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Chapter 1 Operating Environment and Environment Settings

This chapter describes the Web Console operating environment and its environment settings.

1.1 Supported Web Browsers

Web Console works through a web browser on a PC and a tablet. However, the tablet in this manual indicates a device on which iOS or Android is installed.

The following web browsers are supported by Web Console.

For PC

1.2 JavaScript Settings

Web Console needs JavaScript to be enabled in the web browser.

For Internet Explorer

Click the Tools menu, and then click Internet Options.
 The Internet Options dialog box is displayed.

2. On the Security tab, select Trusted sites. Then, click Sites.

The **Trusted sites** dialog box is displayed.

3. Enter the Management Server IP address, and then click **Add**. If the addition is finished, click **Close** to close the **Trusted sites** dialog box.

The Internet Options dialog box is displayed again.

4. Click Custom level with Trusted sites selected.

The Security Settings dialog box is displayed.

5. Scroll down the **Security Settings** list until you reach the **Scripting** section. Under the **Active scripting**, select **Enable**.

For Microsoft Edge

No action is required because JavaScript is enabled in the initial settings.

For Firefox

No action is required because JavaScript is enabled in the initial settings.

For Safari

Follow the procedure listed in the Safari support site to enable JavaScript.

1.3 Cookie Settings

Web Console needs cookies to be enabled in the web browser.

For Internet Explorer

Click the Tools menu, and then click Internet Options.
 The Internet Options dialog box is displayed.

2. On the **Privacy** tab, click **Advanced**. The **Advanced Privacy Settings** dialog box is displayed.

3. Check Accept in the First-party Cookies.

For Microsoft Edge

Click '...' icon on the top-right of screen.
 The Setting menu is displayed.

- 2. Click in order of Settings > Cookies and site permissions > Manage and delete cookies and site data. The Cookies and site data panel is displayed.
- 3. Set the option Allow sites to save and read cookie data (recommended) to On.

For Firefox

Click the **Tools** menu.
 The **Setting** menu is displayed.

2. Click in order of Options > Privacy & Security.

The Browser Privacy panel is displayed.

3. Select Standard.

1.4 Compatibility View Settings of Internet Explorer

When using Internet Explorer, disable Compatibility View.

The procedure to disable it is as follows:

- 1. On the Internet Explorer, press the **Alt** key to display the menu bar, click the **Tools** menu, and then click **Compatibility View Settings**.
- 2. Perform the following settings on the Compatibility View Settings dialog box.
 - a. If the address of the Management Server is displayed in **Websites you've added to Compatibility View**, select the address and then click **Remove**.
 - b. Uncheck the Display intranet sites in Compatibility view checkbox.



- Performing the above step b. setting may disable a Compatibility View enabled site and change its screen view.

- For a site whose screen view is changed, causing a trouble to operation, add URL separately on the **Compatibility View Settings** window to enable Compatibility View.
- On the **Compatibility View Settings** dialog box, the **Use Microsoft compatibility lists** checkbox is Internet site configuration and no setting is required.

1.5 HTTPS Connection

This chapter describes the security features of the HTTPS connection used by this software.

This software uses a HTTPS connection between the web browser (client) and Management Server. The connection data is encrypted with a security certificate.

As a default, a self-signed certificate is used when the product was installed.

As the network is isolated from the intranet by a firewall the communication with the neighboring devices is safe and using a self-signed certificate is not a problem, but may generate warning message in a web browser set to access the Internet.

- When the web browser is started a warning message is displayed regarding the security certificate upon establishing the connection for the first time.
- When Internet Explorer is used, the address bar turns red and a "Certificate Error" message displays in the Security Status bar. Moreover, a warning icon of a possible phishing attempt is displayed in the Security Status bar.

To disable the first connection warning and error messages, it is necessary to create a certificate corresponding to the Management Server IP address or host name (FQDN) and import it in the web browser.

1.5.1 Certificate Creation

A certificate corresponding to "localhost" is created when the product was installed.

If the Management Server is the same as the server for the web browser (client), certificate creation is not necessary.

If Web Console is served from a different terminal than the Management Server, follow the procedure below on the Management Server to create the certificate.



- VMware vSphere and VMware vCenter Server

For information on the supported version, refer to "Devices Supported by Storage Cruiser" under "Supported Devices" in the *Installation and Setup Guide*.

- Fibre Channel switches

Fibre Channel switches are supported only when Storage Cruiser is used. For information on the supported devices, refer to "Devices Supported by Storage Cruiser" under "Supported Devices" in the *Installation and Setup Guide*.

- Supported connection types between business servers and storage devices

FC connections and iSCSI connections are supported.

Supported Operations

The following operations can be performed with Quick Launch.

- Creating pools

You can create Thin Provisioning Pools (TPP).

- Creating and assigning volumes to a server

You can create Thin Provisioning Volumes (TPV).

If Storage Cruiser is used, FC switch zoning is set when the created TPV is assigned to a server.

- Snapshot-type high-speed copies with the Advanced Copy function of storage devices

You can create snapshots and restore from snapshots to a business volume with SnapOPC+ of Advanced Copy function of storage devices and the Copy command via LAN. In addition, you can delete snapshots.



If volumes other than Thin Provisioning Volumes exist in the target storage device, perform the above operations from Detail View.





Figure 2.1 Dashboard Screen Layout




The screen layout when the Quick Launch tab is clicked is as follows.

Figure 2.3 Performance Screen Layout



Figure 2.5 Map View Screen Layout (Overview Screen)





Figure 2.6 Map View Screen Layout (Logical Path View Screen)


2.1.1 Menu Area



Total Status

The comprehensively evaluated status of storage devices, switches, and servers are displayed with icons. The types of icons that are displayed are as follows.

Icon	Meaning
Normal 🗸	All devices are running normally.
⚠ Warning ✔	Some devices require attention.




Clicking the above icons displays the status of storage devices, switches, and servers respectively in a pull-down list.



Clicking the link changes the screen to Detail View to display a list of storage devices, switches, or servers with the filter set so that only the status corresponding to an icon is displayed.

Processing Status


The number of processes that are running in the ETERNUS SF system is displayed. Clicking this icon displays a list of process status in a pull-down list.



Clicking an element in the **Status/Result** column displays a dialog box showing the details about the process status of the clicked line. The meaning of displayed items is the same with the Job Status pane.

List of Unreferenced Logs

Among the various logs, the number of unreferenced logs with a level of "Warning" or "Error", is displayed. Clicking this icon displays a list of unreferenced logs in a pull-down list.



Clicking an element in the **Level** column displays a dialog box showing the details about the log content of the clicked line in detail.



User Menu

The name of the user logged in to Web Console is displayed. Clicking the **Menu** to the right of the user name displays a pull-down menu.

Panel Add Button

This is a button for adding a panel to the Panel area. This button appears on the Dashboard screen. Clicking **Add** displays a menu to add a panel with icons under the Menu area.



In this status, when clicking the icon corresponding to the information that you want to add, a panel is added to the Panel area or a configuration dialog box for adding a panel is displayed.

Actions executed when each icon is clicked, names of added panels, and panel function overview are shown below.

Status	Adds a panel to the Panel area.	Device Status panel	Displays the status of devices that are managed by the ETERNUS SF system.



Panel Move Button

This is a button for changing the panel display location in the Panel area. This button appears on the Dashboard screen.


Clicking **Move** changes all the panels in the Panel area to the Move mode.

When the panels change to the Move mode, an icon indicating the Move mode is displayed on the upper left portion of each panel.




In this status, the panel display location can be changed. The two ways of changing the panel display location are as follows:

- Replace the display location by dragging and dropping the header portion of the panel that you want to change with a different panel.
- Click the icon on the upper left portion of the panel you want the display location changed to display an arrow to move display location. Next, click the arrow in the direction of the other to change locations.
 To delete the arrow, click the button in the center.



If you click **Move** when the panels are in the Move mode, all the panels are returned to the Display mode.

2.1.2 Panel Area



The Panel area is an area that displays information required to operate and monitor the system. A maximum of 24 panels can be displayed in this area.

Each panel is customizable, such as adding/deleting panels, changing the panel display location, and the display content.

The following settings in the Panel area are saved for each user. For this reason, as long as the settings are not changed, even when performing a screen transition or a re-login, the same number of panels, the same locations, and the same panel contents are displayed as before.

- Number of displayed panels
- Panel displayed location
- Panel customized content

Panel Common Menu

This is an operation menu for each panel.

Clicking the button at the upper right of the panel displays a pull-down menu.


The Dashboard action when clicking each menu is as follows.

Menu Name	Dashboard Action
Modify	Displays a dialog box for customizing the display content of the panel.
Refresh	Updates the display content of the panel to the latest status.
Download	Downloads the display content of the panel to a CSV file.
Remove	Deletes the panel.

Simple Filter

A simple filter is displayed only for a tabular panel.

Using a simple filter can display just a line that includes a specified character string or move to a specified page.





The information entered in a simple filter are not saved. Changing the screen or a re-login clears entered information.

2.2 Quick Launch

This section describes the respective elements that make up Quick Launch.

2.2.1 Menu Area

The menu area of Quick Launch is the same as the one for Dashboard. Refer to "2.1.1 Menu Area" for details.


2.2.2 Left Pane

In the left pane of the screen, the storage devices managed by this software appear.

The selection state of the storage devices is saved for each user even after they log out.

If the left pane is open, click to close it. If the left pane is closed, click at the left corner of the screen to open it.

2.2.3 Main Pane



On the Main pane, Thin Provisioning Volumes of the storage devices registered with this software are displayed.

If **All** is selected in the left pane, Thin Provisioning Volumes of all the storage devices registered with this software are displayed.

If a storage device is selected in the left pane, Thin Provisioning Volumes for that storage device are displayed.



Volumes that satisfy any of the following conditions do not appear on the Main pane.

- Volumes used for System or Migration
- They exist in REC copy groups

- They are specified as a copy destination of AdvancedCopy Manager CCM
- They are specified as a replication destination of AdvancedCopy Manager
- They are used as a backup volume of AdvancedCopy Manager

Simple Filter

You can use this filter to narrow down the information displayed on the Main pane.

Use this filter so that only information that matches the filtering condition is displayed in the information display area.

In the input field, you can search for multiple strings by separating them with the AND condition.

Action

From the menus in **Action**, you can perform operations related to the resources or setting values displayed on the screen.

The following action menus appear when you move the mouse over Action.

- Create Pool
- Create & assign volumes
- Save snapshot
- Delete snapshot
- Restore from snapshot

Refer to "Chapter 6 Operations for Quick Launch" for details about each action.

Display Settings

Use this settings to customize the information displayed on the screen. Each user can customize the settings.

Customized settings can be saved for each login user. This enables customized information to be displayed even after a different screen is displayed or after logging in again.

The display settings can be set for the following items.

- Default sort
- Select column
- Record count
- Filter

2.3 Performance

On the Performance screen, various performance information of the devices can be displayed in each panel (tabs in the main pane). For example, panels for displaying the following chart can be allocated side by side.

- Volume read performance chart and volume write performance of storage devices
- Port throughput of Fibre Channel switches

Unlike the performance charts displayed in "9.13 Operations for Performance Management of Storage Device" and "10.11 Operations for Performance Management of Network Device", the correlation between the performance factors can be comprehensively checked on the same screen.

The setting information of the panels displayed on the Performance screen is not deleted even after logging out from Web Console and is taken over as the panel display setting information for the next login. Therefore, the panel display settings do not need to be configured every time a user logs in and performance monitoring can be started with the previously saved settings.

The following section describes the respective elements that make up the Performance screen.

2.3.1 Menu Area



2.3.2 Left Pane

In the left pane of the screen, the devices managed by this software appear.

The selection state of the devices is saved for each user even after they log out.

If the left pane is open, click to close it. If the left pane is closed, click at the left corner of the screen to open it.



When a device is selected in the left pane and if panels have already been configured for the device, those panels are displayed in the main pane.

2.3.3 Main Pane

The main pane of the Performance screen consists of the tab area and the panel area.



2.3.3.1 Relationship between Tabs and Panels

Panels can be allocated to the tabs in the main pane.

The number of tabs per device and the number of panels that can be allocated to the tabs are limited. The maximum number of these values vary depending on the product as shown below.

The display settings of the tabs and panels are automatically saved for each user. Therefore, the screen is displayed with the previous setting the next time the user logs in or when Web Console is restarted.

Inheriting the Number of Panels Added to a Tab and the Display Location

The number of panels added to a tab and the display location are saved as a setting for that specific tab. Therefore, that tab is displayed with the same settings even if the tab is switched or the user logs out and back in.

Inheriting the Previously Displayed Tab of Each Device

If multiple tabs are used for a device, the tab displayed in the main pane is the last tab displayed in the previous session when that device is selected in the left pane.



The performance chart can be easily changed by switching the display tab.

2.3.3.2 Tab Area



The following explains the role of each button and action when each button is clicked.

2.3.3.3 Panel Area



The performance chart of the selected resource can be displayed in the panel.

🚇 Point

- Up to five charts of the same performance data type can be displayed in a single panel. To display the charts of different performance data type or to display six or more charts, multiple panels are required.
- The display range of the vertical axis in a panel can be changed freely when adding a panel.
- The average value or peak value can be displayed in the performance chart. Select one when adding a panel. Average value is selected by default.
- If a threshold is specified for the device and threshold monitoring is performed, the performance chart can be used to check whether the threshold is exceeded. For the procedure to set a threshold value for the device and how to start or stop threshold monitoring, refer to the following sections.
 - For storage devices: "9.13 Operations for Performance Management of Storage Device"
 - For Fibre Channel switches: "10.11 Operations for Performance Management of Network Device"
- The display items (performance data type, vertical axis display range, whether the average value or peak value is displayed) of a chart in the panel can be changed at any time with the procedure described in "7.3.2 Changing the Panel Display Items".

How to Set the Time Axis for a Performance Chart

There are three methods for changing the time axis (hereinafter referred to as "display range") of a performance chart. The methods are "display range selection bar", "display range selection button", and "select in panel". This operation targets all the panels that exist in the currently displayed tab.

- Display range selection bar

The entire period of this bar is automatically determined from the number of storage days or the last 45 days, whichever is closer to the current time. For example, if the number of storage days for the performance data is seven, a range between the current time and seven days prior is specified.

Drag this bar to change the display range. If the selected range includes the right edge of the range, the performance chart in the panel is automatically updated.


- Display range selection button

Select any of the following buttons to change the display range.

Button Name	Explanation
Custom	Displays the Modify display range dialog box where a display range can be specified. Click the input field to enter the date and time. Check the "Always update within the latest range" checkbox to automatically update the performance chart as time passes.
1hour	Changes the display range to the latest hour. After this button is selected, the performance chart is automatically updated as time passes.
1day	Changes the display range to the latest day. After this button is selected, the performance chart is automatically updated as time passes.

- Select in panel

The performance charts of all the panels can be zoomed when a performance chart of a panel is dragged to the time axis. To restore the display setting to the state before the zoom operation is performed, use the display range selection bar or the display range selection button.



- When changing where the new pop-up screen is displayed, make sure that there is no screen opened from the shortcut menu. If a screen opened from the shortcut menu remains, the changed setting may not be reflected correctly.
- If Web Console is open in two browser tabs or windows and you log out from one of the screens, performing an operation from the remaining screen may display a session timeout screen in English regardless of the set language.

Scrolling Up and Down the Drop-down List

If the number of devices registered in this product is 11 or more, the drop-down list displays buttons (up and down triangle buttons) for scrolling up and down the list. The list can be scrolled through just by hovering the mouse over those buttons.



 - If an Error or Warning level event is reported from a device that supports automatic updates of the device component status, this product acquires the device component status automatically from the device. For this reason, no operation is required to update the corresponding device element status manually. For devices that support automatic updates of the device component status, refer to "Monitoring Device Component Status" in the Storage Cruiser Operation Guide.
- Refer to "Windows Displayed in Event of Fault and Troubleshooting" in the *Storage Cruiser Operation Guide* for solutions when an Error or Warning level event is reported.

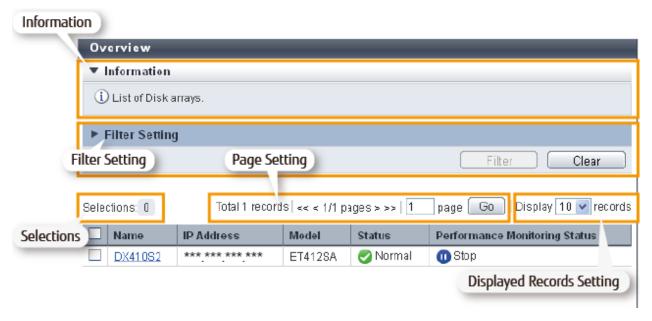



- Click the links (<<, <, >, >>) for the displayed page in Page Setting.
- Click Go in Page Setting.
- Change the pull-down menu in Display xxx records of Displayed Record Setting.
- Click on the column of the table (sort the table).

Page Setting

Information may be divided into several pages.

To display the information on page two and subsequent pages, click > or >>. Also, you can type a page number and click **Go**.





Chapter 3 Notes

This chapter describes notes for the Web Console operations.

3.1 Update of Information (Refresh Screen)

The information displayed on the screen is updated automatically at intervals (Default is 30 seconds) set to **Screen Refresh Interval**. The input item in the screen is held before and after the update.

According to the setting of **Target** of the screen refresh preference, the area updated automatically is different as shown in the following tables.

Entire	Automatic refresh is active for the whole area (Menu area, Category pane, Main pane, Action pane, and Job Status pane) of the screen.	
	However, when it meets any following requirements, the Category pane, the Main pane, and the Action pane are not updated automatically.

