The DVD-ROM media of this product has been created in the UDF Bridge format. For this reason, it is possible to mount as the iso9660 or UDF file system. However, if you mount as the UDF file system, the execution privileges for the execution file may sometimes be removed. In this case, problems such as being unable to execute the installer may occur. Note that, depending on the operating system, the mount specification may sometimes be as shown below. The mount options for the mounted DVD-ROM can be checked by executing the mount command with no argument.

- If you mount the DVD-ROM using automatic mount, or using the mount command with no file system option, the DVD-ROM is mounted as the UDF file system, Therefore, it is not possible to execute the command on the DVD-ROM.
- If the automatic mount of the DVD-ROM was performed using the auto mount daemon (autofs) in RHEL5 (Intel64), "noexec" is set for the mount option. Therefore, it is not possible to execute the command on the DVD-ROM.

1.3 Product License Management

The use of these products is restricted by license management.

Therefore, in order to use a product, besides installing the related programs, it is necessary to register the license for that product. There are two methods to register licenses, i.e. the Web Console and command.

The license keys to register are different for each ETERNUS Disk storage system.

1.4 Installation Method

This product provides the following two installation methods:

- Interactive installation

This method installs the program while necessary information (such as the installation directory and the communication port number) is input with the interactive mode.

- Silent installation

This method installs the program using the installation parameter file that already describes the necessary information for the installation.

Because the installer automatically installs the program by reading the necessary information from the installation parameter file, the operator is not gueried during installation.

To use this installation method, an installation parameter file must be created before installing the program.



The necessary information for an installation varies depending on the program that will be installed and the platform.

Chapter 3 Installation of ETERNUS SF Manager

This chapter explains methods for installation of ETERNUS SF Manager.

3.1 Before Installation

The following preparation is necessary before starting the ETERNUS SF Manager installation.

3.1.1 Available Disk Space Verification

Make sure that there is enough available disk space on the server where the installation will be performed. Refer to "2.2.3.1 Required Disk Space for Installation" for information on the disk space required for installation.

If there is not enough available disk space, perform any of the following actions in order to secure the disk space required for installation:

- Increase disks
- Reconfigure the disk partitions

3.1.2 Incompatible Software Uninstallation

Check if any incompatible software is installed on the server where the installation will be performed. If the incompatible software is found, refer to that software manual and uninstall it before starting the installation.

3.1.3 Estimation of Database Size

To install ETERNUS SF Manager, the following database is required.

- Repository

This is used for the managing the information of the operating environment by ETERNUS SF Manager.

For Windows Environment

The database areas must reside on a drive with NTFS format.

The required size of the repository database must be calculated by the following formula.

Formula for Calculating Repository Database

Required size (MB) = (750 + servers * 35 + devices * 9 + backupVolumes * 0.3 + volumePairs * 1.7) / 1024
```

- servers

This is the total number of Management Server and Managed Servers.

For servers that perform the cluster operation, calculate with the number of physical nodes that compose the clustered system.

- devices
 - For AdvancedCopy Manager

This is the total number of devices (partitions) that are managed by AdvancedCopy Manager. This is not to be confused with the total number of devices that are connected to a Managed Server.

For AdvancedCopy Manager, the meaning of "device" is as follows.

- For Express

If a Managed Server is mirrored by SynfinityDISK or PRIMECLUSTER Global Disk Services, the number of devices is the total number of mirror slices. The total number of mirror slices is the result of multiplying the number of devices by the number of disks composing each mirror group.

- backupVolumes

This is the total number of backup volumes. Resources created when performing backup operation.

- volumePairs

This is the total number of copy source/destination volume pairs. Resources created when performing replication operation.



Cautions for Calculating Disk Space for Repository Database

If there is any possibility that the number of servers and/or devices will increase in the future, specify a larger disk space than calculated.

For Solaris or Linux Environment

Formula for Calculating Repository Database

Required size (MB) = (750 + servers * 35 + devices * 9 + backupVolumes * 0.3 + volumePairs * 1.7) / 1024
```

- servers

This is the total number of Management Server and Managed Servers.

For servers that perform the cluster operation, calculate with the number of physical nodes that compose the clustered system.

This is the total number of copy source/destination volume pairs. Resources created when performing replication operation.



If there is a possibility that the number of servers or number of partitions will be increased in future, specify a size that is greater than the estimated size.

If there is a possibility that the number of mirrors or number of devices will be increased in future and SynfinityDISK or PRIMECLUSTER Global Disk Services are used, also specify a size that is greater than the estimated size.

3.1.4 Kernel Parameter Tuning (for Solaris and Linux)

Tune the kernel parameters, which are required for operation.

3.1.4.1 Kernel Parameter Tuning (for Solaris)

For Solaris kernel parameters required tuning, their values, and how to set the values, refer to the following description.

There are two different tuning methods: writing to /etc/system files and writing to /etc/project files. Implement one of these tuning methods as suitable for the installation environment.

- Tuning Using /etc/system
- Tuning Using /etc/project



If the parameters listed in Table have already been set, perform the following. For a parameter listed with a "Maximum value" in the "Standard configuration" column, specify the larger of the current value and the default value. For a parameter listed with an "Addition", specify the larger of the value obtained by adding the value shown to the default value or the current value.

IPv4 is the version of the IP address used by the Management Server. Confirm that the IPv4 address has been set up on the server where the ETERNUS SF Manager will be installed.

Specify the confirmed IPv4 address as the Management Server IP address when installing the ETERNUS SF Manager.

For Solaris or Linux Environment

Edit the installation parameter file as needed and set up the Management Server IP address.

If All Managed Servers Use Only IPv6 Address

IPv6 is the version of the IP address used by the Management Server. Confirm that the IPv6 address has been set up on the server where the ETERNUS SF Manager will be installed.

The IPv4 address must temporarily be specified in installing the ETERNUS SF Manager. As such, specify a temporary IPv4 address (for example, 127.0.0.1) as the Management Server IP address when installing the ETERNUS SF Manager.

Change the address to the appropriate IPv6 address once installation is complete, referring to "4.4.5 Updating Management Server IP Address Information".

For Solaris or Linux Environment

Edit the installation parameter file and set up the temporary IPv4 address for the Management Server IP address.

If Managed Servers Using IPv4 and Managed Servers Using IPv6 Are Combined

IPv4 and IPv6 are the versions of the IP address used by the Management Server. Confirm that the IPv4 and IPv6 addresses have been set up on the server where the ETERNUS SF Manager will be installed.

Of the confirmed IP addresses, specify the IPv4 address as the Management Server IP address when installing the ETERNUS SF Manager. Add the IPv6 address once installation is complete, referring to "4.4.5 Updating Management Server IP Address Information".

For Solaris or Linux Environment

Edit the installation parameter file and set up the IPv4 address for the Management Server IP address.



Refer to "D.9 Install Parameter File (for ETERNUS SF Manager for Solaris/Linux)" for information on the installation parameter file.



For Express, only IPv4 is the version of the IP address that can be used by the Management Server. IPv6 will not be available.

3.1.7 Confirmation of UpdateAdvisor for Middleware (Windows only)

UpdateAdvisor for Middleware is included with ETERNUS SF Manager (for Windows).

This section describes the points to be confirmed when installing ETERNUS SF Manager on a server with UpdateAdvisor for Middleware already installed.

If UpdateAdvisor for Middleware is not installed, confirmation is not required.

Check the version of the installed UpdateAdvisor for Middleware.

To determine the version of the UpdateAdvisor for Middleware included with ETERNUS SF Manager, refer to "Program Components of ETERNUS SF Manager for Windows" in "A.1 Program Components of ETERNUS SF Manager".

- When the installed UpdateAdvisor for Middleware is older than the version of the UpdateAdvisor for Middleware included with ETERNUS SF Manager:
 - The installed UpdateAdvisor for Middleware is updated to the version of the UpdateAdvisor for Middleware included with ETERNUS SF Manager.
- When the installed UpdateAdvisor for Middleware is equal to or later than the version of the UpdateAdvisor for Middleware included with ETERNUS SF Manager:
 - The installed UpdateAdvisor for Middleware is used.

Get the most up-to-date setup file for the update application management ledger from UpdateSite.

When setting up ETERNUS SF Manager, the update application management ledger must be refreshed.

3.1.8 Download of ETERNUS VMware Support Package

When linking VMware with ETERNUS SF Manager with functions such as VMware vSphere Virtual Volumes, in addition to ETERNUS SF Manager, the ETERNUS VMware Support Package must be installed. The ETERNUS VMware Support Package is software that includes the VASA Provider function to link VMware with ETERNUS SF Manager.

When linking VMware, download ETERNUS VASA Provider from the following Fujitsu site:

ETERNUS VMware Support Package must be installed after installing ETERNUS SF Manager.

3.3.1 Editing Install Parameter File

In this manual, the method of installing with the default install parameters is called "default install" and the method of installing by editing the install parameters is called "custom install". When using default install, it is not necessary to edit installation parameters.

An install parameter file is a file in which to specify install parameters such as installation destination directory and port number. This file is stored on DVD-ROM and default values are set for respective install parameters. In addition, this file has both automatic

service activation and automatic service activation prevention. For details on the install parameter file, refer to "D.1 Install Parameter File (for ETERNUS SF Manager for Windows)".

The install parameter file is stored on the DVD-ROM "ETERNUS SF SC/ACM/Express Mediapack for Windows (Manager Program) (1/2)" of this version.

- Storage location
 - For automatic service activation

- For prevention of automatic service activation

```

When changing install parameters, copy the install parameter file on the DVD-ROM to an optional location and edit the copied file. For description of each install parameter, refer to "D.2 Install Parameters (for ETERNUS SF Manager for Windows)".



The file for automatic service activation (install_parameter.ini) is used to activate the ETERNUS SF Manager services after the installation is complete. The file for the prevention of automatic service activation (install_parameter_not_start_service.ini) is used to prevent the ETERNUS SF Manager services from being activated after the installation is complete.

3.3.2 Running Silent Installation

The silent installation procedure of ETERNUS SF Manager (for Windows) is as follows:

1. Log on to the target server as a user with administrator privileges.

- If there is any file of the same name as the specified install log file exists, it is overwritten.
- It is required to specify an existing directory with write permission for the directory in which to store the install log file. If it has no write permission, no error message is output in the command prompt or screen and the process terminates with error.
- If the paths to the install parameter file and install log file contain any spaces, they should be surrounded by double quote characters.
- The characters " | : * ? / . < > , % & ^ ; ! are not supported for path name for install parameter file or install log file.



- If an invalid option is specified, its corresponding error message is output in the install log file and the process exits. No error message is output in the command prompt or screen.

- Do not execute multiple silent install commands at the same time. If a silent install starts while a silent install is executing, the silent install terminates abnormally without creating an install log file.
- 5. On completion of installation, a command prompt is displayed.

 Remove the DVD-ROM media used for installation out of the device.

3.3.3 Checking Silent Installation Result

Check the return value from the silent installation command. If necessary, check the install log file. However, if the return value from the silent installation command is 3 or 9, no install log file is created. For details, refer to "E.1 Return Values for Silent Installation (for ETERNUS SF Manager, AdvancedCopy Manager CCM)".

The installation result can be viewed in the install log file, too.

Open the install log file to see "ResultCode" in the **ResponseResult** section. In "ResultCode" is written the return value from the silent installation command.

3.3.4 Installation of ETERNUS VMware Support Package

When linking VMware, install the ETERNUS VMware Support Package that was downloaded in "3.1.8 Download of ETERNUS VMware Support Package". Refer to the ETERNUS VASA Provider User's Guide for installation.

3.4 Interactive Installation Procedure of ETERNUS SF Manager (for Solaris)

The following two interactive installation methods of ETERNUS SF Manager (for Solaris) are available:

- Default install

Install ETERNUS SF Manager by using the default values described in "D.10 Install Parameters (for ETERNUS SF Manager for Solaris/Linux)".

- Custom install

Install ETERNUS SF Manager by using the modified default values of the installation information (port number for the communications service, and so on).

Define the installation information to the install parameter file. Specify the install parameter file to which the installation information has been defined when executing the install shell.

Refer to "D.9 Install Parameter File (for ETERNUS SF Manager for Solaris/Linux)" for information on the install parameter file. Refer to "D.10 Install Parameters (for ETERNUS SF Manager for Solaris/Linux)" for information on the install parameter.

The interactive installation procedure of ETERNUS SF Manager (for Solaris) is performed as follows:

For the change method, refer to "Changing IP Address of Management server" in the ETERNUS SF AdvancedCopy Manager Operation Guide (for Solaris).

3.5.3 Checking Silent Installation Result

Check the return value from the silent installation command. If necessary, check the install log file. However, if the return value from the silent installation command is 3 or 9, no install log file is created. For details, refer to "E.1 Return Values for Silent Installation (for ETERNUS SF Manager, AdvancedCopy Manager CCM)".

The installation result can be viewed in the install log file, too.

Open the install log file to see "ResultCode" in the **ResponseResult** section. In "ResultCode" is written the return value from the silent installation command.

3.6 Interactive Installation Procedure of ETERNUS SF Manager (for Linux)

The following two interactive installation methods of ETERNUS SF Manager (for Linux) are available:

- Default install

Install ETERNUS SF Manager by using the default values described in "D.10 Install Parameters (for ETERNUS SF Manager for Solaris/Linux)".

- Custom install

Install ETERNUS SF Manager by using the modified default values of the installation information (port number for the communications service, and so on).

Define the installation information to the install parameter file. Specify the install parameter file to which the installation information has been defined when executing the install shell.

Refer to "D.9 Install Parameter File (for ETERNUS SF Manager for Solaris/Linux)" for information on the install parameter file. Refer to "D.10 Install Parameters (for ETERNUS SF Manager for Solaris/Linux)" for information on the install parameter.

The interactive installation procedure of ETERNUS SF Manager (for Linux) is performed as follows:



- If the value of the environment variable PATH exceeds 800 characters, change it to 800 or less characters to install ETERNUS SF Manager (for Linux).
- You cannot change the install directory during the installation.
- Do not rename, change, and delete the install directory after the installation.
- In the process of the installation, a user account "esfpostgres" is created on the operating system. This account is internally used by the ETERNUS SF system.
 - Do not change other than the password or delete the account because it is necessary to operate the ETERNUS SF system. When changing the password, refer to "4.1.1.4 Esfpostgres User Password Change Procedure".
- 1. Login to the server on which to perform the tasks. Perform operations after logging in with root (superuser).
- 2. Make sure that the local file system is mounted.

 If the local file system is not mounted, execute the following command to mount the local file system:

# mount -a
```

- 3. Insert the DVD-ROM "ETERNUS SF SC/ACM/Express Mediapack for Linux 64bit (Manager Program) (2/2)" for this version into the DVD-ROM drive.
- 4. Mount the DVD-ROM.

```

5. Change directory in which the command for installation is stored.

```

- 6. Execute the install shell.
 - For default install:

Specify the absolute path name of the install parameter file edited in advance for *installParamFile*.

3.7 Silent Installation Procedure of ETERNUS SF Manager (for Linux)

Take the following steps for silent installation:

- 1. Edit an install parameter file.
- 2. Run a silent installation.



- If the value of the environment variable PATH exceeds 800 characters, change it to 800 or less characters and run a silent installation.
- At the time of installation, the installation destination directory cannot be changed.
- After installing, do not rename, move or delete the installation destination directory.
- During installation, the operating system user account (esfpostgres) is added.

 Do not change other than the password or delete the account because it is necessary to operate the ETERNUS SF system.

 When changing the password, refer to "4.1.1.4 Esfpostgres User Password Change Procedure".

3.7.1 Editing Install Parameter File

In this manual, the method of installing with the default install parameters is called "default install" and the method of installing by editing the install parameters is called "custom install". When using default install, it is not necessary to edit installation parameters.

An install parameter file is a file in which install parameters such as installation destination directory and port number are specified. This file is store on DVDD-ROM and default values are set for respective install parameters. In addition, this file has both automatic service activation and automatic service activation prevention. For details on the install parameter file, refer to "D.9 Install Parameter File (for ETERNUS SF Manager for Solaris/Linux)".

The install parameter file is stored on the DVD-ROM "ETERNUS SF SC/ACM/Express MediaPack for Linux 64bit (Manager Program) (2/2)" of this version".

- Storage location
 - For automatic service activation

```
dvdromMountDir/Manager_unix/install_parameter.txt
```

- For prevention of automatic service activation

```
dvdromMountDir/Manager_unix/install_parameter_not_start_service.txt
```

When changing install parameters, copy the install parameter file on the DVD-ROM to an optional location and edit the copied file. For descriptions of respective install parameters, refer to "D.10 Install Parameters (for ETERNUS SF Manager for Solaris/Linux)".



The file for automatic service activation (install_parameter.txt) is used to activate the ETERNUS SF Manager services after the installation is complete. The file for the prevention of automatic service activation (install_parameter_not_start_service.txt) is used to prevent the ETERNUS SF Manager services from being activated after the installation is complete.

3.7.2 Running Silent Installation

The silent installation procedure of ETERNUS SF Manager (for Linux) is as follows:

- 1. Login to the server on which to perform the tasks. Perform operations after logging in with root (superuser).
- 2. Make sure that a local file system is mounted.

 If not, run the following command to mount a local file system:

```
# mount -a
```

- 3. Install the DVD-ROM "ETERNUS SF SC/ACM/Express Mediapack for Linux 64bit (Manager Program) (2/2)" of this version into the DVD-ROM drive.
- 4. Mount the DVD-ROM.

```
# mount -t iso9660 -r /dev/cdrom dvdromMountPoint
```

- 5. Execute the following silent installation command.
 - For preventing automatic service activation in default install:

For the *installLogFile*, specify a file to output the installation log with an absolute path. It is optional to specify *installLogFile*.

- For preventing automatic service activation in default install:

Specifying the *installParameterFile* is required.

- The -eula option is specified to agree to licensing. Only when "agreed" is specified for option parameter is installation enabled. The -eula option must be specified before other options.
- If nothing is specified for *installLogFile*, an install log file named "esfsilentinstall.log" is created in the /var/tmp directory.
- If any file of the same name as the specified install log file exists, it is overwritten.
- It is required to specify an existing directory with write permission for the directory in which to store the install log file. If it has no write permission, no error message is output in the command prompt or screen and the process terminates with error.
- If the paths to the install parameter file and install log file contain any spaces, they should be surrounded by double quote characters
- The characters "! \$ are not supported for path name for install log file.



- If an invalid option is specified, its corresponding error message is output in the install log file and the process exits. No error message is output in the command prompt or screen.
- Do not execute multiple silent install commands at the same time. If a silent install starts while a silent install is executing, the silent install terminates abnormally without creating an install log file.
- 6. On completion of installation, a command prompt is displayed.
- 7. Unmount the DVD-ROM.

umount dvdromMountPoint

8. Remove the DVD-ROM media out of the DVD-ROM drive.

This is the end of the installation of ETERNUS SF Manager (for Linux).



If the IP address of the Management Server is not specified for the install parameter file, it is automatically set at the time of installation. On completion of installation, change the IP address as required. For the change method, refer the "Changing IP Address of Management server" in the ETERNUS SF AdvancedCopy Manager Operation Guide (for Linux).

3.7.3 Checking Silent Installation Result

Check the return value from the silent installation command. If necessary, check the install log file. However, if the return value from the silent installation command is 3 or 9, no install log file is created. For details, refer to "E.1 Return Values for Silent Installation (for ETERNUS SF Manager, AdvancedCopy Manager CCM)".

The installation result can be viewed even by the install log file.

Open the install log file to see "ResultCode" in the **ResponseResult** section. In "ResultCode" is written the return value from the silent installation command.

Chapter 4 Setup of ETERNUS SF Manager

This chapter explains procedures and methods for setting up ETERNUS SF Manager.

4.1 Product Common Settings

This section explains the common settings for the managers of Express, Storage Cruiser and AdvancedCopy Manager.

4.1.1 Setting Up User Account

Set up a user account in order to use the ETERNUS SF Manager functions.

The privileges granted to the Web Console user and the command execution user accounts, and their controllable ranges are shown in the table below.

ETERNUS SF Role	Administrator Privilege of Operating System	
LILKINOS SI KOIE	Yes	No
Yes	Operations are possible from the Web Console and the command line.	Operations are possible only from the Web Console.
No	Operations are possible only from the command line.	Operations are neither possible from the Web Console nor from the command line.

The following section explains how to create and set up the Web Console user and the command execution user accounts, and how to change the user (esfpostgres) password internally using the ETERNUS SF system.



- As the user (esfpostgres) used internally by the ETERNUS SF system is required to run the ETERNUS SF system, do not delete the user account. When the product is installed, a default value is set to a password, so change the password before using the ETERNUS SF system. Also, change the password periodically when running the ETERNUS SF system, as well.
- Periodically change the account name and password for the Web Console user and the command execution user.

