backup generations can be chosen and restored.

However, this function does not support data copy to a different ETERNUS Disk storage system. To copy data over to a different ETERNUS Disk storage system, use the replication function.

- Replication function

This function allows using the copy data differently from a backup (for example, using the copied data in a business application, etc). Copy to a different ETERNUS Disk storage system, including a remote location, is possible.

A replication data source and destination areas are defined as a pair, and data are copied inside this pair. As multi-generation data management is not supported by the replication function, several pairs must be defined for one data source and multiple data destinations.

Please refer to the following selection criteria and decide the function to use.

Function	Choice Criteria
Backup and restore function	- If you need to keep multiple generations of the data copied in AdvancedCopy Manager.
Replication function	- If you want to use the copied data outside a backup dataset.
	- If you want to copy between volumes that are connected to different servers
	 If you want to copy between volumes that are residing on different ETERNUS Disk storage systems.
	 If you want to backup data from Microsoft Exchange Server. The backup and restore function does not support copying data from Microsoft Exchange Server.
	 If you want to backup data from a Hyper-V Guest OS. The backup and restore function does not support copying data from Hyper-V Guest OS.

12.2.2 Choosing Management Server

AdvancedCopy Manager's manager has to process requests from the Web Console as well as various events and data acquisition coming from the managed hardware. To avoid interferences from other software or insufficient physical resources and ensure smooth operations, it is recommended to install AdvancedCopy Manager's manager on its own dedicated server.

If a dedicated server cannot be secured, the Management Server should be chosen according to the following requirements:

Impact on Business Applications

On a server running business applications (hereafter described as "business server"), AdvancedCopy Manager's manager operations will likely have an impact on other applications performance. If the candidate server is a mission critical server running financial, distribution or public utilities applications, the decision to install AdvancedCopy Manager's manager must be evaluated with extra caution.

Impact on Other Guest OS (for Virtual Server Environment)

In a virtual server environment, the physical server resources (CPU, memory, and network) are shared by multiple guest OS. Therefore, the operations of a guest OS have an impact on the other guest OS performance. Before installing AdvancedCopy Manager's manager on a guest OS, usage of physical resources and role of other guest OS must be evaluated carefully.

Incompatible Software

AdvancedCopy Manager's manager cannot run on the same server concurrently to certain other software (hereafter described as "incompatible software"). A server with no incompatible software must be selected.



Refer to "Operating environment of ETERNUS SF Manager" in the *ETERNUS SF Installation and Setup Guide* for information on the incompatible software.

12.3 System Design for Agent-Less Operating Model

This section explains the required tasks to perform before the installation and configuration of Agent-less operating model.

12.3.1 Choosing CCM Server

AdvancedCopy Manager CCM has to process requests from the Web Console as well as various events and data acquisition coming from the managed hardware. To avoid interferences from other software or insufficient physical resources and ensure smooth operations, it is recommended to install AdvancedCopy Manager CCM on its own dedicated server.

If a dedicated server cannot be secured, the server should be chosen according to the following requirements:

Impact on Business Applications

On a server running business applications (hereafter described as "business server"), AdvancedCopy Manager CCM operations will likely have an impact on other applications performance. If the candidate server is a mission critical server running financial, distribution or public utilities applications, the decision to install AdvancedCopy Manager CCM must be evaluated with extra caution.

Impact on Other Guest OS (for Virtual Server Environment)

In a virtual server environment, the physical server resources (CPU, memory, and network) are shared by multiple guest OS. Therefore, the operations of a guest OS have an impact on the other guest OS performance. Before installing AdvancedCopy Manager CCM on a guest OS, usage of physical resources and role of other guest OS must be evaluated carefully.

Incompatible Software

AdvancedCopy Manager CCM cannot run on the same server concurrently to certain other software (hereafter described as "incompatible software"). A server with no incompatible software must be selected.

12.3.2 Selecting Program to Install

AdvancedCopy Manager CCM can be installed using 2 methods.

- [Method 1] Install the ETERNUS SF Manager program and use the AdvancedCopy Manager CCM included in the ETERNUS SF Manager program
- [Method 2] Install and use the AdvancedCopy Manager CCM program only



With the method 1, in addition to the Command Line Interface, AdvancedCopy Manager CCM can be operated from the Web Console. However, it has the following demerits:

- The required disk space for installation is larger than method 2.
- There are more incompatible software applications than method 2.