	- A dialog box is displayed.	
Menu area and Job Status pane	Automatic refresh is active for the menu area and Job Status pane only.

The screen can be updated manually by clicking 💽 in the menu area.



- The status of the automatic refresh processing can be confirmed with the icon displayed in the menu area. Refer to "2.5.1 Menu Area" for details.

- The automatic refresh never operates on the screen before log in and the screen displayed by another window.
 - Login screen
 - Session Timeout screen
 - Logical Path View
 - End to End View detail screen
 - Performance Chart window
- The balancing level of the Tier pool balancing is not refreshed automatically. To show the latest balancing level, perform the Status Update operation of Automated Storage Tiering.
- Clicking resets the following setting values in the Main pane to the default value. Refer to "2.5.3 Main Pane" for respective setting.
 - Filter setting
 - Page setting
 - Displayed records setting

In addition, when information screen has tabs, clicking displays the leftmost tab information on the Main pane regardless of the current tab.

- Clicking does not reset values in the Filter Setting on the Job Status pane.
- Clicking displays the existing information held by ETERNUS SF system. It does not acquire updated information from the devices. Clicking Reload Conf. or Refresh in an Action pane obtains updated information from the device. To update the information of Automated Storage Tiering to the latest status, you need to perform the procedure that is described in "9.14.25 Update Automated Storage Tiering Information".
 However, automatically collected device information excludes system information, status (*1), device resource

However, automatically collected device information excludes system information, status (*1), device resource usage capacity / rate and performance management configuration information (*2) for the following devices. Clicking displays the automatically collected information.

- ETERNUS DX S5/S4/S3 series (All firmware versions)
- ETERNUS DX S2 series (excluding the ETERNUS DX60 S2. V10L40 or later firmware)
- ETERNUS AF All-Flash Arrays (All firmware versions)
- ETERNUS DX200F (All firmware versions)
- *1: For devices that support automatic updates of the device component status, this product acquires the device configuration status automatically from the device. For this reason, you do not need to perform the **Reload Conf.** operation for the device. For devices that support automatic updates of the device component status, refer to "Monitoring Device Component Status" in the *Storage Cruiser Operation Guide*.
- *2: The performance management configuration information is automatically updated when "All" is selected for the range of monitored volumes at the start of performance management. Refer to "Instruction for Performance Management" in the *Storage Cruiser Operation Guide* for details.

3.2 Control by Monitoring Functions

Web Console operations are controlled by the following monitoring functions.

Session Timeout Monitoring

This function monitors the Web Console operations and discards the sessions not operated for a long time.

Web Console operation is the connection, excluding automatic updating of the Web Console screen, to a Management Server from Web Console.

When an operation runs beyond the term of monitoring interval from previous operation, it is rejected because of session timeout. The default monitoring interval is 60 minutes.



Refer to "15.2.5 Change Value for Session Timeout" for information on how to change the monitoring interval.

Session Connection Number Monitoring

This function monitors the number of connecting sessions at the same time. If the number of connecting sessions exceeds the upper limits, 100 sessions, you fail to log on.

Maximum Operation Number Monitoring

This function monitors the number of operations.

If the number of operations exceeds either the following limit, the monitoring function rejects the operation.

- Upper limit for each user

The upper limit immediately after login is 512.

The upper limits can be changed in the **User Management** screen. The changed upper limit is valid during login.



Refer to "15.1.3 Set Maximum Number of Jobs in Queue" for information on how to change the upper limit.

- Upper limit for the whole system

It is the total number of processing operated by all logged on users. The upper limit 1,024 is fixed.



For Number of Operations

Processing requests from Web Console are executed asynchronously after storing in the Management Server. The number of operations indicates the total number of waiting and executing requests.

Use the following procedure for applying Model upgrade options:

For Model upgrade options other than the above, the device model name that is displayed stays the same even after a model upgrade.

- When you reload configuration information of the device which is applied Model upgrade options, make sure that the license for the device model before applying Model upgrade options is registered.

In the following cases, you cannot reload configuration information.

- When all of the licenses for the device which is applied Model upgrade options are deleted.
- When no license is registered with the device which is applied Model upgrade options.

When you cannot reload configuration information since all of the licenses are deleted, provisionally register the license of the old device. Then, reload configuration information of the device.

Operation on Model Upgrade from DX200 S5 to DX500 S5, from DX200 S4 to DX500 S4, from DX200 S3 to DX500 S3, from AF250 S3 to AF650 S3

- When the VMware vSphere Virtual Volumes function is not used
 - Use the following procedure for applying Model upgrade options:
 - 1. If Advanced Copy is in progress, stop Advanced Copy processing.
 - 2. If Automated Storage Tiering has already been started for Tier pools, stop it for all the Tier pools. If a Tier pool with two or more layers exists, record the Tiering policy name for the Tier pool and the values set for level of each sub-pool in the Tier pool.
 - 3. If the Automated QoS function is used, perform the following steps on Web Console:
 - a. Check the Automated QoS settings for the target ETERNUS Disk storage system.

 - d. If you have performed the performance monitoring before applying Model upgrade options, restart it.

If you used Automated Storage Tiering, refer to "Recycling of Tier Pool Made in Storage Device" in the Storage Cruiser Operation Guide for Optimization Function to recycle Tier pools that exist in the upgraded ETERNUS Disk storage system. For the Tiering policy name and level of sub-pools for the Tier pool, specify the same values as those recorded in step 5. On completion of settings, start Automated Storage Tiering for the Tier pool.
- 18. If you used the Automated QoS function, perform the following steps on Web Console:

- 20. If you used the Storage Cluster function, reconstruct the Storage Cluster environment. Refer to the following section in the *Storage Cruiser Operation Guide*.
 - Chapter "Storage Cluster Function" > "Installation" > "Configuring Storage Cluster Structure"
- 21. Power on the VMware Guest on the vSphere Web Client.



- A serial number of ETERNUS Disk storage system may change after applying Model upgrade options. If you apply
 Model upgrade options without deleting ETERNUS Disk storage system, ETERNUS SF may not recognize the new
 ETERNUS Disk storage system.
 - In this case, delete the new ETERNUS Disk storage system and re-register it.
- If you apply Model upgrade options for ETERNUS Disk storage system without deleting the license, the screen displays the license list for the old device. To display the license list for the new device, delete all of the registered licenses and update the screen.
 - Register the license after displaying the license list for the new device.
- The output result of the Reporting function is counted per storage device. Accordingly, if a serial number is changed due to Model upgrade, it is counted as the one belonging to a different storage device. If you want to count it as the one belonging to the same storage device, modify the accounting application.

Operation on Model Upgrade from DX80 S2 to DX90 S2, from DX410 S2 to DX440 S2

Use the following procedure for applying Model upgrade options:

- 1. If Advanced Copy is in progress, stop Advanced Copy processing.
- 2. Apply Model upgrade options for the target ETERNUS Disk storage system.
- 3. Perform the following steps on Web Console:
 - a. Reload the latest information about the upgraded ETERNUS Disk storage system. Refer to "9.1.9 Reload ETERNUS Disk Storage System Configuration Information" for information on how to reload the latest information.
 - b. Delete the license registered with the upgraded ETERNUS Disk storage system. Refer to "9.6.3 Delete License" for information on how to delete the license.
 - c. Register the license with the upgraded ETERNUS Disk storage system. Refer to "9.6.1 Register License" for information on how to register the license.



- The device model name after applying Model upgrade options is displayed as "nameAfterApplyingModelUpgradeOptions"/"nameBeforeApplyingModelUpgradeOptions".
- When you reload configuration information of the device which is applied Model upgrade options to the ETERNUS DX440 S2, make sure that the license of the old device is registered.

In the following cases, you cannot reload configuration information.

- When all of the licenses for the device which is applied Model upgrade options to the ETERNUS DX440 S2 are deleted.
- When no license is registered with the device which is applied Model upgrade options to the ETERNUS DX440 S2.

When you cannot reload configuration information since all of the licenses are deleted, provisionally register the license of the old device. Then, reload configuration information of the device.

Operation on Model Upgrade from DX80 S2/DX90 S2 to DX410 S2/DX440 S2

Use the following procedure for applying Model upgrade options:

1. If Advanced Copy is in progress, stop Advanced Copy processing.

- 2. If Automated Storage Tiering has already been started for Tier pools, stop it for all the Tier pools. If a Tier pool with two or more layers exists, record the Tiering policy name for the Tier pool and the values set for level of each subpool in the Tier pool.
- 3. Perform the following steps on Web Console:
 - a. Delete the license registered with the target ETERNUS Disk storage system. Refer to "9.6.3 Delete License" for information on how to delete the license.
 - b. Delete the target ETERNUS Disk storage system. Refer to "9.1.3 Delete ETERNUS Disk Storage System" for information on how to delete the ETERNUS Disk storage system.
- 4. Apply Model upgrade options for the target ETERNUS Disk storage system.
- 5. Perform the following steps on Web Console:
 - a. Register the upgraded ETERNUS Disk storage system. Refer to "9.1.1 Register ETERNUS Disk Storage System" for information on how to register the ETERNUS Disk storage system.
 - b. Register the license with the upgraded ETERNUS Disk storage system. Refer to "9.6.1 Register License" for information on how to register the license.
 - c. If you have used the Advanced Copy function before applying Model upgrade options, reconfigure the connection type for the upgraded ETERNUS Disk storage system. Refer to "9.10.2 Configure Connection Type for ETERNUS Disk Storage System" for information on how to reconfigure the connection type.
- 6. If you used Automated Storage Tiering, refer to "Recycling of Tier Pool Made in Storage Device" in the Storage Cruiser Operation Guide for Optimization Function to recycle Tier pools that exist in the upgraded ETERNUS Disk storage system. For the Tiering policy name and level of sub-pools for the Tier pool, specify the same values as those recorded in step 2. On completion of settings, start Automated Storage Tiering for the Tier pool.



- A serial number of ETERNUS Disk storage system may change after applying Model upgrade options. If you apply Model upgrade options without deleting ETERNUS Disk storage system, ETERNUS SF may not recognize the new ETERNUS Disk storage system.

......

- In this case, delete the new ETERNUS Disk storage system and re-register it.
- If you apply Model upgrade options for ETERNUS Disk storage system without deleting the license, the screen displays the license list for the old device. To display the license list for the new device, delete all of the registered licenses and update the screen.
 - Register the license after displaying the license list for the new device.

3.4 Restrictions

End to End View (VMware)

Filter setting function is not available for the Path Status column in the Datastore screen.

When extracting the specified "path status" data, narrows data down using some spreadsheet software function after downloading data with CSV format.

About Unusable Characters

Do not use the double quote ("), single quote ('), less than sign (<) and multibyte characters in the input fields on each screen of Web Console.

If these characters are used, an unexpected action may be done.

Detail View

When a web browser for tablet (Safari or Chrome) is in use, Detail View cannot be displayed. For this reason, Detail View cannot be set as the Home screen.

When using Detail View, use a web browser for PC.

3.5 Notes

3.5.1 Note for Operating Web Browser

Do not use buttons to transit screens in the web browser, for example the **Refresh**, **Back** or **Next** and so on, during using Web Console.

If you use these buttons, the screen may not transit properly.

3.5.2 Note When Going Through Proxy Server

When accessing to the Management Server going through a proxy server, the following events may occur:

- The client IP addresses may not be displayed properly in the following screens:
 - Login Result pop-up window displayed at the time of login
 - Login/Logout History screen
 - User Management screen
- When a web browser is Safari, the Login screen of Web Console may not be displayed.

To avoid those events, set a web browser or a client PC operating system so that it may access the Management Server without going through the proxy server. For example, you can take the following actions:

- Specify the Management Server to the exceptional setting without going through the proxy server of a web browser.
- Use an Proxy Automatic Configuration (PAC) file.
- Only when using Web Console, set so that a web browser or a client PC operating system may not go through the proxy server.



If you use Firefox, do not check the **Auto-detect proxy settings for this network** radio button under the **Configure Proxies to Access the Internet** in the Connection Settings screen.

When the **Auto-detect proxy settings for this network** radio button is checked, the following message may be displayed.

esgui00001 Internal error occurred.

When the **Auto-detect proxy settings for this network** radio button is checked and the above message is displayed, select the category to be displayed in the global navigation tab.

3.5.3 Note for Pop-up Window

Clicking **Up** and **Down** on the pop-up window of each screen only displays the parent screen information. When displaying other information, change the parent screen.

3.5.4 Note for Using Web Console with ETERNUS Web GUI or ETERNUS CLI Simultaneously

Some operations from Web Console might terminate abnormally if ETERNUS Web GUI or ETERNUS CLI is used simultaneously with Web Console.

Use ETERNUS Web GUI or ETERNUS CLI only according to the procedure described in the manual for this product when you use Web Console.

3.5.5 Note for Management Software Call

When Web Console calls management software of the following storage devices, it uses HTTPS connection by default.

- ETERNUS DX series
- ETERNUS AF All-Flash Arrays
- ETERNUS DX200F

Set URL with HTTP connection to "Management Software" as a setting item for the storage device.



Refer to "9.1.4 Change ETERNUS Disk Storage System Information" for setting information to "Management Software".

3.5.6 Note for FCoE Port of ETERNUS Disk Storage System

For the FCoE port in ETERNUS Disk storage system, use ETERNUS Web GUI for the following operations:

- Change the port settings

When the **Reload Conf.** operation is performed on Web Console, the setting information set by ETERNUS Web GUI is displayed on Web Console.

3.5.7 Note When Mixing Disks of Different Type in a RAID Group

Web Console cannot create the RAID group in which online disk and nearline disk are mixed. If mixing different types of disks in a RAID group, use ETERNUS Web GUI.

However, it is not recommended to mix disks with different the rotational speed in the same RAID group, because the access performance is degraded.

3.5.8 Note for LUN Mapping Which Does Not Use Host Affinity Function

For the LUN Mapping which does not use Host Affinity function, Web Console can only display. Use ETERNUS Web GUI for the setting, modification and deletion.

When the **Reload Conf.** operation is performed on Web Console, the setting information set by ETERNUS Web GUI is displayed on Web Console.

3.5.9 Note for Dialog Box Displayed During Script Processing

When the script processing is taking a long time, the browser may display a warning dialog box. To continue processing, it is necessary to confirm acceptance on the warning dialog box.

The displaying of the warning dialog box can be avoided by the following methods.

- For Internet Explorer

Change the script time-out value to the larger than current value by modifying a registry entry. Serious problems may occur if you modify the registry incorrectly. Therefore, be careful to modify the registry correctly.

Let the script run longer from about:config page.

3.5.10 Note for Last Operation Date

The Last Operation Date displayed on the **User Management** screen and the pop-up window of the forcible login is a reference, and it is not updated in the following operations.

- Sort the displayed contents
- Switch the screen
- Update to the latest information
- Set the maximum number of jobs in queue
- Change the session timeout value
- Collect the troubleshooting information

3.5.11 Note for IPv6

This sub section describes the notes on IPv6 on Web Console.

Operation

Since using Express in the IPv6 environment is not supported, use it in the IPv4 environment.

View

If IPv6 is displayed in the IP Address field in the table on Web Console, the following are observed.

IPv6 address is expressed in full format or abbreviated format. For abbreviated format, multiple formats are available for one address based on an adaptable rule. Web Console uses and displays the recommended format in RFC5952 so as to make IPv6 address format unique and unified. However, like the screen to add HBA, if there are two fields on one screen; one to enter IP addresses and the other to display the entered IP addresses, IPv6 address is expressed in the format used for its input.

The recommended format in RFC5952 complies with the following rules:

- In the 16 bit field (number between ":" and ":"), if the number starts with zero (0), all leading zeros are suppressed to be expressed. The "0000" is expressed as "0" (called zero-valued field).
- About abbreviation to "::"
 - If a zero-valued field is abbreviated to "::", all zeros are abbreviated to the extent possible. For example, in the case of "2001:db8:0:0:0:0:2:1", it is expressed as "2001:db8::2:1", not as "2001:db8::0:2:1".
 - If many zeros do not continue but only one zero exists in a zero-valued field, the zero is not abbreviated. For example, in the case of "2001:db8:0:1:1:1:1", it is not expressed as "2001:db8::1:1:1:1".
 - When abbreviating a zero-valued field, the field where zero continues the most is abbreviated. For example, in the case of "2001:0:0:1:0:0:0:1", it is expressed as "2001:0:0:1::1", not as "2001:1:0:0:0:1". In addition, if there are multiple zero-valued fields where zero continues, the first zero continuing field (leftmost side) is abbreviated. For example, in the case of "2001:db8:0:0:1:0:0:1", it is expressed as "2001:db8::1:0:0:1", not as "2001:db8:0:0:1::1".
 - Hexadecimal alphabets (from "a" to "f") are expressed in lowercase letters.

Configuration

For IPv6 address entry, both full format and abbreviated format are available. However, a special format of IPv4 embedded IPv6 address (::ffff:192.0.2.10, ::<192.0.2.10>, 2002:192.0.2.10:) and a format that adds an interface number or name with "%" (fe80::1234%fx0) are not available.

On Web Console, the following conditions are checked as an IPv6 address syntax:

- Other characters than from "0" to "9", from "a" to "f", from "A" to "F", and ":" are not used.
- There are not more than nine fields separated with ":".

- The ":" alone is not specified.

If the above conditions are met, an IPv6 address can be configured on Web Console. However, if there is something wrong with the configured IP address, error may occur when accessing a target device with the address.

Filter

IPv6 can be specified in the IP Address field to be filtered in the table on Web Console. Partial match filtering is accepted. For example, only ":" is accepted.

The values displayed in the table are to be filtered. Despite of the same IP address as an IPv6 address, if it does not match with that in the table, it does not correspond to the filter criterion.

