Chapter 2 Operation environment

This chapter explains the operation environment of this software.

Before you install this software, your system must meet the following prerequisites.

1. Cluster node

This software must be installed and a cluster system is configured on a cluster node.

2. Cluster management server

A cluster management server manages cluster operation and features web server functions.

A cluster management server is Web-Based Admin View server. Web-Based Admin View is a common base to utilize GUI (operation management view).

This enables the administrator to operate all monitored nodes only by accessing to the management server.

The management server is necessary to duplicate. The server can be as a cluster node.

When Web-Based Admin View is configured in the three-tier model, a cluster management server is required.

When Web-Based Admin View is configured in the two-tier model, a cluster node is used instead of a cluster management server. For information about the Web-Based Admin View operating models, see Section "Determining the Web-Based Admin View Operation Mode" of the "PRIMECLUSTER Installation and Administration Guide".

2.1 Cluster node operating environment

This section explains operating environment of cluster node.

2.1.1 Software environment

1. Required basic software

To use this software, install either of the following basic softwares.

If you want to operate Web-Based Admin View in the three tier model, install a cluster management server.

For information about the Web-Based Admin View operating mode, refer to Section "Determining the Web-Based Admin View Operation Mode", in the "PRIMECLUSTER Installation and Administration Guide".

 - 1. Check the available disk space for installing this software. For information on the disk space requirements, see "2.2.3 Static disk resources". If the disk space is not enough, reconfigure the disk partition.
 - 2. If you use Oracle Solaris 11 or later, to install this software, it is necessary to modify the IP address of the admin LAN for Web-Based Admin View and its corresponding host name, and the host name corresponding to "127.0.0.1","::1".
 - 1. Login to the system and become a root user.

2. Delete the host name allocated to "127.0.0.1" and "::1" using vi(1) and allocate it to the IP address of the admin LAN.

If you use Oracle Solaris 11 or later, the loopback address is assigned for host name of the host in the /etc/hosts file by default. In this case, PRIMECLUSTER cannot work properly. Before you install the PRIMECLUSTER, make sure to configure the /etc/hosts file described above.

Uninstall this software from non-global zones prior to uninstallation on the global zone if this software is installed on non-global zones.



If you use Oracle Solaris Legacy Containers (OSLC), to uninstall this software, see "Using PRIMECLUSTER in Oracle Solaris Zones Environments" in the "Installation and Administration Guide".

4.1.1 Preparations

Before uninstalling, if you are applying patch for PRIMECLUSTER by UpdateSite format, remove them by UpdateAdvisor (middleware). For details, see help information on UpdateAdvisor(middleware) and the update information file of the patch.

4.1.2 Uninstallation from non-global zone

- 1. Insert DVD of this software into the DVD drive.
- 2. Login to the global zone and become a root user.

3. Boot the non-global zone in single user mode from the global zone.

To solve the problem, please apply an iSCSI patch 143645-15 or later or enable the SMF service of iSCSI initiator.

Workaround

Remove the file /etc/hostname.XX then execute cluster_install again.

ERROR: Failed to add device device to <zonename>.

Description

The addition of the device to zonename failed.

Workaround

Remove the cause of the failure of the addition of the device to zonename, then execute cluster_install again

ERROR: Failed to confirm the return value of cluster_install on <zonename>.

Description

Failed to confirm the return value of cluster_install on <*zonename*>.

Workaround

Put down the message then contact your field engineers.

ERROR: Failed to copy XX to YY.

Description

Failed to copy XX to YY.

Workaround

Remove the cause of the problem then execute cluster_install again.

ERROR: Failed to create file /etc/PCL-release/XX.

Description

Creation of a file in /etc/PCL-release/XX failed. XX shows the abbreviation of the product name.

Workaround

Remove the cause of the problem then execute cluster_install again.

ERROR: Failed to create XX.

Description

Creation of XX failed. XX shows file name or directory name.

Workaround

Remove the cause of the problem then execute cluster_install again.

ERROR: Failed to entry 127.0.0.X to /etc/inet/hosts on <zonename>.

Description

Failed to entry 127.0.0.X to /etc/inet/hosts on <zonename>.

Workaround

Put down the message then contact your field engineers.

ERROR: Failed to execute "command".

Description

Failed to execute "command".

Workaround

Remove the cause of the problem then execute cluster_install again.

ERROR: Failed to install FJQSS<Information Collection Tool>

Description

Installation of FJQSS failed.

Workaround

Collect the following information then contact your Fujitsu system engineers.

·/var/tmp/fjqssinstaller.log

ERROR: Failed to remove directory /etc/PCL-release

Description

Removal of a directory /etc/PCL-release failed.

Workaround

Remove the cause of the problem then execute cluster_uninstall again.

ERROR: Failed to remove file /etc/PCL-release/XX

Description

Removal of a file /etc/PCL-release/XX failed. XX shows the abbreviation of the product name.

Workaround

Remove the cause of the problem then execute cluster_uninstall again.

ERROR: Failed to remove XX.

Description

Removal of XX failed. XX shows file name or directory name.

Workaround

Remove the cause of the problem then execute cluster_install again.

ERROR: Failed to setup Cluster Foundation on <zonename>.