4.1.1.1 Creating User Accounts for Operating from Web Console

For user authentication when logging in on the Web Console, ETERNUS SF product uses the authentication system of the OS on the Management Server.

In order to give a user the privilege ("role") to use ETERNUS SF product, you need to create ETERNUS SF role groups to which each user account is allocated.

The table below shows the relationships between the ETERNUS SF roles that are given to ETERNUS SF role groups and the Web Console control actions that are permitted to users belonging to the respective role group.

Table 4.1 For Windows Environment

ETERNUS SF Role Group	ETERNUS SF Role	Permitted Web Console Controls	
ESFAdmin	Administrator	All operations	
ESFMon	Monitor	Only display-related operations	

Table 4.2 For Solaris or Linux Environment

esfmon	Monitor	Only display-related operations

1. Create the following two ETERNUS SF role groups.

For Windows Environment

Create the following two groups.

- ESFAdmin
- ESFMon

If using Windows domain authentication, create the ETERNUS SF role groups in the domain controller (Active Directory). If not using Windows domain authentication, create the ETERNUS SF role groups on the Management Server.



- Set the Windows security policy, to permit local logon for the ETERNUS SF role groups.
- For creating the ETERNUS SF role groups in the domain controller (Active Directory), the scope and type of each group need to be specified. Make sure to specify the following values:

Group scope: Domain local

Group type: Security

For Solaris or Linux Environment

Create the following two groups using groupadd command and so on.

- esfadmin
- esfmon
- 2. Create user accounts for operating from the Web Console.

For Windows Environment

If using Windows domain authentication, create user accounts in the domain controller (Active Directory). If not using Windows domain authentication, create user accounts on the Management Server.

For Solaris or Linux Environment

Create a user account on Management Server using useradd command and so on.

3. Assign the created user accounts to ETERNUS SF role groups.

For Windows Environment

Use [Computer Management] and so on.

For Solaris Environment

Configure one of the following to the target user accounts by using a command such as the usermod command.

- Set ETERNUS SF role groups as primary group.
- Add ETERNUS SF role groups to secondary group.

For Linux Environment

Configure one of the following to the target user accounts by using a command such as the usermod command.

- Set ETERNUS SF role groups as main group.
- Add ETERNUS SF role groups to supplementary group.

An ETERNUS SF role is assigned to each user account.



ETERNUS SF role groups can also be created via command line input. The example below shows a batch file for creating a role group. Execute the batch file on the domain controller when using Windows domain authentication. Otherwise execute the batch file on the Management Server.

4.1.1.2 User Account of Windows

Commands for Express, Storage Cruiser, AdvancedCopy Manager and AdvancedCopy Manager CCM can only be executed by users with administrator privileges for the operating system.

This section explains how to create accounts for users who can execute commands.



By assigning a user account created here to an ETERNUS SF role group, you can enable the same user to both operate from the Web Console and execute commands.

For Windows

In Windows Server 2008 or later, a User Account Control function (hereafter called "UAC") has been added to enhance security. The cases where UAC is enabled and disabled are explained below.

- When UAC is enabled

When any user other than the built-in Administrator account (including accounts in the Administrators group) executes a process or program that requires administrator permissions, the "Permissions granted/authorized dialog" is displayed. Permissions granted or authorized must be confirmed.

- When UAC is disabled

Processes or programs that require administrator permissions must be executed by either the built-in Administrator account or a user account in the Administrators group.

The operating conditions are shown below.

Table 4.3 Relationship Between Account and UAC

- A: Runs without displaying the permissions granted dialog box.
- B: Displays the permissions granted dialog box, and runs if permissions are approved.
- C: Does not run, because Administrator permissions cannot be obtained.

If you do not wish to perform the dialog process using the administrator permissions dialog box, and the conditions marked as "B" in the table above apply (for example, in batch processing), the program must be executed using administrator permissions with one of the following methods:

- In the Command Prompt, use "runas" command to execute the program as a user with administrator permissions. A password must be entered after this.

[Batch file (test.bat) execution example]

```
runas /noprofile /user:mymachine\acmuser "cmd.exe /k test.bat"
```

- In the Task Scheduler, specify "Execute with top level privileges" to operate the program.
- Execute the program with the Command Prompt.
 - For Windows Server 2008 or Windows Server 2008 R2

From the **Start** menu, select **All Programs** > **Accessories** and right-click on **Command Prompt**. Specify "Run as Administrator" to run the Command Prompt. Execute the program from the Command Prompt.

- For Windows Server 2012 or later

Specify "Command Prompt (Admin)" to run the Command Prompt. Execute the program from the Command Prompt.

4.1.1.3 User Account of Linux/Solaris

Express (for Linux only), Storage Cruiser, AdvancedCopy Manager and AdvancedCopy Manager CCM commands can only be executed as a root, so operate root user.

4.1.1.4 Esfpostgres User Password Change Procedure

Change the esfpostgres user password with the following procedure.

- For Windows
 - 1. Log on with a user that has Administrator privileges.
 - 2. Activate the command prompt with "Run as Administrator".
 - ${\bf 3.} \ \ {\bf Execute \ the \ following \ batch \ to \ stop \ the \ ETERNUS \ SF \ Manager \ service.}$

```
> $INS_DIR\Common\bin\Stop_ESFservice.bat
```

\$INS_DIR is "Program Directory" specified at the ETERNUS SF Manager installation.

4. Execute the following command to change the esfpostgres user password.

- 5. Open ETERNUS SF Manager Postgres Service from Service Control Manager and change the password used when logging on. Set the same password as the esfpostgres user for the password.
- 6. Execute the following batch to start the ETERNUS SF Manager service.

- For Solaris/Linux

If you set up firewalls between the PC on which the Web Console is launched and the Management Server, set the following port number so as to allow transmission to pass the firewalls. When changing the port number from the default variable, set the port number after the change.

9855 (default)/tcp	From Web Console to Management Server	Screen display and operate from the Web Console

In addition, it is necessary to have JavaScript-enabled and cookie-enabled in the web browser using the Web Console.



Refer to "Operating Environment and Environment Settings" in the *ETERNUS SF Web Console Guide* for information on compatible web browsers and their versions, as well as on methods for setting to JavaScript-enabled and cookie-enabled.

4.1.3 Checking Connection from Web Console

The settings described hereafter use the Web Console. Therefore, launch the Web Console and check that the initial screen is displayed.



Refer to "Starting and Stopping Web Console" in the *ETERNUS SF Web Console Guide* for information on methods for launching and logging into the Web Console.

4.1.4 Configuring UpdateAdvisor for Middleware Environment (Windows only)

Configure UpdateAdvisor for Middleware in order to apply the Consolidated Patch via the Web Console.

If ETERNUS SF Manager has been installed on a server with UpdateAdvisor for Middleware already installed, refresh the update application management ledger of UpdateAdvisor for Middleware.

If ETERNUS SF Manager has been installed on a server without UpdateAdvisor for Middleware installed, it is not necessary to refresh the update application management ledger of UpdateAdvisor for Middleware.

Refer to the UpdateAdvisor for Middleware manual for how to refresh the update application management ledger.

4.2 Setup of Express's Manager

This section explains how to set up the ETERNUS SF Manager as the Express's manager.

4.2.1 Registering User Account for Using Express

Register Express users to be able to use a storage system.

Refer to the following table to create user accounts of system administrator and business administrator.

Table 4.4 Privileges Given to Administrator User Account

Administrator	Privileges
System administrator	User with administrator privileges on the Management Server operating system. Grant the Administrator role from the ETERNUS SF roles. (Add the user account designated for administrative tasks to the ESFAdmin role group)

Grant the Monitor role from the ETERNUS SF roles if performing solely for monitoring storage system or displaying status. Refer to "4.1.1.1 Creating User Accounts for Operating from Web Console" for information on the ETERNUS SF roles.



Any user with privileges described in "Table 4.4 Privileges Given to Administrator User Account" can use Express. Create user accounts used only for Express to prevent unexpected users from using it.



Refer to "Flow from Installation to Operation" in the *ETERNUS SF Express Operation Guide* for information on the roles of system administrator and business administrator.

4.2.2 Configuring Network Environment

If you set up firewalls between the Management Server and ETERNUS Disk storage system, set the following port numbers so as to allow transmissions to pass the firewalls.

Express uses SNMP to register ETERNUS Disk storage system. Therefore, before registering devices, it is required to start SNMP Agent of ETERNUS Disk storage system. ETERNUS Disk storage system that has no SNMP Agent started cannot be registered.

Check the network environment, access privileges and settings of communication mode between Management Server and ETERNUS Disk storage system. If either communication mode of the Management Server or the ETERNUS Disk storage system is set to "Full (full duplex)", do not set the other to "Auto Negotiation".

Refer to the manual for each ETERNUS Disk storage system and check the network environment settings.



The telnet connection and the Maintenance connection should be available on the ETERNUS Disk storage system.

4.2.3 SNMP Trap Setting

Set SNMP Trap to receive SNMP Traps on the Management Server.

4.2.3.1 SNMP Trap Setting (for Windows)

Management Server SNMP Trap settings differs from when monitoring devices only with SNMPv1 protocol in either of the following cases:

- When monitoring devices using only SNMPv3 protocol
- When monitoring devices using SNMPv1 protocol and SNMPv3 protocol

Configure according to the operating environment.

When Monitoring Devices Using Only SNMPv1 Protocol

Install a Windows standard SNMP Trap receiver service (SNMP Trap).

This service is included in the install media of OS.

When Monitoring Devices Using Only SNMPv3 Protocol or When Monitoring Devices Using SNMPv1 Protocol and SNMPv3 Protocol

When Other Applications (Systemwalker Centric Manager, ServerView Resource Orchestrator, etc.) Using SNMP Traps Do Not Coexist

- 1. Take the following steps to stop Express's manager.
 - a. Open the **Services** screen.

For Windows Server 2012, click Control Panel > System and Security > Administrative Tools > Services.

For a Windows environment other than listed above, click Control Panel > Administrative Tools > Services.

b. Select "ETERNUS SF Manager Tomcat Service" to click **Stop**.

^{*2:} For Maintenance connection

2. Execute the following command from the command prompt and install the ETERNUS SF SNMP Trap Service. \$INS_DIR is "Program Directory" specified at the ETERNUS SF Manager installation.

```
> powershell -ExecutionPolicy Unrestricted $INS_DIR\ESC\Manager\opt\FJSVssmgr\sbin \swsttctr.psl -install
```

- 3. Take the following steps to start ETERNUS SF SNMP Trap Service.
 - a. Open the **Services** screen.
 - b. Select "ETERNUS SF SNMP Trap Service" to click **Start**.
- 4. Take the following steps to start Express's manager.
 - a. Open the Services screen.
 - b. Select "ETERNUS SF Manager Tomcat Service" to click **Start**.

When Other Applications (Systemwalker Centric Manager, ServerView Resource Orchestrator, etc.) Using SNMP Traps Coexist



If other applications using SNMP Traps coexist, use only IPv4 address for IP address of managed devices.

If IPv6 address is included in the IP addresses of managed devices, ETERNUS SF Manager cannot coexist with other applications using SNMP Traps.

- 1. Take the following steps to stop Express's manager.
 - a. Open the Services screen.

For Windows Server 2012, click Control Panel > System and Security > Administrative Tools > Services.

For a Windows environment other than listed above, click Control Panel > Administrative Tools > Services.

- b. Select "ETERNUS SF Manager Tomcat Service" to click **Stop**.
- 2. Execute the following command from the command prompt and install the ETERNUS SF SNMP Trap Service. \$INS_DIR is "Program Directory" specified at the ETERNUS SF Manager installation.

```
> powershell -ExecutionPolicy Unrestricted $INS_DIR\ESC\Manager\opt\FJSVssmgr\sbin \swsttctr.psl -install
```

3. Refer to "Appendix J Installation and Configuration of SNMP Trap Transfer Program" to install the SNMP Trap transfer program.

4.2.3.2 SNMP Trap Setting (for Linux)

Management Server SNMP Trap settings differs from when monitoring devices only with SNMPv1 protocol in either of the following cases:

- When monitoring devices using only SNMPv3 protocol
- When monitoring devices using SNMPv1 protocol and SNMPv3 protocol

Configure according to the operating environment.

When Monitoring Devices Using Only SNMPv1 Protocol

Customize the snmptrapd configuration file that is in the OS-standard net-snmp package to receive SNMP Trap in Management Server.

For Red Hat Enterprise Linux 7

Execute the following commands.

```
# systemctl enable snmptrapd.service
# systemctl start snmptrapd.service
```

For Red Hat Enterprise Linux 5 or Red Hat Enterprise Linux 6

Execute the following command and check whether snmptrapd is activated.

```
# chkconfig --list snmptrapd
snmptrapd 0:off 1:off 2:on 3:on 4:on 5:on 6:off
```

If snmptrapd is not activated, execute the following commands to activate it.

```
# chkconfig --add snmptrapd
# chkconfig snmptrapd on
```



The snmptrapd file is located at /etc/snmp/snmptrapd.conf, but the file /usr/share/snmp/snmptrapd.conf is also used in some other products.

Check the settings in both files to ensure they are correct for the sake of coexistence with other products.

Check Access Control Settings

Check the status of the access control settings.

If the following setting is not in snmptrapd.conf, access control is enabled:

disableAuthorization yes



- Check the status of access control settings for both /etc/snmp/snmptrapd.conf and /usr/share/snmp/snmptrapd.conf.
- If there are no requests from other products, set the above "disableAuthorization yes" in /etc/snmp/snmptrapd.conf to disable access control.

SNMP Trap Reception Settings (If Access Control Is Disabled)

Add the following setting to /etc/snmp/snmptrapd.conf:

```
forward default unix:/var/opt/FJSVssmgr/trap_socket
```

SNMP Trap Reception Settings (If Access Control Is Enabled)

Add the following setting:

```
authCommunity net public
authCommunity net SANMA
forward default unix:/var/opt/FJSVssmgr/trap_socket
```

Check both /etc/snmp/snmptrapd.conf and /usr/share/snmp/snmptrapd.conf, and edit the snmptrapd.conf in which authCommunity has been set by other products. If it is not set in either file, edit /etc/snmp/snmptrapd.conf.



- authCommunity is an editable item when access control is enabled.

The format is as follows:

```
authCommunity TYPES COMMUNITY [SOURCE [OID | -v VIEW ]]
```

```
TYPES: log,execute,net
COMMUNITY: SNMP trap community name for a device to be monitored
```

Set log, execute and net in the TYPES field.

Set the SNMP Trap community name for a device to be monitored, in the COMMUNITY field.

Do not set SOURCE, OID and VIEW fields for Express.

For example, set as follows:

```
authCommunity net public authCommunity net SANMA
```

- If an ETERNUS Disk storage system with an SNMP Trap community name other than "public" or "SANMA" is to be monitored, add an authCommunity setting.

For example, if an ETERNUS Disk storage system to be monitored has the community name "common", set this parameter as below. Note that the "public" and "SANMA" settings are mandatory.

```
authCommunity net public
authCommunity net SANMA
authCommunity net common
forward default unix:/var/opt/FJSVssmgr/trap_socket
```

- If authCommunity log or authCommunity execute has already been set by another product, add a comma and "net". For example, if authCommunity execute public is already set, set it as follows:

After having changed the snmptrapd.conf, execute the following commands to restart snmptrapd: The changed content is reflected to the SNMP Trap configuration.

For Red Hat Enterprise Linux 7

Execute the following command.

For Red Hat Enterprise Linux 5 or Red Hat Enterprise Linux 6

Execute the following commands.

```
# /etc/init.d/snmptrapd stop
# /etc/init.d/snmptrapd start
```



If ServerView AlarmService or any other application that uses snmptrapd has been installed, uninstalled, or had its settings changed after snmptrapd.conf has been customized, check that these procedures have not changed the customized content of snmptrapd.conf.



In an environment using ServerView trap transfer program, reactivate the snmptrapd daemon and the trpsrvd daemon.



Refer to "snmptrapd.conf Configuration File" in the *ETERNUS SF Storage Cruiser Operation Guide* for information on the snmptrapd.conf file.

When Monitoring Devices Using Only SNMPv3 Protocol or When Monitoring Devices Using SNMPv1 Protocol and SNMPv3 Protocol

Immediately after ETERNUS SF Manager is installed, the setting is to monitor only SNMPv1 protocol devices. For this reason, change from the snmptrapd that contains the OS-standard net-snmp package using the following procedure:

1. Execute the following command to stop ETERNUS SF Manager.

```
# /opt/FJSVesfcm/bin/stopesf.sh
```

2. If the OS-standard SNMP Trap daemon (snmptrapd of the net-snmp package) has started, execute the following step to stop it

For Red Hat Enterprise Linux 7, execute the following command.

```
# systemctl stop snmptrapd.service
```

For Red Hat Enterprise Linux 5 or Red Hat Enterprise Linux 6, execute the following command.

```
# /etc/init.d/snmptrapd stop
```

3. Perform a configuration of the OS-standard SNMP Trap daemon.

Perform the following settings according to the ETERNUS SF Manager program that is installed.

- For Red Hat Enterprise Linux 7:

If the OS-standard SNMP Trap daemon automatically starts when the system starts, execute the following command to stop automatic start.

```
# systemctl disable snmptrapd.service
```

- For Red Hat Enterprise Linux 6:

If the OS-standard SNMP Trap daemon automatically starts when the system starts, execute the following command to stop automatic start.

```
# chkconfig snmptrapd off
# chkconfig --list snmptrapd
```

- For Red Hat Enterprise Linux 5:

The settings are performed automatically when installing the package. No special setting is necessary.

- 4. Perform an installation and configuration of the SNMP Trap daemon package.
 - a. Installation of the package

Install the FJSVswstt-XXXX.rpm package to /opt/FJSVssmgr/etc/pkg.

```
# rpm -i /opt/FJSVssmgr/etc/pkg/FJSVswstt-XXXX.rpm
```

The XXXX part of the package file is depends on the platform of the system.

The command for Red Hat Enterprise Linux 6 and Red Hat Enterprise Linux 7 is as follows:

```
# rpm -i /opt/FJSVssmgr/etc/pkg/FJSVswstt-V13.7.0-1.x86_64.rpm
```

b. Configuring automatic startup

Perform this procedure only for Red Hat Enterprise Linux 7. Configure the automatic startup of the SNMP Trap daemon by executing the following commands.

cp -p /opt/FJSVssmgr/etc/pkg/startsc-snmptrapd.service /usr/lib/systemd/system
systemctl enable startsc-snmptrapd.service

c. Start the OS-standard SNMP Trap daemon

Perform this procedure only for Red Hat Enterprise Linux 5. Restart the OS-standard SNMP Trap daemon by executing the following command.

/etc/init.d/snmptrapd restart

5. Execute the following command to start ETERNUS SF Manager.

/opt/FJSVesfcm/bin/startesf.sh



For environments mixed with Systemwalker Centric Manager on the same server, the SNMP Trap daemon may stop if Systemwalker Centric Manager is uninstalled.

If Systemwalker Centric Manager was uninstalled from the mixed environment, take the following actions:

- 1. Execute the following command to confirm that nwsnmp-trapd is running.
 - For Red Hat Enterprise Linux 7

systemctl status startsc-snmptrapd.service

- For Red Hat Enterprise Linux 5 or Red Hat Enterprise Linux 6

ps -ef | grep nwsnmp-trapd

- 2. If nwsnmp-trapd is not running, restart the system or execute the following command.
 - For Red Hat Enterprise Linux 7

systemctl start startsc-snmptrapd.service

- For Red Hat Enterprise Linux 5 or Red Hat Enterprise Linux 6

/opt/FJSVswstt/bin/mpnm-trapd stop

/opt/FJSVswstt/bin/mpnm-trapd start

Installation of SELinux Policy Module for SNMP Trap Daemon

For SELinux is set to "enforcing", apply the policy module, according to the following procedure.

If Red Hat Enterprise Linux 7, default is SELinux = Enforcing.

By executing this procedure, the SELinux policy module for the snmptrapd daemon is automatically installed, and it is possible to receive events via SNMP Traps.



Check that other products have changed the policy setting for snmptrapd daemon before applying the policy of this product to snmptrapd daemon. Customize the policy setting if necessary.

If the policy is not set correctly, snmptrapd daemon may not work.

- If customizations are not made to the SELinux policy module Execute the following command to apply the SELinux policy module.

/opt/FJSVssmgr/etc/selinux/esfsepolicy_setup.sh

- If customizations are made to the SELinux policy module

By performing this procedure, the SELinux policy for the snmptrapd daemon can be changed.

The policy definition file that corresponds to the SELinux policy module is as follows.

For creating the SELinux policy, selinux-policy-devel package is required.

If a package has not been installed, create a policy after installing the package.

The following procedure is required to register the target ETERNUS Disk storage system. This procedure should be performed by the system administrator.