Sort Method

When sorting IP addresses in the table on Web Console, they are sorted by their displayed values. If IPv4 and IPv6 addresses coexist, they are not separated to be sorted.

3.5.12 Values That Are Displayed in Screen

For the values that are displayed in the Web Console screen, if the "0x" is added to the beginning of the numeric value, it is a hexadecimal number. If the "0x" is not added, the numeric value is a decimal number.

3.5.13 Note for Management of Tier Pool and FTV

The Tier pools (FTRPs) and FTVs that were created with a different Management Server are not correctly displayed on Web Console before they are recycled. Refer to "Recycling of Tier Pool Made in Storage Device" in the *Storage Cruiser Operation Guide for Optimization Function* for the operation procedure and note for recycling Tier pools.

After having recycled Tier pools, do not perform concurrent operation onto the same Tier pool and FTV from multiple Management Servers.

3.5.14 Notes Related to Communication Protocols When Accessing the Management Server

TLS 1.1 or earlier cannot be used as the communication protocol when accessing the Management Server from a browser.

If the Management Server cannot be accessed from a browser, check and modify the communication protocol settings on the browser as required.

Chapter 4 Starting and Stopping Web Console



- Web Console is optimized for a screen size of 1,024 x 768 pixels and the browser default font. If the web browser window settings differ significantly from these values, Web Console may be displayed incorrectly.
- Web Console uses |avaScript and Cookies. Setup the web browser beforehand to enable both these features.

4.1 How to Start Web Console

Web Console is started according by the following procedure:

1. Start a web browser on a PC or tablet that is connected to the Management Server.



Refer to "1.1 Supported Web Browsers" for information on the supported web browsers and versions.

- Enter the address of the Management Server in the web browser address bar.The connection with the Management Server is done through the HTTPS protocol.
 - For specifying the IPv4 address

https://ipv4Address:portNumber/

For *ipv4Address*, specify the IPv4 address or Fully Qualified Domain Name (FQDN) of Management Server. For *portNumber*, specify the port number of "Web Console service (ETERNUS SF Manager Apache service)" that is entered during the installation. The default port number is 9855.



The following example specifies "192.0.2.10" to ipv4Address and "9855" to portNumber.

https://192.0.2.10:9855/

- For specifying the IPv6 address (only when Storage Cruiser or AdvancedCopy Manager is being used)

https://[ipv6Address]:portNumber/

For *ipv6Address*, specify the IPv6 address or Fully Qualified Domain Name (FQDN) of Management Server. When Firefox is used, you cannot specify the IPv6 address. Therefore, specify the FQDN. For *portNumber*, specify the port number of "Web Console service (ETERNUS SF Manager Apache service)" that is entered during the installation. The default port number is 9855.



The following example specifies "2001:db8::1" to ipv6Address and "9855" to portNumber.

https://[2001:db8::1]:9855/



Refer to "1.5 HTTPS Connection" for information on the HTTPS connection between Web Browser and Management Server.



Note 1

If the login screen does not appear, check the following points:

- Error in the URL
- Web browser proxy settings
- Management Server firewall settings

Note 2

When the web browser is started, a warning message about the security certificate is displayed upon establishing the connection for the first time. In Internet Explorer, a dialog box showing the "There is a problem with this website's security certificate." message is displayed. This is due to the fact that the product uses a self-signed certificate for the HTTPS (SSL) protocol.

The software generates a different self-signed security certificate for each Management Server during the ETERNUS SF Manager installation.

As the network is isolated from the intranet by a firewall, the communication with the neighboring devices is safe and using a self-signed certificate is not a problem. Therefore it is possible to acknowledge the warning and proceed safely to the next screen. For Internet Explorer, select "Continue to this website (not recommended)." to display the login screen.

Note 3

When connecting with Internet Explorer, the address bar turns red and a "Certificate Error" message displays in the Security Status bar. Moreover, a warning icon of a possible phishing attempt is displayed in the Security Status bar. These display warnings are caused by the self-signed certificate described in [Note 2] and as such do not constitute a problem.

Note 4

To remove the warning and error notifications about the security certificate, a certificate corresponding to the Management Server IP address or host name must be created and installed in the web browser.

Refer to "1.5 HTTPS Connection" for details.

Note 5

When already logged in a browser window on a client PC, the login screen may not be displayed and the login may be automatically performed when opening another browser window on the same client.

Note 6

When Internet Explorer Information bar displays the following message, a file download has been blocked.

To help protect your security, Internet Explorer blocked this site from downloading files to your computer. Click here for more options...

In the above case, the file can be downloaded by performing the following procedure.


- 1. Click the Information bar to display **Option**.
- 2. Click the "Download Software" on the Option screen.
- 3. The dialog box which contains the following message is displayed. Click Cancel.

To display the webpage again, Internet Explorer Need to resend the information...

4. Execute the blocked operation again.

4.2 How to Login to Web Console

Once "4.1 How to Start Web Console" has been done, the login screen below is displayed. Enter a valid user name and password, and then click **Login**.





When the user of the same name has already logged in, the dialog box including the following message is displayed.


Another user is already logged in under the same username.

If you log in, the user logged in currently will be forcibly logged out.


If you click \mathbf{OK} in the dialog box, the user logged in currently is forcibly logged out and you can log in.

The Home screen is displayed when the user authentication has been successfully completed.

- When Dashboard is set as the Home screen (default) or when Web Console is displayed on tablet.



- When Detail View is set as the Home screen





A different user cannot login concurrently from the same computer.



Refer to "5.5.1 Home Screen Settings" for information on how to set the Home screen.

4.3 How to Logout from Web Console

The procedure to log out from Web Console is as follows:

- When Dashboard is displayed
 - Click Logout in the User menu in the Menu area of Dashboard.
- When Detail View is displayed
 - Click Logout at the upper right of the screen.

Once the logout has been done, the screen returns to the login screen described in "4.2 How to Login to Web Console".



After finishing using Web Console, always logoff.

If the web browser is closed while still logged in, the user authentication is not performed correctly on the next login procedure and might lead to an unintended automatic login.

4.4 How to Stop Web Console

Close the web browser to stop Web Console.

5.1 Operations for Status

5.1.1 Display Device Status

The device status is a comprehensively evaluated status of devices that are managed by the ETERNUS SF system. For every device that are managed by the ETERNUS SF system, Dashboard displays a list of its status on the Device Status panel.

The procedure to display the Device Status panel is as follows:

Click Add in the Menu area of Dashboard.
 A menu to add a panel is displayed.

2. Click **Status** in the menu.

The Device Status panel is added to the Panel area.



For devices that support automatic updates of the device component status, this product acquires the device component status automatically from the device. For this reason, the latest status is automatically displayed in the Device Status panel that has been added in Dashboard once. For devices that support automatic updates of the device component status, refer to "Monitoring Device Component Status" in the *Storage Cruiser Operation Guide*.

5.1.2 Change Displayed Content of Device Status

The content that is displayed on the Device Status panel can be changed.

To change the current settings, use the configuration dialog box that is displayed by clicking **Modify** in the common menu on the Device Status panel.

The items and the specification methods that can be set in the configuration dialog box are as follows.

Default Sort	A field for specifying a column name that is sorted by default and a display order of the sorted information.	Select the column name to be sorted from the pull-down menu. Select the radio button to either display in ascending or descending order.

5.1.3 Display Status Detail

Clicking the name of a device on the Device Status panel displays a detail dialog box for the clicked device status. The detail dialog box displays the following information according to a selected tab.

5.1.4 Collect Error Data

For devices that do not support automatic updates of the device component status, the component status of devices that are displayed in the detail dialog box can be updated to the latest status by performing the following procedures:

- 1. On the Device Status panel, click the name of the device you want to update to the latest status.

 The detailed information about the status of the selected device is displayed in the detail dialog box.
- 2. Click Collect Error Data in the detail dialog box.



If the selected device is a manually embedded storage device or a manually embedded tape library, the error information cannot be collected.



For devices that support automatic updates of the device component status, the latest status is automatically displayed in the detail dialog box. For this reason, you do not need to perform the above procedures. For devices that support automatic updates of the device component status, refer to "Monitoring Device Component Status" in the Storage Cruiser Operation Guide.

5.2 Operations for Logs

5.2.1 Display Log List

Dashboard displays a list of various logs on the Logs panel for all the devices that are managed by the ETERNUS SF system.

The procedure to display the Logs panel is as follows:

- Click Add in the Menu area of Dashboard.
 A menu to add a panel is displayed.
- 2. Click **Log** in the menu.

 The Logs panel is added to the Panel area.

The following logs are displayed on the Logs panel:

- Operation History
- Events
- Threshold Monitoring Alarms
- Quota Management (NAS Management)

For an unreferenced log is displayed the " "icon. If you refer to the log even once, the icon is no longer displayed from then on.



The filter is set so that only Error and Warning level logs are displayed immediately after a panel is added. Refer to "5.2.2 Change Displayed Content of Log" for information on how to change the content that is displayed on the Logs panel.

5.2.2 Change Displayed Content of Log

The content that is displayed on the Logs panel can be changed.

To change the current settings, use the configuration dialog box that is displayed by clicking **Modify** in the common menu on the Logs panel.

The items and the specification methods that can be set in the configuration dialog box are the same as the items that are listed in "5.1.2 Change Displayed Content of Device Status".

The Modify Logs screen can change all the logs to a confirmed state all at once.

The operation procedure is as follows:

- Click Modify in the common menu on the Logs panel.
 The configuration dialog box is displayed.
- 2. Click Mark all logs as confirmed in the configuration dialog box.

5.2.3 Display Log Detail

The detailed information regarding a specific log can be displayed.

The operation procedure is as follows:

1. On the Logs panel, click the date of the log you want to display the detailed information. The detailed information about the selected log is displayed in the detail dialog box.

5.3 Operations for Automated Storage Tiering

5.3.1 Display Configuration Dialog Box for Access Status Chart Panel

To display the Access Status Chart panel for Automated Storage Tiering in Dashboard, you must display a configuration dialog box to add a panel and set the displayed information in the dialog box as described in "Panel Add Button" in the "2.1.1 Menu Area".

The procedure to display a configuration dialog box is as follows:

- Click Add in the Menu area of Dashboard.
 A menu to add a panel is displayed.
- Click Automated Storage Tiering in the menu.
 The configuration dialog box for the Access Status Chart panel is added to the Panel area.



For access status chart of Automated Storage Tiering, the advanced settings can be configured with the definition file. Refer to the *Storage Cruiser Operation Guide for Optimization Function* for details.

5.3.2 Display Access Status Chart for Tier Pool

The distribution of access (IOPS) to each Tier pool is displayed on a per capacity basis. For a two layer or three layer Tier pool, the distribution of capacity that is allocated to each tier is displayed in different colors. In addition, the set data range of High/Middle/Low is displayed in a horizontal line.

The display procedure is as follows:

- 1. In the configuration dialog box, select a device in the Target field and "Tier Pool" in the Resource field.
- 2. If you want to specify the displayed range of IOPS (vertical axis of the panel), select "Manual" in the IOPS Range field and input minimum/maximum values. Default is "Auto", which displays all the ranges in which data exists. If you want to display an interval of IOPS (vertical axis of the panel) on a logarithm scale, select "Logarithm" in the IOPS Scale field. Default is "Linear", which is displayed on a linear scale.
- Select one Tier pool from a table, and then click Add.
 The Access Status Chart panel for the Tier pool is added to the Panel area.
- 4. The evaluation result of the latest generation is set to be displayed by default. When changing a displayed generation, select the target generation from the drop-down list of the **Generation** field. You can select from the latest generation to four generations back.

Point

- Access status is displayed only when Automated Storage Tiering is enabled.

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- Hovering the mouse over a graph area on the panel displays the values of the IOPS and the capacity indicated by the location as a tooltip.
- You can use an access status chart to quantitatively evaluate the introduction effect of Automated Storage Tiering and SSDs. Refer to the *Storage Cruiser Operation Guide for Optimization Function* for details.

5.3.3 Display Access Status Chart for Volume

The distribution of access (IOPS) to each volume is displayed on a per capacity basis. For volumes included in a two layer or three layer Tier pool, the distribution of capacity that is allocated to each tier is displayed in different colors. In addition, the set quota share of High/Middle is displayed in a vertical line.

The display procedure is as follows:

- 1. In the configuration dialog box, select a device in the Target field and "FTV" in the Resource field.
- 2. If you want to specify the displayed range of IOPS (vertical axis of the panel), select "Manual" in the IOPS Range field and input minimum/maximum values. Default is "Auto", which displays all the ranges in which data exists. If you want to display an interval of IOPS (vertical axis of the panel) on a logarithm scale, select "Logarithm" in the IOPS Scale field. Default is "Linear", which is displayed on a linear scale.
- Select one volume from a table, and then click Add.
 The Access Status Chart panel for the volume is added to the Panel area.
- 4. The evaluation result of the latest generation is set to be displayed by default. When changing a displayed generation, select the target generation from a drop-down list of the **Generation** field. You can select from the latest generation to four generations back.

Point

- Access status is displayed only when Automated Storage Tiering is enabled.
- Hovering the mouse over a graph area on the panel displays the values of the IOPS and the capacity indicated by the location as a tooltip.
- You can use an access status chart to evaluate the validity of FTV quota share specified by Automated Storage Tiering. Refer to the *Storage Cruiser Operation Guide for Optimization Function* for details.
- During the period between evaluation by Automated Storage Tiering and capacity information acquisition by the
 polling service, the horizontal axis for quota share in the top of the graph and the vertical line for quota share may
 not be displayed, or quota share may be calculated based on the capacity information before the polling service
 starts. If you refer to an access status chart during this period, perform the procedure that is described in "9.14.25
 Update Automated Storage Tiering Information" beforehand.

5.3.4 Change Displayed Content of Access Status Chart Panel

The content that is displayed on the added panel can be changed.

To change the current settings, use the configuration dialog box that is displayed by clicking **Modify** in the common menu on the panel.

The items that can be set in the configuration dialog box are the same as the items that are listed in "5.3.2 Display Access Status Chart for Tier Pool" and "5.3.3 Display Access Status Chart for Volume".

5.3.5 Display Automated Storage Tiering Detail

The detailed information for Automated Storage Tiering can be displayed with the detail dialog box.

To display the detail dialog box, click the link of the **Target** field, the **FTRP** field, or the **FTV** field on the Access Status Chart panel.

In addition, clicking the link in the detail dialog box can switch the information displayed in the detail dialog box.

The information that can be displayed in the detail dialog box is as follows.

The breadcrumb list is displayed in the detail dialog box.



"All System", "deviceName", "poolName", and "volumeName" are displayed in the breadcrumb list. Whether a link exists or not depends on the currently displayed item.

Clicking the link in the detail dialog box can switch the information displayed in the detail dialog box.

5.4 Operations for Capacity

5.4.1 Display Configuration Dialog Box of for Capacity Panel

To display the Capacity panel in Dashboard, you must display a configuration dialog box to add a panel and set the displayed information in the dialog box as described in "Panel Add Button" in "2.1.1 Menu Area".

The procedure to display a configuration dialog box is as follows:

- Click Add in the Menu area of Dashboard.
 A menu to add a panel is displayed.
- 2. Click **Capacity** in the menu.

 The configuration dialog box for the Capacity panel is displayed.



The plot interval of the Capacity panel is all on a per daily basis. However, for the latest date and time, the capacity when the Reload Configuration was executed is displayed.

5.4.2 Display Capacity Ranking (List Format)

The used capacity of the specified resources is displayed in descending order in a table. In addition, a minigraph of the capacity changes for the latest month can be displayed within the table.

The display procedure is as follows:

- 1. In the configuration dialog box, select "Ranking" in the Type field and "List" in the Chart Type field.
- 2. Select the following items as display options.

3. Click Add.

A panel that displays the capacity ranking is added to the Panel area.



Dedup volumes are not displayed in the capacity ranking.

5.4.3 Display Capacity Ranking (Chart Format)

The top 5 among the largest used capacity of the specified resource can be displayed in a single chart as a line graph of the changes of the capacity.

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The display procedure is as follows:

- 1. In the configuration dialog box, select "Ranking" in the Type field and "Chart" in the Chart Type field.
- 2. Select the display options. The items that can be selected are the same as the items that are listed in "5.4.2 Display Capacity Ranking (List Format)".
- Click Add.
 A panel that displays the capacity ranking is added to the Panel area.



Dedup volumes are not displayed in the capacity ranking.

5.4.4 Display Capacity List

A capacity list of the specified resource can be displayed.

The display procedure is as follows:

- 1. In the configuration dialog box, select "List" in the Type field.
- Select the display options. The items that can be selected are Target and Resource.
 From Target, select one device of the devices that are registered to the ETERNUS SF system.
 The selectable types in the Resource field are the same as the resource types that are listed in "5.4.2 Display Capacity Ranking (List Format)".
- 3. After checking the checkbox of the resource you want to display in a table, click **Add**. A panel that displays the table is added to the Panel area.



The resources that have been added to the panel are displayed in order of addition.

The maximum number of resources displayable at one time on the panel without scrolling the panel is 5.

If there are resources that you want to display at all times without scrolling the panel, it is recommended that the number of resources that can be registered on one panel should be up to 5, and that you display resources using multiple panels.

Information

- The maximum number of resources that can be registered on one panel is 50.
- When adding/deleting a resource to be displayed on the panel after adding it to the Panel area, perform the following operation:
 - Click Add/Delete on the panel.
 A configuration dialog box is displayed.
 - 2. In the configuration dialog box, after checking the checkbox of the resource to be newly displayed and unchecking the checkbox of the resource you want to stop displaying, click **Change**.
- The minigraph of a Dedup volume is not displayed.