- Symfoware verification is necessary (only if Symfoware is installed on the server)
- An estimate of the database size is required.

Select the program to install after considering these issues.

12.3.3 Selecting Advanced Copy Control Method

In AdvancedCopy Manager CCM, the CM Server sends a command to ETERNUS Disk storage system to perform an Advanced Copy function. There are two available methods for sending the copy command:

- Sending a command to ETERNUS Disk storage system to perform an Advanced Copy function from the server over the SAN (hereafter referred to as "Copy command via SAN")
- Sending a command to ETERNUS Disk storage system to perform an Advanced Copy function from the server over the LAN (hereafter referred to as "Copy command via LAN")

With AdvancedCopy Manager CCM, the ETERNUS Disk storage systems listed below can use Copy command via SAN and via LAN.

In this manual, this logical volume is called "access volume". One logical volume of ETERNUS Disk storage system must be assigned to CCM Server as the access volume.




Figure 12.1 Example of System Configuration Using Copy Command via SAN

In case of a system environment where not all managed ETERNUS Disk storage systems support the Copy command via LAN, it is recommended to use only the Copy command via SAN.

13.1 Installation of ETERNUS SF Manager

The ETERNUS SF Manager must be installed to use AdvancedCopy Manager's manager functions. The overview of the installation procedure of ETERNUS SF Manager is shown below.

- 1. Check if the target server satisfies the hardware and software requirements for the ETERNUS SF Manager installation.
 - Refer to "Operating environment of ETERNUS SF Manager" in the *ETERNUS SF Installation and Setup Guide* for information on each condition.
- 2. Install the ETERNUS SF Manager.

Refer to "Installation of ETERNUS SF Manager" in the ETERNUS SF Installation and Setup Guide for information on the installation procedure.



Refer to the ETERNUS SF Cluster Environment Setup Guide for the procedures of the Installation to a clustered system.

13.2 Setup of ETERNUS SF Manager

The overview of the procedure for setting up the ETERNUS SF Manager as the AdvancedCopy Manager's manager is shown below. Refer to "Setup of ETERNUS SF Manager" in the *ETERNUS SF Installation and Setup Guide* for information on the setup procedure.

1. Create and register a user account that will be using AdvancedCopy Manager.

The possible operations by the user are dependent on the level of permission the user account is given. The following table describes the differences:

- On systems using Single Sign-on, a created user account should be registered in the corresponding account authentication system so that the user can login to the Management Server.
 - For example, on the Windows environment, if the Management Server belongs to an Active Directory domain, the user must be added to the Active Directory domain.
- The commands of AdvancedCopy Manager can be executed only by the following users.
 - For Windows environment

Local users belonging to the Administrators group or domain users belonging to the Domain Admins group

- For Solaris or Linux environment

Users who have OS administrator privilege (root user)

2. Set up the firewall.

The firewall must be set up so that the remote PC where the Web Console will be used can connect to the Management Server.

3. Launch the Web Console, and then check that the user registered by step 1 can login to the Management Server from the Web Console.

Refer to "Supported Web Browsers" in the ETERNUS SF Web Console Guide for the version level of the supported web browsers.



From the "Chapter 14 Configuration of Agent-Based Operation Model Environment" chapter on, the described tasks are supposed to be performed from the Web Console. Before proceeding, it is therefore important to check that AdvancedCopy Manager can actually be operated from the Web Console.

4. Register the AdvancedCopy Manager licenses with the license management commands for all the ETERNUS Disk storage systems managed by AdvancedCopy Manager.

Chapter 14 Configuration of Agent-Based Operation Model Environment

This chapter explains how to configure the Agent-based operation model environment.

14.1 Configuration of Environment Using Backup/Restore Function

This section describes the procedure for configuring the operating environment for backup and restore function.

1. Managed Server registration

Register each Managed Server on the Management Server.

Refer to "Registering a Managed Server" in "Backup Operation" in the *ETERNUS SF AdvancedCopy Manager Operation Guide* for the operating system of the Managed Server for information on the procedure.