Description

Failed to setup Cluster Foundation on <zonename>.

Workaround

Put down the message then contact your field engineers.

ERROR: Installation was failed.

Description

The product installation failed.

Workaround

Refer to the following log files to investigate the cause of the installation failure:

/var/sadm/install/logs/cluster_install

After that, remove all the packages referring to "Chapter 4 Uninstallation", and execute the "cluster_install" command again.

ERROR: network service is disabled.

Description

Network service is disabled.

This message is output only in Oracle Solaris 11 or later operating environment.

Workaround

Enable network service then execute cluster_install again.

ERROR: NWAM(Network Auto-Magic) is enabled.

Description

NWAM is enabled.

This message is output only in Oracle Solaris 11 or later and Oracle Solaris 11.3 or earlier.

Workaround

Disable NWAM then execute cluster_install again.

ERROR: option is not supported on non-global zone.

Description

option is not supported on non-global zone.

Workaround

Correct the option then execute cluster_install again.

ERROR: Result of "/usr/bin/svcs -l svc:/network/physical:XX" does not include "enabled" field.

Description

Result of "/usr/bin/svcs -l svc:/network/physical:XX" does not include "enabled" field. XX shows "default" or "nwam".

Workaround

Put down the message then contact your field engineers.

ERROR: Run-level must be the single-user-state.

Description

Run-level is not the single-user-state.

Workaround

Change the run level to the single-user state then execute cluster_uninstall again.

ERROR: shell/ksh88 is not installed.

Description

shell/ksh88 is not installed.

This message is output only in Oracle Solaris 11 operating environment.

Workaround

Install shell/ksh88 then execute cluster_install again.

Refer to OS manual.

ERROR: sysnode already entried with following IP(s) to /etc/inet/hosts on <zonename>.

Description

sysnode already entried with following IP(s) to /etc/inet/hosts on <zonename>.

Workaround

Remove the entry of sysnode then execute cluster_install again.

ERROR: system/xopen/xcu4 is not installed.

Description

system/xopen/xcu4 is not installed.

This message is output only in Oracle Solaris 11 or later operating environment.

Workaround

Install system/xopen/xcu4 then execute cluster_install again.

Refer to OS manual.

ERROR: The PRIMECLUSTER software packages cannot be removed because GDS class(es) exist. Please remove the GDS class(es) and execute cluster_uninstall again.

Description

GDS class(es) exist.

Workaround

- 1. Check whether there are GDS classes using the sdxinfo command. If any, delete the classes. For the class deletion method, see the "PRIMECLUSTER Global Disk Services Configuration and Administration Guide".
- 2. Check the file in the /etc/opt/FJSVsdx/sysdb.d directory using the ls(1) command. If there are other files than class.db, delete the files by executing the rm(1) command.
- 3. Check the file in the /dev/sfdsk directory using the ls(1) command. If there are other files or directories than _adm, _diag, _sysadm, and _sysdiag, delete the files and the directories.
- 4. Execute cluster_uninstall again.

ERROR: This installation is running now.

Description

The "cluster_install" command is running for another process.

Workaround

ERROR: To use this installer you must be the root user.

Description

The user authority is not root.

Workaround

Execute the "cluster_install" command using a root user access privilege.

ERROR: zonename is not running.

Description

zonename is not running.

Workaround

Start zonename then execute cluster_install again.

ERROR: Zonepath zonepath is not available.

Description

Zonepath zonepath is not available.

Workaround

Setup the zonepath correctly then execute cluster_install again.

Please see the following log file. /var/sadm/install/logs/cluster_install

Description

See the /var/sadm/install/logs/cluster_install log file.

Workaround

Remove the cause of the error referring to the log file then execute the command again.

Please see the following log file. /var/sadm/install/logs/cluster_uninstall

Description

See the /var/sadm/install/logs/cluster_uninstall log file.

Workaround

Remove the cause of the error referring to the log file then execute cluster_uninstall again.

PRIMECLUSTER software packages were not installed in this system.

Description

PRIMECLUSTER software packages were not installed in this system.

Workaround

None.

B.1.1 Upgrading a non-global zone from PRIMECLUSTER Enterprise Edition 4.3A10 or later

After uninstalling the previous version of this software from the non-global zone, install the new version of the software.

After installation, it is necessary to construct the non-global zone cluster. As necessary, make a backup of the previous version and perform a restore after installing the new version. For details on backup or restoring, see "Backing Up and Restoring a PRIMECLUSTER System" in the "PRIMECLUSTER Installation and Administration Guide".

B.1.2 Upgrading a physical environment / global zone / domain from PRIMECLUSTER Enterprise Edition 4.2A00 or later

Explains Upgrading a physical environment from PRIMECLUSTER Enterprise Edition 4.2A00 and upgrading a physical environment / global zone / domain from PRIMECLUSTER Enterprise Edition 4.3A10 or later.

- a. If system is Type A, record the port number of "sftrap" in "/etc/inet/services".
- b. If system is Type B, record the listening port number by referring to the following files.
 - The script file in /etc/rc2.d directory, which started snmptrapd daemon with special listening port.
 - /etc/net-snmp/snmp/snmptrapd.conf (Solaris 11)