5.4.5 Display Capacity Summary

The used capacity rate and the free space of the whole system can be displayed in a circle graph by resource type.

The display procedure is as follows:

- 1. In the configuration dialog box, select "Summary" in the **Type** field and a displayed resource in the **Resource** field. The items that can be selected as the resource type are as follows:
 - FTRP
 - TPP
 - RAID Group
 - SDP
- 2. Click Add.

A panel that displays the circle graph is added to the Panel area.

5.4.6 Change Displayed Content of Capacity Panel

The content that is displayed on the added panel can be displayed.

To change the current settings, use the configuration dialog box that is displayed by clicking **Modify** in the common menu on the panel.

The items that can be changed in the configuration dialog box are as follows.

	- Server list (Table)
	- Displays only volumes other than NAS Volume.
	- Displays the information for the allocated servers.
Relocation Detail	Displays the relocation history for each FTV that is created in a selected FTRP.



The breadcrumb list is displayed in the detail dialog box.



"All System", "deviceName", "poolName", and "volumeName" are displayed in the breadcrumb list. Whether a link exists or not depends on the currently displayed item.

Clicking the link in the detail dialog box can switch the information displayed in the detail dialog box.

Information

- For pools with Deduplication/Compression enabled, a graph of the capacity ratio is not displayed in the **Capacity** graph in [Pool Detail].

- For Dedup volumes, a graph of the usage rate is not displayed in the Capacity graph in [Volume Detail].

5.5 Operations for Dashboard Common Function

5.5.1 Home Screen Settings

The Home screen is a screen that is displayed immediately after logging in to Web Console. Each user can set their Home screen with either of the following:

- Dashboard
- Overview screen on the Main tab of Detail View

The procedure to set the Home screen is as follows:

- Click the user name that is displayed in the Menu area of Dashboard.
 A user menu is displayed in a pull-down format.
- Click Dashboard Settings in the menu.
 A configuration dialog box is displayed with the currently reflected settings.
- 3. In the configuration dialog box, after selecting the screen you want to display immediately after logging in, click **Modify**.



In the case that Web Console is used on a web browser of a tablet, you cannot configure the Home screen.

Chapter 6 Operations for Quick Launch

On the Quick Launch screen, perform the following operations in the order shown:

- 1. Creation of pools
- 2. Creation of volumes and assignment of volumes to a server
- 3. Creation of snapshots

6.1 Creation of Pools

You can create Thin Provisioning Pools with Quick Launch.

The procedure for creating pools is shown below.

- 1. In the left pane of Quick Launch, select a storage device in which to create the pool.
- Move the mouse over **Action** in the menu area and click **Create Pool**. The Create Pool screen is displayed.
- 3. Enter the required values.
- 4. Click Done.



- The RAID level that is used when a pool is created varies depending on the number of disks available. RAID6 is used if the number of disks selected in the **Disk type** field is six or more, and RAID5 is used if the number of disks selected is four or five. If the number of disks is three or less, pools cannot be created.
- If the target storage device is an ETERNUS DX S4/S3 series (excluding the ETERNUS DX8900 S4) or ETERNUS AF All-Flash Arrays, 12 disks are required to create a pool by checking "Enable" for the **Deduplication** or **Compression** field. The RAID level of the created pool is RAID6.
- If "HDD" or "HDD SED" is selected for the **Disk type** field, Online disks are preferentially used. If the number of Online disks is insufficient, Nearline disks are used.
- If you create a pool with Quick Launch, an SNMP Trap is sent when the pool usage reaches 75 % and 90 %. You can change the notification of the pool usage rate from **Detail View**.

6.2 Creation of Volumes and Assignment of Volumes to a Server

You can create Thin Provisioning Volumes with Quick Launch.

The entire procedure from creating volumes to assigning them to a server is shown below.

- 1. In the left pane of Quick Launch, select a storage device that contains volumes to assign to a server or a storage device in which to create volumes that are then assigned to a server.
- 2. Move the mouse over **Action** in the menu area and click **Create & assign volumes**. The Access path setting page in the Create & assign volumes screen is displayed.
- 3. Set an access path between the server to assign volumes and the ETERNUS Disk storage system. More than one combination of connected server ports and storage device ports can be defined at the same time.
 - a. Select a server port and a storage device port, and then click Add.
 - b. Add all the required access paths and then click Next.



- If you set access paths, defining multiple ports of different CMs is recommended in case of a CM failure. If a server has multiple ports for connections, specifying a combination that uses two or more server ports (multipath configuration) is recommended.
- If an access path is already set between the specified server and the storage device, the set access path is displayed on the screen. You can skip to the next step without adding access paths by clicking **Next**.

4. If there are no volumes to assign to a server, create a volume.

If a volume creation is not required, proceed to step 5.

- a. Click **Create Volume** on the Volume creation and assignment page in the Create & assign volumes screen. The Create Volume window is displayed.
- b. Enter the required values and then click Next.
- c. Check the contents of the confirmation screen and then click Done.



Volume names are in the *volumeName_n* format. The *volumeName* part is a name that you specify and *n* is an automatically assigned number (starting from 0) according to the number of created volumes.

5. Select a volume to assign to a server on the Volume creation and assignment page in the Create & assign volumes screen and then click **Add**. If you create volumes in step 4, the created volumes are selected automatically. Add all the volumes to be assigned to a server and then click **Next**.



While this screen is open, do not let other users add volumes to the selected storage device.

Note that if volumes have been added from other screens, make sure the volumes to be assigned are correct on this screen.

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6. Check the contents of the confirmation screen and then click **Done**.



If you are using Storage Cruiser and a supported Fibre Channel switch is registered, zoning and volume detection by the server are automatically performed.

6.3 Creation of Snapshots

The procedure for creating transaction volume snapshots is shown below.

- 1. In the main pane of Quick Launch, select a volume that you want to create snapshots.
- 2. Move the mouse over Action in the menu area and click Create snapshot.
- 3. Check the contents of the confirmation screen and then click **Done**.



- You can create up to 512 generations of snapshots.
- After a snapshot is created, a snapshot volume (copy destination volume) is automatically created in the pool where the volume selected in step 1 (copy source volume) exists. The name for snapshot volumes is in the

••••••

- "__backup_[number]" format (where number consists of a seven-digit number). The snapshot volume is not displayed on the Volume list screen of Quick Launch.
- The pool space is not consumed only when snapshots are created. After a snapshot is created, the pool capacity is consumed because the storage device copies the pre-updated data from the copy source volume to the copy destination volume every time the copy source volume is updated. If the free space of the pool is insufficient, delete unnecessary snapshots.
- When using Express only, the maximum number of snapshots is eight sessions per storage device. The number of sessions is the total number of generations that are used in each volume. The session during restore is also counted as one session.



- Create snapshots when access from the business server to the transaction volume (copy source volume) is stopped.
- Be sure to delete the created snapshots before deleting the storage device where those snapshots exist. Refer to "6.5 Deletion of Snapshots" for details on how to delete snapshots.

6.4 Restoration from Snapshots

You can restore the contents of the transaction volumes to the creation time of the snapshot.

The procedure for restoring from the time of the snapshot creation is shown below.

- 1. In the main pane of Quick Launch, select a restore destination volume.
- 2. Move the mouse over **Action** in the menu area and click **Restore from snapshot**. The Restore from snapshot screen is displayed.
- 3. Select a snapshot to restore from and then click Next.
- 4. Check the contents of the confirmation screen and then click **Done**.



- If the copy source volume is damaged, snapshots cannot be restored. To protect the copy source volume, it is recommended that you copy all the data in the copy source volume with OPC/QuickOPC/EC/REC.

- Restore from snapshots when access from the business server to the transaction volume (copy source volume) is stopped.

<u>6.5 Deletion of Snapshots</u>

The procedure for deleting a snapshot is shown below.

- 1. In the main pane of Quick Launch, select a volume that you want to delete snapshots.
- Move the mouse over **Action** in the menu area and click **Delete snapshot**. The Delete snapshot screen is displayed.
- 3. Select the snapshot you want to delete and then click Next.
- 4. Check the contents of the confirmation screen and then click **Done**.



All the snapshots from the oldest to the selected snapshot are deleted.



The snapshot volume may appear on the Volume list screen of Quick Launch immediately after the snapshot is deleted. However, those volumes are automatically deleted and then removed from the Volume list screen after several minutes.

Chapter 7 Operations for Performance

7.1 Operations for Tabs

7.1.1 Adding Tabs

The procedure for adding tabs is shown below.

- 1. In the left pane of the Performance screen, select a device in which to add a tab.
- 2. Click "+" button of the Tab area on the main pane. The **Add tab** dialog box is displayed.
- 3. Enter a name for the tab in the Add tab dialog box.
- 4. Click OK.



Tabs can be added for each device. The following shows the number of tabs that can be added for each device.

- If the ETERNUS SF Storage Cruiser Basic License or the ETERNUS SF Storage Cruiser Standard License is registered: 5

- Other than above: 1

7.1.2 Changing the Tab Name

The procedure for changing the tab name is shown below.

- 1. In the left pane of the Performance screen, select a device in which the tab to be changed is configured.
- Click the tab to be changed in the Tab area of the main pane.The tab of the main pane changes to the tab to be changed.
- 3. Move the mouse over **Action** in the Tab area of the main pane, and select **Modify tab name** from the displayed menu.

The Modify tab name dialog box is displayed.

- 4. Enter a name for the tab in the Modify tab name dialog box.
- 5. Click OK.

7.1.3 Deleting Tabs



If a tab is deleted, the panels that were added in that tab are also deleted. Note that the deleted tabs cannot be restored so be sure to select the correct tab to delete.

The procedure for deleting tabs is shown below.

- 1. In the left pane of the Performance screen, select a device in which the tab to be deleted is configured.
- 2. Select "X" button for the tab to be deleted in the Tab area of the main pane. The **Delete tab** dialog box is displayed.
- 3. Check the contents displayed in the dialog box and click **OK**.

7.2 Operations for the Performance Monitoring

7.2.1 Starting the Performance Monitoring

The procedure for starting the performance monitoring is shown below.

- 1. In the left pane of the Performance screen, select a device to start the performance monitoring.
- 2. Move the mouse over **Action** in the Tab area of the main pane, and select **Start monitoring** from the displayed menu.
 - The Start performance monitoring dialog box is displayed.
- 3. Enter the required values in the Start performance monitoring dialog box.
- 4. Click OK.

7.2.2 Stopping the Performance Monitoring

The procedure for stopping the performance monitoring is shown below.

- 1. In the left pane of the Performance screen, select a device to stop the performance monitoring.
- 2. Move the mouse over **Action** in the Tab area of the main pane, and select **Stop monitoring** from the displayed menu.
 - The Stop performance monitoring dialog box is displayed.
- 3. Check the contents displayed in the dialog box and click **OK**.

7.2.3 Changing the Performance Monitoring Conditions

The procedure for changing the monitoring conditions of the device where the performance is being monitored is shown below.

- 1. In the left pane of the Performance screen, select a device to change the monitoring conditions.
- 2. Move the mouse over **Action** in the Tab area of the main pane, and select **Modify monitoring conditions** from the displayed menu.
 - The Modifying monitoring conditions dialog box is displayed.
- 3. Enter the required values in the **Modifying monitoring conditions** dialog box.
- 4. Click OK.

7.3 Operations for Panels

7.3.1 Adding Panels

The procedure for adding panels is shown below.

- 1. In the left pane of the Performance screen, select a device in which to add a panel.
- 2. Click the tab to add a panel in the Tab area of the main pane. The tab of the main pane changes to the tab to be operated.
- 3. Click the Add panel button of the Tab area on the main pane. The **Add performance chart panel** dialog box is displayed.
- 4. Configure the settings required for the performance data type to be displayed as a chart in the **Add performance chart panel** dialog box.
- 5. Click Next.
- 6. Configure the settings required for the chart to be displayed (for example, range of vertical axis and whether to display the threshold value).

7. Click OK.



The following shows the number of panels that can be added for each tab.

- If the ETERNUS SF Storage Cruiser Basic License or the ETERNUS SF Storage Cruiser Standard License is registered: 24

- Other than above: 1

7.3.2 Changing the Panel Display Items

The procedure for changing the display items in the panel is shown below.

- 1. In the left pane of the Performance screen, select a device where the panel to be changed is configured.
- 2. In the Tab area of the main pane, click the tab that has the panel to be changed. The selected tab is displayed on the main pane.
- 3. Select **Modify** from the menu of the panel to be changed. The **Modify performance chart panel** dialog box is displayed.
- 4. Configure the settings required for the performance data type to be displayed as a chart in the **Modify** performance chart panel dialog box.
- 5. Click Next.
- 6. Configure the settings required for the chart to be displayed.
- 7. Click OK.

7.3.3 Deleting Panels

The procedure for deleting panels is shown below.

- 1. In the left pane of the Performance screen, select a device where the panel to be deleted is configured.
- 2. In the Tab area of the main pane, click the tab that has the panel to be deleted. The selected tab is displayed on the main pane.
- 3. Select **Remove** from the menu of the panel to be changed. The **Remove performance chart panel** dialog box is displayed.
- 4. Check the contents displayed in the dialog box and click **OK**.

7.3.4 Downloading the Performance Chart Data

The procedure for downloading the performance chart data displayed on the panel is as follows. The format of the downloaded file is fixed to the CSV format. Note that the file format cannot be changed.

- 1. In the left pane of the Performance screen, select a device where the panel to be downloaded is configured.
- 2. In the Tab area of the main pane, click the tab that has the panel to be downloaded. The selected tab is displayed on the main pane.
- 3. Select **Download** from the menu of the panel to be downloaded. The performance chart data is downloaded as a CSV file.



Depending on the browser, the procedure varies when **Download** is selected from the menu (for example, whether the dialog box is displayed and confirmation of the save destination of the file). Check the browser settings in your environment.

Chapter 8 Operations Started From Main Tab

This chapter explains the operations started from clicking Main of the global navigation tab.

8.1 Display Overview Screen

If clicking Main of the global navigation tab, the Overview screen is displayed.

The information displayed on the Overview screen is as follows:

Hardware Components

The status of the storage device, network device, and server is displayed. If clicking the number, the detailed information is displayed.

When multiple irregularities occur in the same system, only one status is displayed. For example, if it is in both "Normal" and "Warning" states, only "Warning" is displayed.

This chapter explains the operations started from clicking Storage of the global navigation tab.

9.1 Operations for ETERNUS Disk Storage System

9.1.1 Register ETERNUS Disk Storage System

The procedure to register an ETERNUS Disk storage system is as follows:

On the global navigation tab, click **Storage**.
 The current registered ETERNUS Disk storage systems are displayed on the Main pane.

2. On the Action pane, click **Discover** under **Disk Array**. The information input screen is displayed.

3. Add an ETERNUS Disk storage system.

For Registering by Searching Subnet

- a. Click the Search on Subnet radio button.
- b. Enter a subnet address and SNMP community name.
- c. Click Discover.

For Registering by Searching IP Address

- a. Click the IP Address radio button.
- b. Enter an IP address.
- c. When using the SNMPv1 protocol, check the "v1" radio button in the **SNMP Version** field and enter the SNMP community name.

When using the SNMPv3 protocol, check the "v3" radio button in the **SNMP Version** field and check the radio button of the target user from among the SNMPv3 MIB access users.

- d. Click Discover.
- 4. Check the target ETERNUS Disk storage system checkbox.
- 5. Enter the user name and password of the checked ETERNUS Disk storage system.

The symbols that can be used for password are as follows.

6. Check the **SNMP Trap Setting** checkbox as needed basis.



- Do not check the **SNMP Trap Setting** checkbox if the target ETERNUS Disk storage system is managed by the Management Server that operates AdvancedCopy Manager's manager only.
- When using the SNMPv3 protocol, the checkbox is grayed out. Perform the SNMP Trap settings in the setup of the SNMP Trap transmission destination on the ETERNUS Disk storage system.

 To automatically update the device component status, enable the "SNMP Trap destination address automatic setting" function by checking the SNMP Trap Setting checkbox. For devices that support automatic updates of the device component status, refer to "Monitoring Device Component Status" in the Storage Cruiser Operation Guide.

7. Click **Register**.



- The registration process of an ETERNUS Disk storage system may take from a few minutes to over 10 minutes depending on the device configuration. The Job Status pane allows you to confirm the completion of an ETERNUS Disk storage system registration process. However, since the information in the Job Status pane is automatically deleted 24 hours after process is completed, check deleted information in "14.1 Display Operation History". The ETERNUS Disk storage system registration process has completed when the displayed items of the Operation History screen is as follows:

- Action: Register Disk Array

- State: Complete

- Result: Success

- Target: IP address of the registered ETERNUS Disk storage system

Do not perform any operation for this ETERNUS Disk storage system until the registration process has been completed.

- If the ETERNUS Disk storage system is a dual stack device to which both IPv4 and IPv6 addresses are configured, register either of the two addresses.
- For IPv6 network environment, the ETERNUS Disk storage system cannot be registered by searching subnets. Register it by searching IP address.
- If the ETERNUS Disk storage system is already registered with IPv6 address, to prevent registration in a dual stack configuration, it cannot be registered with IPv4 address by searching subnets.

9.1.2 Display ETERNUS Disk Storage System

The procedure to display the registered ETERNUS Disk storage system list/details is as follows: To display the list, perform step 1 only.

To display the specific ETERNUS Disk storage system details, perform all steps.

- On the global navigation tab, click Storage.
 The registered ETERNUS Disk storage systems are displayed on the Main pane.
- On the Main pane, click the target ETERNUS Disk storage system.The detail of the selected ETERNUS Disk storage system is displayed on the Main pane.