1. Execute the following preparations for each ETERNUS Disk storage system to be registered.

Using the ETERNUS Web GUI, perform the following settings. Refer to the ETERNUS Web GUI manual for information on each setting.

- Check the IP address of the Management Server.

If there is a Management Server on a subnet different from the subnet for which ETERNUS Disk storage system is set up, check that the IP address of the Management Server is registered to the "Allowed IP List" in the Set Network Environment screen on the ETERNUS Web GUI.

If it is not registered to the list, register the IP address of the Management Server to the "Allowed IP List".

- Enable the SNMP function of MNT port on the following screen.

- Check the ETERNUS Disk storage system name displayed in the **Name** column on the Modify Storage System Name screen. When using Advanced Copy functions, specify 16 or less alphanumeric characters for ETERNUS Disk storage system name.
- If you connect iSCSI, specify "Enable" the use of iSNS server in the target port.

Additionally perform the following settings for ETERNUS DX80 S2/DX90 S2, DX60 S3/DX100 S3/DX200 S3, ETERNUS DX200F:

- On the following screen of the ETERNUS Web GUI, create a new SSH server key. The number of bits for the key is at your discretion.

- On the Setup User Account screen of the ETERNUS Web GUI, create a Software Role Account. In later procedures, specify the account information you created here.
- When managing devices using SNMPv1, you must set the SNMP community name on the ETERNUS Disk storage system. Set the SNMP community name on the Setup SNMP Agent Community screen of the ETERNUS Web GUI.
- When managing devices using SNMPv3, you must set the SNMP user name on the ETERNUS Disk storage system. Set the SNMP user name on the Setup SNMP Agent User screen of the ETERNUS Web GUI.
- 2. Launch the Web Console, and then register the target ETERNUS Disk storage system.

- To start Storage Cruiser's manager, map the host name of Storage Cruiser's manager to the corresponding IP address of it for host name resolution. There are methods to map them such as registering them to DNS or describing them in hosts file.

Refer to "B.3.1 Registration of License" for information on how to register licenses.



There are two methods to register licenses, i.e. the Web Console and command.

To be able to use the Web Console, the ETERNUS Disk storage system must be registered in Storage Cruiser beforehand. Refer to "4.2.4 Registering Disk Storage System" for information on how to register the ETERNUS Disk storage system.

By using command, the license can be registered on ETERNUS Disk storage system that is not registered in Storage Cruiser.

4.3.3 SNMP Trap Setting

Set SNMP Trap to receive SNMP Traps on the Management Server.

4.3.3.1 SNMP Trap Setting (for Windows)

Management Server SNMP Trap settings differs from when monitoring devices only with SNMPv1 protocol in either of the following cases:

- When monitoring devices using only SNMPv3 protocol
- When monitoring devices using SNMPv1 protocol and SNMPv3 protocol

Configure according to the operating environment.

When Monitoring Devices Using Only SNMPv1 Protocol

Install a Windows standard SNMP Trap receiver service (SNMP Trap).

This service is included in the install media of OS.

When Monitoring Devices Using Only SNMPv3 Protocol or When Monitoring Devices Using SNMPv1 Protocol and SNMPv3 Protocol

When Other Applications (Systemwalker Centric Manager, ServerView Resource Orchestrator, etc.) Using SNMP Traps Do Not Coexist

- 1. Take the following steps to stop Storage Cruiser's manager.
 - a. Open the Services screen.

For Windows Server 2012, click Control Panel > System and Security > Administrative Tools > Services.

For a Windows environment other than listed above, click Control Panel > Administrative Tools > Services.

- b. Select "ETERNUS SF Manager Tomcat Service" to click **Stop**.
- 2. Execute the following command from the command prompt and install the ETERNUS SF SNMP Trap Service. \$INS_DIR is "Program Directory" specified at the ETERNUS SF Manager installation.

```
> powershell -ExecutionPolicy Unrestricted $INS_DIR\ESC\Manager\opt\FJSVssmgr\sbin \swsttctr.ps1 -install
```

- 3. Take the following steps to start ETERNUS SF SNMP Trap Service.
 - Open the Services screen.
 - b. Select "ETERNUS SF SNMP Trap Service" to click **Start**.
- 4. Take the following steps to start Storage Cruiser's manager.
 - a. Open the **Services** screen.
 - b. Select "ETERNUS SF Manager Tomcat Service" to click **Start**.

When Other Applications (Systemwalker Centric Manager, ServerView Resource Orchestrator, etc.) Using SNMP Traps Coexist



If other applications using SNMP Traps coexist, use only IPv4 address for IP address of managed devices.

If IPv6 address is included in the IP addresses of managed devices, ETERNUS SF Manager cannot coexist with other applications using SNMP Traps.

- 1. Take the following steps to stop Storage Cruiser's manager.
 - a. Open the Services screen.

For Windows Server 2012, click Control Panel > System and Security > Administrative Tools > Services.

For a Windows environment other than listed above, click Control Panel > Administrative Tools > Services.

- b. Select "ETERNUS SF Manager Tomcat Service" to click **Stop**.
- 2. Execute the following command from the command prompt and install the ETERNUS SF SNMP Trap Service. \$INS_DIR is "Program Directory" specified at the ETERNUS SF Manager installation.

```
> powershell -ExecutionPolicy Unrestricted $INS_DIR\ESC\Manager\opt\FJSVssmgr\sbin \swsttctr.psl -install
```

3. Refer to "Appendix J Installation and Configuration of SNMP Trap Transfer Program" to install the SNMP Trap transfer program.

4.3.3.2 SNMP Trap Setting (for Linux)

The SNMP Trap settings of the Management Server differ depending on the IP address of devices or the protocol used for fault monitoring. Perform a configuration according to the operating environment by referring to the following table.

IP Address of Managed Device	Protocol to Be Used with Device Fault Monitoring	SNMP Trap Settings
IPv4 address only	SNMPv1 only	Refer to "When Using OS-standard SNMP Trap Monitoring Daemon".
IPv4 address only	SNMPv3 only, or SNMPv1 and SNMPv3	Refer to "When Using ETERNUS SF SNMP Trap
IPv4 address and IPv6 address		Monitoring Daemon".

When Using OS-standard SNMP Trap Monitoring Daemon

Customize the snmptrapd configuration file that is in the OS-standard net-snmp package to receive SNMP Trap in Management Server.

For Red Hat Enterprise Linux 7

Execute the following commands.

```
# systemctl enable snmptrapd.service
# systemctl start snmptrapd.service
```

For Red Hat Enterprise Linux 5 or Red Hat Enterprise Linux 6

Execute the following command and check whether snmptrapd is activated. \\

```
# chkconfig --list snmptrapd
snmptrapd 0:off 1:off 2:on 3:on 4:on 5:on 6:off
```

If snmptrapd is not activated, execute the following command to activate it.

```
# chkconfig --add snmptrapd
# chkconfig snmptrapd on
```



The snmptrapd file is located at /etc/snmp/snmptrapd.conf, but the file /usr/share/snmp/snmptrapd.conf is also used in some other products.

Check the settings in both files to ensure they are correct for the sake of coexistence with other products.

Check Access Control Settings

Check the status of the access control settings.

If the following setting is not in snmptrapd.conf, access control is enabled:

disableAuthorization yes



- Check the status of access control settings for both /etc/snmp/snmptrapd.conf and /usr/share/snmp/snmptrapd.conf.
- If there are no requests from other products, set the above "disableAuthorization yes" in /etc/snmp/snmptrapd.conf to disable access control.

SNMP Trap Reception Settings (If Access Control Is Disabled)

Add the following setting to /etc/snmp/snmptrapd.conf:

```
forward default unix:/var/opt/FJSVssmgr/trap_socket
```

SNMP Trap Reception Settings (If Access Control Is Enabled)

Add the following setting:

```
authCommunity net public
authCommunity net SANMA
forward default unix:/var/opt/FJSVssmgr/trap_socket
```



- Check both /etc/snmp/snmptrapd.conf and /usr/share/snmp/snmptrapd.conf, and edit the snmptrapd.conf in which authCommunity has been set by other products. If it is not set in either file, edit /etc/snmp/snmptrapd.conf.
- If a device with an SNMP Trap community name other than "public" or "SANMA" is to be monitored, add an authCommunity setting.

For example, if a device to be monitored has the community name "common", set this parameter as below. Note that the "public" and "SANMA" settings are mandatory.

```
authCommunity net public
authCommunity net SANMA
authCommunity net common
forward default unix:/var/opt/FJSVssmgr/trap_socket
```

- If authCommunity log or authCommunity execute has already been set by another product, add a comma and "net". For example, if authCommunity execute public is already set, set it as follows:

```
authCommunity execute,net public
authCommunity net SANMA
forward default unix:/var/opt/FJSVssmgr/trap_socket
```

Reflect Configuration File

After having changed the snmptrapd.conf, execute the following commands to restart snmptrapd: The changed content is reflected to the SNMP Trap configuration.

For Red Hat Enterprise Linux 7

Execute the following command.

systemctl restart snmptrapd.service

For Red Hat Enterprise Linux 5 or Red Hat Enterprise Linux 6

Execute the following commands.

- # /etc/init.d/snmptrapd stop
- # /etc/init.d/snmptrapd start



In an environment using ServerView trap transfer program, restart the snmptrapd daemon and the trpsrvd daemon.



If ServerView AlarmService or any other application that uses snmptrapd has been installed, uninstalled, or had its settings changed after snmptrapd.conf has been customized, check that these procedures have not changed the customized content of snmptrapd.conf.



Refer to "snmptrapd.conf Configuration File" in the *ETERNUS SF Storage Cruiser Operation Guide* for information on the snmptrapd.conf file.

When Using ETERNUS SF SNMP Trap Monitoring Daemon

Immediately after installing ETERNUS SF Manager, the system is set to use the OS-standard SNMP Trap monitoring daemon. For this reason, change from the snmptrapd that contains the OS-standard net-snmp package using the following procedure:

- 1. Execute the following command to stop ETERNUS SF Manager.
 - # /opt/FJSVesfcm/bin/stopesf.sh
- 2. If the OS-standard SNMP Trap daemon (snmptrapd of net-snmp package) has started, execute the following steps to stop it. For Red Hat Enterprise Linux 7, execute the following command:

```
# systemctl stop snmptrapd.service
```

For Red Hat Enterprise Linux 5 or Red Hat Enterprise Linux 6, execute the following command:

- # /etc/init.d/snmptrapd stop
- 3. Make the settings of the OS-standard SNMP Trap daemon.

Make the following settings depending on the version of the installed ETERNUS SF Manager program.

- For Red Hat Enterprise Linux 7:
 If the OS-standard SNMP Trap daemon has automatically started when the system started, execute the following command to stop automatic start.
 - # systemctl disable snmptrapd.service
- For Red Hat Enterprise Linux 6:
 If the OS-standard SNMP Trap daemon has automatically started when the system started, execute the following command to stop automatic start.
 - # chkconfig snmptrapd off
 - # chkconfig --list snmptrapd

- For Red Hat Enterprise Linux 5:

The settings are performed automatically when installing the package. No special setting is necessary.

- 4. Perform an installation and configuration of the SNMP Trap daemon package.
 - a. Installation of package

Install the FJSVswstt-XXXX.rpm package in /opt/FJSVssmgr/etc/pkg.

```
# rpm -i /opt/FJSVssmgr/etc/pkg/FJSVswstt-XXXX.rpm
```

XXXX part of the package file is depending on the platform of the system.

Red Hat Enterprise Linux 6 and Red Hat Enterprise Linux 7 are as shown below:

```
# rpm -i /opt/FJSVssmgr/etc/pkg/FJSVswstt-V13.7.0-1.x86_64.rpm
```

b. Configuration of automatic startup

This procedure is only performed for Red Hat Enterprise Linux 7. Execute the following commands to configure the automatic startup of the SNMP Trap daemon.

```
# cp -p /opt/FJSVssmgr/etc/pkg/startsc-snmptrapd.service /usr/lib/systemd/system
# systemctl enable startsc-snmptrapd.service
```

c. Start the OS-standard SNMP Trap daemon

This procedure is only performed for Red Hat Enterprise Linux 5. Execute the following command to restart the OS-standard SNMP Trap daemon.

```
# /etc/init.d/snmptrapd restart
```

5. Execute the following command to start ETERNUS SF Manager.

```
# /opt/FJSVesfcm/bin/startesf.sh
```



It can be mixed with the following products on the same server if monitoring the IPv6 address device:

- Systemwalker Centric Manager Management Server (V13.6.0 or later)
- Systemwalker Centric Manager Section control server (V13.6.0 or later)

Uninstalling the above products may stop the SNMP Trap daemon. Execute the following when the above products have been uninstalled from the mixed environment.

- 1. Execute the following command and confirm that nwsnmp-trapd is running.
 - For Red Hat Enterprise Linux 7

```
# systemctl status startsc-snmptrapd.service
```

- For Red Hat Enterprise Linux 5 or Red Hat Enterprise Linux 6

```
# ps -ef | grep nwsnmp-trapd
```

- 2. If nwsnmp-trapd is not running, restart the system or execute the following command.
 - For Red Hat Enterprise Linux 7

```
# systemctl start startsc-snmptrapd.service
```

- For Red Hat Enterprise Linux 5 or Red Hat Enterprise Linux 6

```
# /opt/FJSVswstt/bin/mpnm-trapd stop
# /opt/FJSVswstt/bin/mpnm-trapd start
```

Installation of SELinux Policy Module for SNMP Trap Daemon

For environments in which SELinux is set to "Enforcing", apply the policy module, according to the following procedure. If Red Hat Enterprise Linux 7, default is SELinux = Enforcing.

By performing this procedure, the SELinux policy module for the snmptrapd daemon or the nwsnmp-trapd daemon is automatically installed, and event notifications can be received depending on the SNMP Trap.



Check that other products have changed the policy setting for snmptrapd daemon or nwsnmp-trapd daemon before applying the policy of this product to snmptrapd daemon or nwsnmp-trapd daemon. Customize the policy settings if necessary. If the policy is not set correctly, snmptrapd daemon or nwsnmp-trapd daemon may not work.

- If customizations are not made to the SELinux policy module Execute the following command to apply the SELinux policy module.

```
# /opt/FJSVssmgr/etc/selinux/esfsepolicy_setup.sh
```

If customizations are made to the SELinux policy module
 By performing this procedure, the SELinux policy for the snmptrapd daemon or the nwsnmp-trapd daemon can be changed.
 The policy definition file that corresponds to the SELinux policy module is as follows.

In Red Hat Enterprise Linux 7, the contents of the default SELinux policy module definition file are as follows.

Implement the following procedure to customize:

- 1. Refer to "Table 4.6 SELinux Policy Module Customization File" and check the file name to use.
- 2. Copy and correct the policy definition file that corresponds to the system in an optional directory.
- 3. When changing the file context definition, create a file context.

 The created file context is stored in the directory with the corrected policy definition file.
- 4. Move to the directory with the corrected policy definition file.
- 5. Execute the following command. SELinux policy module is created in the current directory.

```
# make -f /usr/share/selinux/devel/Makefile
```

6. Execute the following command to change the setting to "SELinux=Permissive":

```
# setenforce 0
```

7. Execute the following command to apply the policy module.

```
# /usr/sbin/semodule -i policyModuleName
```

8. Execute the following command to check that the policy module name is displayed:

9. Execute the following command to revert the setting to "SELinux=Enforcing":

```
# setenforce 1
```



For creating the SELinux policy, selinux-policy-devel package is required.

If a package has not been installed, create a policy after installing the package.

4.3.3.3 SNMP Trap Setting (for Solaris)

There are no specific settings for receiving the SNMP Trap in Management Server.



This software can be used in the mixed environment with the following software. When uninstalled, the SNMP Trap monitoring daemon may be stopped.

- Systemwalker Centric Manager Management Server
- Systemwalker Centric Manager Section control server
- Systemwalker Network Assist
- Systemwalker Network Topology Manager

When above software is uninstalled in the mixed environment, execute the following commands:

1. Check whether nwsnmp-trapd is running by executing the following command.

```
# /bin/ps -ef | grep nwsnmp-trapd
```

2. If nwsnmp-trapd is not running, reboot the system or execute the following commands.

/opt/FJSVswstt/bin/mpnm-trapd stop

/opt/FJSVswstt/bin/mpnm-trapd start

4.3.4 Setting Up End to End List Display for Hyper-V (Windows only)

To display the End to End list for the VM guest on the Hyper-V host, set up the Management Server with referring to "End to End List Display" in the ETERNUS SF Storage Cruiser Operation Guide.

4.4 Setup of AdvancedCopy Manager's Manager

This section explains how to set up the ETERNUS SF Manager as the AdvancedCopy Manager's manager for using Agent-based operating model.

Refer to "Chapter 8 Setup of AdvancedCopy Manager CCM" for information on the setup for Agent-less operating model.

4.4.1 Configuring Network Environment

If you set up firewalls between the Management Server and Managed Servers, as well as between the Management Server and an ETERNUS Disk storage system, set the following port numbers so as to allow transmissions to pass the firewalls. When changing the port number from the default variable, set the port number after the change.

X: Any number can be specified.



For registering a license to ETERNUS Disk storage system, enable the ssh connection or the telnet connection in setting up interface on the ETERNUS Disk storage system.

Available types of connections vary with the model of ETERNUS Disk storage system. Refer to Note in "B.3 Operation of License Management Function" for details.

4.4.2 Registering AdvancedCopy Manager License

Using the command of the license management function, the AdvancedCopy Manager licenses must be registered for each of ETERNUS Disk storage systems managed in AdvancedCopy Manager.

Refer to "B.1 Types of License" for information on licenses and their respectively available functions.

Refer to "B.3.1 Registration of License" for information on how to register licenses.



There are two methods to register licenses, i.e. the Web Console and command. To be able to use the Web Console, the ETERNUS Disk storage system must be registered in AdvancedCopy Manager beforehand. Refer to "4.2.4 Registering Disk Storage System" for information on how to register the ETERNUS Disk storage system.

4.4.3 Advanced Copy Settings

It is necessary to configure the copy table size of Advanced Copy for each of ETERNUS Disk storage systems managed in AdvancedCopy Manager.

Refer to "Configure Copy Table Size for Advanced Copy" in the *ETERNUS SF Web Console Guide* for information on the operation procedures.

4.4.4 Path Settings for Remote Advanced Copy

When the REC is performed using AdvancedCopy Manager, it is necessary to set the REC path for all of ETERNUS Disk storage systems which the REC is performed.

Refer to "Display/Set REC Path" in the ETERNUS SF Web Console Guide for information on the operation procedures.

4.4.5 Updating Management Server IP Address Information

Update Management Server IP address information.

The work required differ depending on the version of the IP address used in Management Server operation.

If Only IPv4 Address Is Used

No work is necessary.

If Only IPv6 Address Is Used

Change the version of the Management Server IP address to IPv6.

Change the temporary IPv4 address set up when installing ETERNUS SF Manager to the IPv6 address.

Execute the staxfwcmmodsrv command with the -f option to update IP address information.

Describe only the IPv6 address for the IP address.

If Both IPv4 and IPv6 Addresses Are Used

Add the IPv6 address as the Management Server IP address.

Execute the stgxfwcmmodsrv command with the -f option to update IP address information.

Describe both the IPv4 and IPv6 addresses for the IP address.



Refer to "Changing IP Address of Management Server" in the *ETERNUS SF AdvancedCopy Manager Operation Guide* for the OS of the Management Server for the update procedure of IP address information.

4.5 Setup of Various Information

This section explains the settings for the following information to be managed by ETERNUS SF Manager.

After the completion of the manager setting, perform the following information setting by using the Web Console.

- History information
 - Operation history
 - Events

- Login/Logout history
- Threshold monitoring alarm
- Screen refresh information
 - Screen refresh interval
- Session information
 - session timeout

The following section explains the settings for each type of information.

4.5.1 Setting for History Information

Set the number of days and capacity to retain the following four history information that is collected by ETERNUS SF Manager.

- Operation history
- Events
- Login/Logout history
- Threshold monitoring alarm

Refer to "Change Value for Log Preference" in the ETERNUS SF Web Console Guide for the method of settings.

The value range and initial values are as follows.

Either the "Number of days kept" or "File size" can be specified for the save definition.

History Type	Save Definition	Value Range	Initial Value
Events	Number of days kept	between 1 and 365 days	30 days
	file size	between 10 and 100 MB]
Operation history	Number of days kept	between 1 and 365 days	30 days
	file size	between 10 and 100 MB]
Login/Logout history	Number of days kept	between 1 and 365 days	60 days
	file size	between 10 and 100 MB]
Threshold monitoring alarm	Number of days kept	between 1 and 365 days	60 days



Since Express and AdvancedCopy Manager do not support threshold monitoring, settings for information on threshold monitoring alarm cannot be made.