2. Device information collection

Collect the information about the devices connected to the Managed Server.

Refer to "Fetching device information on a Managed Server" in "Backup Operation" in the *ETERNUS SF AdvancedCopy Manager Operation Guide* for the operating system of the Managed Server for information on the procedure.

3. Backup server environment configuration

Decide and configure on which server the backup operations will be performed.

Refer to "Configuring the environment for a backup operation server" in "Backup Operation" in the *ETERNUS SF AdvancedCopy Manager Operation Guide* for the operating system of the Managed Server for information on the procedure.

4. Volume type settings

Set the type for volumes to be managed by AdvancedCopy Manager from among volumes fetched in step 2. Choose one of the following types for each volume:

- Transaction volume

This is a volume to be backed up (copy data source).

- Backup volume

This is a volume that will keep the backed up data (copy data destination).

Set the backup policy for each of the transaction volumes set up in step 4.

- Preservation generations
- Interval days

6. Pre-processing and post-processing scripts customization

If the specific pre-processing and post-processing is needed, customize the pre-processing and post-processing scripts for backup.

Refer to "Pre-processing and Post-processing of Backup and Restoration" in the *ETERNUS SF AdvancedCopy Manager Operation Guide* for the operating system of the Managed Server for information on the procedure.

14.2 Configuration of Environment Using Replication Function

This section describes the procedure for configuring the operating environment for replication function.

1. Managed Server registration

Register each Managed Server on the Management Server.

Refer to "Registering a Managed Server" in "Replication" in the *ETERNUS SF AdvancedCopy Manager Operation Guide* for the operating system of the Managed Server for information on the procedure.

2. Device information collection

Collect the information about the devices connected to the Managed Server.

3. Settings of volumes for replication

Set the copy source and destination volumes used with the replication operation.

4. Pre-processing and post-processing scripts customization

If in one of the following 2 situations, customize the pre-processing and post-processing scripts for replication:

- Specific processing needs to be added before or after replication.
- The standard processing before or after the replication needs to be modified.

14.3 Backing Up the Setup Information

AdvancedCopy Manager setting information should be backed up to prevent its loss in case of a failure of the Management Server.

Chapter 15 Start the Operation of Agent-Based Operation Model

15.1 Starting the Operation Using Backup/Restore Function

15.1.1 Executing the Backup

Perform a backup of the business data in the transaction volume by executing an Advanced Copy.

The backup volume is automatically selected.

However, it is possible to configure the relation between source volumes and destination volumes by using the "device map file".

A data copy created with the replication function can also be used as a backup.

There are two possible methods to install AdvancedCopy Manager CCM, as mentioned in "12.3.2 Selecting Program to Install".

When Using AdvancedCopy Manager CCM Included in ETERNUS SF Manager

Install the ETERNUS SF Manager.

The overview of the installation procedure of ETERNUS SF Manager is shown below.

- 1. Check if the target server satisfies the hardware and software requirements for the ETERNUS SF Manager installation.
 - Refer to "Operating environment of ETERNUS SF Manager" in the *ETERNUS SF Installation and Setup Guide* for information on each condition.
- 2. Install the ETERNUS SF Manager.

When Using AdvancedCopy Manager CCM to Be Installed Individually

Install the ETERNUS SF Manager.

- 1. Check if the target server satisfies the hardware and software requirements for the AdvancedCopy Manager CCM installation.

- 2. Install the AdvancedCopy Manager CCM.

16.2 Setup of AdvancedCopy Manager CCM

When Using AdvancedCopy Manager CCM Included in ETERNUS SF Manager

The overview of the procedure for setting up the ETERNUS Manager as the AdvancedCopy Manager CCM is shown below. Refer to "Setup of ETERNUS SF Manager" in the *ETERNUS SF Installation and Setup Guide* for information on the setup procedure.

1. Create and register a user account that will be using AdvancedCopy Manager CCM.

The possible operations by the user are dependent on the level of permission the user account is given. The following table describes the differences:

ESF Admin Role	OS Administrator Privilege			OS Administrator Privilege

Yes	Operations are possible from the Web Console and the command line.	Operations are possible only from the Web Console.