9.1.3 Delete ETERNUS Disk Storage System

The procedure to delete the registered ETERNUS Disk storage system is as follows:

- On the global navigation tab, click **Storage**.
 The registered ETERNUS Disk storage systems are displayed on the Main pane.
- 2. On the Main pane, check the target ETERNUS Disk storage system checkbox.
- On the Action pane, click **Delete** under **Storage**.
 The information confirmation screen is displayed.
- 4. When releasing the Host Affinity setting related to the ETERNUS Disk storage system, check the **Remove Access**Path checkbox. In case of uncheck this checkbox, delete the access path manually.

5. Click Delete.



- When the **Remove Access Path** checkbox is checked at step 4, zoning information is deleted from the switch on access path. After deleting the ETERNUS Disk storage system, perform **Reload Conf.** for the switch on access path. The zoning information configured to the switch is updated.
- If the ETERNUS Disk storage system is removed from this product, the event notification settings for SNMP Traps that were changed when the device was registered return to the settings prior to the device registration. Refer to [Point] in "Monitoring Device Component Status" in the *Storage Cruiser Operation Guide* for details.
- If the above procedure is performed when AdvancedCopy Manager CCM is operating in the Management Server, the ETERNUS Disk storage system with the same ETERNUS name is also deleted from AdvancedCopy Manager CCM. To continue using the deleted ETERNUS Disk storage system with AdvancedCopy Manager CCM, register it in AdvancedCopy Manager CCM again.

9.1.4 Change ETERNUS Disk Storage System Information

The procedure to change the registered ETERNUS Disk storage system information is as follows:

- On the global navigation tab, click **Storage**.
 The registered ETERNUS Disk storage systems are displayed on the Main pane.
- 2. On the Main pane, check the target ETERNUS Disk storage system checkbox.
- 3. On the Action pane, click **Modify** under **Storage**. The information input screen is displayed.
- 4. Enter the necessary information, and then click Modify.



- This procedure does not include instructions for:
 - Changing any registered IPv4 address to IPv6 address
 - Changing any registered IPv6 address to IPv4 address

To change the IP address version of any registered ETERNUS Disk storage system, delete the registered ETERNUS Disk storage system first and then register the ETERNUS Disk storage system again. When Automated Storage Tiering is used, including the case that one layer Tier pool function is used, perform the procedure of "Change IP Address of Target Device" in the Storage Cruiser Operation Guide for Optimization Function after re-registering the storage device.

- To automatically update the device component status, enable the "SNMP Trap destination address automatic setting" function by checking the **SNMP Trap Setting** checkbox. For devices that support automatic updates of the device component status, refer to "Monitoring Device Component Status" in the *Storage Cruiser Operation Guide*.

9.1.5 Set/Change Information of Account That Can Access ETERNUS Disk Storage System

The procedure to register the information of the account that can access the ETERNUS Disk storage system into this product and the procedure to change the account information registered in this product are as follows:

- On the global navigation tab, click **Storage**.
 The registered ETERNUS Disk storage systems are displayed on the Main pane.
- 2. On the Main pane, check the target ETERNUS Disk storage system checkbox.

- 3. On the Action pane, click **Reset Password** under **Storage**. The information input screen is displayed.
- 4. Enter the necessary information, and then click Reset.



- This procedure does not include instructions for:
 - Registering the account information into the ETERNUS Disk storage system
 - Changing the account information registered in the ETERNUS Disk storage system
- If account information in the ETERNUS Disk storage system is registered or changed, execute this procedure immediately to match the account information in the ETERNUS Disk storage system and this product.

When account information in the ETERNUS Disk storage system and this product is not matched, communication from this product to the ETERNUS Disk storage system fails because of the authentication error. If the authentication error occurs, Web Console cannot display the correct information.

9.1.6 Change Storage System Name or Box ID for ETERNUS Disk Storage System

The procedure to change the ETERNUS Disk storage system name or Box ID managed by this product is as follows.

For Changing Storage System Name

- When using AdvancedCopy Manager CCM

Refer to "Changing Registered Information for ETERNUS Disk Storage System" in the AdvancedCopy Manager Operation Guide for Copy Control Module.

- When not using AdvancedCopy Manager CCM
 - 1. Use ETERNUS Web GUI to change the ETERNUS Disk storage system name.
 - 2. Use Web Console to perform the **Reload Conf.** operation for the ETERNUS Disk storage system whose name was changed.

For Changing Box ID

- When using AdvancedCopy Manager CCM
 - 1. Use ETERNUS Web GUI to change the Box ID of the ETERNUS Disk storage system.
 - 2. Delete the target ETERNUS Disk storage system. Refer to "9.1.3 Delete ETERNUS Disk Storage System" for details.
 - 3. Re-register the target ETERNUS Disk storage system. Refer to "9.1.1 Register ETERNUS Disk Storage System" for details.
 - 4. Re-configure the connection conditions of the ETERNUS Disk storage system. Refer to "9.10.2 Configure Connection Type for ETERNUS Disk Storage System" for details.
- When not using AdvancedCopy Manager CCM
 - 1. Use ETERNUS Web GUI to change the Box ID of the ETERNUS Disk storage system.
 - 2. Delete the target ETERNUS Disk storage system. Refer to "9.1.3 Delete ETERNUS Disk Storage System" for details.
 - 3. Re-register the target ETERNUS Disk storage system. Refer to "9.1.1 Register ETERNUS Disk Storage System" for details.

9.1.7 Configure ETERNUS Disk Storage System

The procedure to configure an ETERNUS Disk storage system is as follows:

- a. Add a server.
- b. Create a new RAID group.
- c. Create new volumes.
- d. Assign volumes to a server.

The procedure to configure an ETERNUS Disk storage system is as follows:

- On the global navigation tab, click **Storage**.
 The registered ETERNUS Disk storage systems are displayed on the Main pane.
- 2. On the Main pane, check the target ETERNUS Disk storage system checkbox.
- 3. On the Action pane, click Storage Conf. under Wizard.

- The Hyper-V configuration information is not automatically updated. If you have changed the configuration information, perform the above procedure to reload the Hyper-V host configuration information.
- For a multipath configuration, the End to End list for Hyper-V displays only one path.
- When the Hyper-V host information is reloaded on a multipath configuration, the using path information is displayed.
- If initiator IP address is not set to the iSCSI initiator when connecting it, the correlation management of Hyper-V is not supported.

9.5.6 Display Hyper-V Host

The procedure to display the Hyper-V host list/details is as follows:

To display the list, perform from step 1 to step 4.

To display the specific Hyper-V host details, perform all steps.

- 3. On the Category pane, click **Correlation**.

 The items of the Category pane change into the items concerning the correlation management.

- 6. On the Main pane, click the **Hyper-V Host** tab, **Hyper-V Guest** tab, **Partition** tab, **Pass-through Disk** tab, or **Virtual Hard Disk** tab.



- To display information, it is required that the Hyper-V host has already been registered.
- When the Data Exchange service of Integration Services is not running on the Hyper-V host, a part of Hyper-V guest information is not displayed.
- When the operating system of Hyper-V guest is not Windows, a part of Hyper-V guest information might be not displayed even if the Data Exchange service of Integration Services is running.

- To display information, it is required that the Hyper-V host has already been registered.

- When the operating system of Hyper-V guest is not Windows, a part of Hyper-V guest information might be not displayed even if the Data Exchange service of Integration Services is running.



The information of virtual HBA on the Hyper-V guest is not displayed.

- The maximum capacity of volume that can be created is the largest contiguous free space in the RAID group. When fragmentation has occurred in the RAID group, the largest contiguous free space is less than the total free capacity of the RAID group.

If the volume cannot be created because of insufficient free capacity of the RAID group, even though you specified

capacity less than the total free capacity of RAID group, use ETERNUS Web GUI to verify the free space of the RAID group.

- In the following cases, the maximum number of volumes cannot be created:
 - There is a Thin Provisioning Pool in the storage device.
 - There is a concatenation volume in the storage device.
 - There is an REC Disk buffer in the storage device.
 - There is a volume which is executing RAID Migration.
 - There is a volume which is executing Thin Provisioning Volume balancing.
- When creating a volume to the RAID group using Self Encrypting Drive (SED) disk, specify "No" for volume encryption.
- Volume creation may take several minutes to several hours depending on the device configuration. When creating a number of volumes at one time, consider the process time to carry it out.
- There are storage device models that cannot set the encryption mode from Web Console. Refer to "Volume Management" in the *Storage Cruiser Operation Guide* for details.
- In Web Console, the volume that is LUN concatenated and Wide Striping Volume cannot be created.
- The type of the volume that can create a Dedup volume is Thin Provisioning Volume only. When creating a Dedup volume, perform the following actions according to the target ETERNUS Disk storage system:
 - For devices that support enabling Deduplication alone or Compression alone
 - If you create a Dedup volume in a Thin Provisioning Pool that has Deduplication enabled, click the "Enable" radio button of the **Deduplication** field.
 - If you create a Dedup volume in a Thin Provisioning Pool that has Compression enabled, click the "Enable" radio button of the **Compression** field.
 - In addition, you must enable Deduplication and Compression of the Thin Provisioning Pool where a Dedup volume is to be created in advance.
 - For devices other than above
 - Click the "Enable" radio button of the **Deduplication/Compression** field.
 - In addition, you must enable Deduplication/Compression of the Thin Provisioning Pool where a Dedup volume is to be created in advance.
- The Allocation setting is available only when creating a Thin Provisioning Volume in an ETERNUS Disk storage system that supports the Allocation function.
 - If "Thin" is selected, the physical area is allocated for use when I/O is issued.
 - If "Thick" is selected, the physical area of the volume capacity is allocated when creating a volume.

9.7.2 Display Volume

The procedure to display volumes is as follows:

- 1. On the global navigation tab, click **Storage**.

 The registered ETERNUS Disk storage systems are displayed on the Main pane.
- 2. On the Main pane, click the target ETERNUS Disk storage system.

In addition, clicking the number of the volume on the Main pane displays the basic information of the volume.



The **Status** column of the volume information shows the status obtained from the storage device. Refer to the manual of the target storage device for the meaning of the status.

9.7.3 Delete Volume

The procedure to delete volumes is as follows:

- On the global navigation tab, click **Storage**.
 The registered ETERNUS Disk storage systems are displayed on the Main pane.
- 2. On the Main pane, click the target ETERNUS Disk storage system.
- On the Category pane, click Volume.The volume list is displayed on the Main pane.
- 4. On the Main pane, check the target volume checkbox.
- 5. On the Action pane, click **Delete** under **Volume**. The information confirmation screen is displayed.
- 6. Confirm the information, and then click Delete.



- Volume deletion may take several minutes to several hours depending on the device configuration. When deleting a number of volumes at one time, consider the process time to carry it out.
- In Web Console, it is not possible to delete Wide Striping Volumes.

- b. Confirm the information, and then click Reserve Delete.

For Deleting Volume forcibly

- a. On the Action pane, click **Force Delete** under **Volume**. The information confirmation screen is displayed.
- b. Confirm the information, and then click Force Delete.

For Formatting Volume

- a. On the Action pane, click **Format** under **Volume**. The information confirmation screen is displayed.
- b. Confirm the information, and then click Format.



In Web Console, the following operations cannot be performed:

Specify whether to use Extreme Cache/Extreme Cache Pool of each volume.

After the volume is created, the Extreme Cache configuration (Enabled or Disabled) can be changed. The default setting is "Enabled" when the volume is created. The change of Extreme Cache configuration is required only when Extreme Cache is used for a specific volume. In addition, this configuration is also common in Extreme Cache Pools.

- ETERNUS DX series (excluding the ETERNUS DX60 S2)
- ETERNUS AF All-Flash Arrays
- ETERNUS DX200F

How to Create RAID Group Automatically

The procedure to create the RAID group within an ETERNUS Disk storage system automatically is as follows:

- On the global navigation tab, click **Storage**.
 The registered ETERNUS Disk storage systems are displayed on the Main pane.
- 2. On the Main pane, click the target ETERNUS Disk storage system.
- 3. On the Category pane, click RAID Group.
- 4. On the Action pane, click **Create** under **RAID Group**. The information input screen is displayed.
- 5. Enter the necessary information in the Name, the RAID Type and the Disk Type fields.
- 6. Click the Automatic radio button in the Create Mode.
- 7. Enter the **Number of RAID Groups**, **Minimum Capacity per RAID Group** and **Select Disks** (only when "High Reliability (RAID6-FR)" is selected for **RAID Type**), and then click **Next**.

 The information confirmation screen is displayed.
- 8. Check that the configuration of the RAID groups to be created is correct, and then click **Create**. The creation of the RAID groups is started.

How to Create RAID Group Manually

9.9 Operations for Thin Provisioning

9.9.1 Create Thin Provisioning Pool

The methods for creating Thin Provisioning Pools are automatic creation and manual creation.

If automatic creation is selected, a Thin Provisioning Pool that is configured with suitable disks based on a specified disk type, reliability, and the total capacity of the Thin Provisioning Pool is automatically created. Automatic creation of Thin Provisioning Pools can be performed for the following storage devices:

- ETERNUS DX S5/S4/S3 series (V10L70 or later firmware is required for the ETERNUS DX S3 series.)
- ETERNUS AF All-Flash Arrays (V10L70 or later firmware is required for the ETERNUS AF series.)
- ETERNUS DX200F (V10L70 or later firmware)



- Automatic creation is recommended due to the advanced knowledge required to create Thing Provisioning Pools that have Deduplication/Compression enabled for the above models excluding the ETERNUS DX S5 series, ETERNUS DX8900 S4, ETERNUS AF S3 series. Refer to the following section in the Chapter "Operation" in the Storage Cruiser Operation Guide.
 - "Resource Management" > "Thin Provisioning Management"
- During manual creation, if you select "High Reliability(RAID6-FR)" in the **Reliability** field, you must specify the parameter in the **Fast Recovery Configuration** field. In addition, creating RAID groups based on the number of disks for the specified configuration is required. During automatic creation, you must specify the parameter in the **Select Drives** field.



To use the Self Encryption Drive (SED) for a disk in a Thin Provisioning Pool, specify "No" for the **Encryption** field of the pool.

Procedure for Automatic Creation of Thin Provisioning Pools

 The information input screen is displayed. (Specify disks to create RAID Groups)
- 7. Enter the necessary information, and then click **Next**. The information confirmation screen is displayed.
- 8. Confirm the information, and then click Create.

- The Thin Provisioning Pool that can be displayed in one Capacity Chart window is only one.
- When "1 Month" is specified in the Duration, the data of every one day is plotted from present to 1 month ago (for 31 days).
 - When "1 Year" or "10 Years" is specified in the Duration, the data of every one month is plotted for one year or ten years.
- The threshold value is not displayed in the Capacity Chart window.

- On the Action pane, click Modify under Copy Table Size.
 The information input screen is displayed.
- 6. Enter the necessary information, and then click Modify.

9.10.2 Configure Connection Type for ETERNUS Disk Storage System

- When not using the Storage Cluster Continuous Copy function, do not specify TFOV for both copy source and copy destination. However, you can specify TFOV for either copy source or copy destination.
- In Web Console, backups for volume content to partitions using the LU to Partition function of AdvancedCopy Manager CCM is not supported. For the LU to Partition function, use the AdvancedCopy Manager CCM commands. Refer to "LU to Partition" in the AdvancedCopy Manager Operation Guide for Copy Control Module for information on using LU to Partition function.
- In an environment using the Copy command via LAN, creating lots of copy pairs all at once for the copy group of the SnapOPC+ copy type from Web Console may take some ten minutes to some hours to finish the processing. - To start the access status data synchronization process for Automated Storage Tiering, the Tier pools that include FTVs that are defined in the TFO group must have a one-to-one relationship between the Primary Storage and the Secondary Storage of the Storage Cluster environment. If a one-to-one relationship does not exist, review the settings of the Affinity/LUN group for each storage device.
- If the synchronization target Tier pool has been changed due to a change in the Storage Cluster settings while synchronizing the access status data, the access status data synchronization process is aborted. To restart the synchronization process, Automated Storage Tiering must be re-executed for the synchronization target Tier pool.
- If the TFO group where FTVs in a Tier pool belong was created/recreated after starting Automated Storage Tiering, the access status data synchronization process for that Tier pool is not performed. To perform the access status data synchronization, Automated Storage Tiering for one of the synchronization target Tier pools must be restarted.

- 5. On the Action pane, click **Delete** under **VVOL Datastore**. The Delete VVOL Datastore page is displayed.
- 6. Confirm that the target VVOL datastore is displayed, and then click **Delete**.



The VVOL datastore that Virtual Volumes are created cannot be deleted.

9.19.3 Operations for Clone Backup VVOL Datastore



To use a clone backup of the Virtual Machine backup, a Clone backup VVOL datastore is required. Create one Clone backup VVOL datastore for each ETERNUS Disk storage system that the target virtual machine of the clone backup is connected.

9.19.3.1 Create Clone Backup VVOL Datastore

The procedure to create a Clone backup VVOL datastore is as follows:

- 1. On the global navigation tab, click Storage.
- On the Category pane, click VVOL Management.The VVOL datastore list is displayed on the Main pane.
- On the Action pane, click Create / Modify under for Clone Backup.
 The Specify VVOL Datastore Information for Clone Backup page is displayed.
- 4. Input a Clone backup VVOL datastore name. In addition, select the Tier pool to add to the Clone backup VVOL datastore from the Tier Pool List, and then click Add. Select a Tier pool that exists in the ETERNUS Disk storage system where the virtual machine is connected to. When the input is completed, click Next.
- 5. The information confirmation screen is displayed. Confirm the information, and then click **Create / Modify**.