4.5.2 Setting for Screen Refresh Information

Set the interval for automatic refreshment of the Web Console screen.

Refer to "Change Value for Screen Refresh Preference" in the ETERNUS SF Web Console Guide for the method of settings.

4.5.3 Setting for Session Information

Set the session timeout time.

Refer to "Change Value for Session Timeout" in the ETERNUS SF Web Console Guide for the method of settings.

4.5.4 Settings for Event Notification E-mails

Any trouble occurring on any device managed by ETERNUS SF Manager is indicated as an event. Administrators can be notified of events by e-mail.

For receiving event notifications by E-mail, the contact e-mail address must be set by using the Web Console.

Refer to "Display/Change Contact Information" in the ETERNUS SF Web Console Guide for the method of settings.

After setting the contact e-mail address, use the Web Console to send a test E-mail and check whether it arrives at the specified E-mail address.

Refer to "Send Test E-mail" in the ETERNUS SF Web Console Guide for the method of sending a test E-mail.

Chapter 5 Installation of ETERNUS SF Agent

ETERNUS SF Agent has the following two types of agents:

- Storage Cruiser's agent
- AdvancedCopy Manager's agent

This chapter explains methods for installation of each agent.

5.1 Installation of Storage Cruiser's Agent

This section explains how to install the Storage Cruiser's agent.

5.1.1 Before Installation

The following preparation is necessary before starting the Storage Cruiser's agent installation.

5.1.1.1 Available Disk Space Verification

Make sure that there is enough available disk space on the server where the installation will be performed. Refer to "2.3.3.1 Required Disk Space for Installation" for information on the disk space required for installation.

If there is not enough available disk space, perform either of the following actions in order to secure the disk space required for installation:

- Increase disks
- Reconfigure the disk partitions

5.1.1.2 Previous Version and Incompatible Software Uninstallation

Check if Storage Cruiser at older version or any incompatible software is installed on the server where the installation will be performed. If found, refer to the following manual and uninstall it before starting the installation.

Refer to "2.3.2.3 Incompatible Software" for information on the incompatible software for Storage Cruiser's agent.

Software to Be Uninstalled	Reference Manual
Incompatible software	Manual for incompatible software

Check the installation progress for older version Storage Cruiser using the following method:

For Windows Environment

From the **Control Panel**, open the **Programs and Features** page to check whether components of an older version of Storage Cruiser are displayed.

If any component of Storage Cruiser is displayed, confirm the version.

For Solaris Environment

Perform the following procedure.

- 1. Login to the server on which to perform the tasks. Perform operations after logging in with root (superuser).
- 2. Insert the DVD-ROM "ETERNUS SF SC/ACM Mediapack (Agent Program and Manual)" for this version into the DVD-ROM drive and mount the DVD-ROM.

In below example of command execution, the device name of the DVD-ROM drive is mounted as /dev/dsk/c0t4d0s0. The device name for the DVD-ROM drive, however, may be different for your particular device.

mount -F hsfs -o ro /dev/dsk/c0t4d0s0 dvdromMountPoint

3. Execute the following command:

```
# cd dvdromMountPoint/Agent_unix/Storage_Cruiser/Solaris
# ./scagtinstall.sh -check
```

If there is any incompatible software installed, you will be notified by a corresponding message. If this output states a Storage Cruiser's agent package, check the version.

For Linux Environment

Perform the following procedure.

- 1. Login to the server on which to perform the tasks. Perform operations after logging in with root (superuser).
- 2. Insert the DVD-ROM "ETERNUS SF SC/ACM/Express Mediapack (Agent Program and Manual)" for this version into the DVD-ROM drive and mount the DVD-ROM.

In below example of command execution, the device name of the DVD-ROM drive is mounted as /dev/cdrom. The device name for the DVD-ROM drive, however, may be different for your particular device.

```
# mount -t iso9660 -r /dev/cdrom dvdromMountPoint
```

3. Execute the following command:

```
# cd dvdromMountPoint/Agent_unix/Storage_Cruiser/Linux
# /bin/sh ./scagtinstall.sh -check
```

If there is any incompatible software installed, you will be notified by a corresponding message. If this output states a Storage Cruiser's agent package, check the version.

For HP-UX Environment

Perform the following procedure.

- 1. Login to the server on which to perform the tasks. Perform operations after logging in with root (superuser).
- 2. Execute the following command to launch the daemon required for this task:

```
# /usr/sbin/pfs_mountd &
# /usr/sbin/pfsd &
```

3. Insert the DVD-ROM "ETERNUS SF SC/ACM/Express Mediapack (Agent Program and Manual)" for this version into the DVD-ROM drive and mount the DVD-ROM.

In below example of command execution, the device name of the DVD-ROM drive is mounted as /dev/dsk/c1t2d0. The device name for the DVD-ROM drive, however, may be different for your particular device.

- For earlier than v11.23:

```
# /usr/sbin/pfs_mount -t rrip -x unix /dev/dsk/clt2d0 dvdromMountPoint
```

- For v11.23 or later:

```
# mount -F cdfs /dev/dsk/c1t2d0 dvdromMountPoint
```

4. Execute the following command:

If this output states a Storage Cruiser's agent package, check the version.

For AIX Environment


Tab Name	Explanation
Port number	This port number is used for transmission between the Storage Cruiser's agent and the manager. Enter the same number as specified in the Management Server configuration.
	The default value is 4917, and there is usually no need to change this value. However, if the system is already using this port number, enter an unused port number. Values between 1024 and 65535 are valid. In this case, it is necessary to change the port number of "sscruisera" service in the Management Server to same number.
	The used port number can be checked with %SystemRoot%\system32\drivers\etc\services file.
Start IP address	In order to have Storage Cruiser's agent communicate with Storage Cruiser's manager on the correct LAN path, set the Start IP address as the IP address to be used for data communication by the Managed Server (an IP address in the administrative LAN). Depending on the IP addresses that are set on the Managed Server, make this setting as follows:
	- If the Managed Server has only one IP address, enter its IP address.
	 If multiple IP addresses are set up on the Managed Server, select and specify a Start IP address from the network configuration of the Managed Server and the Management Server. Basically, you should specify an IP address that is set up in the LAN on the route side of the Management Server.



In this manual, installing using the default install parameters is referred to as "default install" and installing with edited install parameters is referred to as "custom install".

- If nothing is specified for *installLogFile*, an install log file named "scagtsilentinstall.log" is created in the working directory specified for the environment variable TEMP.
- If there is any file of the same name as the specified install log file exists, it is overwritten.
- It is required to specify an existing directory with write permission for the directory in which to store the install log file. If it has no write permission, no error message is output onto the command prompt or screen and the process terminates with error.
- If the paths to the install parameter file and install log file contain any spaces, they should be surrounded by double quote characters.
- The characters " | : * ? / . < > % & ^ ; ! are not supported for path name for install parameter file or install log file.



- If an invalid option is specified, its corresponding error message is output in the install log file and the process exits. No error message is output in the command prompt or screen.
- Do not execute multiple silent install commands at the same time. If a silent install starts while a silent install is executing, the silent install terminates abnormally without creating an install log file.
- In the case of default install or in the case the IP address is not specified for "Agent_server_IP_address" of the install parameter file at custom install, on completion of installation, agent information should be set by the setagtip command.
- 5. On completion of installation, a command prompt is displayed.

 Remove the DVD-ROM media used for installation out of the device.







4. Execute the following command to install Storage Cruiser's agent.

```
# cd dvdromMountPoint/Agent_unix/Storage_Cruiser/AIX
# /bin/sh ./scagtinstall.sh
```

5. The following message will be output. To execute the installation, enter 'y'. To discontinue the installation, enter any key except 'y'.

```
ETERNUS SF Storage Cruiser 16.3

Copyright FUJITSU LIMITED 2013-2015

This program will install "ETERNUS SF Storage Cruiser" Agent on your system.

Do you want to continue the installation of this package? [y,n,?,q]
```

6. If 'y' was entered in step 5, the installation will continue.

When installation is completed normally, the following message will be displayed.

```
INFO: Starting Installation of ETERNUS SF Storage Cruiser ...

INFO: Installation of <FJSVssage> was successful.

INFO: ETERNUS SF Storage Cruiser Agent was installed successfully.
```

If there is any error during installation, the following message will be displayed.

```
ERROR : not privileged or
INFO : Installation is terminated.
or
ERROR : Installing FJSVssage was failed.
```

- 7. Check that the installation is successfully completed.
 - 1. Execute the following command:

```
# /usr/sbin/lsitab FJSVssage
```

If the installation is successfully completed, the following message is displayed.

```
FJSVssage:2:once:/opt/FJSVssage/bin/sstorageagt >/dev/null 2>&1
```

If the message is not displayed, the installation is failed. Confirm "Chapter 2 Operating Environment" and install again.

2. Confirm that all of the following directories exist.

If any of the following directories do not exist, the installation failed. Delete the package according to "10.1.9 Interactive Uninstallation Procedure of Storage Cruiser's Agent (for AIX)" and install again.

- /opt/FJSVssage
- /etc/opt/FJSVssage
- /var/opt/FJSVssage

The Storage Cruiser's agent (for AIX) installation is completed.

Refer to "6.1 Setup of Storage Cruiser's Agent" to set up the Storage Cruiser's agent.

5.2 Installation of AdvancedCopy Manager's Agent

This section explains how to install the AdvancedCopy Manager's agent.

5.2.1 Before Installation

The following preparation is necessary before starting the AdvancedCopy Manager's agent installation.

5.2.1.1 Available Disk Space Verification

Make sure that there is enough available disk space on the server where the installation will be performed. Refer to "2.4.3.1 Required Disk Space for Installation" for information on the disk space required for installation.

If there is not enough available disk space, perform either of the following actions in order to secure the disk space required for installation:

- Increase disks
- Reconfigure the disk partitions

5.2.1.2 Previous Version and Incompatible Software Uninstallation

Check if SystemWalker/StorageMGR, AdvancedCopy Manager at older version or any incompatible software is installed on the server where the installation will be performed.

If found, refer to the following manual and uninstall it before starting the installation.

Refer to "2.4.2.3 Incompatible Software" for information on the incompatible software for AdvancedCopy Manager's agent.

Software to Be Uninstalled	Reference Manual
SystemWalker/StorageMGR	Installation manual of SystemWalker/StorageMGR for relevant version and types of M/A and SE/EE
Incompatible software other than listed above	Manual for incompatible software

Check the installation progress for SystemWalker/StorageMGR or previous version AdvancedCopy Manager using the following method:

For Windows Environment

From the **Control Panel**, open the **Programs and Features** page to check whether components of SystemWalker/StorageMGR or older version AdvancedCopy Manager are displayed.

If any component is displayed, perform the actions described below.

- If the component of SystemWalker/StorageMGR is displayed:
 - SystemWalker/StorageMGR is installed. Referring to the displayed result, confirm the version and types of M/A and SE/EE.
- If the component of AdvancedCopy Manager is displayed:

An older version of AdvancedCopy Manager is installed. Confirm the version.

For Solaris Environment

Execute the following command:

```
# pkginfo -l FJSVswsts
```

If the package information is displayed, SystemWalker/StorageMGR or an older version of AdvancedCopy Manager is installed.

- If the package information displays "SystemWalker/StorageMGR":
 - SystemWalker/StorageMGR is installed. Referring to the displayed result, confirm the version and types of M/A and SE/EE.
- If the package information displays "AdvancedCopy Manager":

An older version of AdvancedCopy Manager is installed. Confirm the version.

The type of installed component (manager or agent) can be checked by executing the following command:

```
# pkginfo -l FJSVswssc
```

If the package information is output, the component of AdvancedCopy Manager's manager is installed. If no information is output, the component of AdvancedCopy Manager's agent is installed

For Linux Environment

Execute the following command:

```
# rpm -qi FJSVswsts
```

If "AdvancedCopy Manager" is displayed in the command result, an older version of AdvancedCopy Manager is installed. Confirm the version

The type of installed component (manager or agent) can be checked by the following command:

rpm -qi FJSVswssc

If the package information is output, the component of AdvancedCopy Manager's manager is installed. If no information is output, the component of AdvancedCopy Manager's agent is installed

For HP-UX Environment

Check whether any of the following files are on the server:

- /opt/swstorage/etc/swstg.ini
- /etc/opt/swstorage/swstg.ini

If any of the above files are on the server, SystemWalker/StorageMGR or an older version of AdvancedCopy Manager is installed.

- If "SystemWalker/StorageMGR" is described in /opt/swstorage/setup/stg/swsetup.ini file, SystemWalker/StorageMGR is installed. Referring to the file, confirm the version and types of SE/EE.
- If "AdvancedCopy Manager" is described in /opt/swstorage/setup/stg/swsetup.ini file, an older version of AdvancedCopy Manager is installed. Confirm the version.

For AIX Environment

Check whether any of the following files are on the server:

- /opt/swstorage/etc/swstg.ini
- /etc/opt/swstorage/swstg.ini

If any of the above files are on the server, an older version of AdvancedCopy Manager is installed.

If "AdvancedCopy Manager" is described in /opt/swstorage/setup/stg/swsetup.ini file, an older version of AdvancedCopy Manager is installed. Confirm the version.

5.2.2 Interactive Installation Procedure of AdvancedCopy Manager's Agent (for Windows)

There are two methods of performing the interactive installation of AdvancedCopy Manager's agent (for Windows).

- Default installation

Default installation uses the following configuration information. You can skip those entries.

- Installation destination

The "systemDrive:\Win32app\AdvancedCopyManager" directory is used as the base location for the Program Directory, Environment Directory, and Work Directory.

- Port number for the communication service
 - "1226" is used.
- Custom installation

You need to enter the configuration information for installation on the screen (installation destination, communication service port number).



5.2.3 Silent Installation Procedure of AdvancedCopy Manager's Agent (for Windows)

Take the following steps for silent installation:

- 1. Edit an install parameter file.
- 2. Run a silent installation.

For version upgrade installation, refer to the ETERNUS SF Migration Guide of this version.

5.2.3.1 Editing Install Parameter File

In this manual, the method of installing with the default install parameters is called "default install" and the method of installing by editing the install parameters is called "custom install". When using default install, it is not necessary to edit installation parameters.

An install parameter file is a file in which to specify install parameters such as installation destination directory and port number. This file is stored on DVD-ROM and default values are set for respective install parameters. In addition, this file has both automatic service activation and automatic service activation prevention. For details on the install parameter file, refer to "D.5 Install Parameter File (for AdvancedCopy Manager's Agent for Windows)".

The install parameter file is stored on the DVD-ROM "ETERNUS SF SC/ACM/Express Mediapack (Agent Program and Manual)" of this version.

Based on the following criteria, select an agent to be installed:

Function to Be Used	Description
When using online backup function working with Exchange Server:	Select 64-bit agent. AdvancedCopy Manager (64bit) for Windows Server 2008 / 2012 (x64) is installed. The Symfoware linkage function is not available (copy and replication functions).
When using Symfoware linkage function:	Select 32-bit agent. AdvancedCopy Manager (32bit) for Windows Server 2008 / 2012 (x86,x64) is installed. The function working with Exchange Server is not available.
When using neither of those above:	Select 64-bit agent. AdvancedCopy Manager (64bit) for Windows Server 2008 / 2012 (x64) is installed.

- Storage location
 - For automatic service activation
 - For 32-bit agent:

 $dvdromDrive: \verb|\Agent_windows| AdvancedCopy_Manager| agent| windows_x86 \verb|\install_parameter.ini| and the control of the con$

- For 64-bit agent:

 ${\it dvdromDrive:} \verb|\Agent_windows| AdvancedCopy_Manager| agent| windows_x64| install_parameter.ini| and {\it dvdromDrive:} agent_windows_x64| agen$

- For prevention of automatic service activation
 - For 32-bit agent:

dvdromDrive:\Agent_windows\AdvancedCopy_Manager\agent\windows_x86\
install_parameter_not_start_service.ini

- For 64-bit agent:

dvdromDrive:\Agent_windows\AdvancedCopy_Manager\agent\windows_x64\
install_parameter_not_start_service.ini

When changing install parameters, copy the install parameter file on DVD-ROM to an optional location and edit the copied file. For description of each install parameter, refer to "D.6 Install Parameters (for AdvancedCopy Manager's agent for Windows)".



The file for automatic service activation (install_parameter.ini) is used to activate the AdvancedCopy Manager's agent services after the installation is complete. The file for the prevention of automatic service activation (install_parameter_not_start_service.ini) is used to prevent the AdvancedCopy Manager's agent services from being activated after the installation is complete.

5.2.3.2 Running Silent Installation

The silent installation procedure of AdvancedCopy Manager's agent (for Windows) is as follows:

- 1. Log on to the target server as a user with administrator privileges.
- 2. Install the DVD-ROM "ETERNUS SF SC/ACM/Express Mediapack (Agent Program and Manual)" of this version into the DVD-ROM drive. If the Installer screen is displayed by autorun, exit the installer.
- 3. Start the command prompt with "Run as administrator".
- 4. Execute the following silent installation command.
 - For automatic service activation in default install:

For *installLogFile*, specify the file in which to output installation log with an absolute path. It is optional to specify for *installLogFile*.

- For 32-bit agent:

```
dvdromDrive:\Agent_windows\AdvancedCopy_Manager\agent
\windows_x86\acmagtsilentinstall.bat [-l installLogFile]
```

- For 64-bit agent:

```
dvdromDrive:\Agent_windows\AdvancedCopy_Manager\agent
\windows_x64\acmagtsilentinstall.bat [-1 installLogFile]
```

- For preventing automatic service activation in default install:

It is mandatory to specify installParameterFile.

For *installParameterFile*, specify the file stored on DVD-ROM (install_parameter_not_start_service.ini) with an absolute path.

For *installLogFile*, specify a file in which to output an installation log with an absolute path. It is optional to specify *installLogFile*.

- For 32-bit agent:

```
dvdromDrive:\Agent_windows\AdvancedCopy_Manager\agent
\windows_x86\acmagtsilentinstall.bat -s installParameterFile [-l installLogFile]
```

- For 64-bit agent:

```
dvdromDrive:\Agent_windows\AdvancedCopy_Manager\agent
\windows_x64\acmagtsilentinstall.bat -s installParameterFile [-l installLogFile]
```

The following is an execution example of a 64-bit agent.

- When the DVD-ROM drive is "D" and the install log file is "C:\silentinstall.log"

```
D:\Agent_windows\AdvancedCopy_Manager\agent\windows_x64\acmagtsilentinstall.bat -s D:\Agent_windows\AdvancedCopy_Manager\agent\windows_x64\install_parameter_not_start_service.ini -l C:\silentinstall.log
```

- For custom install:

For *installParameterFile*, specify with an absolute path. It is mandatory to specify for *installParameterFile*. For *installLogFile*, specify the file in which to output installation log with an absolute path. It is optional to specify for *installLogFile*.

- For 32-bit agent:

```
dvdromDrive:\Agent_windows\AdvancedCopy_Manager\agent
\windows_x86\acmagtsilentinstall.bat -s installParameterFile [-1 installLogFile]
```

- For 64-bit agent:

```
dvdromDrive:\Agent_windows\AdvancedCopy_Manager\agent
\windows_x64\acmagtsilentinstall.bat -s installParameterFile [-l installLogFile]
```



- If nothing is specified for *installLogFile*, an install log file named "acmagtsilentinstall.log" is created in the working directory specified by the environment variable TEMP.
- If there is any file of the same name as the specified install log file exists, it is overwritten.
- It is required to specify an existing directory with write permission for the directory in which to store the install log file. If it has no write permission, no error message is output in the command prompt or screen and the process terminates with error.
- If the paths to the install parameter file and install log file contain any spaces, they should be surrounded by double quote characters.
- The characters " | : * ? / . < > % & ^ ; ! are not supported for path name for install parameter file or install log file.



- If an invalid option is specified, its corresponding error message is output in the install log file and the process exits. No error message is output in the command prompt or screen.
- When reinstalling AdvancedCopy Manager's agent on Windows Server 2012 or later, if you change following port number for service in AdvancedCopy Manager's agent, delete the following service name defined in the %SystemRoot% \system32\drivers\etc\services file before reinstalling:
 - stgxfws
- Do not execute multiple silent install commands at the same time. If a silent install starts while a silent install is executing, the silent install terminates abnormally without creating an install log file.
- 5. On completion of installation, a command prompt is displayed. Remove the DVD-ROM media used for installation out of the device.

5.2.3.3 Checking Silent Installation Result

Check the return value from the silent installation command. If necessary, check the install log file. However, if the return value from the silent installation command is 3 or 9, no install log file is created. For details, refer to "E.3 Return Values for Silent Installation (for AdvancedCopy Manager's Agent)".

The installation result can be viewed in the install log file, too.