Point

- On systems using Single Sign-on, a created user account should be registered in the corresponding account authentication system so that the user can login to the Management Server (also used as CCM Server).
 - For example, on the Windows environment, if the Management Server belongs to an Active Directory domain, the user must be added to the Active Directory domain.
- The commands of AdvancedCopy Manager CCM can be executed only by the following users.
 - For Windows environment
 Local users belonging to the Administrators group or domain users belonging to the Domain Admins group
 - For Solaris or Linux environment
 Users who have OS administrator privilege (root user)
- 2. Set up the firewall.

The firewall must be set up so that the remote PC where the Web Console will be used can connect to the Management Server.

3. Launch the Web Console, and then check that the user registered by step 1 can login to the Management Server from the Web Console.

From the "Chapter 14 Configuration of Agent-Based Operation Model Environment" chapter on, the described tasks are supposed to be performed from the Web Console. Before proceeding, it is therefore important to check that AdvancedCopy Manager can actually be operated from the Web Console.

4. Register the AdvancedCopy Manager licenses with the license management commands for all the ETERNUS Disk storage systems managed by AdvancedCopy Manager CCM.

When using AdvancedCopy Manager CCM to Be Installed Individually

The overview of the procedure for setting up AdvancedCopy Manager CCM is shown below.

1. Create and register a user account that will execute AdvancedCopy Manager CCM commands.

The AdvancedCopy Manager CCM commands can be executed only by users with Administrator permissions or users belonging to the Administrators group. Take this requirement into account when creating and registering a user.



On systems using Single Sign-on, a created user account should be registered in the corresponding account authentication system so that the user can login to the CCM Server.

For example, if the CCM Server belongs to an Active Directory domain, the user must be added to the Active Directory domain.

2. Register the AdvancedCopy Manager licenses with the license management commands for all the ETERNUS Disk storage systems managed by AdvancedCopy Manager CCM.

Refer to "License Management" in the *ETERNUS SF Installation and Setup Guide* for information on the licenses and registering procedure.



When the AdvancedCopy Manager CCM program is installed, AdvancedCopy Manager CCM functions cannot be operated from the Web Console. Therefore, registration of a user for operating the Web Console or firewall settings is not required.

Chapter 17 Configuration of Agent-Less Operation Model Environment

This chapter explains how to configure the Agent-less operation model environment.

17.1 Access Volume Settings

When sending a command to ETERNUS Disk storage system to perform an Advanced Copy function from the CCM Server by using Copy command via SAN, this setting must be performed on each ETERNUS Disk storage system.

When using the Copy command via SAN, a logical volume that can be accessed by the CCM Server must be defined in the ETERNUS Disk storage system, according to "Figure 12.1 Example of System Configuration Using Copy Command via SAN". In this manual, this logical volume is called "access volume". One logical volume of ETERNUS Disk storage system must be assigned to CCM Server as the access volume.

Refer to "Access Volume Settings" in the ETERNUS SF AdvancedCopy Manager Operation Guide for Copy Control Module for information on the procedure.

17.2 Storage Device Registration

The ETERNUS Disk storage system where Advanced Copy operations will be performed with AdvancedCopy Manager CCM must be registered in AdvancedCopy Manager CCM with the following information.

- Name of ETERNUS Disk storage system
- IP address of ETERNUS Disk storage system
- User name and password of users who access the ETERNUS Disk storage system
- Access Volume set in "17.1 Access Volume Settings" (only for using Copy command via SAN)

17.3 Copy Group Creation

Create copy groups.

The combination of the copy source and destination logical volume is called "copy pair". Several copy pairs can be grouped into what is called "copy group".

When creating a copy group, ETERNUS Disk storage system to be used and the type of Advanced Copy must be set.

Refer to "Creating copy groups" in the ETERNUS SF Advanced Copy Manager Operation Guide for Copy Control Module for information on the procedure.

17.4 Copy Pair Creation

The copy pairs must be registered in a copy group.

To register a copy pair, the following information is required.

- Name of the copy source ETERNUS Disk storage system
- Logical volume number of the copy source volume
- Name of the copy destination ETERNUS Disk storage system
- Logical volume number of the copy destination volume

17.5 Backing Up the Setup Information

AdvancedCopy Manager CCM setting information should be backed up to prevent its loss in case of a failure of the CCM Server.