- By specifying the Clone backup VVOL datastore that are created with this operation, a Virtual Volume cannot be created.
- A Clone backup VVOL datastore that is configured with multiple Tier pools can be created. However, Tier pools that exist within different ETERNUS Disk storage systems in a single Clone backup VVOL datastore cannot be mixed. When creating a Clone backup VVOL datastore that is configured with multiple Tier pools, specify Tier pools that exist within the same ETERNUS Disk storage system.
- Clone backup VVOL datastores can be created one at a time in each ETERNUS Disk storage system. However, this area is only valid for Virtual Volumes that are created in the same ETERNUS Disk storage system.
- Clone backup VVOL datastores can be configured of a maximum of 16 Tier pools.
- Multiple Clone backup VVOL datastores can share the same Tier pools as desired. A maximum of 16 can be shared.
- Up to a total of 1023 Clone backup VVOL datastores or VVOL datastores can be created.
- A name of up to 16 characters can be applied to a Clone backup VVOL datastore. Characters that can be used in names are alphanumerical characters, sharps (#), hyphens (-), and underscores (_). Names are not case-sensitive. Names starting with "POOLGROUP" cannot be configured.

9.19.3.2 Change Clone Backup VVOL Datastore

The procedure to change the Clone backup VVOL datastore is as follows:

- 1. On the global navigation tab, click **Storage**.
- 2. On the Category pane, click **VVOL Management**. The VVOL datastore list is displayed on the Main pane.
- 3. On the Main pane, check the target Clone backup VVOL datastore checkbox.
- On the Action pane, click Create / Modify under for Clone Backup.
 The Specify VVOL Datastore Information for Clone Backup page is displayed.

5. Perform the following procedures according to the operation purpose.

For Adding Tier Pool

Select the Tier pool for adding to the Clone backup VVOL datastore from the Tier Pool List, and then click **Add**.

For Deleting Tier Pool

Select the target Tier pool from the **Tier Pool Configuration of VVOL Datastore for Clone Backup**, and then click **Remove**

For Changing Clone Backup VVOL Datastore Name

Input a new name.

When the input is completed, click Next.

6. The information confirmation screen is displayed. Confirm the information, and then click Create / Modify.



- A Clone backup VVOL datastore that is configured with multiple Tier pools can be created. However, Tier pools that
 exist within different ETERNUS Disk storage systems in a single Clone backup VVOL datastore cannot be mixed.
 When creating a Clone backup VVOL datastore that is configured with multiple Tier pools, specify Tier pools that
 exist within the same ETERNUS Disk storage system.
- Tier pools where Virtual Volumes are created cannot be deleted. When deleting Tier pools where Virtual Volumes have been created, delete the Tier pool after deleting all Virtual Volumes.

9.19.3.3 Delete Clone Backup VVOL Datastore

The procedure to delete the Clone backup VVOL datastore is as follows:

- 1. On the global navigation tab, click **Storage**.
- 2. On the Category pane, click **VVOL Management**.

 The items of the Category pane change into the items concerning the VVOL Management.
- On the Category pane, click VVOL Datastore.
 The VVOL datastore list is displayed on the Main pane.
- 4. On the Main pane, check the target Clone backup VVOL datastore checkbox.
- 5. On the Action pane, click **Delete** under **for Clone Backup**. The Delete VVOL Datastore for Clone Backup page is displayed.
- 6. Confirm that the target Clone backup VVOL datastore is displayed, and then click Delete.



The Clone backup VVOL datastore that Virtual Volumes are created cannot be deleted.

9.19.4 Operations for VVOL Access Path

VVOL access path is the connection setting for the VMware host, FC switch, and the ETERNUS Disk storage system. The setting is necessary in order to recognize the created VVOL datastore in the VMware host.

9.19.4.1 VVOL Access Path Setting

The procedure to set a VVOL access path is as follows:

1. On the global navigation tab, click **Storage**.

- 2. On the Category pane, click **VVOL Management**.

 The items of the Category pane change into the items concerning the VVOL Management.
- 3. On the Category pane, click **VVOL Access Path**. The VVOL access path list is displayed on the Main pane.
- 4. On the Action pane, click Set under VVOL Access Path.
- The Welcome page is displayed. Click Next.
 The Specify Disk Array and Server page is displayed.
- 6. Select the ETERNUS Disk storage system and server for setting the VVOL access path, and then click **Next**. The Specify HBA and Port HBA page is displayed.
- 7. When performing an FC switch zoning setting, select "Yes", otherwise select "No".

Perform the following operations for each HBA.

- a. Check the Set Access Path checkbox for the HBA where the access path setting is performed.
- b. Click Connect for the HBA that was loaded in the VMware host. In the displayed dialog box, check the checkbox for the port of the connection target ETERNUS Disk storage system and then click OK.
- c. Refer to the ETERNUS Disk storage system manuals and specify the host response that corresponds to the server.

When the input is completed, click Next.

8. The information confirmation screen is displayed. Confirm the information, and then click Set.



The FC switch between the VMware host and the ETERNUS Disk storage system is registered as a device and when selected to perform as a zoning settings in step 7, the zoning of this FC switch is automatically configured.

9.19.4.2 Change VVOL Access Path

When Replacing FC HBA of Management Target VMware Host

After replacing the HBA hardware for the same slot on the server, perform an access path inheritance. When performing an access path inheritance, an inheritance is also performed for the access path that is set for the same server HBA and disk storage system port. Refer to "11.4.7 Inherit Access Path" for information on the access path inheritance procedure.

When changing the connection to an FC HBA of a different slot on the server, delete the VVOL access path, and after changing the access path, perform a VVOL access path reconfiguration. Refer to "9.19.4.3 Delete VVOL Access Path", "11.4.5 Change Access Path", and "9.19.4.1 VVOL Access Path Setting" for information on the various operations.

When Replacing iSCSI HBA of Management Target VMware Host

For the replaced iSCSI HBA, set with the same iSCSI Name and IP address that was set before the replacement. An access path inheritance operation is not required.

When Changing Connection Ports for Same HBA

After deleting the VVOL access path and the access path, set the access path and VVOL access path again. Refer to "9.19.4.3 Delete VVOL Access Path", "11.4.4 Delete Access Path", "11.4.2 Add Access Path to ETERNUS Disk Storage System" and "9.19.4.1 VVOL Access Path Setting" for information on the various operations.

9.19.4.3 Delete VVOL Access Path

The procedure to delete the VVOL access path is as follows:

1. On the global navigation tab, click **Storage**.

- 2. On the Category pane, click **VVOL Management**.

 The items of the Category pane change into the items concerning the VVOL Management.
- 3. On the Category pane, click **VVOL Access Path**. The VVOL access path list is displayed on the Main pane.
- 4. On the Main pane, check the target VVOL access path checkbox.
- 5. On the Action pane, click **Delete** under **VVOL Access Path**. The Delete VVOL Access Path page is displayed.
- 6. Confirm that the target VVOL access path is displayed, and then click **Delete**.



- In environments in which multipath is not configured, the VVOL access path in use (path that the virtual machine is operating) cannot be deleted. In environments in which multipath is configured, VVOL access paths can be deleted until there is only one VVOL access path remaining.
- In an environment in which both an access path and a VVOL access path are set, if only one of access paths is deleted, FC switch zoning is not deleted. In both the access path and the VVOL access path are deleted, zoning is deleted.

9.19.4.4 Update VVOL Access Path Status

The VVOL access path status is updated only when reloading the configurations for both the related ETERNUS Disk storage system and the servers. However, by performing an operation for updating the VVOL access path status, the latest status of the VVOL access path can be checked.

Update the VVOL access path status for the following situations:

- When setting/changing/deleting the VVOL access path
- When notified of an event that is related to a device or part that is related to the VVOL access path

The procedure to update the VVOL access path status is as follows:

- 1. On the global navigation tab, click Storage.
- 2. On the Category pane, click **VVOL Management**.

 The items of the Category pane change into the items concerning the VVOL Management.
- 3. On the Category pane, click **VVOL Access Path**.

 The VVOL access path list is displayed on the Main pane.
- 4. On the Action pane, click Reload under VVOL Access Path.



When performing this operation, the VVOL access path status and access path status are updated simultaneously.

9.19.5 Operations for Virtual Volume

Virtual Volumes cannot be created/changed/deleted from Web Console. Refer to the VMware vCenter Server manuals and perform the operation.

However, Virtual Volumes where the management information (metadata) is broken can be deleted from Web Console.

9.19.5.1 Display Virtual Volume

The procedure to display the Virtual Volumes is as follows:

- To view a list of Virtual Volumes created in a specific VVOL datastore
 - 1. On the global navigation tab, click **Storage**.
 - 2. On the Category pane, click **VVOL Management**. The VVOL datastore list is displayed on the Main pane.
 - 3. On the Main pane, click the VVOL datastore that the Virtual Volume has been created.
 - 4. On the Main pane, click the Virtual Volume tab.
 The list of Virtual Volumes that are created in the selected VVOL datastore is displayed.
 Check whether the Virtual Volumes that have been created with VMware vCenter Server are displayed.
- To view a list of Virtual Volumes created in all the VVOL datastores
 - 1. On the global navigation tab, click Storage.
 - 2. On the Category pane, click VVOL Management.
 - 3. On the Category pane, click **VVOL List**.

 The list of Virtual Volumes that are created in all the VVOL datastores is displayed on the Main pane.

 Check whether the Virtual Volumes that have been created with VMware vCenter Server are displayed.

9.19.5.2 Delete Virtual Volume

Virtual Volumes where the management information (metadata) is broken are displayed as "Unknown" in the **VVOL Type** column in the Volume List screen of Web Console and can be deleted using the same procedure for FTVs. Refer to "9.14.23 Delete FTV" for information on how to delete the Virtual Volume which "Unknown" is displayed in the **VVOL Type** column.

9.19.6 Operations for Virtual Machine Backup

9.19.6.1 Automatic Execution Setting of Virtual Machine Backup

By setting a backup policy schedule on VMware vCenter Server, virtual machine backups are performed automatically. With Web Console, automatic execution of the virtual machine backup can be set to enable/disable.

The procedure to enable/disable the automatic execution of virtual machine backups is as follows:

- 1. On the global navigation tab, click Storage.
- On the Category pane, click VVOL Management.
 The items of the Category pane change into the items concerning the VVOL Management.
- 3. On the Category pane, click **VVOL Backup Management**. The VMware guest list is displayed on the Main pane.
- 4. On the Main pane, click the target VMware guest.
- 5. On the Action pane, click **Enable** or **Disable** under **Auto Execution**.

9.19.6.2 Manual Execution of Virtual Machine Backup

With Web Console, a virtual machine backup can be instantaneously executed manually.

The procedure to execute the virtual machine backup manually is as follows:

- 1. On the global navigation tab, click Storage.
- 2. On the Category pane, click **VVOL Management**.

 The items of the Category pane change into the items concerning the VVOL Management.
- 3. On the Category pane, click **VVOL Backup Management**. The VMware guest list is displayed on the Main pane.
- 4. On the Main pane, check the target VMware guest checkbox.

On the Action pane, click Execute under Manual Execution.
 The warning dialog box is displayed. Check the displayed information, and then click OK.

9.19.6.3 Display Virtual Machine Backup History

The procedure to display the virtual machine backup history is as follows:

- 1. On the global navigation tab, click Storage.
- On the Category pane, click VVOL Management.
 The items of the Category pane change into the items concerning the VVOL Management.
- On the Category pane, click VVOL Backup History. The backup history list is displayed on the Main pane.
- 4. When displaying the Snapshot backup history, click the **Snapshot Backup History** tab in the Main pane. When displaying the Clone backup history, click the **Clone Backup History** tab in the Main pane.

9.19.6.4 Restore from Snapshot Backup

Restoration from a Snapshot backup is a function that restores the VMware guest to the point in time when the backup was acquired.

The procedure to restore from the Snapshot backup is as follows:

- 1. On the global navigation tab, click **Storage**.
- 2. On the Category pane, click **VVOL Management**.

 The items of the Category pane change into the items concerning the VVOL Management.
- On the Category pane, click VVOL Backup History.The backup history list is displayed on the Main pane.
- 4. On the Main pane, click the Snapshot Backup History tab. Then, check the target backup history checkbox.
- 5. On the Action pane, click **Restore** under **Snapshot**.

 The warning dialog box is displayed. Check the displayed information, and then click **OK**.



Executing a restore by specifying a VMware guest is also possible. The restoration procedure of the Snapshot backup where the VMware guest is specified is as follows:

- 1. On the global navigation tab, click **Storage**.
- On the Category pane, click VVOL Management.
 The items of the Category pane change into the items concerning the VVOL Management.
- 3. On the Category pane, click **VVOL Backup Management**. The VMware guest list is displayed on the Main pane.
- 4. On the Main pane, click the target VMware guest. The VMware Guest Details screen is displayed.
- 5. Click the Snapshot Backup History tab. Then, check the target backup history checkbox.
- On the Action pane, click Restore under Snapshot.
 The warning dialog box is displayed. Check the displayed information, and then click OK.



If the VMware guest of the backup source has been deleted, a restoration of the Snapshot backup cannot be executed.

9.19.6.5 Single Item Restore from Snapshot Backup

Single item restore performs a restore to a temporary volume that is different from the Virtual Volume that was backed up. The temporary volume is automatically allocated to the VMware guest where the Snapshot backup was acquired. By referencing the temporary volume from the VMware guest, a restoration can be manually performed for each file.

The procedure to perform the single item restore from the Snapshot backup is as follows:

- 1. On the global navigation tab, click Storage.
- On the Category pane, click VVOL Management.
 The items of the Category pane change into the items concerning the VVOL Management.
- 3. On the Category pane, click **VVOL Backup History**. The backup history list is displayed on the Main pane.
- 4. On the Main pane, click the Snapshot Backup History tab. Then, check the target backup history checkbox.
- 5. On the Action pane, click Single Item Restore under Snapshot.
- 6. The Single Item Restore screen is displayed. Enter the allocation time duration of temporary volume and check the target VMDK files. Then, click **Restore**.

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Executing a Single item restore by specifying a VMware guest is also possible. The Single item restore procedure of the Snapshot backup where the VMware guest is specified is as follows:

- 1. On the global navigation tab, click Storage.
- 2. On the Category pane, click **VVOL Management**.

 The items of the Category pane change into the items concerning the VVOL Management.
- On the Category pane, click VVOL Backup Management. The VMware guest list is displayed on the Main pane.
- 4. On the Main pane, click the target VMware guest. The VMware Guest Details screen is displayed.
- 5. Click the Snapshot Backup History tab. Then, check the target backup history checkbox.
- 6. On the Action pane, click Single Item Restore under Snapshot.
- 7. The Single Item Restore screen is displayed. Enter the allocation time duration of temporary volume and check the target VMDK files. Then, click **Restore**.



If the VMware guest of the backup source has been deleted, a single item restore of the Snapshot backup cannot be executed.

9.19.6.6 Delete Snapshot Backup

The procedure to delete the Snapshot backup is as follows:

- 1. On the global navigation tab, click Storage.
- On the Category pane, click VVOL Management.
 The items of the Category pane change into the items concerning the VVOL Management.
- 3. On the Category pane, click **VVOL Backup History**. The backup history list is displayed on the Main pane.
- 4. On the Main pane, click the Snapshot Backup History tab. Then, check the target backup history checkbox.

On the Action pane, click **Delete** under **Snapshot**.
 The warning dialog box is displayed. Check the displayed information, and then click **OK**.



Even if this operation is performed, the Virtual Volume of the backup source is not deleted.

9.19.6.7 Restore from Clone Backup

Restore from the Clone backup is a function to restore newly created Virtual Volumes and VMware guests. Different from restore of the Snapshot backup, restore from the Clone backup is available even if a Virtual Volume as backup source is damage or deleted.

The procedure to restore from the Clone backup is as follows:

- 1. On the global navigation tab, click Storage.
- 2. On the Category pane, click **VVOL Management**.

 The items of the Category pane change into the items concerning the VVOL Management.
- 3. On the Category pane, click **VVOL Backup History**. The backup history list is displayed on the Main pane.
- 4. On the Main pane, click the Clone Backup History tab. Then, check the target backup history checkbox.
- 5. On the Action pane, click **Restore** under **Clone Backup**.
- 6. The Restore Clone Backup screen is displayed. Enter the name of the VMware guest that is newly created, and then click **Restore**.



Executing a restore by specifying a VMware guest is also possible. However, if the target VMware guest is deleted, the operation is not possible because the VMware guest is not displayed in the VMware Guest Overview screen. When restoring a deleted VMware guest, operate from the VVOL Backup History screen.

The restoration procedure of the Clone backup where the VMware guest is specified is as follows:

- 1. On the global navigation tab, click Storage.
- 2. On the Category pane, click **VVOL Management**.

 The items of the Category pane change into the items concerning the VVOL Management.
- 3. On the Category pane, click **VVOL Backup Management**. The VMware guest list is displayed on the Main pane.
- 4. On the Main pane, click the target VMware guest. The VMware Guest Details screen is displayed.
- 5. Click the Clone Backup History tab. Then, check the target backup history checkbox.
- 6. On the Action pane, click **Restore** under **Clone Backup**.
- 7. The Restore Clone Backup screen is displayed. Enter the name of the VMware guest that is newly created, and then click **Restore**.



When restoring with the same name as the VMware guest where the backup was acquired, the VMware guest where the backup was acquired must be deleted before the restoration. Refer to the VMware vCenter Server manuals for information on the VMware guest deletion procedure.

9.19.6.8 Delete Clone Backup

The procedure to delete the Clone backup is as follows:

- 1. On the global navigation tab, click **Storage**.
- On the Category pane, click VVOL Management.
 The items of the Category pane change into the items concerning the VVOL Management.
- 3. On the Category pane, click **VVOL Backup History**. The backup history list is displayed on the Main pane.
- 4. On the Main pane, click the Clone Backup History tab. Then, check the target backup history checkbox.