Open the install log file to see "ResultCode" in the **ResponseResult** section. In "ResultCode" is written the return value from the silent installation command. Refer to "6.2 Setup of AdvancedCopy Manager's Agent" and set up AdvancedCopy Manager's agent.

5.2.4 Interactive Installation Procedure of AdvancedCopy Manager's Agent (for Solaris)

The interactive installation procedure of AdvancedCopy Manager's agent (for Solaris) is as follows:

- 1. Login to the server on which to perform the tasks. Perform operations after logging in with root (superuser).
- 2. Insert the DVD-ROM "ETERNUS SF SC/ACM/Express Mediapack (Agent Program and Manual)" for this version into the DVD-ROM drive and mount the DVD-ROM.

In below example of command execution, the device name of the DVD-ROM drive is mounted as /dev/dsk/c0t4d0s0. The device name for the DVD-ROM drive, however, may be different for your particular device.

```
# mount -F hsfs -o ro /dev/dsk/c0t4d0s0 dvdromMountPoint
```

3. Install AdvancedCopy Manager's agent.

By executing the following command, multiple packages are installed at one time.

```
 \verb| # cd | \textit{dvdrom} \verb| MountPoint/Agent_unix/AdvancedCopy_Manager/Solaris \\
```

./swsetup



If, instead of the swsetup command, you execute the easysetup command, specifying the installation directory and registering the port number in the /etc/services file will not be necessary.

- Example of executing the command:

```
# cd dvdromMountPoint/Agent_unix/AdvancedCopy_Manager/Solaris
# ./easysetup [-0]
```

or

```
# ./easysetup -p port-number [-o]
```

- Operation overview depending on specified options:

Specified Option	Overview of Operation
None	The port number used on the Managed Server is 1226 (default). If the port number for the stgxfws service is already registered in the /etc/services file, this registered port number will be used for installation, so that registration of the port number can be omitted.
-р	Use this option to change the port number used on the Managed Server. The port number must be specified within a range from 1024 to 65535. If the port number for the stgxfws service is already registered in the /etc/services file, the registered port number will be used for installation, so that registration of the port number can be omitted.
-0	Use this option if the port number and installation destination directory are to be specified by the interactive setup. If the port number for the stgxfws service is already registered in the /etc/services file, or if this option is specified at the same time as the -p option, the registered port number will be used for installation, so the port number will not be requested.

- Cautions for executing the easysetup command:
 - A default value is used for the destination directory of installation. Refer to step 8 of this procedure for information on this default value.

- The port number is not registered if the stgxfws service port number or the port number specified by the -p option is already registered by other software. Refer to "6.2.2 Port Number Setting" to register the port number manually.

4. If an older version of AdvancedCopy Manager is installed, the following message will be displayed and installation processing is aborted.

```
# swsetup: ERROR: AdvancedCopy Manager is already installed.
```

5. When the following message is displayed, enter the installation destination directory.

The directory names in above message have the following meanings:

Directory Name	Meaning
Program install directory	This is the directory to which the package will be installed. The default directory is /opt.
Fixed configuration directory	This is the directory to which the files for the environment settings will be installed. The default directory is /etc/opt.
Modifying configuration directory	This is the directory to which the modified files (log files, temporary files, etc.) will be installed. The default directory is /var/opt.

For modifying any installation destination directory, enter 'y' and proceed to step 9. For not modifying, enter 'n' or press the [Return] key and proceed to step 10.

6. Specify the installation destination directory.

When the message below is displayed, enter the directory into which to install.

```
Please specify install directory: (default: /opt) [?,q] /acm/opt

Please specify fixed configuration directory: (default: /etc/opt) [?,q] /acm/etc/opt

Please specify variable configuration directory: (default: /var/opt) [?,q] /acm/var/opt
```

When input is complete, a confirmation message like the one below will be displayed.

To confirm the message, enter 'n' or press the [Return] key.

To make any other changes, enter 'y' and then modify.

```
Installation settings for this setup are as follows:

Program install directory : /acm /opt

Fixed configuration directory : /acm /etc/opt
```



Spaces and the characters " ' * = are not supported for directory names.

7. On entering the installation destination directory, a message like the one below will be displayed. Enter 'y' to continue, or 'n' to cancel the installation.

```
Do you want to continue with the installation of this package? [y,n,?]
```

8. If 'y' is entered in step 7, the installation will continue.

When the installation completes successfully, the following message will be displayed.

```
swsetup: AdvancedCopy Manager was installed successfully.
```

9. Execute the following commands, and then eject the DVD-ROM:

```
# cd /
# umount dvdromMountPoint
```

The AdvancedCopy Manager's agent (for Solaris) installation is completed.

Refer to "6.2 Setup of AdvancedCopy Manager's Agent" to set up the AdvancedCopy Manager's agent.

5.2.5 Silent Installation Procedure of AdvancedCopy Manager's Agent (for Solaris)

Take the following steps for silent installation:

- 1. Edit an install parameter file.
- 2. Run a silent installation.

For version upgrade installation, refer to the *ETERNUS SF Migration Guide* of this version.

5.2.5.1 Editing Install Parameter File

An install parameter file is a file in which to specify install parameters such as installation destination directory or port number. This file is stored on DVD-ROM and default values are set for respective install parameters. For details on the install parameter file, refer to "D.13 Install Parameter File (for AdvancedCopy Manager' Agent for Solaris/Linux)".

The install parameter file is stored on the DVD-ROM "ETERNUS SF SC/ACM/Express Mediapack (Agent Program and Manual)" of this version.

- Storage location

```
dvdrom Mount Dir/{
m Agent\_unix/Advanced Copy\_Manager/Solaris/install\_parameter.txt}
```

When installing with default install parameter values, no editing is required.

When changing install parameters, copy the install parameter file on the DVD-ROM to an optional location and edit the copied file. For description of each install parameter, refer to "D.14 Install Parameters (for AdvancedCopy Manager's Agent for Solaris/Linux)".

In this manual, installing using the default install parameter values is referred to as "default install" and installing with edited install parameters is referred to as "custom install".

5.2.5.2 Running Silent Installation

The silent installation procedure of AdvancedCopy Manager's agent is as follows:

1. Login to the server on which to perform the tasks. Perform operations after logging in with root (superuser).

2. Install the DVD-ROM "ETERNUS SF SC/ACM/Express Mediapack (Agent Program and Manual)" of this version in the DVD-ROM drive to mount the DVD-ROM media.

In the following example of command execution, the device name of the DVD-ROM drive is mounted as /dev/dsk/c0t4d0s0. The device name of a DVD-RO drive varies with the device:

```
# mount -F hsfs -o ro /dev/dsk/c0t4d0s0 dvdromMountPoint
```

- 3. Execute the following silent installation command.
 - For default install:

For *installLogFile*, specify the file in which to output installation log with an absolute path. It is optional to specify for *installLogFile*.

```
# dvdromMountPoint/Agent_unix/AdvancedCopy_Manager/Solaris/acmagtsilentinstall.sh [-l
installLogFile]
```

For custom install:

Specify for *installParameterFile* with an absolute path. It is mandatory to specify for *installParameterFile*. For *installLogFile*, specify the file in which to output installation log with an absolute path. It is optional to specify for *installLogFile*.

dvdromMountPoint/Agent_unix/AdvancedCopy_Manager/Solaris/acmagtsilentinstall.sh -s
installParameterFile [-1 installLogFile]



- If nothing is specified for *installLogFile*, an install log file named "acmagtsilentinstall.log" is created in /var/tmp directory.
- If there is any file of the same name as the specified install log file exists, it is overwritten.
- It is required to specify an existing directory with write permission for the directory in which to store the install log file. If it has no write permission, no error message is output in the command prompt or screen and the process terminates with error.



- If an invalid option is specified, its corresponding error message is output in the install log file and the process exits. No error message is output in the command prompt or screen.
- Do not execute multiple silent install commands at the same time. If a silent install starts while a silent install is executing, the silent install terminates abnormally without creating an install log file.
- 4. On completion of installation, a command prompt is displayed.

 After running the following command, remove the DVD-ROM media used for installation, out of the device.

umount *dvdromMountPoint*

5.2.5.3 Checking Silent Installation Result

Check the return value from the silent installation command. If necessary, check the install log file. However, if the return value from the silent installation command is 3 or 9, no install log file is created. For details, refer to "E.3 Return Values for Silent Installation (for AdvancedCopy Manager's Agent)".

The installation result can be viewed in the install log file, too.

Open the install log file to see "ResultCode" in the **ResponseResult** section. In "ResultCode" is written the return value from the silent installation command. Refer to "6.2 Setup of AdvancedCopy Manager's Agent" to set up AdvancedCopy Manager's agent.

5.2.6 Interactive Installation Procedure of AdvancedCopy Manager's Agent (for Linux)

The interactive installation procedure of AdvancedCopy Manager's agent (for Linux) is as follows:

- 1. Login to the server on which to perform the tasks. Perform operations after logging in with root (superuser).
- 2. Insert the DVD-ROM "ETERNUS SF SC/ACM/Express Mediapack (Agent Program and Manual)" for this version into the DVD-ROM drive and mount the DVD-ROM.

In below example of command execution, the device name of the DVD-ROM drive is mounted as /dev/cdrom. The device name for the DVD-ROM drive, however, may be different for your particular device.

```
# mount -t iso9660 -r /dev/cdrom dvdromMountPoint
```

3. Install AdvancedCopy Manager's agent.

By executing the following command, multiple packages are installed at one time.

```
# cd environmentDir
# ./swsetup
```

5.2.7 Silent Installation Procedure of AdvancedCopy Manager's Agent (for Linux)

Take the following steps for silent installation:

- 1. Edit an install parameter file.
- 2. Run a silent installation.

For version upgrade installation, refer to the ETERNUS SF Migration Guide of this version.

5.2.7.1 Editing Install Parameter File

An install parameter file is a file in which to specify install parameters such as installation destination directory or port number. This file is stored on DVD-ROM and default values are set for respective install parameters. For details on the install parameter file, refer to "D.13 Install Parameter File (for AdvancedCopy Manager' Agent for Solaris/Linux)".

The install parameter file is stored on the DVD-ROM "ETERNUS SF SC/ACM/Express Mediapack (Agent Program and Manual)" of this version.

5.2.7.2 Running Silent Installation

The silent installation procedure of AdvancedCopy Manager's agent (for Linux) is as follows:

- 1. Login to the server on which to perform the tasks. Perform operations after logging in with root (superuser).
- 2. Install the DVD-ROM "ETERNUS SF SC/ACM/Express Mediapack (Agent Program and Manual)" of this version in the DVD-ROM drive to mount the DVD-ROM media.

In the following example of command execution, the device name of the DVD-ROM drive is mounted as /dev/dsk/c0t4d0s0. The device name of a DVD-RO drive varies with the device:

```
# mount -t iso9660 -r /dev/cdrom dvdromMountPoint
```

- 3. Execute the following silent installation command.
 - For default install:

For *installLogFile*, specify the file in which to output installation log with an absolute path. It is optional to specify for *installLogFile*.

```
# eachEnvironmentDir/acmagtsilentinstall.sh [-l installLogFile]
```

- For custom install:

Specify for *installParameterFile* with an absolute path. It is mandatory to specify for *installParameterFile*. For *installLogFile*, specify the file in which to output installation log with an absolute path. It is optional to specify for *installLogFile*.

```
# eachEnvironmentDir/acmagtsilentinstall.sh -s installParameterFile [-l installLogFile]
```

5.2.8 Interactive Installation Procedure of AdvancedCopy Manager's Agent (for HP-UX)

The interactive installation procedure of AdvancedCopy Manager's agent (for HP-UX) is as follows:

- 1. Login to the server on which to perform the tasks. Perform operations after logging in with root (superuser).
- 2. Execute the following command to launch the daemon required for this task: This task is not necessary for OS v11.23 or later.

```
# /usr/sbin/pfs_mountd &
# /usr/sbin/pfsd &
```

3. Insert the DVD-ROM "ETERNUS SF SC/ACM/Express Mediapack (Agent Program and Manual)" for this version into the DVD-ROM drive and mount the DVD-ROM.

In below example of command execution, the device name of the DVD-ROM drive is mounted as /dev/dsk/c1t2d0. The device name for the DVD-ROM drive, however, may be different for your particular device.

- For earlier than v11.23:

- For v11.23 or later:

```
# mount -F cdfs /dev/dsk/clt2d0 dvdromMountPoint
```



Cautions about mounting the DVD-ROM:

- If the user (usually "root") who executes the pfs_mount command belongs to 9 or more groups, the following error message will be output:

```

The interactive installation procedure of AdvancedCopy Manager's agent (for AIX) is as follows:

- 1. Login to the server on which to perform the tasks. Perform operations after logging in with root (superuser).
- 2. Insert the DVD-ROM "ETERNUS SF SC/ACM/Express Mediapack (Agent Program and Manual)" for this version into the DVD-ROM drive and mount the DVD-ROM.

In below example of command execution, the device name of the DVD-ROM drive is mounted as /dev/cd0. The device name for the DVD-ROM drive, however, may be different for your particular device.

```
# /usr/sbin/mount -o ro -v cdrfs /dev/cd0 dvdromMountPoint
```

3. Install AdvancedCopy Manager's agent.

By executing the following command, multiple packages are installed at one time.

```
 \verb| # cd | dvdromMountPoint/Agent_unix/AdvancedCopy_Manager/AIX \\
```

./swsetup

Also, AdvancedCopy Manager may not start normally when the OS is restarted, and this would have an adverse effect on operation. Do not use the reboot command to restart the OS, use the shutdown command.

Chapter 6 Setup of ETERNUS SF Agent

This chapter explains procedures and methods for setting up Storage Cruiser's agent and AdvancedCopy Manager's agent.

6.1 Setup of Storage Cruiser's Agent

This section explains how to set up Storage Cruiser's agent.

6.1.1 Port Number Setting

By default, Storage Cruiser's agent uses LAN port number 4917 to communicate with Storage Cruiser's manager (Management Server). The relationship of service name, port number, protocol name, sender and receiver is as follows:

Service Name	Port Number / Protocol	Sender	Receiver
sscruisera	4917/tcp	Storage Cruiser's manager	Storage Cruiser's agent



If this port number is already being used in the system, allocate an unused port number. In this case, it is necessary to change the port number of "sscruisera" service in the Management Server to same number.

Methods for setting the port number to be used are described below. If no other port number is specified, port number 4917 will be applied when launching Storage Cruiser's agent.

For Windows Environment

This information reflects the port number that was entered during installation of Storage Cruiser's agent, in the **Registration of Agent service** page to the services file. Check that the setting for the specified port number is applied, and that the port number is not being used for other purposes.

#Service name Port number/protocol name sscruisera 4917/tcp



- If the specified port number is already being used for other purposes, edit the %SystemRoot%\system32\drivers\etc\services file manually and change to an unused port number. Values between 1024 and 65535 are valid.
- On Windows Server 2008 or later, the firewall is active by default. For this reason, the port number settings on the side where the agents receive data must be configured so that communications can pass through the firewall. If a port number is modified, adapt these settings accordingly.

For Solaris, Linux or HP-UX Environment

Enter the service name, the port number to be used, and the protocol name into the /etc/services file. The example below shows how to set "4917" for the port number to be used.

#Service name Port number/protocol name sscruisera 4917/tcp



- If the specified port number is already being used for other purposes, change to an unused port number. Values between 1024 and 65535 are valid.

- If a firewall is active for a port number on the side where the agents receive data, the settings must be configured so that communications can pass through the firewall. If a port number is modified, adapt these settings accordingly.

For AIX Environment

Run the following command in order to set the service name, the protocol name, and the port number to be used in the /etc/ services file.

The example below shows how to set "4917" for the port number to be used.

/usr/sbin/chservices -a -v sscruisera -p tcp -n 4917



- If the specified port number is already being used for other purposes, change to an unused port number. Values between 1024 and 65535 are valid.

- If a firewall is active for a port number on the side where the agents receive data, the settings must be configured so that communications can pass through the firewall. If a port number is modified, adapt these settings accordingly.

6.1.2 Start IP Address Setting

In order to have Storage Cruiser's agent communicate with Storage Cruiser's manager on the correct LAN path, set the "Start IP address" as the IP address (IP address in the administrative LAN) to be used for data communication by the Managed Server.

For Solaris, Linux, HP-UX or AIX environment, set the Start IP address as described in procedure below.

For Windows environment, this procedure is required only when Storage Cruiser's agent was installed in either of the following ways:

- The Silent Installation function was installed by default.
- The Silent Installation function was customized and installed without specifying any IP address for "Agent_server_IP_address" in the install parameter file.

For Windows Environment

- 1. If Storage Cruiser's agent is currently running, stop its services.
 - a. Open the **Services** screen.
 - For Windows Server 2012

Click Control Panel > System and Security > Administrative Tools > Services.

- For Windows environment other than above

Click Control Panel > Administrative Tools > Services.

- b. Select "ETERNUS SF Storage Cruiser Agent" and then click **Stop**.
- 2. Set the Start IP address to Storage Cruiser's agent.

```
> $INS_DIR\ESC\Agent\bin\setagtip -i ipAddress
```

\$INS_DIR is "Program Directory" specified at the Storage Cruiser's agent installation.

For Solaris, Linux, HP-UX or AIX Environment

1. If Storage Cruiser's agent is currently running, execute the following command to stop it:

```
# /opt/FJSVssage/bin/pstorageagt
```

2. Set the Start IP address to Storage Cruiser's agent.

```
# /opt/FJSVssage/bin/setagtip -i ipAddress
```



About Setting Values for Start IP Address

Depending on the IP address configuration on the Managed Server, make the following settings:

- If only one IP address is set up on the Managed Server, specify that IP address.
- If multiple IP addresses are set up on the Managed Server, select and specify a Start IP address from the network configuration of the Managed Server and the Management Server. Basically, you should specify an IP address that is set up in the LAN on the route side of the Management Server.
- In firewall and other environments applying IP address translation (e.g. NAT), do not set up the IP address of the server itself but an IP address that can receive transmissions from the Management Server.



The following notes apply when using the IPv6 address.

- Only the global address is supported.
- The Web Console displays the IP address in accordance with RFC5952. As such, the IP address format displayed may differ from the content specified using this command.

6.1.3 SNIA HBA API Library Installation (Excluding HP-UX)

For managing an HBA that is mounted on a Managed Server, it is necessary to install the SNIA HBA API library distributed by the HBA vendor.

Refer to the *ETERNUS SF Storage Cruiser SNIA HBA API Library Installation Guide* at the following URL for information on how to install the HBA API library:

http://storage-system.fujitsu.com/global/doc/sms/

This website offers various technical documentation and catalogs for Storage Cruiser.

6.1.4 Correlation.ini File Modification (Solaris only)

When an OS standard HBA driver is in use, it is necessary to modify the correlation.ini file that sets the details of the Storage Cruiser's agent using the following commands:

```
# cp -p /etc/opt/FJSVssage/Correlation.ini /etc/opt/FJSVssage/Correlation.ini.org
# cp -p /etc/opt/FJSVssage/Correlation.ini.sun /etc/opt/FJSVssage/Correlation.ini
```

When following HBA is used, the change in "Correlation.ini" is unnecessary because the HBA driver of OS standard is not used:

- SE0X7F11F
- SE0X7F12F
- SE0X7F11L
- SE0X7F12L



When "Correlation.ini" is changed, information on the following server node middleware is displayed:

- Multipath driver (MPxIO only)
- File system

6.1.5 Auto Stop Setting (AIX only)

In order to let the agents stop automatically when the system is stopped, modify the /etc/rc.shutdown file. Add the contents that are shown in below example of file modification.

If there is no /etc/rc.shutdown file, create it as a new file and add the contents from the example of file modification.

Refer to your AIX documentation for information on the /etc/rc.shutdown file.

Example of File Modification

```
if [ -x /opt/FJSVssage/bin/pstorageagt ]
then
   /bin/sh -c "/opt/FJSVssage/bin/pstorageagt;exit 0"
fi
```

6.1.6 System Rebooting (Excluding Windows)

After completing the settings, reboot the system. Storage Cruiser's agent will start automatically.

The following are command examples for rebooting the system.

For Solaris Environment