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On the Action pane, click **Delete** under **Clone Backup**.
 The warning dialog box is displayed. Check the displayed information, and then click **OK**.



Even if this operation is performed, the backup source Virtual Volume is not deleted.

Chapter 10 Operations Started From Network Tab

This chapter explains the operations started from clicking Network of the global navigation tab.

10.1 Display FC Switch

The procedure to display the registered FC switch list/details is as follows:

To display the list, perform step 1 only.

To display the specific FC switch details, perform all steps.

- On the global navigation tab, click Network.
 The registered FC switch list is displayed on the Main pane.
- 2. On the Main pane, click the target FC switch.

 The detail of the selected FC switch is displayed on the Main pane.

10.2 Register FC Switch

The procedure to register the FC switch is as follows:

- 1. On the global navigation tab, click Network.
- On the Action pane, click **Discover** under **Switch**. The information input screen is displayed.
- 3. Enter the necessary information, and then click **Discover**. The information registration screen is displayed.
- 4. Check the target switch checkbox.
- 5. Specify the FC switch information, and then click Register.



- First register the Principal switch and then register all the FC switches that make up the fabric.

If the Principal switch has not registered first or unknown, on completion of registration of all the FC switches making up the fabric, perform "10.8 Reload FC Switch Configuration Information" on all the FC switches making up the fabric.

- For the FC switch, register the FC switch after enabling the SSH connection of the FC switch.



- If the FC switch is a dual stack device to which both IPv4 and IPv6 addresses are configured, register either of the two addresses.
- Insure that the URL for the Management Software is in one of the following formats. If it is not then an unexpected action is done.

10.3 Delete FC Switch

The procedure to delete the FC switch is as follows:

- 1. On the global navigation tab, click **Network**.

 The registered FC switch list is displayed on the Main pane.
- 2. On the Main pane, check the target FC switch checkbox.
- On the Action pane, click **Delete** under **Switch**.The information confirmation screen is displayed.
- 4. Confirm the information, and then click **Delete**.

10.4 Change FC Switch Information

The procedure to change the FC switch information is as follows:

- On the global navigation tab, click Network.
 The registered FC switch list is displayed on the Main pane.
- 2. On the Main pane, check the target FC switch checkbox.
- 3. On the Action pane, click **Delete** under **Switch**. The information input screen is displayed.
- 4. Refer to the following table to enter the necessary information, and then click Modify.

Item Name	Explanation
SNMP Community Name(Write)	This is a Write-direction SNMP community name. In order to start/stop beacon, it is necessary to set the Write-direction SNMP community name correctly. The "private" is specified at the time of the device registration. If it does not agree to the value of the FC switch, set a correct value on this screen.



This procedure does not include instructions for:

- Changing any registered IPv4 address to IPv6 address.
- Changing any registered IPv6 address to IPv4 address.

To change the IP address version of any registered FC switch, delete the registered FC switch first and then register the FC switch again.

10.5 Reset FC Switch Password

The procedure to re-configure the FC switch password is as follows:

- 1. On the global navigation tab, click **Network**.

 The registered FC switch list is displayed on the Main pane.
- 2. On the Main pane, check the target FC switch checkbox.
- 3. On the Action pane, click **Reset Password** under **Switch**. The information input screen is displayed.
- 4. Enter the necessary information, and then click Reset.

10.6 Display FC Switch Ports

The procedure to display the FC switch ports is as follows:

On the global navigation tab, click **Network**.
 The registered FC switch list is displayed on the Main pane.

- 2. On the Main pane, click the target FC switch.
- 3. On the Category pane, click **Port**.

 The FC switch ports are displayed on the Main pane.



1GbE RJ45 port is not displayed.

10.7 Display/Delete FC switch Zoning

The procedure to display/delete the FC switch zoning is as follows:

- On the global navigation tab, click Network.
 The registered FC switch list is displayed on the Main pane.
- 2. On the Main pane, click the target FC switch.
- 3. On the Category pane, click **Zoning**.

 The FC switch zoning information is displayed on the Main pane.
- 4. Perform the following procedures according to the operation purpose.

For Displaying

a. On the Main pane, click the target zoning.
 The World Wide Port Name (WWPN) registered in the clicked zoning is displayed on the Main pane.

For Deleting

- a. On the Main pane, click the target zoning checkbox.
- b. On the Action pane, click **Delete** under **Zoning**. The information confirmation screen is displayed.
- c. Confirm the information, and then click **Delete**.

10.8 Reload FC Switch Configuration Information

The procedure to reload the FC switch configuration information is as follows:

- On the global navigation tab, click Network.
 The registered FC switch list is displayed on the Main pane.
- 2. On the Main pane, check the target FC switch checkbox.
- 3. On the Action pane, click **Reload Conf.** under **Switch**.



- In registering FC switches, if the Principal switch has not been registered beforehand or unknown, on completion of registration of all the FC switches making up the fabric, perform this operation on all the FC switches making up the fabric.
- If the FC switch configuration has been changed in such cases as below, perform this operation on all the FC switches making up the fabric:
 - The Principal switch was changed due to FC switch replacement.
 - The fabric configuration was changed due to cascade connection/disconnection between FC switches.
 - Switches were added to or deleted from the fabric.
 - The Principal switch was intentionally changed.

10.9 Start/Stop Beacon



- The beacon can be operated only with FC switches that are using the SNMPv1 protocol.
- In order to start/stop beacon, it is necessary to set the Write-direction SNMP community name of the FC switch to the ETERNUS SF system. When the device is registered to the ETERNUS SF system, "private" is set by default. If the Write-direction SNMP community name of the FC switch is not "private", refer to "10.4 Change FC Switch Information" to change the SNMP Community Name(Write).

- Before operating the beacon, execute the snmpConfig command of the FC switch and check that SNMP SET Security Level is "No security". - b. Confirm the information, and then click Start.

For Stopping of Beacon

- a. On the Action pane, click **Beacon (Stop)** under **Beacon**. The information confirmation screen is displayed.

The server registration processing has completed when the displayed items of the **Operation History** screen is as follows:

- State: Complete
- Result: Success
- Target: IP address for registered server

Do not perform any operation for this server until the registration processing has been completed.

- Do not register a server which is managed by another Management Server.
- To install the Storage Cruiser's agent on the Managed Server which the AdvancedCopy Manager's agent has been installed, it is necessary to register its Managed Server again after deleting it.
- If the server is a dual stack device to which both IPv4 and IPv6 addresses are configured, register either of the two addresses.
- For a server on which the following agent is installed, even if IPv6 address exists in the server, its registration is accepted only with IPv4 address.
 - Storage Cruiser's agent that does not support IPv6 address



- If the server where the ETERNUS SF Agent is installed is a clustered system, select/input each item as shown in the following table and register both the logical node and the physical node.
 - However, when using the Storage Cruiser's agent only, registration of the logical node is not necessary.
 - When not operating Storage Cruiser and when operating AdvancedCopy Manager with the logical node only, registration of the physical node is not necessary.

- When registering VMware host or VMware guest, select "Yes" for **VMware ESX**, and enter the VMware host user name, password, and IP address. When the VMware host is registered, all the VMware guests that were created in that VMware host are automatically registered.

When VMware guests are not displayed, execute the following procedure:

- 1. Install VMware Tools in the VMware guest. (Recommended)
- 2. Check that the VMware guest has started.
- 3. With Web Console, perform the **Reload Conf.** operation for the VMware host that is registered in the ETERNUS SF system.
- In a VMware vSphere Virtual Volumes environment, a VMware guest created in the VVOL datastore is automatically registered on the ETERNUS SF system after the power is turned on for the first time. However, the VMware host to which the VMware guest belongs must be registered to the ETERNUS SF system beforehand.

 After the VMware guest has been recognized, if you want to update the status of the VMware guest to the latest one, perform the **Reload Conf.** operation for the VMware host.

11.1.2 Display Server

The registered server list is displayed on the Main pane when clicking Server on the global navigation tab.



- The servers registered by CLI are not displayed on Web Console.
- In the case of the following servers, a displayed operating system name may be different from a Storage Cruiser's agent installed server:
 - VMware Host
 - VMware Guest
 - Hyper-V host

11.1.3 Display Server Details

The procedure to display the detailed information of the registered server is as follows:

- On the global navigation tab, click Server.
 The registered servers are displayed on the Main pane.
- 2. On the Main pane, click the target server name.

 The detailed information of the server and HBA list are displayed on the Main pane.



A CNA card installed in the server is displayed as "FC HBA".

11.1.4 Delete Server

The procedure to delete the registered server is as follows:

- On the global navigation tab, click Server.
 The registered servers are displayed on the Main pane.
- 2. On the Main pane, check the target server checkbox.
- 3. On the Action pane, click **Delete** under **Server**. The information confirmation screen is displayed.
- 4. Confirm the information, and then click **Delete**.



- If there are access paths connected with the server to be deleted

To continue server operations even after excluding the server as a management target of this product, do not delete the access paths that are connected to the server.

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To stop server operations such as by physically removing the server, delete all the access paths connected to the server and then delete the server.

- If the server is registered as the Hyper-V host
 - Before deleting the server, delete the registration as the Hyper-V host.
- If you delete the VMware host

After deleting all VMware guests that belong to the target VMware host, delete the VMware host.

11.1.5 Change Server Information



To change the server information, there are operations that are required before and after use of Web Console. For this reason, change the server information after referring to the following sections in the operation guide of the product in use:

- "Maintenance" in the Express Operation Guide
- "Changing Operating Environment" in the Storage Cruiser Operation Guide
- "Changing Operating Environment" in "Operation Maintenance" in the AdvancedCopy Manager Operation Guide

The procedure to change the registered server information on the Modify Server screen of Web Console is as follows:

- On the global navigation tab, click Server.
 The registered servers are displayed on the Main pane.
- 2. On the Main pane, check the target server checkbox.
- 3. On the Action pane, click **Modify** under **Server**. The information input screen is displayed.
- 4. Enter the necessary information, and then click Modify.



- If the following conditions apply, it is necessary to perform the above procedure to declare the use of AdvancedCopy Manager:
 - The server registered using Web Console has been set up the Managed Server of AdvancedCopy Manager using the command.
 - In addition, you perform the Advanced Copy functions in Web Console.
- When using the Advanced Copy function on the server registered by Web Console, specify "Yes" for [Use AdvancedCopy Manager]. In addition, when a server registered by Web Console is configured by the command as the Managed Server of AdvancedCopy Manager, it is necessary to perform same procedures for using the Advanced Copy function.

 - Registering the account information into the VMware Host
 - Changing the account information registered in the VMware Host
- If account information in the VMware Host is registered or changed, execute this procedure immediately to match the account information in the VMware Host and this product.

When account information in the VMware Host and this product are not matched, communicate from this product to the VMware Host fails because of the authentication error. If the authentication error occurs, Web Console cannot display the correct information.

11.1.7 Reload Server Configuration Information

The procedure to reload the server configuration information is as follows:

On the global navigation tab, click Server.
 The registered server list is displayed on the Main pane.

- 2. On the Main pane, check the target server checkbox.

 If the target server is a VM guest, check the checkbox of the VM host where the VM guest exists.

If you change the Management Server name or the Managed Server name with the stgxfwcmmodsrv command, the **AdvancedCopy Manager Server Name** field on the Server Detail screen is refreshed by reloading the server configuration information. The Sever List screen and the **Name** field of the Server Detail screen are not refreshed.

It may take a few minutes to display the status of the access path after the link status is changed. For devices that support automatic updates of the device component status, refer to "Monitoring Device Component Status" in the *Storage Cruiser Operation Guide*.

If the link status of the port is not changed or if the device does not support automatic updates of the device component status, the status of the access path is not updated automatically. When you check the status of the access path, click **Refresh** on the Action pane to update the status of the access path.

It may take a few minutes to update the status of the access path. You can confirm the completion of the processing on the **Operation History** screen.

11.4.2 Add Access Path to ETERNUS Disk Storage System

The procedure to add an access path to an ETERNUS Disk storage system is as follows:

- 1. On the global navigation tab, click Server.
- On the Category pane, click Access Path.
 The connection information for a server and storage devices is displayed on the Main pane.
- 3. On the Action pane, click Add (ETERNUS) under Access Path.
- 4. Click the target server radio button on the Select Server screen. Enter the necessary information, and then click **Next**.

Even if this operation is interrupted, the new Affinity/LUN group created during this operation is not deleted. To delete the new Affinity/LUN group created during this operation, perform the operation "9.11.11 Delete Affinity/LUN Group".



If you create a new Affinity/LUN group, you can check by the **Assigned** column of the volume list whether the selected volume is assigned to other Affinity/LUN group.

11.4.3 Add Access Path (Other Than ETERNUS Disk Storage System)

This operation for devices other than ETERNUS Disk storage systems executes only the WWPN zoning setting to the FC switch because it cannot set the host affinity for devices other than ETERNUS Disk storage systems.

Set WWPN zoning information can be confirmed with the zoning list screen.

Devices for which host affinity cannot be set are not displayed in the screen displaying access path information.

In an environment in which both an access path and a VVOL access path are set, if only one of access paths is deleted, FC switch zoning is not deleted. In both the access path and the VVOL access path are deleted, zoning is deleted.

- Basic conditions under which an ETERNUS SF system can recognize HBA replacement on a server node are as follows:
 - Storage Cruiser's agent is installed in the server node.
 - HBA is replaced in the same slot on the server node.
 - The server node is registered in the ETERNUS SF system.
 - Access path is configured for pre-replaced HBA.

Even if HBA is replaced with the above basic conditions met, HBA replacement may not be recognized in the following cases:

- When hot swapping HBA on Linux
- When replacing HBA on the Solaris OS
- When the zoning settings intended for access path inheritance is as follows, access path cannot be inherited:
 - Port zoning
 - Not one-to-one WWPN zoning
- The zoning of tape library devices or other storage devices than ETERNUS Disk storage systems cannot be inherited.
- In the host registration information, host number cannot be inherited. Host name can be inherited.
- If inheritance processing is done on any access path to which no zoning is set, zoning creation is skipped, and host registration and affinity settings alone are performed.
- For the ETERNUS DX S2 series, you must not be logged into ETERNUS Web GUI. Make sure you perform the operation after logging off from ETERNUS Web GUI.

Chapter 12 Operations Started From Map View Tab

This chapter explains the operations started from clicking Map View of the global navigation tab.

Map View has the following screens.

Screen Name	Explanation
Overview	Displays the physical configuration of device nodes held by the ETERNUS SF system.
Logical Path View	Displays on the Main pane the physical configuration and logical configuration of device nodes selected on the Overview screen.



When displaying the Overview and Logical Path View screens, the maximum number of registered devices is 1,000. If the number exceeds 1,000, a communication error may occur.

To confirm the device information when any communication error occurs, use "End to End view".

12.1 Display Overview Screen

In order to display the Overview screen, it is necessary to click **Map View** on the global navigation tab. As a result, physical configuration information of the system is displayed on the Main pane.



- If you click in the menu area with the displayed content different from the resources (other user added or deleted the resources),

a dialog box that includes the following message is displayed:

Resource information has been refreshed because they were modified.

To close the dialog box, click OK or Close.

The information displayed on the tree view and Main pane is updated.

- If you click a in the menu area while the device selected on the tree view has been deleted by other user, a dialog box that includes the following message is displayed:

Resource information has been refreshed because they were modified.

To close the dialog box, click **OK** or **Close**.

At this time, the selected state on the tree view is transferred to the root node (Overview node). On the Main pane, the content when the root node was selected is displayed. The tree view expanded state is not changed.

12.2 Highlight on Overview Screen

The procedure to highlight is as follows:

- On the global navigation tab, click Map View.
 Physical configuration information of the system is displayed on the Main pane.
- 2. On the Main pane, click the target device node.



Depending on the type of the device clicked in step 2, what is highlighted varies as follows.

Device to Be Clicked	What Is Highlighted
Server	- Physical connection line between clicked server and its physically connected network device
	- Network device as physical connection destination
Storage device	- Physical connection line between clicked storage device and its physically connected network device
	- Network device as physical connection destination
Network device	None.

 Physical configuration information of the system is displayed on the Main pane.
- 2. On the Main pane, click the pull-down menu icon of the menu bar.
- 3. Click Arrange devices in the pull-down menu.

12.4 Display All on Overview Screen

The procedure to display the entire system is as follows:

- 1. On the global navigation tab, click **Map View**.

 Physical configuration information of the system is displayed on the Main pane.
- 2. On the Main pane, click the pull-down menu icon of the menu bar.
- 3. Click View all device in the pull-down menu.

12.5 Move Device Node on Overview Screen

The procedure to move the device node is as follows:

 The list of current registered scheduler tasks and their status are displayed on the Main pane.
- 2. On the Action pane, click **Create** under **Task**. The **Create scheduler task** wizard is launched. Then, the welcome page is displayed.
- Check the displayed information, and then click Next. The Select of task type page is displayed.



The type displayed on the page is "ACM Script".

If "ACM Script" is selected, the following scripts can be registered in the scheduler task:

- Backup script generated by the Backup Wizard for Exchange Server
- Backup script generated by the Backup Wizard for SQL Server
- Select type from the pull-down list, and then click Next.
 The Select of Host name page is displayed.



The hosts that meet all the following conditions are displayed on the page:

- The ETERNUS SF Manager or AdvancedCopy Manager's agent of Version 16.1 or later is installed.

- The server that the ETERNUS SF Manager or AdvancedCopy Manager's agent has been installed is registered on the ETERNUS SF system as a Managed Server of AdvancedCopy Manager.
- The host operating system is Microsoft Windows Server 2008 or later.
- 5. Select a host that executes the subject (script) of the scheduler task. In addition, enter the following authentication information for the selected host, and then click **Next**.

Item Name	Explanation
Domain name	Enter a domain name required for authentification. The specification of this item can be omitted. When this specification has been omitted, the local domain is selected. The maximum length of the input character is 63.
User name	Enter a user name required for authentification. The maximum length of the input character is 20.
Password	Enter a password for the user required for authentification. The maximum length of the input character is 127.

The Select of operations page is displayed. In this page, a list of scripts on the selected host is displayed.



The scripts that are stored in the following folder are displayed on the page:

- In the case that the selected host is a non-clustered system
 - <AdvancedCopy Manager program directory>\Wizard\bat
- In the case that the selected host is a clustered system
 - <Drive of shared disk for shared data of AdvancedCopy Manager>:\var\opt\swstorage\Wizard\bat
- 6. From the list of scripts, select the scripts in the order they are to be executed, and then click Add. Then, click Next. To change a selected script or the order of execution of scripts, check the script to be changed and click Delete. The Setting of schedule page is displayed.



There is no limit in the number of scripts to be registered in one scheduler task.

7. Enter or select about the following items, and then click **Next**.

Item Name	Explanation
Task name	Specify a name of the scheduler task to be created. Any alphanumeric character and an underscore (_) may be specified. The first character must use the alphabet. The letters to be specified are not case sensitive.
Execution period	Select the scheduler task execution period. Make a selection from one of the following.
	- Once The scheduler task is executed only once at the specified time.
	- Hourly The scheduler task is executed in intervals of the specified time. When this period is selected, the item of Execution interval(Hour) is displayed.
	- Daily The scheduler task is executed at the specified time of every day.

The information confirmation screen is displayed.

8. As the information entered up until step 7 is displayed, finally check whether it is okay to create a scheduler task with the displayed content.

If it is okay, click **Create**.

When the creation of the scheduler task has been completed, a pop-up indicating the completion of the creation is displayed.

9. Click Done.

13.2 Display Scheduler Task

The procedure to display the scheduler task list/details is as follows:

To display the list, perform step 1 only.

To display the specific scheduler task details, perform all steps.

- 2. On the Main pane, either check the target scheduler task checkboxes (multiple selections allowed) or click the link of the task name of the target scheduler task to display the scheduler task display page.
- 3. On the Action pane, click **Delete** under **Task**. The **Delete schedule task** page is displayed.
- 4. Check that the selected scheduler task is correct, and then click **Delete**. When the scheduler task has been deleted, a pop-up notifying the deletion is displayed.



If Cancel is clicked, the scheduler task is not deleted.

5. Click Done.



When any of the following conditions is met, the scheduler task cannot be deleted.

- When the status of scheduler task is "Executing".
- When the scheduler task type is "VM Backup".

13.4 Execute Schedule Task Immediately

The procedure to execute a scheduler task immediately is as follows:

- On the global navigation tab, click Scheduler.
 The list of current registered scheduler tasks and their status are displayed on the Main pane.
- 2. On the Main pane, either check the target scheduler task checkboxes (only one selection allowed) or click the link of the task name of the target scheduler task to display the scheduler task display page.
- 3. On the Action pane, click **Execute immediate** under **Operation**. The **Execute immediate schedule task** page is displayed.
- 4. Check that the selected scheduler task is correct, and then click **Execute**.

 When the scheduler task has been instantly executed, a pop-up notifying the instant execution is displayed.



If Cancel is clicked, the scheduler task is not executed immediately.

5. Click Done.



- The number of scheduler tasks that can be executed concurrently and immediately for the same host is one.

- Even if status of scheduler task is "Disable", the scheduler task can be executed immediately.
- When the status of scheduler task is "Executing", the scheduler task cannot be executed immediately.

13.5 Enable/Disable Scheduler Task

The procedure to enable/disable a scheduler task is as follows:

- On the global navigation tab, click **Scheduler**.
 The list of current registered scheduler tasks and their status are displayed on the Main pane.
- 2. On the Main pane, either check the target scheduler task checkboxes (multiple selections allowed) or click the link of the task name of the target scheduler task to display the scheduler task display page.
- 3. Perform the following procedures according to the operation purpose.

For Enabling

- a. On the Action pane, click **Enable** under **Operation**. The **Enable scheduler task** page is displayed.
- b. Check that the selected scheduler task is correct, and then click **Enable**.

 When the scheduler task has been enabled, a pop-up notifying the changing to enable is displayed.



If Cancel is clicked, the scheduler task is not enabled.

c. Click Done.

For Disabling

- a. On the Action pane, click **Disable** under **Operation**.
 The **Disable scheduler task** page is displayed.
- b. Check that the selected scheduler task is correct, and then click **Disable**.
 When the scheduler task has been enabled, a pop-up notifying the changing to disable is displayed.



If Cancel is clicked, the scheduler task is not disabled.

c. Click Done.



When the status of scheduler task is "Executing", the schedule task cannot be enabled or disabled.

- 2. On the Category pane, click **Operation History**. The operation log list is displayed on the Main pane.

If confirming the detailed operation log information, click the confirmation object operation log. The detailed information displayed on a pop-up window.

If there are operation logs which the processing result is ". Warning " or " Failed ", check the message and perform appropriate action by following procedures. The operation logs with unidentified messages are displayed with boldface and unidentified mark " on the leftmost column.

- 1. Click the confirmation object operation log.
- 2. Refer to the **Message** field in a pop-up window.
- 3. Refer to the Messages and perform appropriate action according to the corresponding message.

When no corrective action is required, the log status can be marked as confirmed.

- 1. On the Action pane, click [Mark as Confirmed].
- 2. Confirm that the log in the Mark as Confirmed screen does not require corrective action, and then click Mark.



- The target operational logs of "Mark as Confirmed" are limited to logs currently displayed on the screen.
- When confirming a specific user's operation logs, set the filter function to only display the specific user's operation logs.

14.2 Export Operation History

The procedure to export operation logs is as follows:

- 1. On the global navigation tab, click **Log**.
- 2. On the Category pane, click Operation History.
- 3. On the Action pane, click **Download** under **Operation History**. The **File Download** dialog box is displayed.
- 4. Click **Save**. The **Save As** dialog box is displayed.
- 5. Click Save, specifying the location to save the operation logs.



- Even if Filter setting is enabled on Web Console, all data is exported.
- Logs are exported as zip-compressed CSV file.
- The character code of the CSV format file is UTF-8. It is necessary to specify the character code depending on the application which opens the file.

- A hyphen (-) is displayed in the **Operation ID** column of all of the data in the exported file, because the **Operation ID** column is currently unused.

14.3 Display Events

The procedure to display the events is as follows:

- 2. On the Category pane, click **Events**. The event list is displayed on the Main pane.

If confirming the detailed event information, click the **Message** column for the confirmation object event. The detailed information is displayed in a pop-up window.



The event caused by quota setting in NAS management is not displayed on this screen. For the event notified as to quota setting in NAS management, refer to "9.15.24 Display Quota Information" to confirm.

14.4 Export Events

The procedure to export events is as follows:

- 1. On the global navigation tab, click Log.
- 2. On the Category pane, click Events.
- 3. On the Action pane, click **Download** under **Events**. The **File Download** dialog box is displayed.
- Click Save.
 The Save As dialog box is displayed.
- 5. Click Save, specifying the location to save the events.



- Even if Filter setting is enabled on Web Console, all data is exported.
- Logs are exported as zip-compressed CSV file.
- The character code of the CSV format file is UTF-8. It is necessary to specify the character code depending on the application which opens the file.

14.5 Display Login/Logout History

The procedure to display the login and logout logs is as follows:

 The **File Download** dialog box is displayed.
- 4. Click Save.

The Save As dialog box is displayed.

5. Click **Save**, specifying the location to save the threshold monitoring alarms.



- Even if Filter setting is enabled on Web Console, all data is exported.
- Logs are exported as zip-compressed CSV file.
- The character code of the CSV format file is UTF-8. It is necessary to specify the character code depending on the application which opens the file.

Chapter 15 Operations Started From System Tab

This chapter explains the operations started from clicking System of the global navigation tab.

15.1 Operations for User Management

15.1.1 Display/Change Contact Information

The procedure to display or change the setting values of the Contact information (Mail Settings, Business Administrator, System Administrator and Hardware Administrator) is as follows:

- 1. On the global navigation tab, click System.
- On the Category pane, click Contacts.The current set value is displayed on the Main pane.
- 3. On the Action pane, click **Modify** under **Contacts**. The information input screen is displayed.
- 4. Enter the necessary information, and then click Modify.

15.1.2 Send Test E-mail

Regardless of the status of [Send Event Notification Mail] in "15.1.1 Display/Change Contact Information", the test mail is sent to the following users. By sending test mails, you can confirm whether the destination addresses are correctly configured or not.

- System Administrator
- Business Administrator

The procedure to send test mails is as follows:

- 1. On the global navigation tab, click System.
- 2. On the Category pane, click Contacts.
- 3. On the Action pane, click Send Test Email under Contacts.

15.1.3 Set Maximum Number of Jobs in Queue

The procedure to set the maximum number of jobs in queue is as follows:

- 1. On the global navigation tab, click System.
- 2. On the Category pane, click User Management.
- 3. On the Main pane, check the checkbox to select a user that can set the maximum number of jobs in the queue.
- On the Action pane, click Set Max. Jobs in Queue under Session Management.
 The information input screen is displayed.
- 5. Enter the necessary information, and then click Modify.

15.1.4 Forcible Logout

A forcible logout is executed to a user by the system administrator.

- 1. On the global navigation tab, click System.
- 2. On the Category pane, click User Management.
- 3. On the Main pane, check the checkbox to select a user that can execute forcible logout.
- 4. On the Action pane, click Force Logout under Session Management.

15.2 Web Console Control Settings

15.2.1 Display Values Set for Web Console Control

When clicking **System** on the global navigation tab, the values set for Web Console control is displayed on the Main pane as follows.

Screen Refresh Preference	Target Screen Refresh Interval

15.2.2 Change Value for Log Preference

The procedure to display the values set for log preference is as follows:

- On the global navigation tab, click System.
 The current value is displayed on the Main pane.
- On the Action pane, click Modify under Log Preference.
 The information input screen is displayed.
- 3. Enter the necessary information, and then click Modify.

15.2.3 Change Value for Screen Refresh Preference

The procedure to change the screen refresh target and/or screen refresh interval for Web Console is as follows:

- 1. On the global navigation tab, click **System**. The current value is displayed on the Main pane.
- On the Action pane, click Modify under Screen Refresh Preference.
 The information input screen is displayed.
- 3. Enter the necessary information, and then click Modify.

15.2.4 Display Preference

You can change the set value of the following items related to the screen display:

- Default record count in table
- Default Information panel status (opened/closed status immediately after screen transition)
- Opened/closed status of the Filter Setting area after filtering

The procedure to change the set value is as follows:

- 1. On the global navigation tab, click **System**. The current set value is displayed on the Main pane.
- 2. On the Action pane, click **Modify** under **Display Preference**. The information input screen is displayed.

3. Enter the necessary information, and then click **Modify**.

15.2.5 Change Value for Session Timeout

The procedure to change the session timeout value is as follows:

- On the global navigation tab, click System.
 The current value is displayed on the Main pane.
- 2. On the Action pane, click **Modify** under **Session Timeout**. The information input screen is displayed.
- 3. Enter the necessary information, and then click Modify.



When the session timeout value is set to "Omin", the session timeout value is invalid. The session remains connected as long as it does not log out.

15.2.6 Reload Configuration Files

The procedure to display/reload the configuration file is as follows:

- 1. On the global navigation tab, click System.
- On the Category pane, click System Settings.The content of the configuration files is displayed.
- 3. On the Action pane, click **Refresh Config File** under **System Settings**. The information confirmation screen is displayed.
- 4. Confirm the information, and then click Refresh.

15.3 SNMP Communication Settings

15.3.1 Display SNMP Communication Settings

The procedure to display SNMP communication settings is as follows:

- 1. On the global navigation tab, click System.
- 2. On the Category pane, click SNMP Configuration.



The SNMP Configuration overview screen only displays devices that support the SNMPv3 protocol.

15.3.2 Change Manager Engine ID



Change the ETERNUS SF Manager Engine ID only when multiple ETERNUS SF Managers exist within the system.

The procedure to change the ETERNUS SF Manager Engine ID is as follows:

- 1. On the global navigation tab, click System.
- 2. On the Category pane, click SNMP Configuration.

- 3. On the Action pane, click **Modify** under **Manager Engine ID**. The information input screen is displayed.
- 4. Enter a new Engine ID.
- 5. Confirm the information, if no problem then click Modify.

15.3.3 Change SNMP Communication Settings

The procedure to change the SNMP communication settings is as follows:

- 1. On the global navigation tab, click System.
- 2. On the Category pane, click SNMP Configuration.
- 3. On the Main pane, click the target device.
- 4. On the Action pane, click Modify under SNMP Configuration.
- 5. Enter a new SNMP Communication information.

For Setting to SNMPv1

- a. Check the "v1" radio button in the SNMP Version field.
- b. Enter the SNMP community name.

For Setting to SNMPv3

- a. Check the "v3" radio button in the SNMP Version field.
- b. Check the radio button of the target user from among the SNMPv3 MIB access users.
- 6. Confirm the information, if no problem then click Modify.

15.3.4 Display/Add/Change/Delete SNMPv3 User Configuration

The procedure to display/add/change/delete the SNMPv3 user configuration is as follows: To display the SNMPv3 user configuration, perform from step 1 to step 3. Otherwise, perform all steps.

- 1. On the global navigation tab, click System.
- 2. On the Category pane, click **SNMP Configuration**.

 The items of the Category pane change into the items concerning the SNMP communication settings.
- 3. On the Category pane, click **User Configuration (v3)**. The current SNMPv3 user configuration information is displayed on the Main pane.



The ID that is displayed on the screen cannot be changed because it is part of the internal system management information. In addition, this ID is not relevant to the operation of this product.

4. Perform the following procedures according to the operation purpose.

For Adding SNMPv3 User Configuration

a. On the Action pane, click **Add/Modify** under **User Configuration**. The information input screen is displayed.



If you select "Both" in the **Usage** field, both the usage for SNMP Traps and MIB access are created simultaneously.

b. Enter the necessary information, and then click Add/Modify.

For Changing SNMPv3 User Configuration

- a. On the Main pane, check the target user checkbox.
- b. On the Action pane, click **Add/Modify** under **User Configuration**. The information input screen is displayed.
- c. Enter the necessary information, and then click Add/Modify.

For Deleting SNMPv3 User Configuration

- a. On the Main pane, check the target user checkbox.
- b. On the Action pane, click **Delete** under **User Configuration**. The deletion confirmation dialog box is displayed.
- c. If there is no problem to delete, click Yes.



If you change the user settings that are used for the SNMP communication settings, the SNMP communication settings for all of the devices that are using this user are changed. When the device side SNMP communication settings no longer match due to this change, an error log stating that the security level does not match is output to the event log. If an error log is output, reconfigure the user settings to match the device side settings.



The user setting information that is used to configure the SNMP communication settings on the registered device cannot be deleted.

15.4 System Maintenance

15.4.1 Collecting Troubleshooting Information

The procedure to collect the troubleshooting information is as follows:

- 1. On the global navigation tab, click System.
- 2. On the Category pane, click Trouble Shootings.
- 3. On the Action pane, click the operation to perform.

Selectable operations are as follows.

Operation	Explanation
Download(Initial)	This function collects the information needed for the initial investigation.
Download(All)	This function collects the detailed troubleshooting data.



While the collection of the troubleshooting data is in progress, other processes may be kept waiting. Therefore, do not execute other operations during the collection of troubleshooting data.

15.5 Patch Management

15.5.1 Apply Consolidated Patch/Display Application Status/Delete All Patches

The procedure to apply the Consolidated Patch of ETERNUS SF Manager program in the Management Server, the procedure to display the application status of the Consolidated Patch of ETERNUS SF Manager program, and the procedure to delete all patches applied to the ETERNUS SF Manager program in the Management Server are as follows: To display the application status of the Consolidated Patch, perform from step 1 to step 2. Otherwise, perform all steps.

- 1. On the global navigation tab, click System.
- On the Category pane, click Patch Management.
 The information of the Consolidated Patch applied to the ETERNUS SF Manager program in the Management Server is displayed on the Main pane.
- 3. Perform the following procedures according to the operation purpose.

For Applying a Consolidated Patch

- a. On the Action pane, click **Apply** under **Consolidated Patch**. The **Apply Patch** page is displayed.
- b. Specify the file to be uploaded, and then click Apply.
- c. Check the displayed information dialog box, and then click Done.



Clicking **Done** automatically logs out the logged-in user. Do not attempt re-login to Web Console right after the logout as the ETERNUS SF Manager services automatically stop 30 seconds later.

The ETERNUS SF Manager services launch automatically once the patch application is complete. Try logging in afterwards.

For Deleting All Patches

- a. On the Action pane, click Delete All under Consolidated Patch.
- b. Check the displayed warning dialog box, and then click \mathbf{OK} .
- c. Check the displayed information dialog box, and then click **Done**.



Clicking **Done** automatically logs out the logged-in user. Do not attempt re-login to Web Console right after the logout as the ETERNUS SF Manager services automatically stop 30 seconds later.

The ETERNUS SF Manager services launch automatically once the patch deletion is complete. Try logging in afterwards.



When the operation for deleting all of the patches is executed, all patches that had been applied to the ETERNUS SF Manager program up to that point are deleted. However, patches applied to other products using the UpdateAdvisor for Middleware are not be deleted.