```
# /usr/sbin/shutdown -y -g0 -i6
```

For Linux Environment

```
# /sbin/shutdown -r now
```

For HP-UX Environment

```
# /sbin/shutdown -r -y 0
```

For AIX Environment

```
# /usr/sbin/shutdown -r now
```

6.1.7 Restart/Start of Storage Cruiser's Agent (Windows only)

After completing the settings, restart or start Storage Cruiser's agent.

- 1. Open the **Services** screen.
 - For Windows Server 2012

Click Control Panel > System and Security > Administrative Tools > Services.

- For Windows environment other than above

Click Control Panel > Administrative Tools > Services.

- 2. Select "ETERNUS SF Storage Cruiser Agent".
 - When the service status of Storage Cruiser's agent is "Executing" or "Started":

Click Restart Service.

- When the service status of Storage Cruiser's agent is "Blank Space (Stopped)":

Click Start Service.

6.1.8 Setting Up End to End List Display for Hyper-V (Windows only)

To display the End to End list for the VM guest on the Hyper-V host, refer to "End to End List Display" in the *ETERNUS SF Storage Cruiser Operation Guide* to set up the Hyper-V host.

6.2 Setup of AdvancedCopy Manager's Agent

This section explains how to set up AdvancedCopy Manager's agent.

6.2.1 Setting Up User Account

Set up a user account in order to use the AdvancedCopy Manager's agent functions.

6.2.1.1 User Account of Windows

AdvancedCopy Manager commands can only be executed by users with administrator privileges for the operating system.

This section explains how to create accounts for users who can execute commands.

In Windows Server 2008 or later, a User Account Control function (hereafter called "UAC") has been added to enhance security. The cases where UAC is enabled and disabled are explained below.

- When UAC is enabled

When any user other than the built-in Administrator account (including accounts in the Administrators group) executes a process or program that requires administrator permissions, the "Permissions granted/authorized dialog" is displayed. Permissions granted or authorized must be confirmed.

- When UAC is disabled

Processes or programs that require administrator permissions must be executed by either the built-in Administrator account or a user account in the Administrators group.

The operating conditions are shown below.

Table 6.1 Relationship Between Account and UAC

Account Type	UAC: Enabled	UAC: Disabled
Built-in Administrator account	А	А
User account in the Administrators group	В	Α
Standard user account	В	С

- A: Runs without displaying the permissions granted dialog box.
- B: Displays the permissions granted dialog box, and runs if permissions are approved.
- C: Does not run, because Administrator permissions cannot be obtained.

If you do not wish to perform the dialog process using the administrator permissions dialog box, and the conditions marked as "B" in the table above apply (for example, in batch processing), the program must be executed using administrator permissions with one of the following methods:

- In the Command Prompt, use "runas" command to execute the program as a user with administrator permissions. A password must be entered after this.

[Batch file (test.bat) execution example]

runas /noprofile /user:mymachine\acmuser "cmd.exe /k test.bat"

- In the Task Scheduler, specify "Execute with top level privileges" to operate the program.
- Execute the program with the Command Prompt.
 - For Windows Server 2008 or Windows Server 2008 R2

From the **Start** menu, select **All Programs** > **Accessories** and right-click on **Command Prompt**. Specify "Run as Administrator" to run the Command Prompt. Execute the program from the Command Prompt.

- For Windows Server 2012 or later

Specify "Command Prompt (Admin)" to run the Command Prompt. Execute the program from the Command Prompt.

6.2.1.2 User Account of Linux/Solaris

AdvancedCopy Manager commands can only be executed as a root, so operate root user.

6.2.2 Port Number Setting

For operation of the Managed Server, port numbers must be specified.

For Windows Environment

This information reflects the port number that was entered during installation of AdvancedCopy Manager's agent, in the **Port Registration** page to the services file. Check that the setting for the specified port number is applied, and that the port number is not being used for other purposes.

#Service name Port number/protocol name

stgxfws 1226/tcp



If the specified port number is already being used for other purposes, edit the %SystemRoot%\system32\drivers\etc\services file manually and change to an unused port number. Values between 1024 and 65535 are valid.

The table below shows the intended purposes of port numbers. If settings for port filtering are required, refer to the information described in the Purpose in the following table to check the objects to be connected to the ports before you make the settings.

Service Name	Reception Port	Purpose
Communication service	1226/tcp	Used for the followings:
Communication service for cluster transactions (*1)	<i>anyNumber</i> /tcp	 Communication with Management Server Communication with other Managed Servers for performing the replication between servers

^{*1:} For clustered systems, this service is required for each transaction that is created during the cluster setup. The reception port is any port number that was specified for that transaction.



If, when you installed AdvancedCopy Manager's agent, you entered a port number other than the default one, replace the port number listed above by the one you actually entered.

For Solaris, Linux, HP-UX or AIX Environment

Prepare the port numbers to be used on the Managed Servers and enter them into the /etc/services file.

The table below shows the intended purposes of port numbers. If settings for port filtering are required, refer to the information described in the Purpose in the following table to check the objects to be connected to the ports before you make the settings.

Service Name	Reception Port	Purpose
stgxfws	1226/tcp	Used for the followings:
stgxfws_ <i>logicalNodeName</i> (*1)	<i>anyNumber</i> /tcp	- Communication with Management Server - Communication with other Managed Servers for performing the replication between servers

^{*1:} For clustered systems, this service is required for each transaction that is created during the cluster setup. The *logicalNodeName* is the name that was specified during the cluster setup, and the reception port is any port number that was specified for that transaction.

Enter the service name, the port number to be used, and the protocol name into the /etc/services file. The example below shows how to set "1226" for the port number to be used.

#Service name Port number/protocol name

stgxfws 1226/tcp



If the specified port number is already being used for other purposes, change to an unused port number. Values between 1024 and 65535 are valid.

6.2.3 ETERNUS Disk Storage System Setting Verification

To use the Advanced Copy function of an ETERNUS Disk storage system, it is required to set a copy table size in the ETERNUS Disk storage system. For the procedure to set copy table size, refer to "Configure Copy Table Size for Advanced Copy" in the ETERNUS SF Web Console Guide.

6.2.4 Firewall Setting (Windows only)

Follow the steps in the procedure below to modify the firewall settings. Alternatively, disable the firewall.

For Windows Server 2008 R2, or Windows Server 2012 or Later

- 1. Click Control Panel > Check firewall status to open the Windows Firewall screen.
- 2. On the left side pane, click Advanced settings to open the Windows Firewall with Advanced Security screen.
- 3. In the list at the left of the screen, select Inbound Rules.
- 4. In the **Action** menu, select **New Rule** to open the **New Inbound Rule Wizard** screen.
- 5. In the **Rule Type** step, select **Port** and then click **Next**.
- In the Protocol and Ports step, select TCP and Specific local ports:
 Enter the port number for the communication service into the Specific local ports: field, and then click Next.
- 7. In the **Action** step, select **Allow the connection** and then click **Next**.
- 8. In the **Profile** step, check **Domain**, **Private** and **Public** depending on your network environment, and then click **Next**.
- 9. In the Name step, specify the Name and Description of the new rule as necessary, and then click the Finish.
- 10. If you want to modify a scope, display the properties of the **Inbound Rules** for which to modify the scope.

 Specify the permitted scope for communication with other servers that are not operating AdvancedCopy Manager on the **Scope** tab in the **Properties** screen.
- 11. On the **Windows Firewall** screen, click **OK** to finish your settings.

For Operating Systems Other than Above

- 1. From the Control Panel, open the Windows Firewall screen.
- 2. Click **Add Port** on the **Exceptions** tab to open the **Add Port** screen.
- 3. Make the following settings for the communication service:
 - **name**: Specify any name
 - **Port number**: Specify the port number assigned to the communication service at the time of installation, and select "TCP" for the protocol.
- 4. If you want to modify a scope, display the properties of the **Inbound Rules** for which to modify the scope. Specify the permitted scope for communication with other servers that are not operating AdvancedCopy Manager on the **Scope** tab in the **Properties** screen.
- 5. Click **OK** in the **Add Port** screen.

6. Click **OK** in the **Windows Firewall** screen.

6.2.5 System Log Setting (AIX only)

If the operating system is AIX, there is no output of the system log by the default settings of the operating system.

If you want to use the system log to check starting and stopping of the communication daemons, you have to enable output of the system log in the settings.

Refer to the operating system manuals for information on setting methods.

6.2.6 Start Daemon (Excluding Windows)

After completing the settings, start the daemon.

Refer to "Starting Daemons" in the ETERNUS SF AdvancedCopy Manager Operation Guide for the method of starting daemon.

Chapter 7 Installation of AdvancedCopy Manager CCM

This chapter explains how to install AdvancedCopy Manager CCM.



This chapter explains the tasks to be conducted for installing only the AdvancedCopy Manager CCM.

In the case you also want to use other products than the AdvancedCopy Manager CCM (e.g. Express and Storage Cruiser), refer to "Chapter 3 Installation of ETERNUS SF Manager".

7.1 Before Installation

The following preparation is necessary before starting the AdvancedCopy Manager CCM installation.

7.1.1 Available Disk Space Verification

Make sure that there is enough available disk space on the server where the installation will be performed. Refer to "2.5.3.1 Required Disk Space for Installation" for information on the disk space required for installation.

If there is not enough available disk space, perform any of the following actions in order to secure the disk space required for installation:

- Increase disks
- Reconfigure the disk partitions

7.1.2 Incompatible Software Uninstallation

Check if any incompatible software is installed on the server where the installation will be performed. If the incompatible software is found, refer to that software manual and uninstall it before starting the installation.

7.2 Interactive Installation Procedure of AdvancedCopy Manager CCM (for Windows)

There are two methods of performing the interactive installation of AdvancedCopy Manager CCM (for Windows).

- Default installation

The following configuration is used without the need to input any values.

- Installation destination

The "systemDrive:\ETERNUS_SF" directory is used as the base location for the Program Directory, Environment Directory and Work Directory.

- Custom installation

Installation is done by entering the configuration information on the screen (installation destination).

The interactive installation procedure of AdvancedCopy Manager CCM (for Windows) is as follows:

1. Log on to the server using Administrator privileges.




- 2. Insert the DVD-ROM "ETERNUS SF SC/ACM/Express Mediapack for Windows (Manager Program) (1/2)" for this version into the DVD-ROM drive.
- 3. The following window will be displayed. Click **Manager installation**. To cancel the installation at this point, click **Exit**.



4. The **Choose Setup Language** dialog box will be displayed. Select the appropriate language and click **OK**. The language selected in this dialog box will be used during the installation and uninstallation.



5. The following progress bar will be displayed. To cancel the installation, click **Cancel**.




6. The installation wizard page will be displayed. Click **Next**.




7. Read the terms and conditions of the **License Agreement** page.

If the conditions are agreeable, select [I accept the terms of the license agreement] and then click **Next**.



8. Select the features and options to install from the **Install option** page.

Select [AdvancedCopy Manager Copy Control Module is installed.]. The component configured AdvancedCopy Manager CCM is installed.


Option selection

Select the desired options according to the following information.

9. Specify the installation directory in the **Installation Destination** page.

If installing to a directory other than the default directory, click **Browse** and change the install location. After designating all of the directories, click **Next**.



- Do not specify the shared directory as the installation directory.
- Spaces and the characters " | : * ? / . < > , % & ^ = ! ; # '@ () + are not supported for file name.
- The number of characters in a directory name must be between 4 and 70.
- 10. Check the settings information in the **Start Copying Files** page.

If the settings are correct, click **Next**.

To change a setting, click **Back**.



11. Copying of the program will be started.

During this process, the file copy completion status will be displayed in the **Setup Status** page.

12. When the copying process is completed, the system configuration will be updated. Wait for the configuration update process to complete.



13. The following installation wizard page will be displayed. The installation process is completed. Click Finish.



14. Eject the DVD-ROM.

The AdvancedCopy Manager CCM (for Windows) installation is completed.

7.3 Silent Installation Procedure of AdvancedCopy Manager CCM (for Windows)

Take the following steps for silent installation:

- 1. Edit an install parameter file.
- 2. Run a silent installation.

7.3.1 Editing Install Parameter File

An install parameter file is a file in which to specify install parameters such as installation destination directory and port number. This file is stored on DVD-ROM and default values are set for respective install parameters. For details on the install parameter file, refer to "D.7 Install Parameter File (for AdvancedCopy Manager CCM for Windows)".

The install parameter file is stored on the DVD-ROM "ETERNUS SF SC/ACM/Express Mediapack for Windows (Manager Program) (1/2)" of this version.

- Storage location

```
dvdromDrive:\Manager_windows\install_parameter_ccm.ini
```

When installing with default install parameter values, no editing is required.

When changing install parameters, copy the install parameter file on the DVD-ROM to an optional location and edit the copied file. For description of each install parameter, refer to "D.8 Install Parameters (for AdvancedCopy Manager CCM for Windows)".

In this manual, installing using the default install parameter values is referred to as "default install" and installing with edited install parameters is referred to as "custom install".

7.3.2 Running Silent Installation

The silent installation procedure of AdvancedCopy Manager CCM (for Windows) is as follows:

1. Log on to the target server as a user with administrator privileges.



Specify a user that corresponds to the using server type.

Server Type	User to Be Specified
Domain Controller	Domain user
Machine that belongs to the domain Local user	
WORKGROUP (does not belong to the domain)	

- 2. Install the DVD-ROM "ETERNUS SF SC/ACM/Express Mediapack for Windows (Manager Program) (1/2)" of this version into the DVD-ROM drive. If the Installer screen is displayed by autorun, exit the installer.
- 3. Start the command prompt.
- 4. Execute the following silent installation command.
 - For default install:

For *installLogFile*, specify the file in which to output installation log with an absolute path. It is optional to specify for *installLogFile*.

dvdromDrive:Manager_windows\esfsilentinstall_ccm.bat -eula agreed [-l installLogFile]

- For custom install:

Specify for *installParameterFile* with an absolute path. It is mandatory to specify for *installParameterFile*. For *installLogFile*, specify the file in which to output installation log with an absolute path. It is optional to specify for *installLogFile*.

dvdromDrive:\Manager_windows\esfsilentinstall_ccm.bat -eula agreed -s installParameterFile [l installLogFile]



- The -eula option is specified to agree to licensing. Only when "agreed" is specified for optional parameter is installation enabled. The -eula option must be specified before other options.
- If nothing is specified for *installLogFile*, an install log file named "esfsilentinstall.log" is created in the working directory specified with the environment variable TEMP.
- If any file of the same name as the specified install log file exists, it is overwritten.
- It is required to specify an existing directory with write permission for the directory in which to store the install log file. If it has no write permission, no error message is output in the command prompt or screen, and the process terminates with error.
- If the paths to the install parameter file and install log file contain any spaces, they should be surrounded by double quote characters.
- The characters " | : * ? / . < > , % & ^ ; ! are not supported for path name for install parameter file or install log file.



- If an invalid option is specified, its corresponding error message is output in the install log file and the process exits. No error message is output in the command prompt or screen.
- Do not execute multiple silent install commands at the same time. If a silent install starts while a silent install is executing, the silent install terminates abnormally without creating an install log file.
- 5. On completion of installation, a command prompt is displayed.

 Remove the DVD-ROM media used for installation out of the device.

7.3.3 Checking Silent Installation Result

Check the return value from the silent installation command. If necessary, check the install log file. However, if the return value from the silent installation command is 3 or 9, no install log file is created. For details, refer to "E.1 Return Values for Silent Installation (for ETERNUS SF Manager, AdvancedCopy Manager CCM).

The installation result can be viewed in the install log file, too.

Open the install log file to see "ResultCode" in the **ResponseResult** section. In "ResultCode" is written the return value from the silent installation command.

7.4 Interactive Installation Procedure of AdvancedCopy Manager CCM (for Solaris)

The interactive installation procedure of AdvancedCopy Manager CCM (for Solaris) is as follows:



No needs to modify the install parameter file for AdvancedCopy Manager CCM.

Refer to "D.15 Install Parameter File (for AdvancedCopy Manager CCM for Solaris/Linux)" for information on the install parameter file.

- 1. Log in to the server as a superuser.
- 2. Make sure that the local file system is mounted.

 If the local file system is not mounted, execute the following command to mount the local file system:
 - For Solaris 10:

```
# /usr/sbin/mountall -l
```

- For Solaris 11:

```
# /usr/sbin/zfs mount -a
```

- 3. Insert the DVD-ROM "ETERNUS SF SC/ACM Mediapack for Solaris (Manager Program) (2/2)" for this version into the DVD-ROM drive.
- 4. Mount the DVD-ROM.

In below example of command execution, the device name of the DVD-ROM drive is mounted as /dev/dsk/c0t4d0s0. The device name for the DVD-ROM drive, however, may be different for your particular device.

```
# mount -F hsfs -o ro /dev/dsk/c0t4d0s0 dvdromMountPoint
```

5. Change directory in which the install shell is stored.

```
# cd dvdromMountPoint/Manager_unix
```

6. Specify the install parameter file, and execute the command for installation.

The install parameter file is stored in the same directory in which the install shell is stored. However, specify the install parameter file by using absolute path.

```
# ./esfinstall.sh -s installParamFile
```

The absolute path name for install parameter file is as follows:

dvdromMountPointlManager_unix/install_parameter_ccm.txt

7. The license agreement information will be displayed. Display example is mentioned below. If the conditions are agreeable, enter "y".

Chapter 8 Setup of AdvancedCopy Manager CCM

This chapter explains how to set up AdvancedCopy Manager CCM.

8.1 Configuring Network Environment

In order to enable the server on which the AdvancedCopy Manager CCM is installed (hereafter referred to as "CCM Server") to communicate with the ETERNUS Disk storage systems to be managed, configure the network environment. Refer to the ETERNUS Web GUI manual for information on how to configure the network environment.

When Setting Up Firewall Between CCM Server and ETERNUS Disk Storage System

If you set up a firewall between the CCM Server and ETERNUS Disk storage system, specify below port numbers so as to enable transmissions to pass the firewall.

The port numbers depend on the model of ETERNUS Disk storage system.

8.2 Creating User Account for Using AdvancedCopy Manager CCM

This section explains how to create user accounts with the privileges that are required for using the AdvancedCopy Manager CCM.

8.2.1 For Windows

In Windows Server 2008 or later, a User Account Control function (hereafter called "UAC") has been added to enhance security. Cases where UAC is enabled and disabled are explained below.

- When UAC is enabled

When any user other than the built-in Administrator account (including accounts in the Administrators group) executes a process or program that requires administrator permissions, the "Permissions granted/authorized dialog" is displayed. Permissions granted or authorized must be confirmed.

- When UAC is disabled

Processes or programs that require administrator permissions must be executed by either the built-in Administrator account or a user account in the Administrators group.

The operating conditions are shown below.

Table 8.1 Relationship Between Account and UAC

Account Type	UAC: Enabled	UAC: Disabled
Built-in Administrator account	А	А
User account in the Administrators group	В	А

Account Type	UAC: Enabled	UAC: Disabled
Standard user account	В	С

- A: Runs without displaying the permissions granted dialog box.
- B: Displays the permissions granted dialog box, and runs if permissions are approved.
- C: Does not run, because Administrator permissions cannot be obtained.

If you do not wish to perform the dialog process using the administrator permissions dialog box, and the conditions marked as "B" in the table above apply (for example, in batch processing), the program must be executed using administrator permissions with one of the following methods:

- In the Command Prompt, use the runas command to execute the program as a user with administrator permissions or the permissions required to operate AdvancedCopy Manager CCM. A password must be entered.

[Batch file (test.bat) execution example]

```
runas /noprofile /user:mymachine\acmuser "cmd.exe /k test.bat
```

- In the Task Scheduler, specify "Execute with top level privileges" to operate the program.
- Execute the program with the Command Prompt.
 - For Windows Server 2008 or Windows Server 2008 R2

From the **Start** menu, select **All Programs > Accessories** and right-click on **Command Prompt**. Specify "Run as Administrator" to run the Command Prompt. Execute the program from the Command Prompt.

- For Windows Server 2012 or later

Specify "Command Prompt (Admin)" to run the Command Prompt. Execute the program from the Command Prompt.

8.2.2 For Solaris or Linux

When using AdvancedCopy Manager CCM in Solaris or Linux environment, operate as a "root (super user)".

8.3 Setting Environment Variable PATH

To execute AdvancedCopy Manager CCM commands, it is necessary to add the "bin" directory of the AdvancedCopy Manager CCM to the environment variable PATH.

For Windows Environment

- 1. Right-click on **Computer** on the **Start** menu, and select the **Properties** from the pop-up menu.
- 2. Click **Advanced system settings** on the left side of **System** dialog box.
- 3. Click **Advanced** tab in the **System Properties** dialog box, and then click **Environment Variables**.
- 4. Add the following value to the environment variable PATH.

installDir\CCM\bin



When listing multiple directories, separate them with semicolons (;).

For Solaris or Linux Environment

When using Bourne shell, add a value to the environment variable PATH as below.

- # PATH=\$PATH:/opt/FJSVccm/bin
- # export PATH



When listing multiple directories, separate them with semicolons (;).

Chapter 9 Uninstallation of ETERNUS SF Manager

This chapter explains methods for uninstallation of ETERNUS SF Manager.

9.1 Before Uninstallation

The following preparation is necessary before starting the ETERNUS SF Manager uninstallation.



It is not necessary to stop the ETERNUS SF Manager services before starting the ETERNUS SF Manager uninstallation. The ETERNUS SF Manager uninstaller will stop the ETERNUS SF Manager services before it removes the programs.

9.1.1 Backup of ETERNUS SF Manager Environment

If there is a possibility that the current environment will be used again, e.g. after migration, back up (save) the ETERNUS SF Manager environment as needed.

Use the following manuals as reference for saving the ETERNUS SF Manager environment.

- For Express:
 - "Backing Up Express's Manager Environment" in the ETERNUS SF Express Operation Guide
- For Storage Cruiser:
 - "Backup of Manager" in the ETERNUS SF Storage Cruiser Operation Guide
- For AdvancedCopy Manager:
 - "Operation Maintenance" in the ETERNUS SF AdvancedCopy Manager Operation Guide

9.1.2 Backup of Backup Management List

If ETERNUS SF Manager is uninstalled, the backup management list of AdvancedCopy Manager will also be deleted.

Under any of the following circumstances, you should back up the backup management list before starting the of ETERNUS SF Manager uninstallation.

- If you performed the backup operation of AdvancedCopy Manager on a Management Server
- If there is a possibility that the backup management list will be used again

For backing up the backup management list, execute the swstresback command.

Refer to "Command References" in the *ETERNUS SF AdvancedCopy Manager Operation Guide* for the operating system of the Management Server for information on the command.

9.1.3 Deletion of Managed Servers

If AdvancedCopy Manager was used, all Managed Servers under the Management Server from which ETERNUS SF Manager is uninstalled must be removed from the control of AdvancedCopy Manager.

There are two methods for this task:

- Using the Web Console
- Executing the stgxfwcmdelsrv command on the Management Server

Refer to "Command References" in the *ETERNUS SF AdvancedCopy Manager Operation Guide* for the operating system of the Management Server for information on the command.



If AdvancedCopy Manager was not used, this task is not necessary.

9.1.4 Backup of Pre-processing and Post-processing Scripts

If ETERNUS SF Manager is uninstalled, AdvancedCopy Manager's pre-processing and post-processing scripts (shell scripts) used in backup/restore and replication will also be deleted.

Under any of the following circumstances, you should back up the scripts before starting the ETERNUS SF Manager uninstallation.

- If you performed the backup/replication operation of AdvancedCopy Manager on a Management Server
- If there is a possibility that the customized scripts will be used again

9.1.5 Eject Media

Make sure that the DVD-ROM "ETERNUS SF SC/ACM/Express Mediapack" is not in a DVD-ROM drive.

When the media is in the DVD-ROM drive, eject it.



An unexpected error may occur, when the media is left in the DVD-ROM drive.

9.1.6 Uninstallation of SELinux Policy (for Linux)

When an SELinux policy module is installed using Express's manager or Storage Cruiser's manager, perform the following procedure and uninstall the SELinux policy:

- 1. Login to the server on which to perform the tasks. Perform operations after logging in with root (superuser).
- 2. If SELinux = Enforcing, execute the following command to return the state back to before the policy was applied. If SELinux = Disabled, this step is not needed.

 If Red Hat Enterprise Linux 7, default is SELinux = Enforcing.

/opt/FJSVssmgr/etc/selinux/esfsepolicy_unsetup.sh

9.1.7 Uninstallation of SNMP Trap Daemon Package (for Linux)

When using Express's manager or Storage Cruiser's manager, and when using the ETERNUS SF SNMP Trap monitoring daemon (monitoring devices using IPv6 address devices or SNMPv3 protocol), perform the following procedure and uninstall the SNMP Trap daemon package:

1. By executing the following commands, automatic startup of the SNMP Trap daemon is prevented when the system is started. This procedure is only performed for Red Hat Enterprise Linux 7.

```
# systemctl stop startsc-snmptrapd.service
# systemctl disable startsc-snmptrapd.service
# rm /usr/lib/systemd/system/startsc-snmptrapd.service
```

2. Execute the following command to uninstall the SNMP Trap daemon package.

```
# rpm -e FJSVswstt
```

9.1.8 Uninstallation of ETERNUS VMware Support Package

If the ETERNUS VMware Support Package has been installed, refer to the *ETERNUS VASA Provider User's Guide* that was downloaded in "3.1.8 Download of ETERNUS VMware Support Package" and uninstall the ETERNUS VMware Support Package.

9.1.9 Uninstallation of ETERNUS SF SNMP Trap Service (Windows only)

When using Express's manager or Storage Cruiser's manager, and when monitoring devices using the SNMPv3 protocol, perform the following procedure and uninstall the SNMP Trap Service:

- 1. Open the service screen.
 - For Windows Server 2012

Click Control Panel > System and Security > Administrative tools > Services.

- For all other Windows environments

Click Control Panel > Administrative tools > Services.

- 2. If the ETERNUS SF SNMP Trap Service status is "Started", select the SNMP Trap monitoring service and click **Stop**.
- 3. Execute the following command from the command prompt to uninstall the ETERNUS SF SNMP Trap Service.

```
\verb|-powershell -ExecutionPolicy Unrestricted $INS_DIR\backslash ESC\Manager\opt\FJSVssmgr\sbin\swsttctr.psl-uninstall|
```

\$INS_DIR is "Program Directory" specified at the ETERNUS SF Manager installation.


Notes when Storage Cruiser's agent is installed in a target server

Uninstaller suspends Storage Cruiser's agent of a target server so that no error may occur in uninstalling ETERNUS SF Manager. For this reason, do not perform any operations associated with the target server before uninstallation is completed. When the target server is also operated as Storage Cluster Controller, ETERNUS Disk storage systems are not monitored by the Storage Cluster Controller, so that Automatic Failover of ETERNUS Disk storage systems is disabled.



9.3 Silent Uninstallation Procedure of ETERNUS SF Manager (for Windows)

9.3.1 Running Silent Uninstallation

- 1. Log on to the target server as a user with administrator privileges.
- 2. Start a command prompt. Start a new command prompt different from the silent installation execution, and run a silent uninstallation.

Running an uninstallation from the program directory specified at installation tries to delete the esfsilentuninstall_ccm.bat file itself and fails uninstallation. For this reason, copy the file to other than the program directory specified at installation, and then run the copied file.

For *uninstallLogFile*, specify the file in which to output uninstallation log with an absolute path. It is optional to specify for *uninstallLogFile*.

copyDestinationDir\esfsilentuninstall.bat [-l uninstallLogFile]



- If nothing is specified for *uninstallLogFile*, an uninstall log file named "esfsilentuninstall.log" is created in the working directory specified for the environment variable TEMP.

- Notes when Storage Cruiser's agent is installed in a target server

Uninstaller suspends Storage Cruiser's agent of a target server so that no error may occur in uninstalling ETERNUS SF Manager.

For this reason, do not perform any operations associated with the target server before uninstallation is completed.

When the target server is also operated as Storage Cluster Controller, ETERNUS Disk storage systems are not monitored by the Storage Cluster Controller, so that Automatic Failover of ETERNUS Disk storage systems is disabled.

- 5. On completion of uninstallation, a command prompt is displayed.
- 6. Delete the command run at step 4.

9.3.2 Checking Uninstallation Result

9.3.3 Post-silent Uninstallation Work

- 1. Restart the system.
- 2. Delete the AdvancedCopy Manager's agent management information.

 Back up all the files under <Configuration directory>\etc and as required, delete them by Explorer after backup.

This is the end of the uninstallation of ETERNUS SF Manager (for Windows).

Following that, perform the procedure in "9.8 Deletion of Port Number".



When ETERNUS SF Manager is uninstalled, UpdateAdvisor for Middleware is not uninstalled.

If you do not use UpdateAdvisor for Middleware, uninstall it manually.

Refer to the UpdateAdvisor for Middleware manual for how to uninstall UpdateAdvisor for Middleware.

9.4 Interactive Uninstallation Procedure of ETERNUS SF Manager (for Solaris)

The interactive uninstallation procedure of ETERNUS SF Manager for Solaris is as follows:

- 1. Log in to the server as a superuser.
- 2. Uninstall ETERNUS SF Manager executing the following command:

4. The relevant packages are deleted, and execution result will be displayed.

Before deleting the package, confirm that none of the package functions used by any system other than ETERNUS SF Manager.

Delete the "/var/opt/FJSVesflm" directory manually, if the directory still exists after ETERNUS SF Manager is uninstalled.

- If an invalid option is specified, its corresponding error message is output in the log file and the process exits. No error message is output on the screen.

- Do not execute multiple silent uninstall commands at the same time. If a silent uninstall starts while a silent uninstall is executing, the silent uninstall terminates abnormally without creating an uninstall log file.
- 3. On completion of uninstallation, a command prompt is displayed.

9.5.2 Checking Uninstallation Result

Check the return value from the silent uninstallation command. If necessary, check the uninstall log file. However, if the return value from the silent uninstallation command is 3 or 9, no uninstall log file is created. For details, refer to "F.1 Return Values for Silent Uninstallation (for ETERNUS SF Manager, AdvancedCopy Manager CCM)".

The uninstallation result can be viewed in the uninstall log file, too.

Open the uninstall log file to see "ResultCode" in the **ResponseResult** section. In "ResultCode" is written the return value from the silent uninstallation command.

1. If FSUNiconv package is installed, delete the package.

Before deleting, make sure that this package function is not used for other than ETERNUS SF Manager.

```
# pkgrm FSUNiconv
```

2. Restart the system.

```
# /usr/sbin/shutdown -y -g0 -i6
```

This is the end of the uninstallation of ETERNUS SF Manager (for Solaris).

Following that, perform the procedure in "9.8 Deletion of Port Number".



When ETERNUS SF Manager is uninstalled, the /var/opt/FJSVesflm directory may be left. In that case, delete the /var/opt/FJSVesflm directory.

Chapter 10 Uninstallation of ETERNUS SF Agent

This chapter explains how to uninstall Storage Cruiser's agent and AdvancedCopy Manager's agent.

10.1 Uninstallation of Storage Cruiser's Agent

This section explains how to uninstall Storage Cruiser's agent.

10.1.1 Before Uninstallation

The following preparation is necessary before starting the Storage Cruiser's agent uninstallation.

10.1.1.1 Stopping Services/Daemons

Perform the tasks described below to stop the service/daemon of the Storage Cruiser's agent to be uninstalled.

For Windows Environment

- 1. Open the **Services** screen.
 - For Windows Server 2012

Click Control Panel > System and Security > Administrative Tools > Services.

- For Windows environment other than above

Click Control Panel > Administrative Tools > Services.

2. Select "ETERNUS SF Storage Cruiser Agent" and then click **Stop**.

For Solaris, Linux, HP-UX or AIX Environment

1. Execute the following command to stop the daemon:

```
# /opt/FJSVssage/bin/pstorageagt
```

- 2. Execute the following command to confirm that the daemon has stopped:
 - For Solaris, HP-UX or AIX environment:

```
# /usr/bin/ps -ef | grep FJSVssage
```

- For Linux environment:

```
# /bin/ps -ef | grep FJSVssage
```

3. If the daemon has not stopped, execute the following command to stop the daemon forcibly:

```
# /usr/bin/kill -9 <Process ID of daemon>
```

10.1.2 Interactive Uninstallation Procedure of Storage Cruiser's Agent (for Windows)

The interactive uninstallation procedure of Storage Cruiser's agent (for Windows) is as follows:

- 1. Log on to the server using Administrator privileges.
- 2. Perform the following tasks.





- If an invalid option is specified, its corresponding error message is output in the uninstall log file and the process exits. No error message is output in the command prompt or screen.
- Do not execute multiple silent uninstall commands at the same time. If a silent uninstall starts while a silent uninstall is executing, the silent uninstall terminates abnormally without creating an uninstall log file.
- 5. On completion of uninstallation, a command prompt is displayed. Delete the directory copied at step 3.

However, if the return value from the silent uninstallation command is 3 or 9, no uninstall log file is created. For details, refer to "F.2 Return Values for Silent Uninstallation (for Storage Cruiser's Agent)".

The uninstallation result can be viewed in the uninstall log file, too.

Open the uninstall log file to see "ResultCode" in the **ResponseResult** section. In "ResultCode" is written the return value from the silent uninstallation command.

10.1.4 Interactive Uninstallation Procedure of Storage Cruiser's Agent (for Solaris)

The interactive uninstallation procedure of Storage Cruiser's agent (for Solaris) is as follows:

- 1. Log in to the server as a superuser.
- 2. Execute the following command:

pkgrm FJSVssage



If you are planning to install Storage Cruiser's agent again in a different directory after executing the pkgrm command, make sure that no FJSVssage package directories remain. Refer to "2.3.3.1 Required Disk Space for Installation" for information on the FJSVssage package directory.

If the FJSVssage package directory contains any user-specific files, the uninstallation process cannot delete these files; due to this, executing the pkgrm command will also not delete the FJSVssage package directory. In such a case, delete the directory manually.

- 3. Delete the sscruisera line from the /etc/services file.
- 4. Reboot the system.

/usr/sbin/shutdown -y -g0 -i6

The Storage Cruiser's agent (for Solaris) uninstallation is completed.

10.1.5 Silent Uninstallation Procedure of Storage Cruiser's Agent (for Solaris)

10.1.5.1 Running Silent Uninstallation

The silent uninstallation procedure of Storage Cruiser's agent is as follows:

- 1. Log in to the target server. Perform the post-login operation as root (superuser).

 For uninstallLogFile, specify the file in which to output uninstallation log with an absolute path. It is optional to specify for uninstallLogFile.

- If an invalid option is specified, its corresponding error message is output in the uninstall log file and the operation exits. No error message is output in the command prompt or screen.
- Do not execute multiple silent uninstall commands at the same time. If a silent uninstall starts while a silent uninstall is executing, the silent uninstall terminates abnormally without creating an uninstall log file.

- After running this command, if you reinstall Storage Cruiser's agent in another directory, make sure that the directory for the FJSVssage package is not left. For the size of the FJSVssage package, refer to "2.3.3.1 Required Disk Space for Installation".
- If there is any file unique to the user existing in the directory for the FJSVssage package, the file cannot be deleted by the uninstallation process. Therefore, even running uninstallation does not delete the directory of the FJSVssage package. In this case, delete the directory.
- 3. On completion of uninstallation, a command prompt is displayed.
- 4. Delete the line of "sscruisera" from the /etc/services file.
- 5. Restart the system.

/usr/sbin/shutdown -y -g0 -i6

10.1.5.2 Check Uninstallation Result

Check the return value from the silent uninstallation command. If necessary, check the uninstall log file. However, if the return value from the silent uninstallation command is 3 or 9, no uninstall log file is created. The uninstallation result can be viewed in the uninstall log file, too.

Open the uninstall log file to see "ResultCode" in the **ResponseResult** section. In "ResultCode" is written the return value from the silent uninstallation command.

10.1.6 Interactive Uninstallation Procedure of Storage Cruiser's Agent (for Linux)

rpm -e FJSVssage



If you are planning to install Storage Cruiser's agent again in a different directory after executing the rpm command, make sure that no FJSVssage package directories remain. Refer to "2.3.3.1 Required Disk Space for Installation" for information on the FJSVssage package directory.

If the FJSVssage package directory contains any user-specific files, the uninstallation process cannot delete these files; due to this, executing the rpm command will also not delete the FJSVssage package directory. In such a case, delete the directory manually.

- 3. Delete the sscruisera line from the /etc/services file.
- 4. Reboot the system.

/sbin/shutdown -r now

The Storage Cruiser's agent (for Linux) uninstallation is completed.

10.1.7 Silent Uninstallation Procedure of Storage Cruiser's Agent (for Linux)

10.1.7.1 Running Silent Uninstallation

The silent uninstallation procedure of Storage Cruiser's agent (for Linux) is as follows:

- 1. Login to the server on which to perform the tasks. Perform operations after logging in with root (superuser).

- If there is any file of the same name as the specified uninstall log file exists, it is overwritten.
- It is required to specify an existing directory with write permission for the directory in which to store the uninstall log file. If it has no write permission, no error message is output in the command prompt or screen, and the process terminates with error.



- If an invalid option is specified, its corresponding error message is output in the log file and the process exits. No error message is output in the command prompt or screen.
- Do not execute multiple silent uninstall commands at the same time. If a silent uninstall starts while a silent uninstall is executing, the silent uninstall terminates abnormally without creating an uninstall log file.

- If there is any file unique to the user in the directory for the FJSVssage package, uninstallation process cannot delete the file. Therefore, even running uninstallation does not delete the directory for the FJSVssage. In this case, delete the directory.
- 3. On completion of uninstallation, a command prompt is displayed.
- 4. Delete the line of "sscruisera" from the /etc/services file.
- 5. Restart the system.

/sbin/shutdown -r now

10.1.7.2 Check Uninstallation Result

Check the return value from the silent uninstallation command. If necessary, check the uninstall log file. However, if the return value from the silent uninstallation command is 3 or 9, no uninstall log file is created. For details, refer to "F.2 Return Values for Silent Uninstallation (for Storage Cruiser's Agent)".

The uninstallation result can be viewed in the uninstall log file, too.

Open the uninstall log file to see "ResultCode" in the **ResponseResult** section. In "ResultCode" is written the return value from the silent uninstallation command.

10.1.8 Interactive Uninstallation Procedure of Storage Cruiser's Agent (for HP-UX)

The interactive uninstallation procedure of Storage Cruiser's agent (for HP-UX) is as follows:





The currently set value will be displayed. In this example, the setting is "4917".

sscruisera 4917/tcp

10.2 Uninstallation of AdvancedCopy Manager's Agent

This section explains how to uninstall AdvancedCopy Manager's agent.

10.2.1 Before Uninstallation

The following preparation is necessary before starting the AdvancedCopy Manager's agent uninstallation.

10.2.1.1 Backup of Backup Management List

If you are planning to use the backup management list afterwards, back up the backup management list using the swstresback command before starting the uninstallation of AdvancedCopy Manager's agent.

Refer to "Command References" in the *ETERNUS SF AdvancedCopy Manager Operation Guide* for the operating system of the Managed Server for information on the command.

10.2.1.2 Deletion of Clustered Operating Environment

Before starting the uninstallation of AdvancedCopy Manager's agent from server nodes on which a cluster environment is built, delete the environment of all Managed Server transactions created on these server nodes.

Refer to "Deletion of Cluster Environment for Managed Server Transactions" in the *ETERNUS SF Cluster Environment Setup Guide* for information on the instructions.

10.2.1.3 Deletion of Backup Operation Settings for Exchange Server (Windows only)

Before starting the uninstallation of AdvancedCopy Manager's agent from environments in which backup operation was implemented for Exchange Server databases, perform the tasks described under "Uninstallation" in "Backup and Restore of Exchange Server Databases" in the ETERNUS SF AdvancedCopy Manager Operation Guide.

10.2.1.4 Deletion of Managed Server

The server from which the AdvancedCopy Manager's agent is uninstalled must be removed from the control of Management Server.

There are two methods for this task:

- Using the Web Console
- Executing the stgxfwcmdelsrv command on the Management Server

Refer to "Command References" in the *ETERNUS SF AdvancedCopy Manager Operation Guide* for the operating system of the Management Server for information on the command.

10.2.1.5 Backup of Pre-processing and Post-processing Scripts

If AdvancedCopy Manager's agent is uninstalled, AdvancedCopy Manager's pre-processing and post-processing scripts (shell scripts) used in backup/restore and replication will also be deleted.

If there is a possibility that any customized scripts are used again, back up these scripts.

10.2.1.6 Stopping Services/Daemons

Perform the tasks described below to stop the services/daemons of the AdvancedCopy Manager's agent to be uninstalled.

For Windows Environment

- 1. Open the **Services** screen.
 - For Windows Server 2012 or later

Click Control Panel > System and Security > Administrative Tools > Services.

- For Windows environment other than above

Click Control Panel > Administrative Tools > Services.

2. Select "AdvancedCopy Manager COM Service" and then click Stop.

For Solaris, Linux, HP-UX or AIX Environment

Execute the following command to stop AdvancedCopy Manager daemon.

/opt/swstorage/bin/stopacm

10.2.1.7 Deletion of Port Number

From the services file, delete the port numbers that were used by services/daemons of AdvancedCopy Manager's agent. Usually, the services file is on the following path:

OS Type	Path Name
Windows	%SystemRoot%\system32\drivers\etc\services
Solaris Linux HP-UX AIX	/etc/services

Running uninstallation from the program directory specified at installation tries to delete the acmagtsilentuninstall.bat file itself and fails in uninstallation. For this reason, copy the file to any directory other than the program directory specified at installation and then run the copied file.

cd C:\temp\ISSetup

- If the path to the uninstall log file contains any spaces, it should be surrounded by double quote characters.
- The characters " | : * ? / . < > % & ^ ; ! are not supported for path name for uninstall log file.



- If an invalid option is specified, its corresponding error message is output in the uninstall log file and the process exits. No error message is output in the command prompt or screen.
- Do not execute multiple silent uninstall commands at the same time. If a silent uninstall starts while a silent uninstall is executing, the silent uninstall terminates abnormally without creating an uninstall log file.
- 6. On completion of uninstallation, a command prompt is displayed. Delete the directory copied at step 3.

Chapter 11 Uninstallation of AdvancedCopy Manager CCM

This chapter explains how to uninstall AdvancedCopy Manager CCM.



This chapter describes the tasks that are necessary only if you have installed the AdvancedCopy Manager CCM as a standalone product. If you were using the AdvancedCopy Manager CCM that is included in ETERNUS SF Manager, do not perform the tasks described in this chapter.

11.1 Before Uninstallation

The following preparation is necessary before starting the AdvancedCopy Manager CCM uninstallation.

11.1.1 Backup of Environment Setting Files

If there is a possibility that the current environment will be used again, e.g. after migration, back up (save) the AdvancedCopy Manager CCM environment as needed.

Refer to "Backing Up Environment Settings Files" in the *ETERNUS SF AdvancedCopy Manager Operation Guide for Copy Control Module* for information on how to backup.

11.1.2 Stopping of Copy Sessions

Stop all Advanced Copy sessions that are currently in progress in ETERNUS Disk storage system under the control of AdvancedCopy Manager CCM.

Refer to "Managing Copy Sessions" in the *ETERNUS SF Advanced Copy Manager Operation Guide for Copy Control Module* for the methods for checking and stopping active sessions of Advanced Copy.

11.1.3 Eject Media

Make sure that the DVD-ROM "ETERNUS SF SC/ACM/Express Mediapack" is not in a DVD-ROM drive.

When the media is in the DVD-ROM drive, eject it.



An unexpected error may occur, when the media is left in the DVD-ROM drive.

11.2 Interactive Uninstallation Procedure of AdvancedCopy Manager CCM (for Windows)

The interactive uninstallation procedure of AdvancedCopy Manager CCM (for Windows) is as follows:

- 1. Log on to the server using Administrator privileges.
- 2. Perform the following tasks:


From the **Control Panel**, open the **Programs and Features** page.

From the list of displayed programs, select "ETERNUS SF AdvancedCopy Manager Copy Control Module" and then click **Uninstall**.


3. The following progress bar will be displayed. To cancel the uninstallation, click **Cancel**.



4. The following page will be displayed. Click **Yes**.



5. The following installation wizard page will be displayed. The uninstallation process is completed. Click **Finish**.



Sometimes, uninstallation does not delete the directory into which the software was installed. In such a case, use Explorer or another application to delete the directory manually. The default installation directory is "C:\ETERNUS_SF".

6. Restart the system.

The AdvancedCopy Manager CCM (for Windows) uninstallation is completed.

11.3 Silent Uninstallation Procedure of AdvancedCopy Manager CCM (for Windows)

11.3.1 Running Silent Uninstallation

The silent uninstallation procedure of AdvancedCopy Manager CCM (Windows) is as follows:

- 1. Log on to the target server as a user with administrator privileges.
- 2. Start a command prompt. Start a new command prompt different from the one used to run installation.
- 3. Copy the following silent uninstallation batch file to any directory other than the directory in which AdvancedCopy Manager CCM is installed:

programDirAtInstallation\ISSetup\esfsilentuninstall_ccm.bat



Running uninstallation from the program directory specified at the time of installation tries to delete the esfsilentuninstall.bat file itself and fails in uninstallation. For this reason, copy the file to any directory other than the program directory specified at installation and then run the copied file.

4. Execute the command copied at step 3 to uninstall.

For *uninstallLogFile*, specify the file in which to output uninstallation log with an absolute path. It is optional to specify for *uninstallLogFile*.

copyDestinationDir\esfsilentuninstall_ccm.bat [-1 uninstallLogFile]



- If nothing is specified for *uninstallLogFile*, an uninstall log file named "esfsilentuninstall.log" is created in the working directory specified by the environment variable TEMP.
- If there is any file of the same name as the specified uninstall log file, it is overwritten.
- It is required to specify an existing directory with write permission for the directory in which to store the uninstall log file. If it has no write permission, no error message is output on the screen, and the process terminates with error.
- If the path to the uninstall log file contains any spaces, it should be surrounded by double quote characters.
- The characters " | : * ? / . < > % & ^ ; ! are not supported for path name for uninstall log file.



- If an invalid option is specified, its corresponding error message is output in the uninstall log file and the process exits. No error message is output on the screen.
- Do not execute multiple silent uninstall commands at the same time. If a silent uninstall starts while a silent uninstall is executing, the silent uninstall terminates abnormally without creating an uninstall log file.
- 5. On completion of uninstallation, a command prompt is displayed.
- 6. Delete the command run at step 4.
- 7. Restart the system.



Despite performing uninstallation process, the installation destination directory may not be deleted.

In that case, delete the directory using Explorer and the like. Default installation destination directory is [C:\ETERNUS_SF].

11.3.2 Checking Uninstallation Result

Check the return value from the silent uninstallation command. If necessary, check the uninstall log file. However, if the return value from the silent uninstallation command is 3 or 9, no uninstall log file is created. For details, refer to "F.1 Return Values for Silent Uninstallation (for ETERNUS SF Manager, AdvancedCopy Manager CCM)".

The uninstallation result can be viewed in the uninstall log file, too.

Open the uninstall log file to see "ResultCode" in the **ResponseResult** section. In "ResultCode" is written the return value from the silent uninstallation command.

- Do not execute multiple silent uninstall commands at the same time. If a silent uninstall starts while a silent uninstall is executing, the silent uninstall terminates abnormally without creating an uninstall log file.
- 3. On completion of uninstallation, a command prompt is displayed.
- 4. Restart the system.

Appendix C Required Disk Space for Performance Management

This appendix explains the required disk space for the performance management with ETERNUS SF Manager.

When the performance management is being performed, based on the fibre channel switch used to collect the performance information, the type of ETERNUS Disk storage system, the number of logical units involved, the number of Disk Enclosures (DEs), and the number of days for which information is to be collected, the required capacity given below becomes necessary.



The default number of days for collection is seven. The number of secured Logical Units (LUs) is the actual number of LUs the functions of which are secured in order to perform performance management for the ETERNUS Disk storage systems. Performance management is secured in units of 64 LUN for the ETERNUS Disk storage systems. Therefore, when instructed to secure from LUN 15 to 200, the information for the actual LUs 0 to 255 (256 in total) would be secured.



Appendix H Consolidated Patch

The Consolidated Patch is a patch that combines all of the patches of ETERNUS SF Manager for a specific version (Version 16.1 or later is supported). This makes it possible to keep the ETERNUS SF Manager in the most recent state, simply by applying the most recent Consolidated Patch.

How to perform the following items are explained in this chapter:

- Applying the ETERNUS SF Manager Consolidate Patch to the Management Server
- Deleting all ETERNUS SF Manager patches that have been applied to the Management Server

To apply the Consolidated Patch, upload the file from the Web Console.

Deletion of all patches is used when deleting all of the patches that have been applied to the ETERNUS SF Manager. After deleting all patches, the Consolidated Patch is applied.



When applying the Consolidated Patch, the ETERNUS SF Manager service must be running. If the services is not running, execute the following command to start the service.

/opt/FJSVesfcm/bin/startesf.sh

H.1 Operating Environment

H.1.1 Supported Products

With this feature, it is possible to apply only the ETERNUS SF Manager Consolidate Patch.

This feature cannot be applied to the following programs:

- Storage Cruiser's agent
- AdvancedCopy Manager's agent
- AdvancedCopy Manager CCM (When ETERNUS SF Manager is not installed).



AdvancedCopy Manager CCM patch can be applied when the ETERNUS SF Manager is installed on the same server.

H.1.2 Supported Operating Systems

This feature only supports Windows environments on which the ETERNUS SF Manager is capable of operating.

Refer to "For Windows Environment" of "2.2.2.1 Supported Operating Systems" for details on the Windows environments on which the ETERNUS SF Manager is capable of operating.

H.1.3 Notes

For Clustered Environments

In cases when the Management Server is operated as a cluster, do not use this feature.

When a Consolidated Patch is applied or when all of the patches are deleted, the services will automatically restart due to this feature. For this reason, there are cases when the node will fail over / fail back, the patches may not properly apply.

For utilization of UpdateAdvisor for Middleware

When implementing other tasks that use UpdateAdvisor for Middleware on the Management Server, do not execute this feature at the same time. Tasks that utilize the UpdateAdvisor for Middleware include tasks that are subject to not only this product but other products as well.

H.2 How to Obtain Consolidated Patch

Contact your technical product support for ETERNUS SF products.

H.3 Tasks to Perform before Applying Consolidated Patch / Deleting All Patches

The tasks that are to be performed prior to implementing the application of the Consolidated Patch or the deleting all of the patches will be explained.

H.3.1 Login to Web Console

Login to the Web Console with a user that has been granted the Administrator role from the ETERNUS SF roles.



Refer to the *ETERNUS SF Web Console Guide* for information on the Web browsers that can be used and their versions, how to start the Web Console, and how to login to the Web Console.

Refer to "4.1.1.1 Creating User Accounts for Operating from Web Console" for information on the range of Web Console operations that are permitted for each ETERNUS SF role.

H.3.2 Confirm Login User

After the application of the Consolidated Patch, the ETERNUS SF Manager services are automatically restarted. Users that are currently logged in to the Web Console will be forced to disconnect.

Be sure to confirm that users other than the user applying the patch are not logged in to the Web Console. If there are other users that are logged in, have them log out, or execute forcible log out as needed. Refer to "Forcible Logout" in the *ETERNUS SF Web Console Guide* for information on how to confirm the users that are logged in and how to execute forcible log out.

H.3.3 Confirm Processing Status

In relation to the Management Server on which the ETERNUS SF Manager is operating, when an action is executed with the screen of the Web Console or a command is executed, the process is executed in the background. While these processes are being executed, it is not possible to apply the Consolidated Patch to the ETERNUS SF Manager. To confirm the processing status, use the Job Status pane of the Web Console.

Refer to "Web Console Screen Layout" in the ETERNUS SF Web Console Guide for information on how to display the Job Status pane.

In cases when a process is being executed, the Status of the information displayed in the Job Status pane will be displayed as "Waiting" or "Executing". Start the application of the Consolidated Patch after all of the processes are completed and confirming that the Status of all information is displayed as "Completed".

H.4 Applying Consolidated Patch

H.4.1 Prepare Consolidated Patch File

Save the Consolidated Patch obtained from the public site to the client that will be accessing the Web Console. When doing so, do not change the name of the file.



Use the Consolidated patch file exactly how it was obtained from the public site. Do not use a patch that has been obtained elsewhere or has been re-compressed.

The update file of UpdateSite Fix Type cannot be used, either.

H.4.2 Applying Consolidated Patch

The Consolidated Patch can be applied from the Web Console.

Refer to "Apply Consolidated Patch/Display Application Status/Delete All Patches" in the *ETERNUS SF Web Console Guide* for information on the procedures for application.



After the operations have been completed, the user that had been logged in will be automatically logged out. In addition, the services of the ETERNUS SF Manager will automatically be stopped after 30 seconds.

Once the application of the patch has been completed, the services of the ETERNUS SF Manager will be automatically started. Login after the ETERNUS SF Manager has started.

In cases when it is not necessary to apply the patch, such as when the Consolidated Patch that has been uploaded with the application of the Consolidated Patch has already been applied, the services of the ETERNUS SF Manager will not be stopped. In this case, it will not be necessary to login again.



In cases when stop or restart of the services of the ETERNUS SF Manager have not been implemented automatically, it is possible that the application of the patch has failed. Confirm whether the ETERNUS SF Manager has output an error to the system log or the event log of the server.

In the case that an error has been output, refer to the article of the corresponding message number in the *ETERNUS SF Messages* for information about the issue and recovery actions. In the case that an error has not been output, after some time has passed, reconfirm whether it is possible to access the Web Console.

H.4.3 Confirm Results of Application of Consolidated Patch

Login to the Web Console after restart of the ETERNUS SF Manager services to confirm the results of the application and the application status of the Consolidated Patch.

The results of the application of the patch can be found in the operation history. Refer to "Display Operation History" in the *ETERNUS SF Web Console Guide* for information on procedures for displaying this information. If the **Action** column is "Apply Patch" and the **Result** column is "Success" in the operation history, the application of the patch has been properly completed.

The status of the application of the patch can be displayed using the **Patch Management** screen. Refer to "Apply Consolidated Patch/Display Application Status/Delete All Patches" in the *ETERNUS SF Web Console Guide* for information on the procedures to display this information.

An entry with the same name as the Consolidated Patch file name will be displayed in the [Consolidated Patch Name] of the **Patch Management** screen.

In cases when the application of the patch has failed, a dialogue will be displayed immediately after logging in. Similarly in this case, confirm the operation history and the status of the application of the Consolidated Patch.

For errors displayed in the operation history, refer to the article for the corresponding message number in the *ETERNUS SF Messages*. If you have referred to the system log or the event log of the server and have dealt with the error of the ETERNUS SF Manager services, it is unnecessary to deal with this error message.



If the details of the operation history have been confirmed, the dialogue that is displayed in cases when the application of the patch has failed will not be displayed at the time of the next login.

H.5 Deleting All Patches

H.5.1 Deleting All Patches

The operation for deleting all of the patches can be performed from the Web Console.

Refer to "Apply Consolidated Patch/Display Application Status/Delete All Patches" in the *ETERNUS SF Web Console Guide* for information about the procedures for deleting the patches.



When the operation for deleting all of the patches is executed, all patches that had been applied to the ETERNUS SF Manager up to that point will be deleted. However, patches applied to other products using the UpdateAdvisor for Middleware will not be deleted.

After the operation has been completed, the user that had been logged in will be automatically logged out. Once the deletion of the patches has been completed, the services of the ETERNUS SF Manager will be automatically started. Login after ETERNUS SF Manager has started.

In cases where no patches have been applied to the ETERNUS SF Manager, the services of the ETERNUS SF Manager will not be stopped. In this case, it will not be necessary to login again.



In cases when stop or restart of the services of the ETERNUS SF Manager have not been implemented automatically, it is possible that the deletion of the patch has failed. Confirm whether an error of the ETERNUS SF Manager has been output to the system log or the event log of the server.

In the case that an error has been output, refer to the article of the corresponding message number in the *ETERNUS SF Messages* to correspond to the issue. In the case that an error has not been output, after some time has passed, reconfirm whether it is possible to access the Web Console.

H.5.2 Confirm Results of Deleting All Patches

The results of the deletion of all patches is found in the operation history. Refer to "Display Operation History" in the *ETERNUS SF Web Console Guide* for information on procedures for confirming this information. If the **Action** column is "Delete All Patches" and the **Result** column is "Success" in the operation history, the deletion of all patches has been properly completed.

The status of the application of the patch can be referred to from the **Patch Management** screen. Refer to "Apply Consolidated Patch/Display Application Status/Delete All Patches" in the *ETERNUS SF Web Console Guide* for information on the procedures for confirming this information.

A "-" (hyphen) will be displayed in the [Consolidated Patch Name] of the **Patch Management** screen.

In cases when the deletion of the patch has failed, a dialogue will be displayed immediately after logging in. Similarly in this case, confirm the operation history and the status of the application of the Consolidated Patch.

For errors displayed in the operation history, refer to the article for the corresponding message number in the *ETERNUS SF Messages*. If you have referred to the system log or the event log of the server and have dealt with the error of the ETERNUS SF Manager services, it is unnecessary to deal with this error message.



If the details of the operation history have been confirmed, the dialogue that is displayed in cases when the deletion of the patch has failed will not be displayed at the time of the next login.

When setting up a firewall in an environment using Express, Storage Cruiser, or AdvancedCopy Manager, set it up so that the ports used in each product can pass through the firewall. For the setup method, refer to the manuals listed in the table below.

Appendix J

Installation and Configuration of SNMP Trap Transfer Program

In this product, when monitoring devices using SNMPv3 protocol and when other applications receiving traps coexist on Management Server, it is required to install the SNMP Trap transfer program.

Other applications include Systemwalker Centric Manager and applications that use Microsoft SNMP Trap Service such as ServerView Resource Orchestrator and others.

- When coexisting with Systemwalker Centric Manager

When installing ETERNUS SF Manager into a Systemwalker Centric Manager installed server, use the SNMP Trap transfer program attached to Systemwalker Centric Manager. (Do not install the SNMP Trap transfer program included in the DVD-ROM media of this product.)

When installing both Systemwalker Centric Manager and ETERNUS SF Manager, or when installing Systemwalker Centric Manager into an ETERNUS SF Manager installed server, install the SNMP Trap transfer program included in the DVD-ROM media of this product. (Do not install the SNMP Trap transfer program attached to Systemwalker Centric Manager.)

- When coexisting with applications other than listed above Install the SNMP Trap transfer program included in the DVD-ROM media of this product.

To install and set up the SNMP Trap transfer program included in the DVD-ROM media of this product, take the following procedure.



The SNMP Trap transfer program is available for Windows and IPv4 environments only.

Configuration Procedure

1. Extract the following zip file to any folder (hereinafter called \$TPF_DIR).

\$INS_DIR\ESC\Manager\opt\FJSVssmgr\etc\pkg\MpSttr.zip

\$INS DIR is "Program Directory" specified at the ETERNUS SF Manager installation.

- 2. Edit the %SystemRoot%\system32\drivers\etc\services file to change the port numbers used for applications using SNMP Traps.



- 4. Stop all the applications (including ETERNUS SF Manager) receiving traps.
 - a. Stop ETERNUS SF Manager.
 For how to stop, refer to "Starting and Stopping Manager" in the ETERNUS SF Storage Cruiser Operation Guide. Also, stop the SNMP Trap monitoring service/daemon, too.


- b. If Systemwalker Centric Manager coexists, execute the pcentricmgr command to stop Systemwalker Centric Manager. Refer to the Systemwalker Centric Manager manuals for information on the command.





Appendix K Adding Memory to ETERNUS SF Manager When Using Large Numbers of Volumes

When managing the ETERNUS DX8000 S2/DX8000 S3 series in which the number of volumes exceeds 18,000 per device, it is required to add memory to the Management Server and set the memory to ETERNUS SF Manager.

To estimate the memory required to add to the Management Server, refer to "K.1 Estimating Memory Size When Using Large Numbers of Volumes".

To set memory to ETERNUS SF Manager, refer to "K.2 Memory Settings to ETERNUS SF Manager When Using Large Numbers of Volumes".

K.1 Estimating Memory Size When Using Large Numbers of Volumes

Add the following memory size to the memory size listed in "Chapter 2 Operating Environment":

Table K.1 When Number of Storage Devices Whose Number of Volumes Exceeds 18,000 is One

Number of Volumes	Memory Size Required to Add
18,001 to less than 30,000	1 GB
30,000 or more	2 GB

Table K.2 When Number of Storage Devices Whose Number of Volumes Exceeds 18,000 is More Than One (N)

Number of Volumes Per Device	Memory Size Required to Add
18,001 to less than 30,000	3 GB * N - 2 GB
30,000 or more	4 GB * N - 2 GB

If a storage device whose number of volumes is 18,001 to less than 30,000 and a storage device whose number of volumes is 30,000 or more are mixed, use the estimation for a storage device that has more volumes (30,000 or more).

K.2 Memory Settings to ETERNUS SF Manager When Using Large Numbers of Volumes

When using large numbers of volumes, it is required to set a memory size that ETERNUS SF Manager Tomcat Daemon/Service uses. Take the following steps for settings:

For Windows Environment

- 1. Stop ETERNUS SF Manager.
 - For non-cluster operation
 - 1. Open the **Services** screen.

For Windows Server 2012, click **Control Panel** > **System and Security** > **Administrative Tools** > **Services**.

For a Windows environment other than listed above, click **Control Panel** > **Administrative Tools** > **Services**.

- 2. Select "ETERNUS SF Manager Tomcat Service" to click **Stop**.
- For cluster operation
 Use Failover Cluster Manager to stop ETERNUS SF Manager.
- 2. Execute the following command. In the case of cluster operation, execute the command on both primary and secondary nodes.

\$INS_DIR is "Program Directory" specified at the ETERNUS SF Manager installation.

3. Edit the following file. In the case of cluster operation, edit the file on both primary and secondary nodes.

\$INS_DIR\Common\sys\tomcat\conf\esfsetenv.conf

Add the following line to the above file. If there is already an entry in "-Xmx", edit memorySize.

-Xmx=memorySize

memorySize: Specify a memory size to be used in terms of megabytes. Put "m" at the end of the memory size specified in figures. Specify a value found by adding 2 GB to the memory size estimated in "K.1 Estimating Memory Size When Using Large Numbers of Volumes".

EXAMPLE

When setting a memory size to 4 GB

-Xmx=4096m
